School election set for Tuesday

Handley up for re-election;

proposals on ballot as well

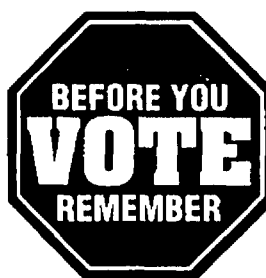

Yes, there is a school board election next week. May 3, to be exact.

Due to a change in Michigan's election-consolidation law, signed by Gov. Jennifer Granholm last year, voters statewide face a new school election schedule.

Under the reform, the dates when a school election may take place have changed. Also different for some local residents: where they cast school election ballots.

According to the revised law, elections may now be held one day in February, May, August and November. As a rule, voters will cast their ballots at the same polling places where they vote for President of the United States.



Voting precincts for school elections have changed. Make sure you vote at your governmental polling place.

Back to the future

Monday city council meeting may outline downtown vision

Northville Mayor Christopher Johnson would like to see his hometown retain its historical charm.

He would like to see parking concerns resolved. He would like a pedestrian-friendly shopping district to thrive.

Johnson hopes his city council peers and fellow residents get a "Downtown 2010 Vision" rolling Monday night.

But he knows it will take a willingness from commissioners, board members, merchants, building owners, residents and city officials to really dig into a vision existing now only on paper.

In an ever-evolving community, Johnson said, what's needed most to turn ideas into amenities is a concise action plan and a clear strategy.

Lion hearts on display

'White cane' campaign resumes this weekend — but not from the streets, from the curb

Even in the safety of a sports utility vehicle, navigating the congested crossroads of Eight Mile and Haggerty can be treacherous.

Ever tried standing in the middle of the intersection, though?

Over the past 25 years, Barbara Morgan has done just that — on numerous occasions.

Like others in the Northville Lions Club, she's taken to the thoroughfare with yellow safety vest, collection bucket and pocketful of small "white cane" cards.

"Believe me, it's scary," laughed Morgan. "I've had some people put an extra dollar in and tell me to get off the street."

Morgan, 63, will stick to Hiller's grocery store downtown for this weekend's White Cane Week.

In a longtime spring tradition, Lions members and volunteers will be stationed near local food shops and areas like Main and Center streets.

When drivers roll down windows and give a bill tomorrow or Saturday, they'll get a small card to fasten to rearview mirrors.

What's more, every donated cent goes straight to local charities helping blind and deaf persons.

But this year, don't expect to find smiling faces at Morgan's old post.

Township officials last Friday marked Haggerty Road at Eight Mile — and every township intersection along Haggerty Road — off-limits due to high numbers of traffic accidents.

"It is on the state law that they're not to be in the roadway," Township Police Chief John Werth said. "We do enforce that."

Certain areas on Beck, Sheldon and Six Mile roads are fair game, officials said, but Lions should stick to the curbs and not the painted road lines.

Members of Northville's eight-year-old club say the blitz is their only annual charity fund-raiser.

Last year, treasurer Bill Basse tallied \$2,200 in collection bags on a Saturday evening.

Usually at the Center Street area, Basse said there are two sides to losing posts like Eight and Haggerty.

"Volume in this thing is everything, and obviously you get the volume there," Basse said. "But with all of the people going every which way... we don't have very many people who say, 'Oh, I'll go do that intersection.'"

On the streets, Lions say there's camaraderie and community connection.

There's competition, too, said veteran Phyllis Heckemeyer.

Local artist lends signature style to Flower Days promotion

Annual Main Street event slated for May 27-28

Accomplished artist Tom Hale is lending his signature automobile and floral stylings to promote downtown Northville's Flower Days.

The result of a team effort by the Northville resident and local business owner Tom James: a poster blending images of Main Street with a red rose and a vintage car commemorating the Northville Central Business Association's 18th annual flower sale May 27-28.

Hale will sign 100 of the 1,000 \$20 posters printed. Proceeds from the poster sales go to the merchant association, which hosts a variety of activities downtown.

Vendors again will line a blocked off Main Street for the annual sale, held each year prior to the Memorial Day traditional planting weekend. More than a dozen growers bring truckloads of floral varieties, ornamental grasses and yard ornaments.

This is the second year the business association is selling a poster as a fund-raiser. Last year, Northville artist Caroline Dunphy depicted the flower sale street scene in water colors.

The artist's automobile art, showing reflective surfaces realistically and abstractly, often incorporate floral images.

Hale, who earned his degree from the Art Center College of Design in Los Angeles, began fine art painting in 1972.

Floor Shopping Simplified

A carefully considered flooring purchase will reward you often over the years.

Ask yourself these questions before you buy.

How is the room to be used? Your answers lead to selecting the type and grade of flooring that best fits your lifestyle.

How do I choose color? Color provides personality by uniting decorative elements and creating atmosphere. Light colors "expand" a room. Darks provide coziness.

How do I maintain my new floor? Some floors are easier to clean than others. Some warranties require it. Before buying, consult product guides or contact your salesperson about proper care and maintenance.

How much flooring will I need? Economically speaking, it is best to have your retailer or installer make final measurements, then plan the layout to ensure you purchase the correct amount.

Name that cow: Guernsey donating cow to Maybury Farm

Plant tour offer chance to name cows, win prizes

April's been a monumental month for a 1,300-pound Guernsey cow from Indiana.

Last week, the 3-year-old bovine gave birth to a male calf. Tomorrow, she and her baby will arrive at their new home, Northville's Maybury Farm, a

gift from Novi staple Guernsey Farms Dairy.

"We knew they needed animals out there," said Hugh McGuire, one of the dairy's four brother owners. "It's hard to find a Guernsey cow in Michigan."

This Saturday, residents can help feed the brown and white cows — and submit a name for the mom — for a \$1 donation.

In return, they'll also be treated to a tour of the dairy's 28,000 square foot processing plant, live music, free samples and a glimpse of the mooing guest of honor.

The cow will complete a new barnyard family, according to the Northville Community Foundation, which runs the farm. Most animals perished in a 2002 fire.

"There were cows there when it burned," said director Shari Peters. "This is the only animal we needed. We're happy to get it."

In the business' first plant tour in eight years, McGuire and his 13 siblings will all be there, along with their father and company founder, John McGuire, 96.

A family affair for six decades, Guernsey boasts 23 relatives making ice cream, bottling milk and home-delivering dairy products — all under one roof.

Karen Kinville, the youngest daughter who handles finances, said dairy work was both a passion and necessity.

"To feed all those kids," she laughed. "The family is what

we're all about. We get along."

Before milk, ice cream, yogurt and eggnog hit Guernsey's store shelves, though, the plant is where it all comes together.

Starting by a huge, recently added freezer, the tour will walk participants through the process.

Raw milk tapped from Holstein cows begins its trek from trucks to two holding tanks that together hold 154,800 pounds.

From there, skim milk and cream are separated. Then, they're homogenized and pasteurized, or blended back together,

er, at high temperatures.

After going through mixing and freezer tanks, ice cream gets special flavors by fruit and nut feeder and a ripple machine for caramel and fruit swirls.

Packaged in cardboard or plastic, the dairy delicacies are then shipped by Guernsey's fleet.

"Fifty miles in all directions, we go," Hugh McGuire said, adding that Guernsey cows were once the preferred breed. "They produce higher butterfat."

Though Maybury's Guernsey won't be tapped for any dairy products, farm goers will be able to visit the cow, along with chickens, horses, sheep, and goats.

At the Guernsey's event, WJR-AM radio host Foster Braun will judge a "Cutest Kid

Eating Guernsey Farms Dairy Ice Cream" contest. Entries due tomorrow, three winners will get prizes.

To boot, donors will be entered in a raffle. Top reward: 52-and-one-half gallons of ice cream, 12 jars of hot fudge, 52-and-one-half gallons of milk and a dozen 12-piece chicken dinner buckets.

But the money will go to a bigger cause.

"The dollar is used to (help) feed the cow," Kinville said. "I think everybody's going to want to pay."

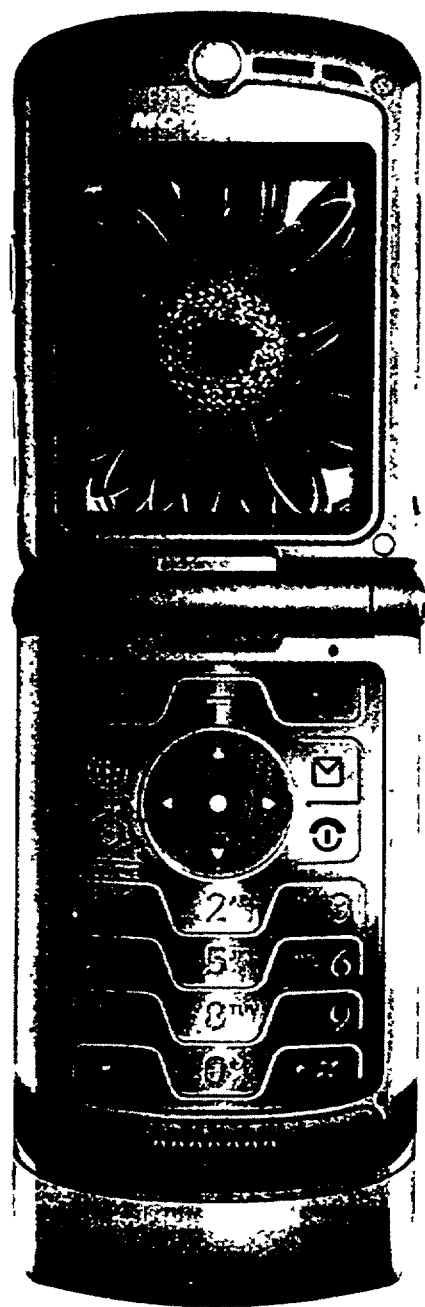

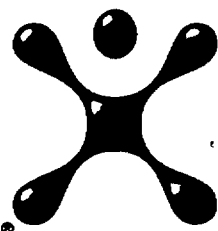

"They don't want to pool their money all together. They want to count it first so they can see if they've gotten more than the other person," she said.

But funds will continue to help retirement homes for the blind, leader dog training and local projects — such as the handicapped-accessible playground being built for children at Northville's Old Village School.

And regardless of where she's at, Morgan said she'll keep the same philosophy she's used for over two decades.

"You've got to make eye contact and you've got to smile," she said. "People like a smiling face and if people don't want to give, you smile at them anyway."

"They give what they feel that they can give, but a dollar at a time adds up."

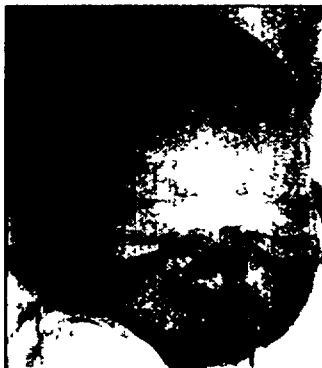

Annual student art show begins April 29

Graphic artist Bridget Karaisz remembers what a big deal it was for her work to be publicly exhibited when she was a student.

The Northville Arts Commission member this year volunteered to chair the sixth annual juried Student Fine Art Show for Northville Public Schools. About 200 artworks by sixth-12th graders will be on display April 29-May 5 at the First Presbyterian Church, 200 E. Main St.

"It was a boost," Karaisz said. "It helped steer me in making some decisions after school."

"It inspires you to do more." Local middle school and high school students were inspired to create in eight categories.

"I knew the young people were capable of incredible things," Karaisz said. "There's a few surprising pieces from the younger high school and middle school students."

"The sculptures were just over the top."

Show visitors will see sculpture, functional ceramics, metals, photography, mixed media, graphics, drawing and painting.

The exhibit will include 50 photos, Karaisz said, primarily black and white. Students selected different times of the day to convey mood and feeling in their photo subjects ranging from piano keys to downtown Northville street scenes, she said.

Local business sponsors — Sherri Mewha of Sherrus Gallery of Fine Art, Sandy Baughman of Creative Cottage and Steve Fecht of Fecht Photography — contributed for first-place cash prizes in eight categories.

The arts commission, school district and First Presbyterian have co-hosted the event for six years. Arts commission member Sue Taylor, who launched the program, started the tradition of inviting four local artists to select which works to showcase.

"I think it gives more kids an opportunity to show what they can do," Taylor said. "It's a show downtown, within the community and it gets more exposure."

"Many on the committee have been kind of envious the kids have the opportunity to take these classes at the high school level," she said.

Students showing their projects and viewing what others have done spurs them to try new things, Karaisz said.

"You can see how this is developing."

Township Briefs

NORTHVILLE

Brownfield approved

Township trustees unanimously decided April 21 that they want to create a brownfield redevelopment authority and board.

Brownfields offer tax breaks in exchange for redevelopment of contaminated property.

Officials may designate the former Northville Psychiatric Hospital on Seven Mile Road a potential brownfield.

Developer Real Estate Interests has asked the township to consider a brownfield in its initial plans.

"This was almost a protective measure," Township Supervisor Mark Abbo said.

Conditional rezoning OK'd

Through its first conditional zoning, the township will allow up to 47 condominium units on land near Eight Mile and Haggerty roads.

The 16 acres sits between Meijer and Meadowbrook Golf

Course. Talon Development wants to rezone the land from single family homes to multiple family.

Township officials said a package of state bills approved in December allows the board of trustees to allow the plan with certain conditions.

In this case, density was capped. The board approved the measure 7-0 April 21.

REI meeting canceled

A planned meeting between township officials and developer Real Estate Interests slated for April 20 was canceled. Township Supervisor Mark Abbo said at last week's trustees meeting.

"REI did not produce any additional documents," Abbo said. A rescheduled meeting has not been announced.

Northville path update

A sheet pile retaining wall will be designed for the soon-to-be built Northville Road pathway.

In a 7-0 vote, trustees approved the move, valued at \$6,800, on April 21. As costs are shared with the city, the township would pay no more than \$3,400.

Township officials also said they hope to soon receive approval to build the path on CSX Railroad's easement.

The path is expected to be complete sometime next spring.

Land swap news

Northville Township's Economic Development Corporation has not yet acted on a potential land swap, Township Supervisor Mark Abbo said.

The township is considering selling 15 undeveloped acres at Sheldon and Five Mile roads to the corporation, and rezoning it from residential to commercial.

The land would be exchanged with Farmington Hills-based developer Grand Sakwa for 168 acres further west, and the township could make money leasing the new land.

Officials leaned toward having the planning department first review and update the master plan for land use, which occurs every five years.

Planner Jennifer Frey said the rezoning process still would take six months at minimum.

Gift policy in place

Northville Township officials now have a gift acceptance policy and procedure. Approved

April 21, the plan notes that all gifts become the property of the township and can't be used to influence the board, among other criteria.

Community Park latest

Township trustees made a \$14,283 progress payment on Community Park at an April 21 meeting.

Also, \$97,512 was deducted from the project due to nixed crosswalk painting on asphalt and landscape materials.

Work on the latter was to be re-bid, but when trustees were faced with a \$3,060 in re-bidding fees from current contractor M.C. Smith Associates, they tabled the issue.

Recent soil erosion on the property also was cited as an issue.

Community Park is expected to open by next spring.

Renovation expenses up

An 11th change order for renovation work on the township's police station was approved April 21.

Township trustees supported an extra \$141,211, which was not originally budgeted.

Parks budget approved

The Northville Parks and Recreation and Seniors Services budgets were trustee-approved April 21.

The \$899,539 budget, which includes a \$125,914 contribution for Community Park, is effective July 2005-July 2006.

Seedling give-away

In honor of Arbor Day, seedlings will be given away by Northville's beautification committees April 30.

From 9:30 a.m.-noon, small trees are free to city and township residents, as well as Northville Public School District students. Offerings include white spruce and pine, blue spruce, Douglas fir, red pine, red bud trees and service berry bushes. Limit is five per family.

Participants must bring proof of residency. Seedlings will be at Northville Township Hall, 44405 Six Mile Road. For details, call (248) 348-5800.

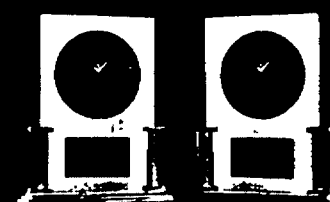

Yard Art: signs for the times

Local resident puts public stamp on personal enterprising spirit

Three years ago, Susan Walsh towed plywood, a tennis racket, stencils and paint to her family's Northville garage.

Her goal: create 15 personalized yard signs for her daughter's varsity team.

"I was surprised in the following days how much the girls liked the signs and how much the parents liked them," Walsh said.

Today, Walsh's Novi business, Yard Art, creates colorful lawn and wall signs, customized with names, school colors and more.

Created in a 2,400-square foot plant, signs honor events from basketball to ballet to birthdays, Walsh said — and, if constantly outdoors, last up to two years.

The two-year-old company is getting attention from parenting and cheer leading magazines to Ladies who Launch, a national networking and resource group that featured Walsh last month.

But the mother of four said the highest praise is kids' excitement.

"It's all about the signs for the times in your life," she said.

Entrepreneurial spirit

Walsh's first batch sparked six months of research. Her plate was full, she said, but her kids were older and her husband supportive.

"After I decided not to do it, the feeling wouldn't go away," she said.

Loan in hand, the former financier picked out design software, digital printer, computer-

ized wood cutting machine and sturdy ground stakes.

By chance, Walsh also found graphic artist AnnaMaria Sala, a friend of her brother.

"She was so excited about it," Sala said. "I thought, 'Why not?' She's just incredible to work for. She and I think exactly alike."

Soon the duo had more than 30 designs, from canvas art and signing boards to baby announcements and smaller "tot art."

"It's a great learning experience," Walsh said. "I love to come to work everyday."

Handling finances at her par-

ents' Detroit tool and die business for years offered early lessons.

"My mother was extremely kind and compassionate," she said. "I learned from my father what the entrepreneurial spirit is all about: perseverance and passion."

"To be in something creative is like a breath of fresh air 10 times over. It is invigorating."

Her two younger sisters soon caught the bug. Patrice Ambrose sells Yard Art near her Ohio home — and buys for her three children.

"The best part about this is when I get to deliver a sign to a child and to see their face and

how happy they are," she said. "It just comes through."

Future signs

Shipping to nearly 25 states, Walsh said there's plenty in store for Yard Art's future.

Promotional tie-ins are one avenue. Until June 30, for instance, proceeds from teacher's apple designs will benefit the non-profit TeachersCount organization.

Other partnerships also are in the works, Walsh said, and team

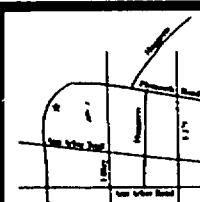

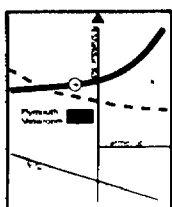

Weekend snowstorm evokes 'Frosty' notions of kids' magic

At first glance, it's difficult to tell whether Phillip Bondy, his sister, Rachel, and his brother, Colin, built the season's final snowman.

Or its first curb-side lemonade stand.

Last weekend, the sibling trio transformed a crate of Old Man Winter's sourest lemons into a six-foot snowman. They re-shaped a 24-hour snowstorm into something they'll not soon forget.

For the Bondys, a few inches of fresh snow was plenty to build Frosty II, a thick-shouldered second cousin to a snowman built by the three earlier this past winter.

The main design difference: Frosty II is sitting down, boasting a "Frosty" hat, yellow mop hair, black spray paint cap eyes, a red WD-40 cap nose, a blue Finsbee smile and four green tennis ball buttons.

"We did it ourselves," Rachel, 13, said. "Well, our dad did help a little. But mostly it was just us."

They used all the snow in their Highland Lakes front and side yards, then borrowed some more snow from the neighbor.

They started with a simple snowball. Rolled it. Packed it.

And really good teammates. Is Frosty II special? someone asked. Yeah, they said at once.

"He's a spring snowman, so he's really special," Phillip said, who also attends Silver Springs.

"And it's the best snowman we ever built," Rachel added.

But is he magic, like, you know, the real Frosty?

"Yeah, he's magic!" Phillip waived. "We've been getting good luck ever since we made him."

And though he couldn't think of a single instance supporting such an enthusiastic contention, it didn't matter. It was apparent.

Right questions

The Northville Record nailed it right on the head last week, challenging local public officials who too often talk a good "fiscal conservative" game, but then have no problem asking voters for "just one more millage" because they have used existing taxpayer money poorly.

Editor David Aguilar's column last week posed exactly the right questions: how will the Northville school district bundle its upcoming bond request — as a critical funding request centered on academic learning, or as a shrewdly packaged legislative sausage, inclusive of excessive athletic field houses and more retchid excess?

Northville residents have plenty of health club options, no need to "sell" us on the "community value" of some larger-than-life sports facility. I'll go to the Water Wheel Health Club or LifeTime fitness, thank you.

Our most pressing need is for more classrooms — kids, after all,

are attending school now inside portable trailers. If the district truly believes athletic field houses, and other such non-academic endeavors, pose a critical need, then taxpayers should have the right to vote for each priority separately, during a special election the following spring.

Likely, though, the district will simply string together the "classrooms and fieldhouse" request by the same "please, help our children" rope and we will all once again be stuck with the tab because who doesn't want to "help our kids?" Shameful.

Equally shameful is the fact that Northville Township officials apparently think no one has noticed the bungled Community Park project — way over budget and minus any operational funding, except for an upcoming recreational millage "cash grab" from local residents. They will be sorely mistaken come the next election.

Moreover, I thought it embarrassing that not one township board trustee has a clue about how much money the township earns or spends during the course of the year, yet they have no problem voting each meeting to approve taxpayer-paid expenditures worth several hundred thousands of dollars, if not millions.

And they call themselves "fiscal conservatives?" No wonder the township and the parks and recreation department have so badly bungled Community Park. No one has a clue.

Maybe we should require an aptitude test for anyone applying to these publicly-elected jobs. Or maybe we should simply show up to the polls next election — with a tighter hand on our wallet and our eyes more wide open about what's really going on.

City faces crossroads Monday

Opportunity knocks

Northville Township's elected officials approved a first-ever conditional rezoning of land last week, allowing condominiums on 16 acres near Eight Mile and Haggerty roads. Permitted by state law since December, this move gives government leaders more muscle when trying to curb density. Led by a subcommittee of township and Talon Development representatives, the rezoning is an early instance of cooperative scrutiny and planning. If future projects are handled with similar care — along with high regard for neighbors — this option holds potential as the township's smaller, undeveloped parcels are targeted for growth.

Crowded out by tough choices

Tuesday night parents heard grim news about the available choices for kindergartners attending Ridge Wood Elementary School. Because of continued Northville Township growth near the Six Mile and Ridge Road school, district officials said during the next two years kindergartners will attend Winchester, Moraine, Silver Springs and Thornton Creek elementary schools. In the meantime, officials must devise a solution. The most likely plan will include construction of a new school, requiring new taxpayer money. But requesting taxpayer money will not come without scrutiny and tough questions.

NORTHVILLE ATHLETICS

What's in a ranking, anyway?

The Northville Mustangs girls soccer team was ranked pre-season No. 1 in Michigan according to the coaches' association poll — a ranking they held until this week following their loss to Livonia Stevenson. Last season, the girls weren't in the top place of the poll until the final week, so the change in their current standing means nothing. Sure, rankings are nice, but a team has to prove they deserve it. Northville did last year and we'll have to wait until the dust settles before we know if they can do it again this year.

Gerrymandering draws more than political lines

Well, they may not be able to balance the budget, attract new industry or fix the roads, but our politicians do know how to do one thing right: draw the lines of their congressional or legislative districts so they are sure to get re-elected or, failing that, to assure that their party will continue to control the district.

Both parties have become amazingly skilled at gerrymandering. And more often than not they are engaged in a silent conspiracy that assures that most Democratic districts will stay Democratic and most Republican districts will vote reliably GOP year after year.

This is the nasty secret that underlies why our political system has become both so intensely partisan and so rigidly unchanging over recent years. Michigan's John Dingell, who as the currently longest serving member of Congress should know, says that there are no more than 25 genuinely competitive congressional districts out of the 435 around the country.

Wayne County Probate Judge Milton Mack, one of the smarter people on the bench and a long-time student of Michigan voting behavior, adds that just a handful of Michigan state legislative districts are competitive these days.

Why is this a problem? Simple. In districts that are drawn to favor one party over the other, the important contest is not the general election. It's the primary, when a small minority of voters, usually a more strident group than the rest of us, picks their party's nominee, who then will waltz to certain victory in the November general election.

For Republicans, it's the passionate Right-to-Lifers and the religious/social conservatives who turn out and generally pick a candidate who is usually to the right of the majority of the party. For Democrats, it's their equally highly motivated ACLU members, union functionaries and "tree huggers." AKA environ-

mentalists, who tend to select nominees more liberal than most.

As respected veteran political columnist

David Broder puts it, "Each party now only plays to its hard-core supporters, and the pragmatic center goes unrepresented." With general elections then coming down to a choice between extremes, it is any wonder partisan conflict has become so sharp? And with most voters more or less firmly in the middle of the road, is it any wonder many of us feel left out of the political process?

That's why there's been a lot of recent discussion about fiddling with election rules to make it easier for all of us to vote, or alternatively, to change the way the redistricting process works.

State Rep. Chris Ward (R-Brighton) has introduced a bill that would allow voters with a photo ID to cast an absentee ballot at the local clerk's office, without having to give a reason, any time during the week before the election. (As it now works, to get an absentee ballot you have to be older than 60 or declare you must be out of town on election day.) Ward says he has bipartisan support for his bill, although Gov. Jennifer Granholm and other Democrats object to requiring voters, some of whom may not work or drive, to produce an ID.

Elsewhere, people are talking about changing the way in which district lines are drawn. In Michigan, they are drawn up by the majority party in the state legislature to favor their side. About the only legal limitations are those that require all districts to be the same size ("one man, one vote") and avoiding drawing lines that slice through normally recognized communities.

In California, Gov. Arnold

Schwarzenegger wants to shift the line-drawing from the legislature to a panel of retired judges. Maybe these are both good ideas. Especially appealing to me is the thought that drawing district lines is a task too important to be left to the politicians.

But the trouble is that neither strategy addresses the basic problem. Making it easier to vote absentee doesn't change the dynamic of each party playing to its hard-core supporters in primary elections. And retired judges, most of whom owed their seats on the bench to one party or another, are not immune to being almost as partisan as legislators.

Judge Mack has developed a fine 10-point "Voters' Bill of Rights" that neatly frames what a good voting system ought to do. Included are:

- The right to have their vote count. Consider Republican voters in an overwhelmingly Democratic district. Does their vote count for much? No.

- The right to vote in elections that matter. Consider Democratic voters in an overwhelmingly Republican district. Do November elections matter to them? Not in local races.

- The right to vote in election districts that are fairly drawn. The key notion here is "fairly." In Judge Mack's mind, fair means not gerrymandered for partisan advantage.

Judge Mack has succeeded in defining what a properly functioning democratic (with a small "d") voting system ought to do. Plainly, the system we now have is failing these tests. Next week's column will describe a simple, common sense solution that could go a long way toward healing our steadily more dysfunctional political system.

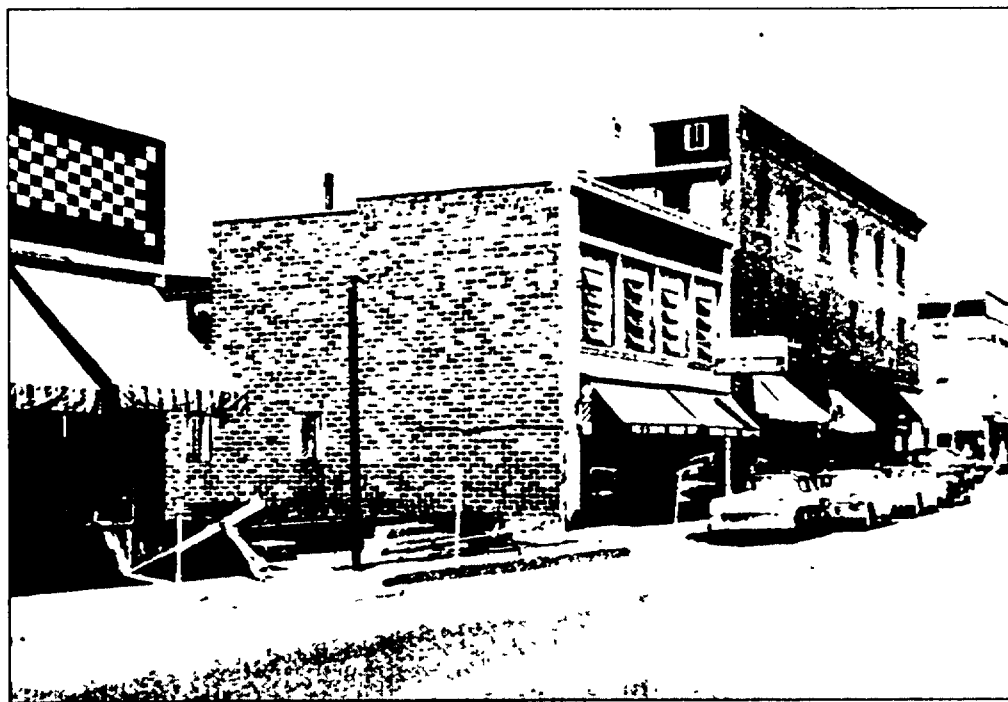

Fish culturist doing business

A Century ago

The following story has been excerpted from the 1905 Northville Record by Northville Historical Society board member Mark Chester. With minor exceptions, the stories comprising this year-long weekly series will appear as published 100 years ago this week.

Northville Station Handles 40,000,000 Embryo Fishes
Close of Fiscal Year in July Will show Large Results

The fiscal year of the Bureau of Fisheries comes to a close in July and the records at the Northville Station show how important a place that institution holds in this necessary and ever-growing government industry for the benefit of the future food supply of the United States. The fact that the plant here is among the finest in the United States in location, arrangement, equipment and effi-

ciency has long been undisputed.

During the year 40,000,000 lake trout eggs and 800,000 brook trout fry were distributed. 10,000,000 eggs went to various government and state stations, 6,000,000 to the Charlevoix substation, 6,000,000 to Alpena and 7,000,000 to the Saulte St. Marie for hatching and later planting in the Great Lakes.

Handley runs unopposed for school board

Northville Public Schools trustee Judy Handley views the May 3 school board election as an opportunity to complete unfinished business.

"There are things that are just not completed," Handley said. "I still think there are things to offer and if I continued on, it would be easier. The learning curve is incredible."

Two issues the incumbent hopes to move forward with if elected to another four-year term are funding and capacity.

"With all the growth in the district, probably our biggest issues are how can we maintain the grade-level size, the equity from building to building and have that same quality education," Handley said. "I know we can do it with content, but it's that atmosphere I'm concerned with."

Handley, 55, said capacity is an issue she is personally familiar with.

She could see Moraine Elementary School from her living room in 1985, but could not send her children there because it was closed.

Instead, two of her children traveled by bus to Amman.

"I know what parents are feeling when they say, 'I can see the school from my front door, yet my kids aren't going there.' I had the same feeling," she said.

All three of Handley's children went through the Northville Public School system, including two who participated in Early Childhood Center programs.

Funding from Lansing is another hurdle Handley expects to jump if re-elected.

The Northville resident said funding shouldn't be based on the economy.

"When people are spending money it is comfortable for schools, but when economic times are tight and people are watching their spending that pot of money shrinks for the schools," she said. "We have already committed to contracts and with class sizes and to a certain expectation for our

residents and our students and when the money is not there, that is an issue."

Handley said if chosen again by voters, she promises to blend her personal strengths and professional experience.

"I've been working in a school district since '71, so education has been my experience forever," she said.

Handley is the director of elementary school development with the Wayne-Westland Community School District.

Her administrative role includes overseeing school improvement, steering MEAP testing, managing an English Language Arts literacy grant and running the district's summer school program.

As part of her administrative duties, Handley is familiar with Education Yes! state legislation and No Child Left Behind.

"What child would you want left behind," Handley said in support of the federal legislation. "It has a very good intent, I think the spirit of the law is absolutely wonderful."

"It is what every child deserves, but when it rolls out into practicality in school districts it really involves a lot of additional work and compliance issues."

Before becoming an administrator, the school board candidate taught 21 years in the classroom.

teaching first-sixth grades for the Wayne-Westland Community School District

She also taught at-risk children for nine years.

On a personal level, Handley said her contribution to the board is a level head.

"I tend to try and think about the big picture and equity across the district, so that we maintain equitable programs," she said. "And I try to be very logical and non-emotional. I think when you have to make tough decisions you have to leave the emotional aspect off the table as much as possible."

Handley said she wants to see an end to the days of bond after bond.

"We've been in building mode since 1997," she said. "We're hoping we can put together a plan to serve us for the next five years. I would like to see that. A sense of steelness would be nice for families."

The 2005 Northville school board election marks the third time Handley runs unopposed. She has served two prior terms.

Pitching a shut-out

School districts adjust to election life on the outside

Northville Public Schools Director of Business and Finance John Street was in charge of all district elections. It was a job he did for 23 years.

Now, his role in the district's May 3 election will take a spectacular decline.

"The preparations we used to do here are now being done by the municipalities," Street said. "I will still call the election."

The change from district-run to municipality-run school elections is a result of the Michigan election-consolidation law, signed by Gov. Jennifer Granholm last year.

The reform states school officials no longer administer their own elections.

Opportunities afforded.

Northville Township Clerk Sue Hillebrand said despite the shift, her department will not shut the school district out from Election Day happenings.

"The schools are our customer and we are dedicated to giving them the best customer service ever," Hillebrand said. "We will work very closely with them."

In the past, school officials had the opportunity to monitor how voter turnout was shaping up throughout the day at particular precincts, a convenience attached to administering an election.

Hillebrand and Street said that type of opportunity will still be available.

But district officials will have to call for updates instead, Street said.

More work

While Street's schedule has opened up on May 3 municipal

clerk's schedules became a lot busier.

"This is our first time, so we are not used to having a May election so there is an increase in work," said Northville City Clerk Dianne Massa.

Massa said her department is administering the election for city residents.

Establishing polling locations, organizing workers and offering absentee ballots are duties the city clerk's office is heading.

"It is a lot of work for us," Hillebrand said.

The township clerk said she will assess how much work, after the polls close.

Northville Township historically did not have odd-year elections

I've got it

Hillebrand said with the addition of an odd-year election comes additional costs.

"Under the new law, if the schools piggy-back on another election then it would basically be free," she said. If the school district doesn't, she said, it is charged.

Street said the school district will receive six bills for the May 3 election coming from Novi, Northville Township, City of Northville, Salem and Lyon Township.

"It will probably be more expensive, but at least from the district's point of view, since Schoolcraft Community College is a part of this election, they will bear half of the costs too," Street said.

Both Hillebrand and Massa declined comment on how much the district's bill will be.

Hillebrand said her department is very sensitive to election costs on behalf of the school district and is cutting all possible corners and watching all costs.

Eye on the pie

State Rep. John Stewart (R-Plymouth) said he is keeping a close eye on the May 3 election costs in his district.

Stewart said in the Plymouth-Canton Community School District, the school election may cost four times as much.

"If it truly isn't a cost savings... I'm going to head for the hills," Stewart said.

The representative said he signed the election consolidation bill because he didn't want to appear like he was against consolidating elections, but now wonders if it may have been an overreaction.

"If it truly ends up costing a lot more, than there will need to be some amendments to the election consolidation law," he said.

House Bill 4471, introduced by Stewart in March, already asks election control be given back to local school districts.

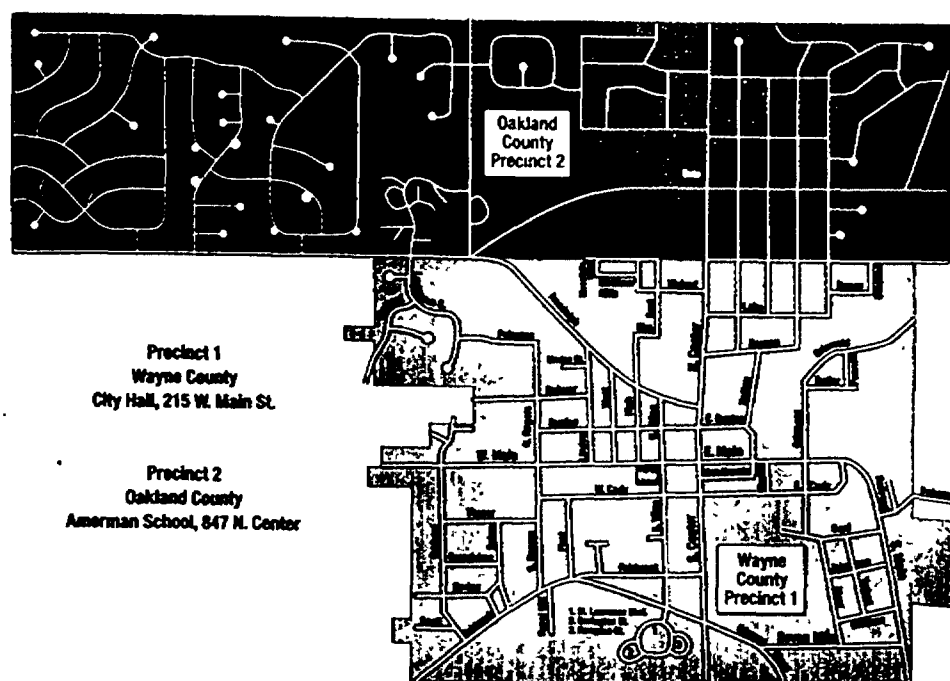

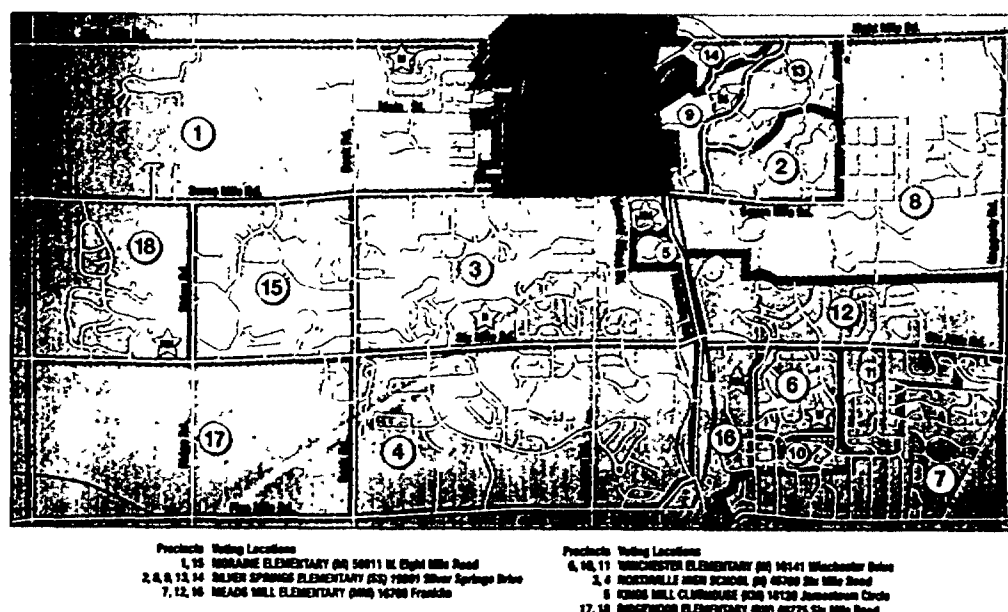

Waiting in the weeds

Do write-in candidates pose a quiet election threat?

Two years ago about 30 miles from downtown Northville a school board hopeful decided to run in his local election — five days before polls opened.

Long after community debates and candidate profiles, Pleasant Ridge resident Tim Wedge filed the appropriate paperwork to run as a write-in candidate.

Lawn signs urging residents to "Vote Wedge" sprang up everywhere four days before the election.

The result: Wedge was one of three candidates elected to the Ferndale Public Schools Board of Education, beating out three other candidates, including one incumbent.

But is the notion of waging a last-minute, write-in election campaign purposeful planning or political fodder?

Political analyst Bill Ballenger said the idea while possible, is frankly a little kooky.

"I can't think of a situation where someone would want to do that," Ballenger said. "That sounds a little nutty."

Ballenger said winning as a write-in candidate is extremely difficult under any circumstances, especially in a school board election.

"School elections are very famous for anyone turning out in the first place," Ballenger said. "It would be a difficult thing to do."

Northville Public Schools Director of Business and Finance John Street said in the past 23 years there has been several write-in candidates for school

elections, but none collecting a significant number of votes.

Street said no write-in candidate has ever won a school board election.

"Personally, I am opposed to write-in candidates," said Sue Hillebrand, Northville Township clerk. "I feel they should follow the same process of other candidates."

Hillebrand said from a clerk's perspective, the process can prove challenging.

Northville residents interested in running as a write-in candidate for the May 3 Northville Public Schools board election have until 4 p.m. Friday, April 29 to file the appropriate paperwork.

Only the names of residents filing by deadline are counted when written on an election ballot.

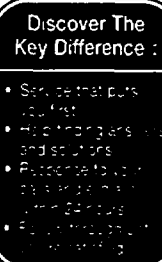

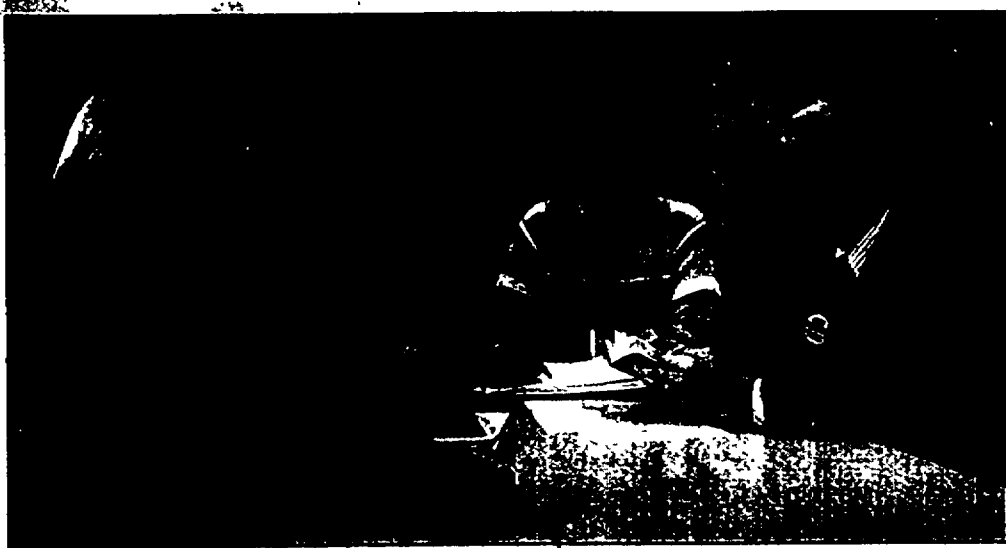

Is Northville going 'Blue'?

Democrats form local club, cite growing ranks

Carol Poenisch's blood has run blue since birth.

At the peak of the Viet Nam War, the daughter of Democrats took to the Ann Arbor trenches.

"I helped dig a bomb crater," Poenisch said. "We spent a day just digging this big hole in the ground to show what we were doing to Viet Nam."

Today, along with other residents, she has a new goal: organizing Northville's Democrats.

Launched in February, the Northville Democratic Club meets monthly and last week co-sponsored its first speaker.

There's about a dozen members so far said Poenisch, who believes more exist in a rapidly growing community.

"Being a Democrat in Northville is kind of lonely sometimes," she said. "I just want issues raised and discussed."

Getting motivated

Democrats aren't new to Northville, club members said.

Poenisch recalls sporadic efforts since she moved to the township 12 years ago.

"It's been kind of around on and off," she said. "I think after the Kerry campaign, there was just a lot of volunteers in Northville. That kind of got people motivated."

Don Jones said that's how he got involved.

The group's treasurer, Jones knocked on hundreds of Northville doors last November as a "MoveON" precinct leader. He said he found 160 supporters.

"Currently, Democrats are intimidated," he said. "They think that they're the only Democrat in the neighborhood. It's just not true."

In Northville Township, 30 percent of nearly 15,000 voters cast Democratic ballots, according to township voting records.

That's up roughly 10 percent in 10 years, Township Clerk Sue Hillebrand said.

"Historically, Northville's been a very heavy Republican community," she said. "We're growing like crazy out here."

Jones, who moved to Northville five years ago, calls himself a Democrat out of necessity.

His issues range from war to environmental concerns.

Similar concerns prompted for-

mer city of Northville councilman Chuck Keys to join.

The insurance agent said he voted for Republican Ronald Reagan in the 1980s, but has otherwise cast ballots the other way.

"I don't like to see... the entire federal government controlled by one party," said Keys, who served two council terms the 1990s. "I don't think that's healthy."

Plans to grow

Striking balance and offering information is a big part of the club's goal, Poenisch said.

Guest lectures are one means — and not always partisan, she said.

Last week, a research expert spoke on pitfalls of privatizing Social Security, an issue that has support on both sides, she said.

Naturally, the club also rallies to its political party.

Jones said that during last November's campaign, groups gathered for "debate parties."

"Like a Super Bowl party," he laughed. "We're all cheering for the same side."

After last week's event, he said, two signed up for the club.

Poenisch said that today, the pit she dug in the 1960s is a pond.

She and others hope the club's efforts will also one day yield a positive result for their party.

"That in itself is very motivating, to try get Democrats elected," she said. "I think the No. 2 tries harder."

Democrats: What are they talking about?

The Northville Democratic Club was sure they had a mole.

After a John Kerry event, president Carol Poenisch called to follow up with Scott Craig, who'd signed up.

When his Anne Scott answered the phone, she could have laughed at the thought of her husband being a Democrat.

"I'm like, no," she said. "My husband said, 'If John Kerry wins, we'll have to move to Canada.'"

After sleuthing, the club unveiled the mystery: Scott Craig is a Republican. And a Democrat.

That's because Northville has two Scott Craigs. Growing up near Flint, Craig the Democrat was son of a United Auto Workers president.

"My family goes way back," said the Democratic Craig, 51. "We just talked about politics all the time at my house. I did door to door work when I was 12, 13 years old."

Campaign literature bore names of Congressional Democratic contenders. The social studies teacher helped organized anti-nuclear and pro-environment protests, too.

Also born to a union father, the Republican Craig, 39, said he's voted the GOP ticket for 15 years.

Social Security talk

—Dr. Dean Baker said he's been researching the U.S. Social Security system for 13 years and last week stopped by Northville Township to share his opinion about President George W. Bush's plan to fund the program using optional private accounts.

In an event sponsored in part by the Northville Democratic Club, Baker argued against placing social security into bond and stock market funds.

Baker is co-director of a nonpartisan think tank Center of Economic and Policy Research in Washington, D.C. He told a room of 85 people, retirees will still see higher wages than today, and the system could remain unchanged until 2052.

Bush said private accounts would offer higher interest return rates. Baker argued private accounts are risky because of stock market fluctuation and higher administrative costs from financial institutions.

"There's no pot of gold here," he said. "All we're doing is replacing guaranteed benefit with risk."

"I've been a supporter," he said. "I haven't gone out and rallied. I'm fairly conservative in my views and in my nature."

Calling himself an "active observer," the automotive engineer said the party fits with his Biblical ideals and upbringing.

Both men chuckle over the case of mistaken identity. "I had to explain myself," said the Republican Craig, when his wife questioned him. "I feel like there was a game show."

"I am Scott Craig." "No, I'm Scott Craig."

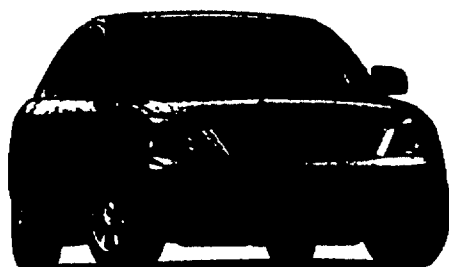

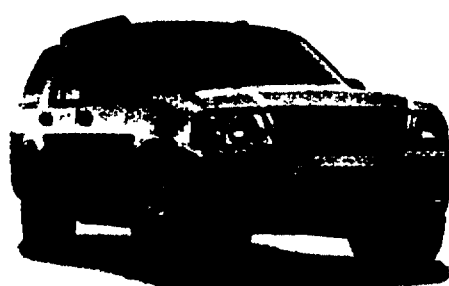

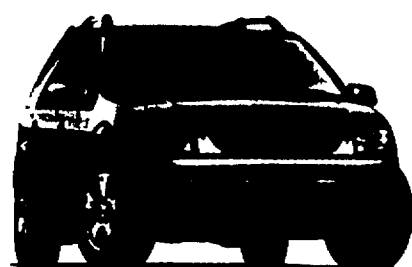

It's not just for boys

Northville juniors Erin Keranen and Meredith Ponder didn't expect glory or recognition or even their names to be in the newspaper when they decided to start a girls lacrosse team.

They just wanted something to do.

They've got it. The two Mustangs, who are captains on the first-year squad, have kept themselves busy since first sitting down with their parents and discussing the idea. They've recruited players, interviewed coaches and even helped come up with the uniform for the girls to wear.

"It was a lot of fun," said Ponder. "It was a lot of work but it was worth it. We're having a lot of fun right now."

First-year surprises

There was no doubt in Ponder and Keranen's minds they were going to have a rough season this year. They were assembling a first-year program and planning on trying to learn the game along with 32 other girls. Wins weren't going to be easy.

"We just wanted to play," said Keranen. "For us, just being able to start a program was exciting. If we won then that would be great too. All of us were just happy to play lacrosse."

The squad, led by coach Aurora Zinck, won their first game of the season before dropping the next two. The Mustangs then stuck it to Waterford in their latest contest, 12-9.

"The softball team lost only four seniors and it was clear there were going to be a lot of us with nothing to do," said Ponder, a former softball player along with Keranen. "We thought this would give everyone a chance to be a part of something without having had played it since they were young."

Equal opportunity

While girls soccer and golf

requires most players in Northville to have previous experience, lacrosse did not. The sport provided an opportunity for everyone to start spring off on equal footing, even those just starting out.

"I think it was a great idea," said Keranen's father, Ted, who is the president of the Northville lacrosse boosters. "These girls wanted something to do and this was a great sport for them to do it with."

The team drew plenty of attention early. Over 95 students showed up for the inaugural meeting, which was narrowed down by spring. The team eventually narrowed to 34.

"No one was cut," Keranen said. "We were looking for 30 or 35 people. It worked out perfectly."

Ponder said plenty of experienced and inexperienced athletes showed interest. It was nothing new to her, though. She was one of the girls who helped kick off Northville's girls hockey program three years ago.

"It's great that everyone was able to start off as equals," she said. "We're all trying to learn the game right now and we're doing a pretty good job of that. I think."

Non-typical lacrosse

Girls lacrosse isn't the same as boys lacrosse. Face-offs are different, no rough contact is allowed and instead of helmets, pads and shorts the girls wear face shields, mouth guards and skirts.

"We wanted to go with a traditional look," Keranen said. "That's why we went with the skirts."

Beyond functional for easy movement, the skirts had another appeal for Keranen and Ponder, who worked with their parents in coming up with the final look for the team.

"We look cute in them," Ponder said. "We could have gone with shorts, but that wouldn't have made us much different than the softball or the soccer teams. We figured we might as well go all out."

Sticks are different also. Boys lacrosse allows for a deep net for easier control of the ball while

moving while the girls have a much shallower net.

The girls are still learning about their adopted sport. But they are coming together nicely.

"I think we've become really close as a team," Ponder said. "We're still learning but we're having a lot of fun. I think that has really helped so far this season."

Off and running

"We probably only had five seniors at the first meeting," Ponder said. "They decided not to come out for the team. That means next year we'll return a bunch of experienced players."

And experience is the name of the game right now. Not one players stays on the sideline for the entire game under Zinck's coaching strategy.

It keeps fresh feet on the field and keeps the girls learning, she said.

"It's not good for the girls to

just stand there," said Zinck, who is a native of Nikiski, Alaska and played sports for the Nikiski High School Bulldogs before coming to Michigan. She learned girls lacrosse at Oakland University.

MHSAA continues with gender lawsuit

The fight for equality continues as the Michigan High School Athletic Association takes its appeal to the highest court in the land — the United States Supreme Court.

At stake: a revised high school sports schedule allowing girls volleyball to be played in the fall and girls basketball to be moved to the winter. Also moving to the fall will be girls golf and boys tennis. Boys golf will move to the spring season as will girls tennis.

The MHSAA, the governing body for almost all high school sports in Michigan, has been notified that tomorrow the Supreme Court will conduct a conference regarding the request to consider an appeal of the lower court rulings in

the sports seasons litigation.

It's a fight some believe should end. Others disagree.

"Personally, I think it's a noble fight," said Northville athletics director Bryan Masi. "Though a lot of the schools have prepared for either decision, they haven't given in."

There are other reasons the fight continues. Novi athletic director Curt Ellis said if the MHSAA were to lose their litigation, they'd be responsible for the plaintiff's court costs.

"The MHSAA does have insurance to cover these costs, but you can bet their insurance company isn't expecting them to roll over and hand out their money," Ellis said. "There are outside factors (driving the appeals)."

Despite several steps to stop the seasons from changing, the MHSAA has found itself mostly on the losing side of the legal battle.

But if the Supreme Court decides to hear the case, it could mean another year-long delay.

"If they do decide to hear the case it is my understanding the MHSAA will ask for a stay, or an extension, until the case is heard," said Ellis. "While I may not be a lawyer, I think if they decide to hear the case the stay would be automatic."

Mostly, everything will stay the same. Why is that bad? This state just happens to be the final holdout in getting the volleyball season in the fall and the girls hoops to the winter. That means those sports don't line-up with their college counterparts.

A delay will likely slow down the inevitable, not prevent it. Schools are prepared for either decision from the Supreme Court. If the Supreme Court decides not to hear the case, then the seasons will immediately be expected to change.

"The conference has built schedules for both situations," said Masi of the Western Lakes Activities Association. "The conference is in good shape. Most schools, I would think, should be ready by now."

The MHSAA is rolling the dice

with the Supreme Court appeal, but they're hoping.

The appeals court in Cincinnati, which upheld a decision by a district court requiring the season changes, allowed the plaintiffs to argue both constitutional law and federal statute.

"Apparently there are appellate courts that make you predetermine which one you'll argue," said Ellis. "The MHSAA is hoping the Supreme Court will not only hear their case, but use it as a way to get continuity or consistency in the court of appeals."

Beyond who plays in what sport in the winter, the MHSAA appeal could have a broader meaning to the United States appeals process.

But who would notice anyway? Everyone would finally be able to watch their sports when they want to the most, right?

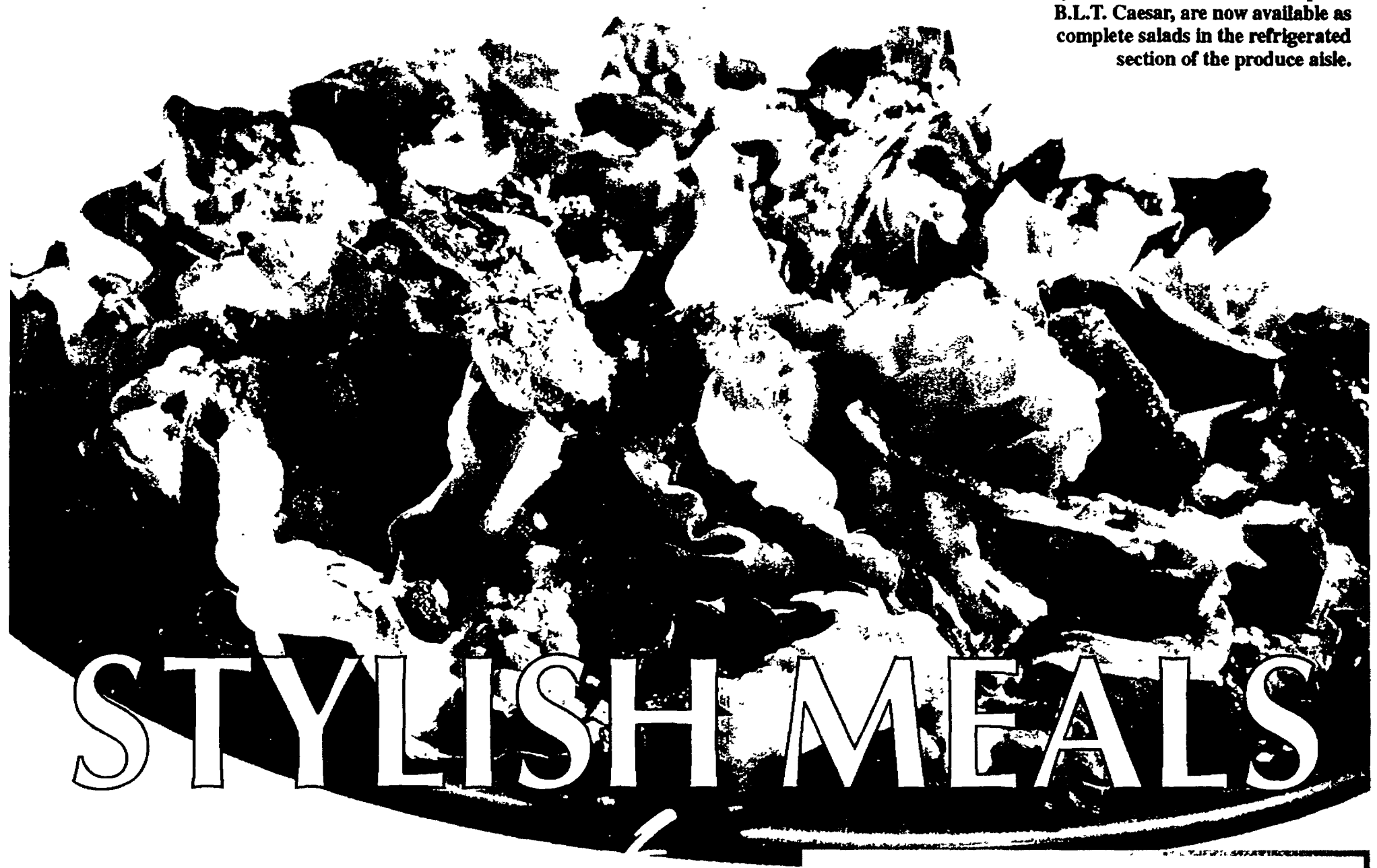

Moonlighting — working two jobs to make ends meet — is more than a time-honored American tradition; it's a necessity for a substantial share of the nation's workforce. According to the most recent employment-situation summary released by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, 7.2 million Americans hold more than one job.

The federal government doesn't collect statistics on how many of the nation's 25 million small-business owners are forced to juggle the equivalent of two jobs most of the time. They don't do it to earn extra income, but to protect what they've already gained against a never-ending list of government regulations, tax schemes and ill-conceived, but politically popular programs that gnaw incessantly at their cash registers and bank accounts.

And while these late-night-oil-burning entrepreneurs are certainly not eager to add anything else to their time-crunched schedules, President Bush's State of the Union message was a clear call for them to put in some extra hours. Only this notice from the nation's chief executive was a plea for help to roll back some of those anti-free-enterprise initiatives that have gobbled up far too much of the American business sector's precious time and financial resources.

Fitting a third job into their already long days won't be easy, but by becoming grassroots political activists at every opportunity between now and Election Day 2006, small-business owners can have a major, favorable impact on their struggling enterprises.

The president has made it very clear that he understands the important role of entrepreneurs in the nation's economy. Announcing his Fiscal Year 2006 budget, he specifically pledged to boost small-business owners and their employees, calling on Congress to make health care more affordable and accessible to Americans through the enactment of Small-Business Health Plans (also known as Association Health Plans or AHPs).

These plans are a key priority for the National Federation of Independent Business (NFIB). Passage of legislation such as the Small Business Health Fairness Act would make health insurance more affordable for small-business owners by allowing them to band together across state lines through bona-fide trade associations to buy insurance at lower premium costs for themselves and their employees. Main Street supporters U.S. Reps. John Boehner of Ohio, Sam Johnson of Texas, Nydia Velazquez of New York and Albert Wynn of Maryland, recently introduced the Small Business Health Fairness Act in the U.S. House. U.S. Sens. Olympia Snowe of Maine, Jim Talent of Missouri and Christopher "Kit" Bond of Missouri have introduced companion legislation in the Senate.

The cost of health insurance has been ranked the No. 1 problem for small-business owners since 1986, according to the NFIB Research Foundation's "Small Business Problems and Priorities," which reports on the most pressing issues facing small business. While very important, it is just one of the issues that need attention.

The president also promised to focus Congress' attention on the pressing need to make permanent the tax cuts that were passed in 2001 and 2003, to repeal the "death tax," and to reverse the upward trend in frivolous lawsuits.

By moonlighting as letter writers, e-mail messengers and visitors to their elected officials' offices to help them promote these crucial small-business agenda items, America's overworked, excessively taxed and red-tape tangled entrepreneurs could, in the long term, reduce the moonlighting they're now required to do to hold the government at bay.




Don't Exaggerate.

Include the Price.
Price is one of the biggest concerns of classified shoppers. Ads that list prices will get their attention first. Including price also helps you avoid inquiries from callers not in your price range.

ILLINOIS—One of Abraham Lincoln's handwritten copies of the Gettysburg Address is among treasures at the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum in Springfield. The library opened in October, and the museum's opening this month coincides with the 140th anniversary of Lincoln's assassination.

INDIANA—Motorists pulled over in Bluffton (pop. 9,536) may pick up some grooming tips from the Bluffton Police Department, which last year won honors as the best-dressed law enforcement department with fewer than 200 officers. A national uniform manufacturing association presents the annual awards.

IOWA—The carriage house in Cedar Rapids where artist Grant Wood painted *American Gothic* in 1930 and other famous works is restored as the Grant Wood Studio and Visitor Center.

KANSAS—Pheasant hunters from around the nation flock to Norton (pop. 3,012), the "Pheasant Capital of Kansas." The area also is known for Prairie Dog State Park, home to a thriving population of prairie dogs.

MICHIGAN—In 1959, Berry Gordy Jr. borrowed \$800 from his family and opened a recording studio he called "Hitsville USA" in a Detroit house. The house today is the Motown Historical Museum, a shrine to the "Motown sound" and artists such as Stevie Wonder and Diana Ross and the Supremes.

MINNESOTA—Working for the 3M Co., Richard Drew invented masking tape in 1925 and cellophane adhesive tape in 1930. These tapes got their "Scotch" brand name when an auto painter told Drew his "Scotch" (frugal) bosses needed to add more adhesive.

MISSOURI—Illustrator, author and creator of the Kewpie doll, Rose O'Neill spent much of her time at her family's home, a 14-room mansion called Bonniebrook, near Branson (pop. 6,050). She claimed that the idea for the plump cupids with turnip-shaped heads came to her in a dream in 1909.

NEBRASKA—In 1992, Columbus (pop. 20,971) celebrated the 500th anniversary of Columbus' voyage to the New World with the dedication of the Quincentenary Bell Tower in Pawnee Park.

NORTH DAKOTA—The nation's largest beet sugar producer, American Crystal Sugar Co., operates processing plants at Drayton (pop. 913) and Hillsboro (pop. 1,563) and at sites in Minnesota and Montana. Sugar beets are grown on about 500,000 acres in the Red River Valley.

OHIO—Here's an event to stick on your calendar: the Avon Heritage Duct Tape Festival June 17-19 showcases fashions, floats and more made from Duck brand duct tape. Avon (pop. 11,446) is the self-proclaimed "Duct Tape Capital" and headquarters for Henkel Consumer Adhesives, marketer of Duck tape.

SOUTH DAKOTA—At the Little Wound School in Kyle (pop. 970), Cecilia Fire Thunder was sworn in last December as the first female president of the Oglala Sioux Tribe on the Pine Ridge Agency.

WISCONSIN—Leinenkugel's beer has been brewed in Chippewa Falls (pop. 12,925) since 1867. In addition to its year-round offerings, the company produces seasonal products—Berry Weiss, Oktoberfest and Big Butt Doppelbock. ☆

Lawn & Garden Tune-up Tips

Warmer weather brings fun—and work. In order to get the most use out of your outdoor gear, follow these easy steps to keep your lawn mower and garden tools working at peak performance.

Lawn mower—To tune up a 4-cycle lawn mower, start the engine to warm up the oil and then turn it off. Pull the wire off the spark plug to prevent it from starting accidentally. Use an adjustable wrench to remove the oil plug on the mower's underside and drain the oil into a funnel and plastic gallon container or use a disposable drip pan. Replace the drain plug when you're finished.

Next, turn the mower on its side, scrape off dried dirt or matted grass, and remove the blade by loosening the bolt that holds it to the crankshaft. Clamp the blade in a vise and sharpen the cutting edges with a metal file. Re-install the blade, turn the mower right side up, and fill the engine's crankcase with fresh oil.

Finally, remove the spark plug with an adjustable wrench and buy a replacement. Carefully screw the new plug into the cylinder head by hand, then tighten it with a wrench. Clean or replace the air filter, fill the gas tank with fresh fuel, and it's ready to roll.

Garden tools—Give all your garden tools a once-over inspection and remove any dirt and mud. Use a wire brush to remove any rust from metal parts and coat with a lubricant such as WD-40. Tighten or replace any loose screws, nuts or bolts.

Handheld pruning tools need oiling and sharpening. Apply lubricant to the pivot point of the tool and sharpen the blades with a fine metal file. Sharpen the edge of shovels the same way. Wooden tool handles can be reconditioned by going over them with fine sandpaper and then rubbing them down with a wipe-on oil finish.

Remember, taking the time to make sure your gear is in good shape can make your outdoor work easier and extend the life of your equipment. ☆

"Would you like to dance?" Schnur asks Antonia "Sis" Hayes.

Her smile says it all as the 95-year-old woman takes Schnur's hand. Hayes attended her own first prom as a sophomore at Washington High School 79 years ago.

"The jitterbug was just coming in," she recalls.

Come April, teenagers aren't the only ones who catch prom fever in Washington, Mo. (pop. 13,243). So do senior citizens, and together, they dance the night away.

At Senior Citizens Prom 2004, the elders arrived at Washington High School, and students whisked them in a fleet of golf-cart "limos" to the gymnasium door and a night that dazzles. Inside, 60 feet of festive food is arrayed on tables lining both sides of the hallway. The gym shimmers with silver star-shaped balloons, blue ribbons and an archway flanked with columns wrapped with white lights.

Three best friends, all widows, arrive at 5:30 p.m., an hour before the gala starts, to stake out a prime table near the dance floor. They plant their purses on the table behind them to reserve seats for seven other

widows and watch as Sonny Lefholz, 80, and members of his jazz band set up their equipment.

"I danced to his band 50 years ago when he was Sonny and the Moonlight Serenaders," says Eleanor Hellebusch, 71, nodding toward the bandleader.

Hellebusch, Millie Chisholm, 77, and Jean Kluesner, 72, are dolled up in fancy dresses. Kluesner is freshly permed. Chisholm wears pearls. The women can't wait to fill all 20 spots on the dance cards in front of them.

"This gets all of us out here," Chisholm says of the annual event organized by student council members and funded through community donations.

Nothing is spared for the glitzy evening, which includes prom mementos of an engraved light-up pen for each guest. Students keep cameras flashing all evening. Later, the photos will be pasted in scrapbooks

alongside dozens of thank-you notes and on the bulletin board in the classroom of teacher Karen Dawson, student council adviser, who can't contain her pride for her students.

"I believe in this project with all my heart," Dawson says. "When we started I had no idea of the feel-good ramifications. When you leave at night you feel like you're walking on air."

"I love it," says senior Amber Boland, who co-chairs the dance with fellow student Mallory Stowe. Boland wrestles with last-minute decorations—a 3-foot bolt of gossamer—in her glittery backless black gown. "The first year I went home and couldn't stop talking about it."

Prom preparations

Students kick off preparations in December, organizing committees to work on decorations, designing and distributing fliers to nursing homes, doctors' offices and businesses, and planning the menu. Everyone age 50 or older is invited.

The big night keeps getting bigger. Seventy attended the first prom in 2002 and 325 in 2004. Seniors come from nursing homes, assisted-living centers and the neighboring towns of Union (pop. 7,757) and New Haven (1,867) by bus, retirement-center vans and their own vehicles. Some dancers use walkers, canes or wheelchairs.

The gala costs about \$4,500, most of which is donated by local businesses and organizations. Teachers contribute desserts, and home-economics students whip up raspberry-peach trifle and other goodies. Joy Chartrou, food-service coordinator, supervises trays of meatballs and

ravioli, and students help prepare fruit and cheese trays. The all-out effort won a first-place national award for community-service projects in 2003 from the National Association of Student Councils.

The high school jazz band warms up the crowd, then Lefholz and his band kick off the dance and play the song *Sentimental Journey*. The dance floor fills slowly at first, but soon it's an all-out jam-packed party as students and seniors sway to the tunes of yesteryear.

Some students have taken a crash course in the Big Band tunes and jitterbug and fox trot steps from their grandparents. Others, such as Josh Wehmeyer, 18, wing it with a smile and flair.

"I'm having a blast," he says. "I don't know what you call it, but it's one step forward and two steps back . . . I signed one dance card and six women started waving their cards."

Lydia Gerhart, 16, freckle-faced with long blonde hair and wearing a cream-colored gown, awkwardly waltzes with Al Leary, 72.

"I didn't step on her toes once," he teases.

Throughout the evening, the elders reminisce about their own high school years and proms. Gowns were equally showy in their day, the older women say, though they were more modest. Genevieve Kell, 88, still owns and treasures her formal.

"It was black lace and ruffled from the waist down with a red taffeta cape," she says dreamily. "And I wore red shoes." She remembers paying \$7 for the gown from the Three Sisters Dress Shop in Waterloo, Iowa.

Golden memories

At another table, Louise and Don Brune, who now live in Collinsville, Ill. (pop. 24,707), share what may be the evening's best prom story. As juniors at Washington High School in 1952, they attended prom together on their first and only date.

"Did I say two words to you that night?" Don asks.

Louise agrees conversation was skimpy. "We were so self-conscious."

They may have been too shy to talk, but they sure made an impression on each other. Louise remembers that he drove a blue 1949 Plymouth. Don remembers that she wore a burgundy gown.

Both went their separate ways after graduation, married other people and

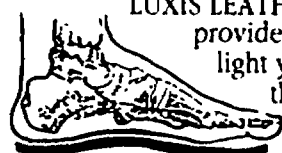

"We're having a much better time at this prom," Don says with a laugh. Louise, her eyes shining, agrees that this prom couldn't be sweeter.

A highlight of the evening was the crowning of the Senior Citizens Prom Queen and King from names picked at random.

It's a sparkling memory revisited for Cynthia Kell Esterly, 66, who was crowned prom queen at Washington High School in 1956. And for Delwin Juedeman, 80, of nearby Berger, Mo. (pop. 206), it's "a first time around for me," he declares.

The band plays *It Had to Be You* during their honorary dance while a cluster of teenage photographers captures the moment.

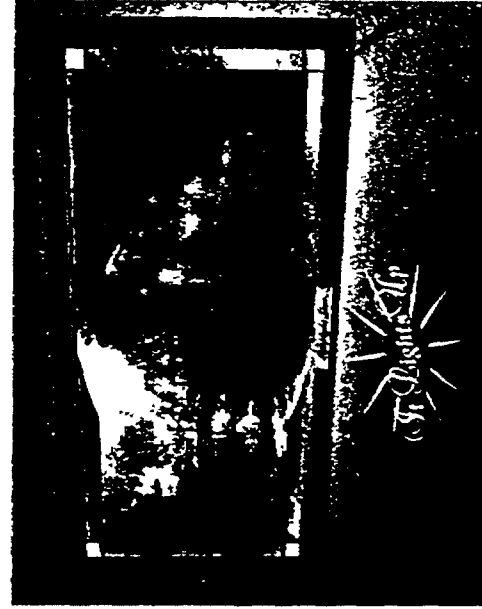

Hometown Spotlight

Race City USA

Perhaps no other town in America can boast more residents who drive 200 mph, or can change four tires in less than 15 seconds, than Mooresville, N.C., known as Race City USA.

The town of 18,823 comes by the moniker honestly, considering that it's home to the North Carolina Auto Racing Hall of Fame, racecar training schools, 60 motorsports teams and scores of NASCAR drivers.

"I moved my shop to Mooresville in 1992, the same year we won the Busch Series Championship," racecar driver Joe Nemechek says. "Mooresville was centrally located to a lot of the tracks at the time, and this area soon became the hub for NASCAR."

In the early 1990s, the Mooresville Chamber of Commerce even

trademarked the name Race City USA. "Residents like being branded with the distinction because it implies skilled employees," chamber official Melanie O'Connell Underwood says.

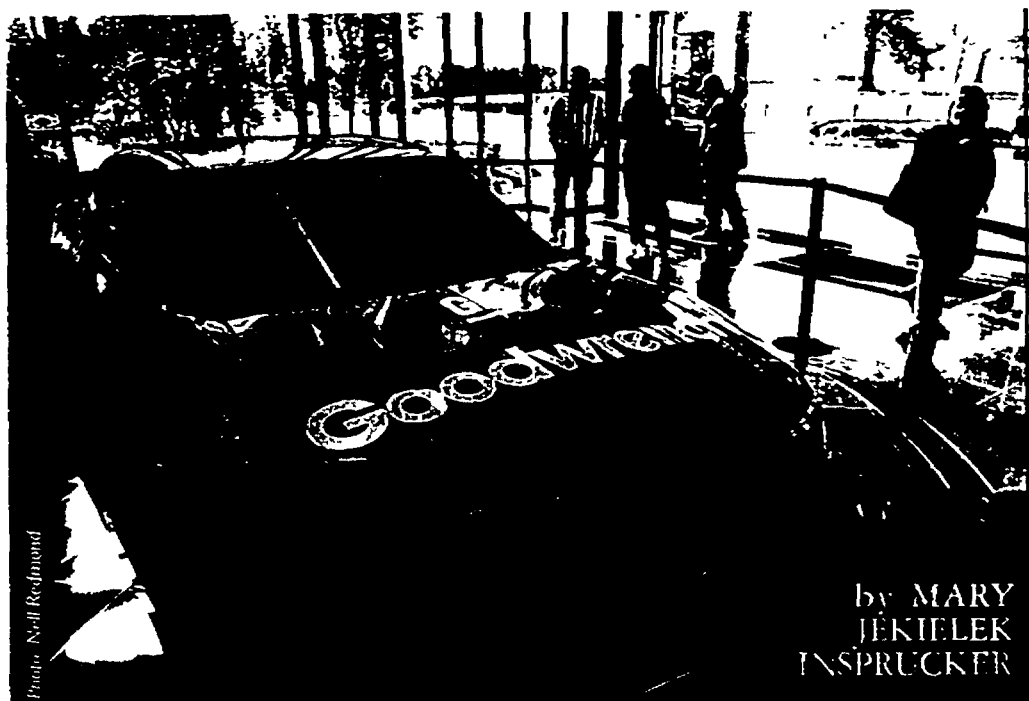
Dan Wallace, the chamber's executive director, believes the racing industry began around Mooresville in 1988 when the Bahari Racing team moved to town, followed by Penske Racing South in 1990. Others soon followed, including auto racing-related industries such as museums, suppliers and schools.

"Mooresville courted the racing industry when there was a decline in the textile mills, which moved overseas," says Breon Klopp, senior director of development at PIT Instruction and Training, which provides pit crew coaching and consulting services. The company's Mooresville facility includes

a pit road with six pit stalls, where visitors can don fireproof suits and participate in a mock pit experience, including changing tires, a fueling simulation and making car adjustments.

No one knows for certain how many racecar drivers live in Mooresville or the surrounding area, but Dale Earnhardt Jr., Jeremy Mayfield, Nemechek, and Ryan Newman all call it home. Townspeople bonded together in their grief when the tragic death of Mooresville resident and NASCAR driver Dale Earnhardt occurred in 2001.

"He was a member of our church and community," Wallace says. "We got the state Legislature to change the name of State Highway 136 to (his racecar number) No. 3 in his memory."

Mayor Al Jones, who served as assistant principal during Earnhardt Jr.'s years at Mooresville High School, says, "We've had some families come for a visit and like the area so much they went back, sold their home, and moved here."

That's exactly what happened to NASCAR fan and Mooresville Chamber Special Projects Coordinator Sylvia Spury, who claims among her prized racing collection several life-size cardboard cutouts of racecar drivers.

"We moved here from Massachusetts to be near racing," says Spury, who, along with her husband, Dave, relocated to Mooresville in 2000. "I'm a huge fan who would rather spend my lunch money on race collectibles than on diamonds."

"My dream is to work for Earnhardt," she adds, referring to the racing corporation of Dale Earnhardt Inc.

In fact, Mooresville, located 30 miles north of Charlotte and Lowe's Motor Speedway, is so tied to motorsports that racing-

related businesses employ nearly 8 percent of the town's population.

One such business is NASCAR Technical Institute, the nation's first technical training school to blend automotive and NASCAR specific motorsports technology. Up to 2,000 students a day are trained in the \$12 million, 146,000-square-foot facility, which opened in 2002.

Appropriately, Mooresville also is home to the North Carolina Auto Racing Hall of Fame. Opened in 1994, the museum houses 35 racecars and honors racecar driving legends such as Richard Petty, Ned Jarrett and Junior Johnson.

"The cars themselves seem to be the favorite exhibit of our patrons," museum manager Donna DeNardo says. In addition, the organization holds a Hall of Fame induction ceremony every October.

"Everywhere you go in Mooresville you see the residents and businesses celebrating our sport," Nemechek says. ★

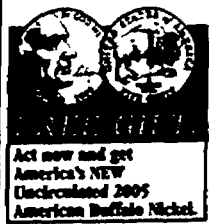

American Profile



As he's done for nearly eight decades, Les Paul entertains audiences with his impressive guitar playing.

Still Here & Still Creating

Les Paul strums the tan and black Gibson electric guitar that bears his name. It's 5:45 p.m., and Paul is doing an extensive sound check before he joins his five-piece band onstage for the first of two shows he performs every Monday night in New York City's Iridium Jazz Club. The audience soon arrives, and first-timers are amazed to see this 89-year-old man playing the intricate guitar parts in standards such as *How High the Moon* almost as fast as he did in his younger days.

"I'm still here, and I'm still creating," says Paul, the legendary guitarist, inventor and recording engineer who designed a line of namesake electric guitars and pioneered techniques like multi-tracking and the echo effect. And even though he now makes his home in Mahwah, N.J. (pop. 24,062), his heart is never far from the small towns in Wisconsin that nurtured his creative growth.

The Grammy winner, who began playing guitar at about age 9, recalls a comment made when he was performing at Beekman's drive-in restaurant in Brookfield, Wis. (pop. 38,649), that set him on his journey of innovation in both the playing and design of the electric guitar. "A fellow came into this barbecue drive-in, and thank God for him," says Paul, who was then known as "Red Hot Red" for the color of his hair. "He was a critic, unintentionally. He wrote a note to the carhop asking to deliver this message to me: 'Hey Red, I can hear your voice and your harmonica playing, but the guitar's not audible.'"

So Paul, then about 12 years old, set out to make sure his guitar would come through loudly and clearly to everyone in his audience.

From the late 1920s onward, Paul constantly experimented to improve the sound. He would plug in radio speakers and then stuff the guitar's body with socks, shorts, and even his mother's tablecloth—"everything to muffle the sound so that it wouldn't feed back," he says—pioneering the modern solid-body electric guitar. He would later find success by filling the body with solid wood, and in 1952, Gibson introduced its first Les Paul electric guitar based on his designs.

By then, Paul also had gained fame playing his guitar on hit songs by Bing Crosby and the Andrews Sisters, and in the 1950s had several Top 10 pop hits with his late wife, singer Mary Ford, including the No. 1s *How High the Moon* and *Vaya Con Dios*. Those hits were important because they unveiled his technique of multi-track recording, or layering music parts on top of each other. Paul has influenced rock guitarists such as Led Zeppelin's Jimmy Page and Aerosmith's Joe Perry, and other famous musicians such as Paul McCartney and Tony Bennett have frequently joined him onstage at his Iridium shows.

Paul's inventions have gone hand in hand with his needs as a performer, and he is still innovating. After he got arthritis, he developed a bigger pick so that he could still play. Dealing with a hearing loss, Paul also is working with doctors from the Cleveland Clinic in Ohio to create a hearing aid to help musicians and others pick up more tones, words and phrases.

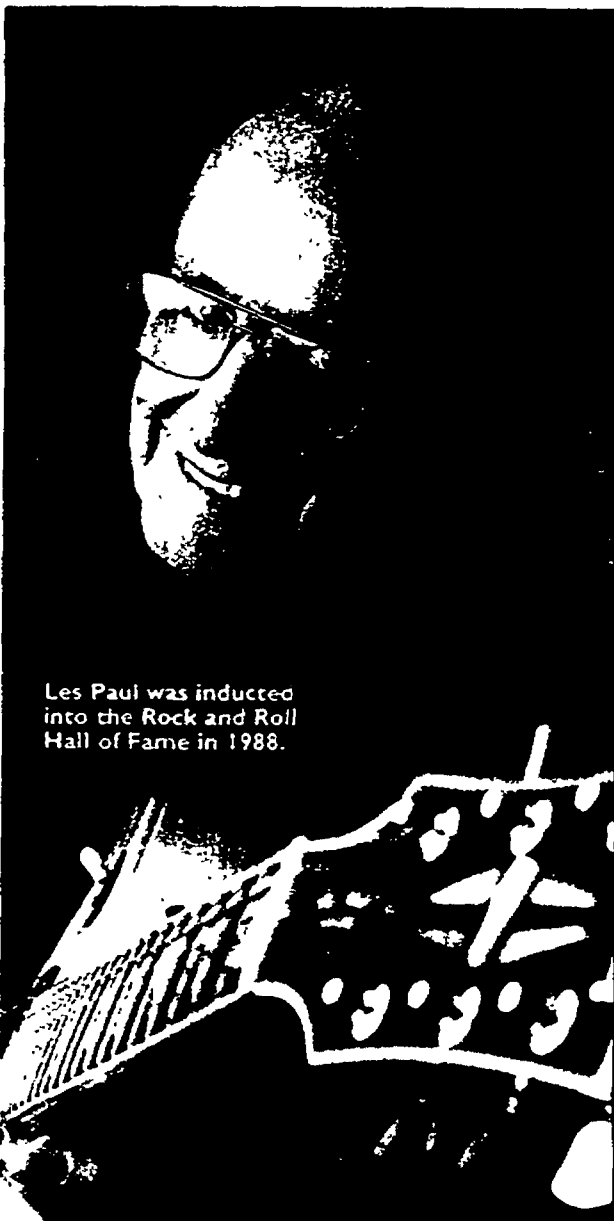

Through it all, Paul has kept in touch with his hometown of Waukesha, Wis. (pop. 64,825), which he last visited in October when the town created Les Paul Day. He says he will never forget so many people who helped him there, including the teachers who let him write history reports on musical instruments and scheduled breaks to let him perform for the class. And Paul, who signs many an autograph, is especially welcoming when Wisconsin fans show up at the Iridium. "If you're from Wisconsin, you're in," says Susan Masino, author of *Famous Wisconsin Musicians*.

Paul insists, however, that audiences everywhere have much in common, and, after a while, even New York City feels like a small town. New Yorkers, he says, are "a little more direct about things, and they get right to the point. But you get used to them, and you find out they're the same people anyway." ☆

Chocolate Zucchini Cake

1/2 cup soft margarine
1/2 cup vegetable oil (or applesauce)
1 and 3/4 cups sugar
2 eggs, beaten
1 teaspoon vanilla
1/2 cup sour milk
2 and 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
4 tablespoons cocoa powder
1/2 teaspoon baking powder
1 teaspoon baking soda
1/2 teaspoon ground cloves

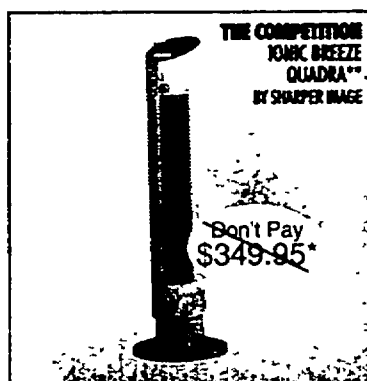

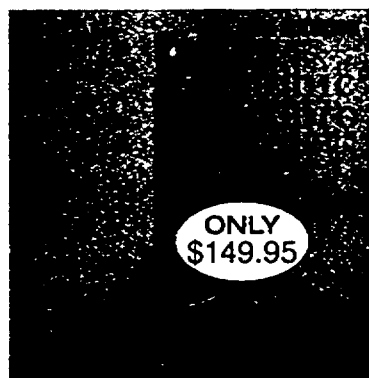
