And thanks to First United Methodist Church's Wednesday night youth group, the 17-year-old knows God's got his back.

Like a growing number of area teens,

He saunters up with the rest of the "God's Guys" choral group at Sunday services to sing acappella praise to the Lord.

Peer approval

Foraker, a congregation member eight years, exemplifies the growing number of local young people seeking a spiritual foundation in their life, said Lisa Cook, associate pastor at United Methodist Church.

In addition to their studies, sports and friend time, kids are slotting spiritual homework. And classmates don't snicker in school.

"All my friends know what I do on Wednesday night," Foraker said. "A few have asked if they can come."

Andrea Moeche, a freshman at University of Michigan, said her Northville Public Schools peers were respectful of her beliefs.

"Most of my friends were just like me," she said. "Two of my closest friends go to my church."

Election forum tonight

■ City council candidates will speak their mind at city hall

From their mouths to your ballot pen.

Tonight, candidates for the two vacant Northville City Council seats will answer questions during a forum hosted by The Northville Record.

Record Forum

■ Tonight at 7 p.m. in city hall chambers.

The 7-9 p.m. event is open to the public and will be held in the city hall council chambers, 215 W. Main St.

The agenda will ask the four council candidates for an opening statement, answers to questions prepared by the Record editorial board, responses to questions written by audience members and a brief closing statement.

Responses to the Record's preliminary questionnaire (See Page 19A) illustrate how the candidates differ on various issues.

Eight-year incumbent Kevin Hartshorne and challengers Jim Allen, Michele Fecht and Larry Parks are running for two four-year terms expiring this November.

The Nov. 8 city ballot will include two council vacancies, the mayor's seat and a Northville Public Schools millage proposal. Eighteen-year incumbent Mayor Christopher Johnson is unopposed in his 10th bid for election.

Councilman Jerry Mittman in August announced he would not seek re-election. Councilman Swigart and Mayor Pro-tem Carolann Ayers were elected through 2007.

Taking a bite out of crime

■ Boosting security, locking your doors can keep criminals out

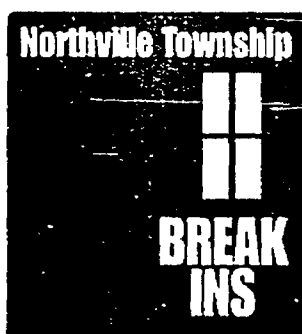
Susan Boll never thought it could happen to her. Then it did.

A trip to Home Depot turned ugly Oct. 2 after the 49-year-old Northville Township woman and her husband, Greg, returned home to find their barn had been broken into.

"We had been cleaning the barn out all day and left for an hour," Boll said. "We didn't lock it because there had been people in and out all day. You never think this could happen to you."

A generator, wood chipper, water pump and weed wacker were just a few items missing from the barn. Boll said she is now installing a security system in both her home and barn.

As the township's 25,856-resident population continues to

swell, community liaison officer Samantha Bowlin, of the Northville Township Police Department, said more break-ins are being reported.

Bowlin, 32, has taken security to a new level as the township's crime prevention officer.

She has spoken to several homeowners associations, neighborhood watches, individual residents and business owners.

Her message: you don't have to be a victim again.

"My job is to see

to it that people are secure in their own homes and businesses," Bowlin said. "This program has taught more citizens to be aware of what's around them and who's around them."

Bowlin conducts free security surveys, including a critical on-site examination and analysis of a home or business.

She also determines the present security status, weaknesses or excesses, protection needs and provides recommendations to help improve overall security.

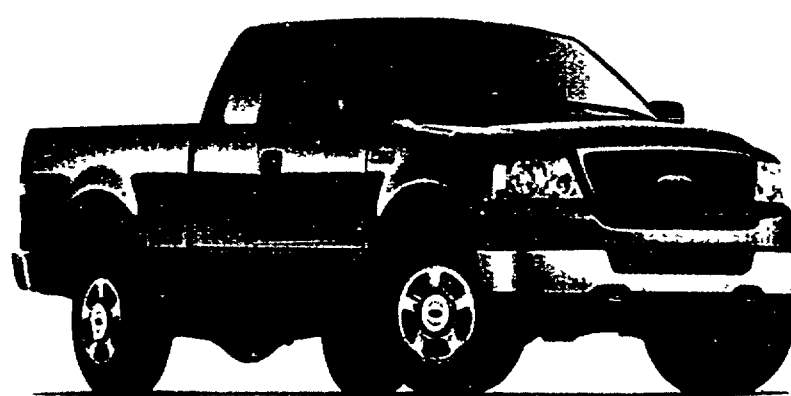

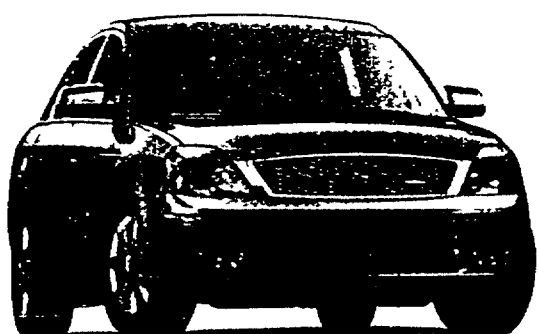

GOD: teens finding faith

Invited by a friend to church as a young child, Moehle said her involvement in her church and faith continued to grow over the years. She said her devotion early on to follow a Christian path helped the many aspects of her life flow seamlessly together.

The round peg

"Today's teens are definitely searching for purpose in life, meaning in life, happiness, joy and contentment," said Joe Snyder, pastor of student ministries for Oak Pointe Church.

His non-denominational weekly youth groups draw nearly 300 teenagers. Another 200 attend United Methodist's Logos (The Word) Wednesday nights.

"Some of them turn to find it in sports, some to good grades, some to popularity. ... There's nothing wrong with all those things, but when it becomes your pursuit, your god, it's like putting a square peg in a round hole," Snyder said.

"In our youth ministry, we're trying to provide the round peg in their life and that's Jesus Christ."

Kids are listening, Snyder said. They are called spiritual seekers. And they're growing in numbers.

The seekers

Snyder knows hymnals and an organ aren't going to cut it with today's kids.

He comes at them instead with some hang out time, a couple of hip

musical sets and then a brief, Bible-based message.

"We're trying to bring timeless truth to a culture that's looking for the truth," Snyder said.

The key to bringing them into the fold takes making faith relevant to their lives, he said.

The three-part series he started this week: "How to live with your family without going insane."

Northville teenagers, like their peers nationally, are pulled in many directions at a fast pace. It's on them to focus within all the distractions.

Ministers at area churches are tuning in to the younger crowd, maintaining the message but revising how it's transmitted.

Taking root

Foraker said his spiritual studies started to take on real meaning for him when he was an eighth grader.

"It all starts with confirmation," he said. "It's like, 'Wow, this is

what it's all about.' It clicks."

"It's almost a maturity thing. Once you're old enough to accept it, it's easier to get in that mindset."

The youth group counselors, all fellow youth group parents like his mom Linda, were instrumental in modeling behavior and providing guidance to live a Christian lifestyle, Foraker said.

Cook said children younger than 13 seldom truly grasp Christian principles as their lifestyle.

"They know how they're supposed to treat each other with the love of Christ," she said. "We don't have super kids, we have regular kids who have a great opportunity."

"If they get that confirmation experience, then they have that stake in the church. Then they get more maturity in the faith."

A way of life

Seldom is arm-twisting by parents necessary to get teenagers involved in church, the ministers said.

Cook said busy teenagers sometimes beg their parents for Sunday mornings to sleep in. For that crowd, the pastor is planning to start a weekend evening service.

Meanwhile, Snyder said Oak Pointe children invite their parents to Sunday services.

"They're coming because little Billy stumbled onto youth group," he said. "They see a change in him and the parents are 'What's going on with this church thing?'"

Moehle said she can't really imagine living a God-less life.

"You can be involved in it and it's part of your life," she said.

Got God? Fast pace demands relevant message

How do spiritual leaders get people to invite God into their busy lives?

Lisa Cook, First United Methodist Church associate pastor, said her own 23-year-old son asks for a five-word-or-less message.

"It's a proven fact that college age kids will fall away from church," Cook said. "It's this church, it is proven across all denominations."

The wayward flock tends to trickle back into the fold when they become parents, she said.

Attentive alternative and mainstream churches are trying to broaden their appeal.

When the prodigals return, spiritual leaders are doing their best to extend their stay by providing child care services and youth programs, and by revising worship formats and service schedules.

Joe Snyder, Oak Pointe Church pastor of student ministries, said they plan outreach events with the specific intent of members inviting friends and family.

"I think today people are more spiritually open than in the past," Snyder said. "It seems as soon as you bring up Jesus it begins to ruffle feathers — you can just see it in their body language, in their eyes, their expression. They don't want to go there."

"Without it, you'd know you'd be missing something, but you wouldn't totally know what you were missing."

"It's not just a book about people 2,000 years ago. It's a book that can relate to everyday life."

"You can talk about being in touch with your spiritual self."

Acceptance comes in part from Hollywood types like Madonna wearing a T-shirt emblazoned "Jesus is my homeboy," Snyder said.

A look out at the congregation tells Cook said the First United Methodist congregation crosses a range of ages. The church in particular is reaching the long-devout and the newly devout, she said.

"You look around churches and you don't see a lot of 30s, 40s and 50s," Cook said. "You can certainly preach from the Bible but be relevant to life."

"It's not just a book about people 2,000 years ago. It's a book that can relate to everyday life."

Maintaining successive generations in the church takes spiritual leaders in touch with their congregation members.

"Take the message out that you can use during the week for spiritual sustenance," Cook said.

"It's a new kind of thinking, not hellfire and brimstone."

"We just don't preach that anymore — that doesn't seem to help anyone anymore."

Hundreds of years ago, church hymn lyrics were set to songs people knew from their beer gardens, Cook said. The churches' current outreach attempts parallel those efforts.

Snyder said, "We're just trying to really be real. I think they're looking for that."

"My life would be completely different and not in a positive way."

Local athletes, coaches gladly put God into starting lineup

Novi boys basketball coach Pat Schluter headed for the door of the locker room just before another rivalry game and paused.

Something was missing.

"It could be a big game and things are really hectic and after the pre-game speech I start for the door and one of the kids will stop me," he said. "They'll say 'Coach, we forgot the pre-game prayer.'"

Prayer, in public school? Where does that fit in?

Prior to a math test or a final exam, it may not be welcome. But in sports — even at the high school level — it's a common place.

Schluter, like many coaches, has never pushed prayer on his players. Many athletes take a moment to pray by themselves, calming their nerves and preparing mentally for the upcoming contest. Others, like the boys basketball team at Novi where the seniors lead the team in their pre-game tradition, pray together and focus on being their best.

A part of life

Father George Chamley of St. James Roman Catholic Church in Novi said for many God is involved in every aspect of life. Athletics included.

"God sits in life and in everything we do," he said. "It's not just athletics, though it should be a part of that."

Chamley enjoys athletics. He's often seen at Novi football and soccer

games, though basketball is his favorite. He's a fan, but he also knows church and sports often can go hand-in-hand.

Sports push athletes to learn the value of teamwork and the benefits of hard work while constantly struggling for self-improvement. Religions — and not just Christian — quite often preach the same.

"God wants us to work hard, be good to one another, help out and be there for those who are in trouble and need us," said Schluter. "That's what he wants us to do in our life as well."

"That's what sports are about, too. You help each other and you work hard and you show good sportsmanship."

Where does religion fit?

Religion has shown itself in many forms of athletics, from touchdowns where a professional player drops to one knee and says silent prayers to a Northville High school football player grabbing a bite to eat because during Ramadan Muslim religious beliefs require waiting until sundown.

Prayer before games is common in athletic arenas, but it doesn't always have to be religious, said Chamley.

"It doesn't have to be a papal announcement," he said. "Everyone is capable of prayer and leading prayer. You don't need a priest to pray because any coach and any kid can pray. It can be very generic and cover every one there."

Religion, or at least the fundamental beliefs that drive it, are

shown in everyday events as athletes engage each other in competition and do it with sportsmanship.

"We try to spread Christ's love to others through our sports and through our sportsmanship," said Lauren Moak, a captain of the Northville High School Fellowship of Christian Athletes and a member of the swimming and diving team.

"We can display Christ through what we do. It's not about preaching, but showing it more through our actions and deeds instead of words. We try to be loving, patient and good."

When is it too much?

There are times that should be a line. He said that if they should be doing that and I plays by professional athletes, they don't believe in doing that."

and crossing themselves after touchdowns and bowers thanking God after wins — aren't needed.

"There's a place for prayer, and it's not because you scored a touchdown," he said. "God didn't let him score that touchdown. God has more important things to worry about than him scoring."

Schluter agreed. He said athletes who react to individual successes with those kinds of displays aren't acting in the role they should be — as a professional or a member of a particular religion.

"I think it's all showboating," he said. "It's kind of ridiculous. The way the NFL guys are doing that, it's not being a good role model."

He said that if they should be doing that and I plays by professional athletes, they don't believe in doing that."

sports? Not every athlete prays before games and not all of them are religious.

But for those who are, prayer and thankfulness are part of the game.

"Before a meet I thank God that I'm able to be there and able to compete," said Moak. "I just ask him for strength and to do my best. I know he'll be there for me."

Players pray for guidance, strength and a multitude of other elements. But what about wins?

"You should never pray to God for victory," said Chamley. "It puts God in quite the predicament if you do. I used to coach at a Catholic school and if the two Catholic school teams both prayed to beat the daylight out of one another, what should he do?"

"That's not what it's all about

and it's hard to tell kids that and get them to understand it and have it make sense."

In the end, does God care who wins or loses?


Schluter said he doesn't think so. He said religion in sports isn't about winning or losing, but about trying to be one's best no matter what the situation is.

It's not about who prays more or who on Sunday, but rather who leaves knowing they should have done more.

"I tell the guys that when we come back into the locker room there should be no regrets," Schluter said. "It's not about winning or losing. It's about the effort we give and making sure no one outworks us. That's our approach."

and enterings in an area, I contact the associations or residents and advise them about what they can do to stay secure," Bowlin said.

Bowlin, who has spent seven years as a police officer including five with Northville Township, said she has seen her fair share of break-ins.

"It happens, but you can help prevent it," she said. "Learning ways to stay secure is important."

Engraving protection

The police department offers residents the opportunity to electronically engrave identification marks on their valuables for free.

"Let's say someone breaks in a home and steals a TV," Bowlin said. "If the owner's driver's license number is on it and we find it, we can immediately identify who that TV belongs to."

Bowlin said the engraver works on everything, including thick

glass.

Det. Sgt. Matthew Mayes said juveniles are responsible for the majority of break-ins in the township.

"There could be less break-ins, but people are still leaving those opportunities open."

"Just because some people may be out in the country doesn't mean anything. We still live in a major metropolitan area," Mayes said.

Bowlin said she reminds residents to always lock their doors and shut their garages.

"People are becoming more aware," she said. "That's the purpose of this program."

"We can help them, but they can also help us by keeping their eyes and ears open."

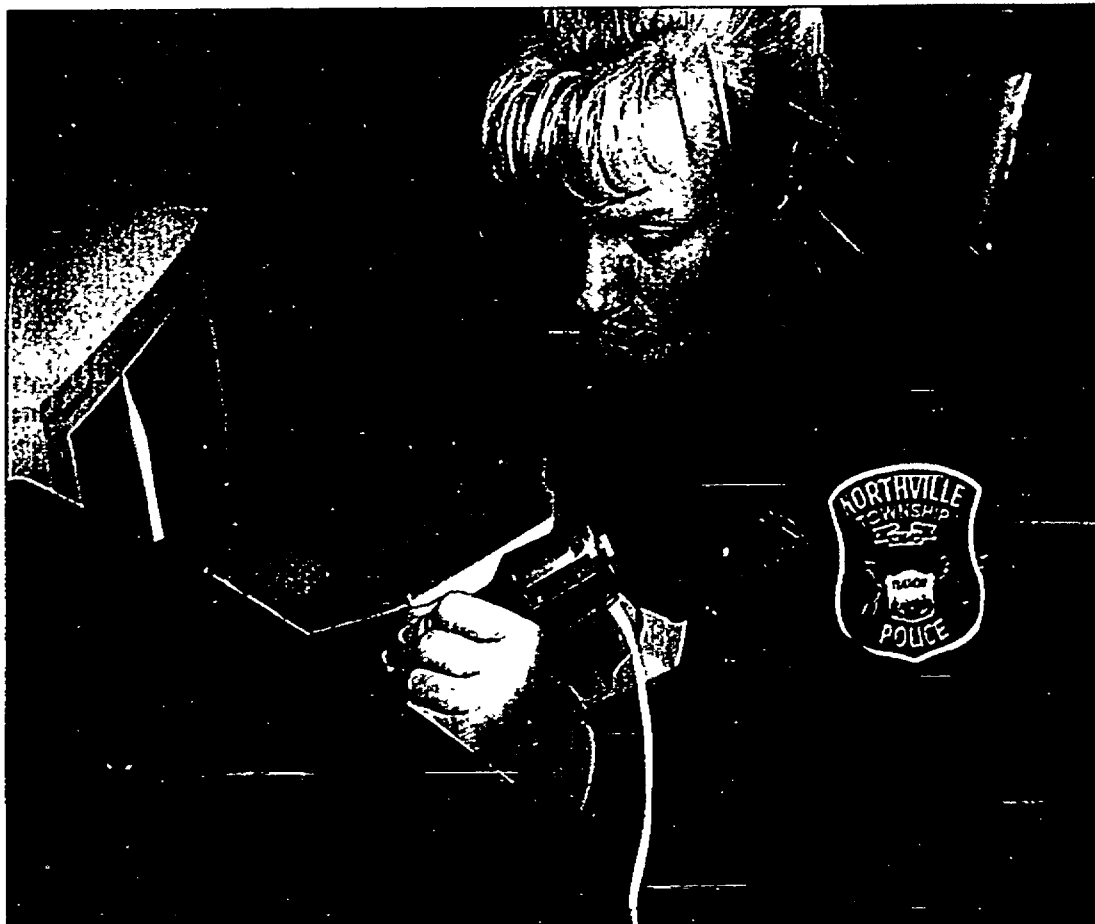

Sold, or not?

State committee investigates sale of former state hospital

Bridget Medina continues to support the state's strive to seal the deal on the former Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital.

The state's plan to close on the sale with Real Estate Interest Group, Inc. for \$31.5 million was halted due to a temporary restraining order still in place.

"The Department of Management and Budget was going to close on the date the state administration board approved the contract, but the restraining order prohibited all work from being done," said Medina, spokeswoman for the state Treasury Department.

"They are working on it now." However, there are still concerns from local developers that the sale was not legal.

"The question at hand is

whether or not the state sold the property according to the public act that was passed in 2002 allowing the sale," said State Rep. Jack Hoogendyk (R-Kalamazoo), chair of the subcommittee leading the investigation of the sale.

Hoogendyk said it was too early to determine if the state broke the law, and he said he wouldn't want to speculate on what it would mean if they did.

Hoogendyk is currently moving forward by interviewing all concerned parties.

"The sale is also moving forward however," he said. "And so far, there is nothing stopping it."

Medina said she did not know when another hearing would be held.

"You could conjecture that if the law was not followed, a possible outcome could be the current sale could be voided," Hoogendyk said. "We just have to take it one step at a time."

Northville Public Schools seek Nov. 8 tax increase

■ Non-homestead property owners asked to foot 3-mill increase

Commercial property owners are being asked to foot the bill for a 3-mill tax increase proposed by Northville Public Schools next month.

If approved Nov. 8, the district would receive nearly \$320,000 worth of annual state funding. If denied, the state would withhold the money.

Homeowners whose principal residence is in Northville would not be affected, said Northville Public Schools Director of Business and Finance John Street.

Street said the owner of commercial property valued at \$1 million would pay an additional \$45 this year, if approved.

Non-homestead taxpayers would collectively receive a \$45,000 tax break, if denied.

Northville commercial and homestead property owner Bob Buckhave said he supports the proposal.

"I am so positive on this school system because of my knowledge with Len Rezmierski and the fine job he is doing and how important our school system is to this community," Buckhave said.

"So I will do what is necessary to support this school system."

Buckhave's name appears on the list of the City of Northville top 10 taxpayers.

"The schools help every corner of this community by creating a strong community," he said.

"And I think it is important to everyone who comes into this community because property values are so high and because they are so high people are willing to sacrifice for their children, if that is what it ends up being, a sacrifice."

Why an election?

Street said the election is being held because the district cannot assess this year the full 18 voter-approved mills on non-homestead property as it has in previous years.

He said the rising value of Northville commercial property, as a group, has increased above the rate of inflation, triggering a need for an election, according to state law.

On deck

- Nov. 8: Non-homestead property owners are asked to approve a 3 mill tax increase.
- Feb. 28: Homestead property owners will be asked to approve a \$69.3 million bond request.

According to Michigan law, commercial property owners are entitled to a tax rollback whenever the collective value of their properties rises faster than the rate of inflation.

However, the rollback means the Northville district is unable to assess a full 18 mills, the amount required by the state to maintain an extra \$50 per student in state funding.

The extra \$50 is defined under Proposal A as "hold harmless" funding and applies to qualifying school districts such as Northville.

Street said often the entire property value of a community can exceed the current rate of inflation, when a few businesses changing hands results in a steep property re-evaluation.

Hold that mill

School officials said a November "yes" vote will result in a .09 mill restoration on non-homestead property owners' December 2005 tax bills.

A "yes" vote will also give district officials authority to hold onto the remainder of the 3 mills for up to eight years.

If the district faces a funding forfeiture during that time, it will use the remaining mills to make up the difference, Street said.

"The money does have a limited life and can't be used for anything," Street said.

In the case the district is able to assess the full millage amount in future years, officials said the money will go unallocated until 2012.

Northville Public Schools voters approved a Headlee override proposal in September 2004, casting ballots in favor of a .25 mill increase.

Additional mills were approved last year, but Street said not enough to carry into 2005.

"How and when sales will take place in the future is difficult to predict, so with the benefit of hindsight, we want to now have a new rate that will keep our current millage rate," Street said. "The district doesn't get a cent more locally, this just allows us to receive what is due."

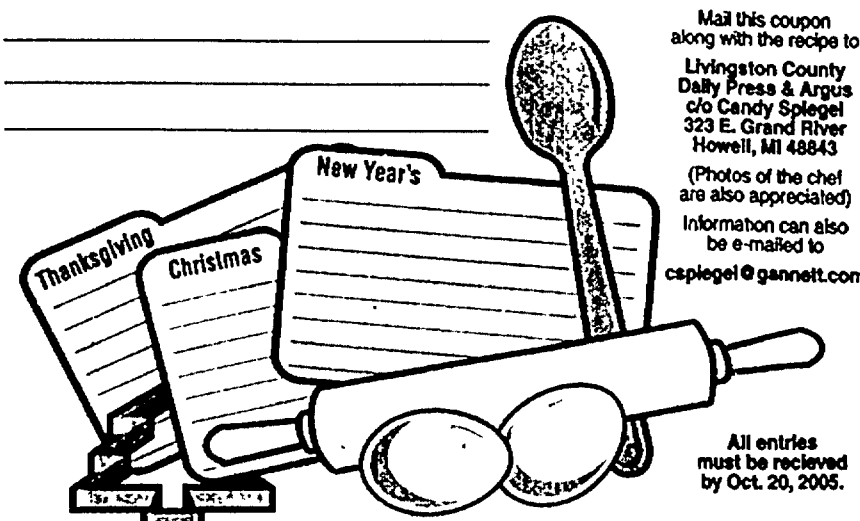

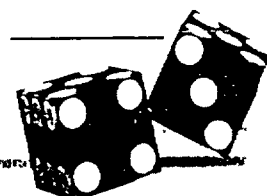

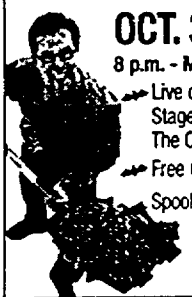

Minimum table stake: \$5. 20-30 CC per hour. The 10-15 floor has many tables to choose from. The high stakes table is especially interesting. Watch some top players and see how they play. If you are not a skilled player, you will probably get lost with the other players. Watch the money flow in and out of the game.

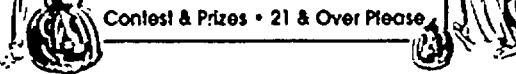

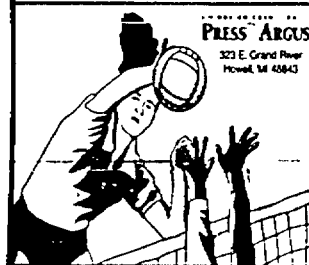

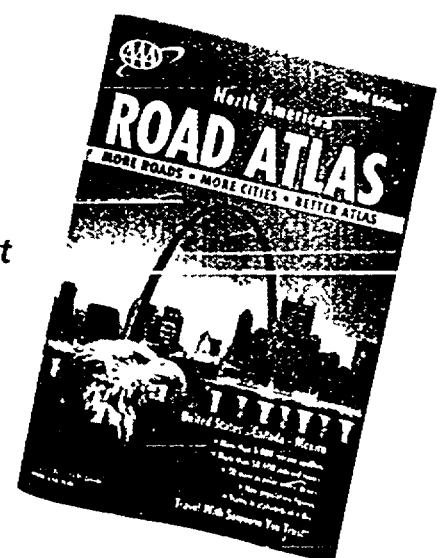

Hitting the books

■ Parents, children battle over homework responsibilities

The first in a four-part series looking at children and homework. Next week, unique homework help.

When Kira Haas goes to school in the morning, her homework is done. But getting to that point isn't always easy.

"I take a little break when I get home, and then I pull it out," Haas said. "I would rather be outside playing with my friends, but it helps me learn, and I want to grow up and be very smart."

Her mother, Cindy, said the daily homework ritual isn't so smooth.

She said often making her fourth-grade daughter begin studying includes arguing, negotiations and often an exhaustive battle.

The Haas family isn't alone in the homework dance.

Book battle

Dr. Arnold Keller, executive director of Psychotherapy & Counseling Services in Northville, said many parents experience homework struggles.

The key, Keller said: Don't micro-manage, don't coerce, and don't over-parent.

"When a parent is always prompting and initiating the child's homework, it's an example of over-parenting because then the child becomes dependent on the parent's reminders and sometimes the child becomes dependent on the parents' coercion," Keller said.

Instead, he said, begin good practices and give up parental control in primary grades. And when needed, use natural consequences as an enforcement, he said.

Keller said natural consequences sometimes means explaining to a child missed homework could mean summer school.

Keller said.

"A good technique is to help them get started at first and then eventually have them on automatic pilot, so to speak, so the parent isn't even aware the homework is completed."

Healthy habits

According to "No More Homework Battles," by Dr. Charles Fay, there are ways to make evening homework stress-free.

Fay, a psychologist with the Love and Logic Institute, suggests avoiding battles by offering choices.

Ask a child, "Would you rather do homework right after school or at 4 p.m.?" he suggests. Or, "Would you like to do your homework in your room or at the kitchen table?"

Fay's writings also recommend parents should only help their children if it is enjoyable for everyone.

The doctor says if conflict begins brewing, kiss your child, wish them luck and walk away.

Keller said healthy homework parental involvement includes being a cheerleader, showing interest while being available

only if needed.

He cautioned never to complete a child's homework. Instead, help when only absolutely necessary, he said.

There is a way

Keller said his practice recommends parenting through Love and Logic techniques.

He also offers services at his Northville practice ranging from support groups to family counseling to parental-technique consultations.

Keller cautions there are times medical assistance is required. Childhood depression, anxiety disorders or other adjusted reactions like oppositional defiant disorder are often evidenced by refusing to do homework or go to school, he said.

But experts say many children will welcome a healthy homework environment.

"I'd like to learn and be very smart," Haas said. "And maybe be a basketball player or a scientist."

■ Tips to end homework battles

• **Make Time for Homework:** Fitness gurus have known this for years: you are more likely to stick to an exercise regimen if you do it at the same time everyday and make it an inviolable part of your schedule. The same goes for homework. Don't leave it up in the air as to when homework will be completed.

• **Don't Accept No for an Answer:** It shouldn't matter if your child doesn't have a specific assignment. Homework is an extension of the learning that occurred in school. What they learned that day can be extended by reading silently or looking at flash cards during their allotted homework time.

• **Establish a Partnership with Teachers:** Early in the school year make an effort to get to know your child's teacher. Make an appointment to talk with the teacher in the first few weeks of school, so you can express your desire to be a good partner in your child's education.

• **Provide the Right Environment:** Most advice on

homework is to set up a desk in your child's room and make sure that they have a distraction-free work environment. Many students instead do their homework on the living room floor or the dining room table. If that is the case, then provide a small traveling office with the necessary items. With all the supplies nearby, and distractions limited to the general background noise, your student ought to be able to concentrate.

• **Set a Good Example:** In order to instill the proper values in our children, we must model them. If we expect our children to be hard-working students, then that is what they must see in us. Make an effort to show your child your work ethic by reading trade magazines and business books while they do their homework. The more you show your child learning is a lifelong adventure, the more likely it is homework will cease being a chore and start being an integral part of a life well-lived.

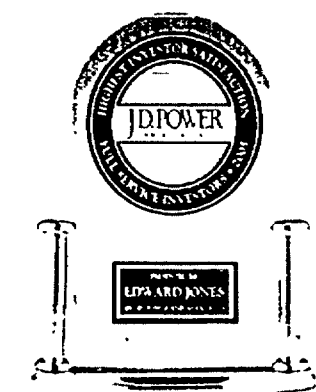

Caregiver assistance often a phone call away

■ Local agencies offer relief, support to those who need it

Savvy Senior

Caregiving Help

Dear Savvy Senior:

My 78-year-old father recently suffered a debilitating stroke. He is recovering slowly but he now needs much more care than mom and I can supply. Do you have some ideas that can help us take care of dad at home?

Overwhelmed Daughter

Dear Overwhelmed:

Caregiving is a tough job that most people don't ever think about or prepare for until it's staring them in the face. Fortunately, help is on hand. Here are some great caregiving services and resources you should know about.

Caregiving Services

Knowing what resources are available and who to call for help are invaluable tools for caregivers.

Depending on your needs and circumstances, there are lots of programs and services that may be able to assist you. The best place to help you locate what's available in your community is your Area Agency on Aging. Call the Eldercare Locator at (800) 677-1116 to get your local agency phone number, or visit www.eldercare.gov. Some specific services to ask about are:

- **Home and Personal Care:** Home care aides can do chores such as cleaning the house, grocery shopping, preparing meals, doing laundry and can provide non-medical help with activities of daily living such as bathing, dressing, or using the toilet.

- **Home Health Care:** Provides health care needs prescribed by a doctor. This includes skilled nursing care, rehabilitative therapy, giving medicine, wound care and medical help.

- **Companion Services:** Volunteers that make regular visits or phone calls to older adults who can't get out of the house.

- **Transportation:** Many communities provide transportation to medical appointments, senior centers, or shopping. These services are usually free, but some may have a small fee.

- **Meal Services:** Home-delivered meal programs offer nutritional meals to those who can't shop for groceries, cook or go out to eat. Many senior centers also offer congregate meal services.

- **Home Repair and Yard Work:** Home repair services can make minor safety changes like

installing grab bars, bathing seats in the shower, or ramps for wheelchairs. Free or low cost yard work services may also be available in your community through church, scout or other volunteer groups.

- **Adult Day Care Centers:** For elderly who need supervised assistance. Adult day care can include health care, recreation, meals and rehabilitative therapy in a group setting. While there is usually a cost, many offer sliding rate scales or some financial assistance.

- **Respite Care:** Provides time off for caregivers.

It can be for a few hours or for several weeks and can be provided in the home of the person being cared for, in an adult day center, or at a residential setting such as an assisted living facility or nursing home.

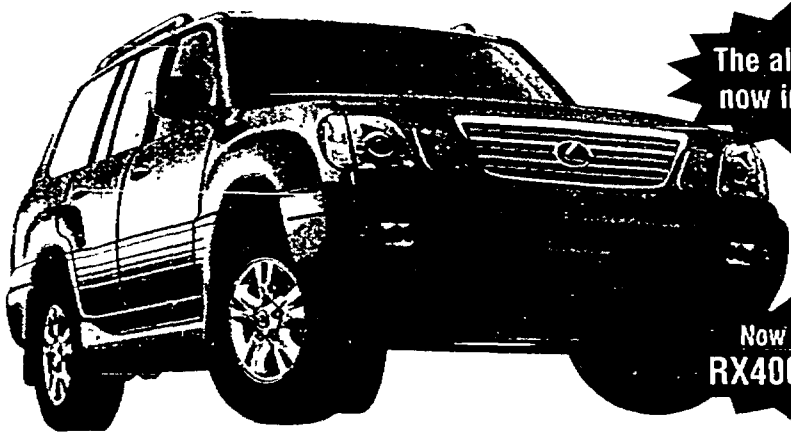

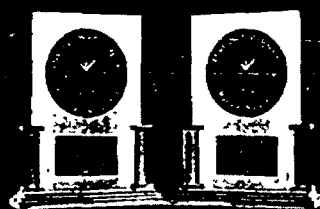

REMOVABLE APPLIANCES

Nearly everyone associates orthodontic treatment with fixed, permanent braces that are applied to the teeth on a 24-hour, 7-days-a-week basis. 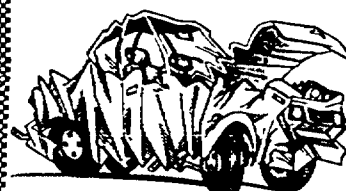





HYPERINFLATED LUNGS

Your lungs' job is to bring oxygen into your body and push carbon dioxide out. Your body produces carbon dioxide during its normal metabolic functions. Asthma patients may develop hyperinflated lungs when their inflamed airways (various tubes and passageways leading to and from the lungs) fail to push out all the air they've inhaled. Because "old air," which contains little or no oxygen, remains in the lungs, the person may feel increased shortness of breath. People with chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) and emphysema may also experience hyperinflated lungs, but for different reasons. In COPD, the airway lose elasticity and become inflamed. In emphysema cases, some airway walls are destroyed, leaving less surface area for air to pass through.

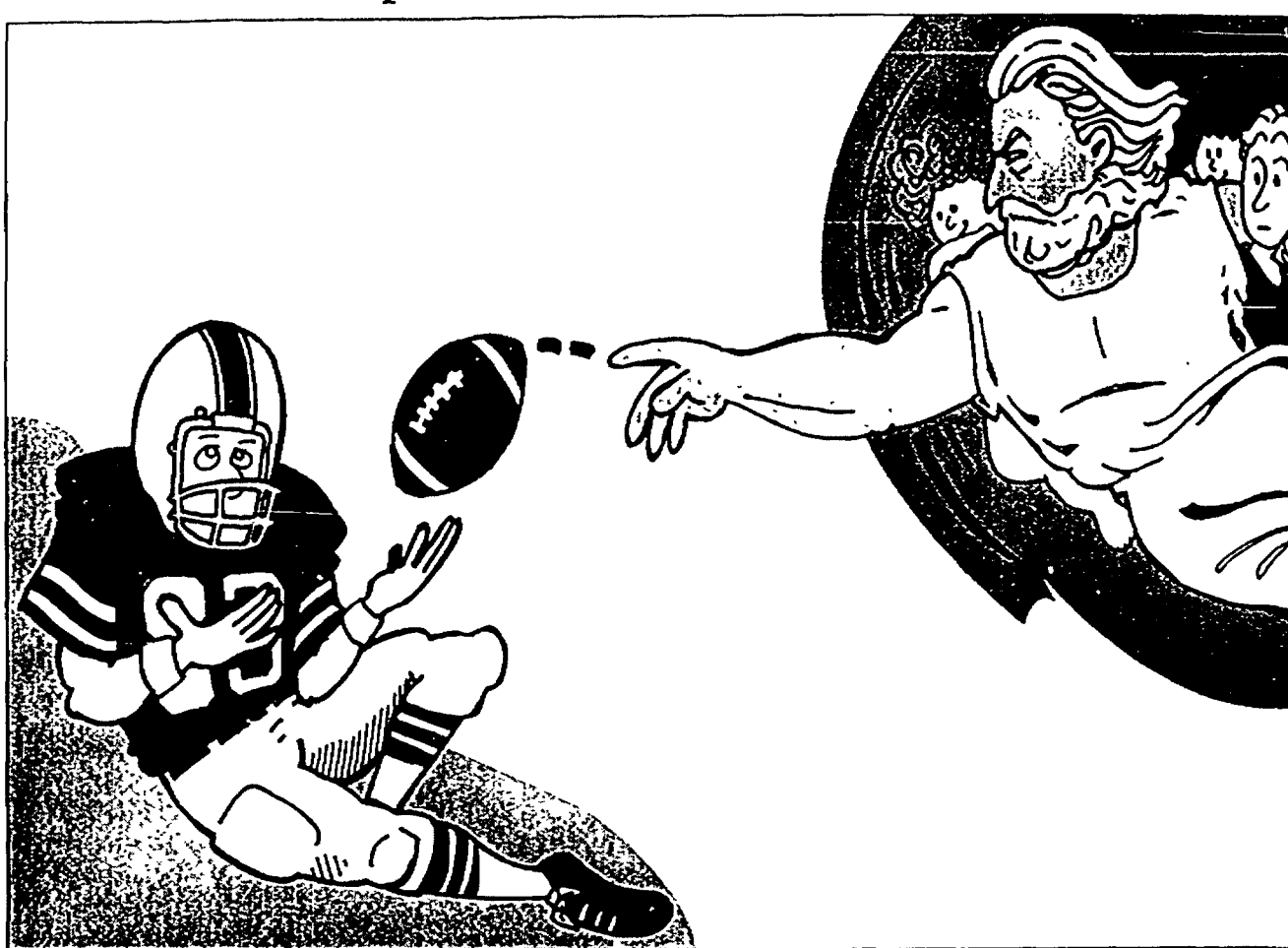

School projects face deadline

Northville school officials are asking residents to cast "yes" votes in the Nov. 8 election. A millage proposal will ask all school district voters to decide if Northville non-homestead property owners should forego a tax break. If they do, the school will receive nearly \$320,000 of state funding, officials already included in the district's 2005-06 budget. The collective cost to commercial property owners is estimated at \$45,000. If the millage request fails, the district will lose the money.

Northville: leave a good mark

While at away games, Northville fans need to remember they are representing their school and their community.

They should clean up after themselves, picking up any trash left behind by their fellow fans to help the host school keep their grounds as presentable as possible. Salute the flag

Mr. Thomas Steele is quite fervent in urging respect for the flag in the form of presenting a salute and doing so less as a choice than as a duty (Oct. 13, 2005). With his six years service in the navy and my own only four in the army (WWII, volunteer), perhaps I should defer to him and remain silent, but there is another point of view that may deserve some tolerance in our society that supports individual freedom. Freedom to do as you are told is different from freedom with choice, and balancing them requires careful thought.

To promote coordinated action but at the cost of individual freedom, the military salute is a required ritual to be initiated by a person of inferior rank to a person of superior rank acknowledging submission and obedience to that person, whether respected as a person or not.

Saluting the flag, aside from its overtones of appreciation and affection, is basically the same ritual of submission but to the national government.

Officers of government stand in front of the flag to symbolize their power. However, the flag is but a symbol and not the actual person or agency serving the practical purpose of governing: the laws and their agents do that, and they are what must be obeyed, not the flag. The members of the Sheriff's and Police Departments as the parade provided public safety by being there ready to enforce appropri-

ate laws appropriately; they were even friendly and helpful.

I appreciate and respect them, but the point is that I also must obey them and that relationship suggests that saluting them would be more appropriate than saluting a flag. So why not let the freedom symbolized by the flag embrace our fellow citizens who forget the customary formality of saluting it and even those who feel that obeisance to a symbol is a ritual in less than comfortable agreement with an old but perhaps not obsolete command to worship no graven image?

Does the City of Northville have its priorities straight? Explain.

Looking at the big picture, yes we do. The city is fiscally strong as well as the neighborhoods and downtown. Northville is a very desirable place to live and work!

Yes. Faced with declining state revenues and a sluggish economy, the city remains fiscally sound and continues to deliver quality services. The strategic planning initiative for downtown is a critical step toward securing the city's future. Recent zoning amendments to limit size and scale of residential properties is commendable.

Every year the City Council prioritizes its goals and objectives. At the end of the year we evaluate our progress. Water costs, for example got on the list as a low priority. It has been steadily rising ever since. The process works well. Achieving the goals is the hard part.

Overall, Northville's priorities are beginning to align. While we still face the question of whether or not the city can provide adequate parking given the current level of development, we are actively engaged in a process, with the help of our consultant Beckett & Raeder, to determine the future of our downtown.

The city currently has a \$1.9 million rainy day fund. Is that sufficient? Give one specific example of how this money should be used.

Yes. The fund represents approximately 25-30 percent of the entire budget. Even with rising revenues, this percentage must be maintained for emergencies or reduced state funding. This is fiscally sound and will ensure that the high levels of city services are maintained during an unforeseen event.

At a time when many municipalities and school districts are depleting their fund balances to try and meet budget due to cutbacks in state revenue, Northville has maintained a healthy fund equity. Its auditors have praised the City administration for increasing its fund balance during tough fiscal times.

I am not sure I would call it a rainy day fund when our medical pension liability exceeds \$8 million. Our compensated time off obligation exceeds \$300,000 and our pension plans funded at 65 percent. I think a fund balance closer to 50 percent of our annual budget should be the target.

It's difficult to determine if \$1.9 million is sufficient, given an unstable economy and the fact that we have experienced cuts from the state's shared revenues in the past. I would recommend that we continue to build this fund. One specific example of how this money could be used is to transfer some of it into the Budget Stabilization Fund, which was depleted in 1991 and has not been rebuilt since.

Did you attend the city's Oct. 5 visioning session? If so, what were your impressions? If not, why?

I was unable to attend due to work. I am off the current Downtown Steering Committee and look forward to being involved in this process and, more importantly, to implement the results.

Yes. There was a respectable turnout of residents/business owners, which is important because community buy-in will be essential to action plans put forth from the findings of the Beckett & Raeder study. I was happy to see the ideas shared at the workshop were a reaffirmation of the Downtown Steering Committee's findings.

I enjoyed attending the most recent visioning session. There are always a lot of different opinions. When one of the groups suggested we could expand the downtown into the neighborhoods I actually heard a collective gasp for air. The common thread I observed of all groups was to retain Northville's character and quaintness.

I did attend the visioning session as a table leader, helping our consultant document the input from citizens. I believe it was a productive session where residents were able to discuss and provide valuable input pertaining to their vision for downtown. Overall, residents were thoughtfully engaged in the process and demonstrated a sincere interest in helping to shape the future of our city.

What differentiates you from other city council candidates?

I have been in the Northville community almost my entire life. That, along with my professional skills, enables me to bring a strong skill set to complement council.

My nearly 15 years of involvement in a broad spectrum of civic arenas gives me a unique community perspective to bring to Northville City Council. I am committed to maintaining the city's identity but believe we need to maintain a cooperative relationship with the Northville Public Schools and Northville Township.

I think highly of all the candidates running for City Council. I believe the knowledge and experience I have gained, as a city councilman is a difference worth mentioning.

I believe this question is best answered by city residents.

In Northville, the city, township and public schools jointly provide recreation and senior citizen programs. The city and township also jointly provide public safety dispatch. Are such partnerships in the city's best interest? Explain.

Yes. The city, township and schools are intertwined in many ways and have historically shared programming. By working together we can continue to provide exceptional programs that benefit the residents of both communities.

Yes. The Shared Services Agreement between the city and township with an in-kind contribution from the school district has greatly benefited city residents. The City does not have the resources to solely fund Northville Youth Assistance, senior citizen programming and Parks and Recreation. Joint dispatch has been a prudent and effective partnership.

Yes, I believe in joint services. Add to the list Youth Assistance, the district library and the Senior Advisory Council. There may be other opportunities to share services, but based upon the experience and knowledge I mentioned above, police and fire are not among them.

Although these partnerships allow for more choices in their respective programs, all future partnerships would need to be analyzed individually and the impact to city residents would need to be thoroughly investigated. Public safety was outsourced; the City pays for the service with limited control on how the service is provided.

What are the two most pressing issues facing the city during the next year, and what role do you envision playing toward their resolution?

Strategic plan and parking. The results will be a blueprint for our future and need to be implemented. As a 13-year member of the Northville Planning Commission, professional planner and community volunteer, I understand the processes and the issues facing our town and I know the people.

A community-driven strategic plan for downtown. City Council will need to provide leadership and direction in moving this process to an action plan. Development of the 400-acre former psychiatric hospital site. City Council will need to work with the township to minimize the impact on the city.

The perennial challenge facing this City is to retain our charm, character and quaintness. The pressure to redevelop and overdevelop our city is constant. Eternal vigilance is required. I believe a long-range parking plan is long overdue. We should not be selling parking credits until that plan is in place.

Balance the budget, which sets the course for the city for a year. Given the current economic climate of our state, it is critical that we carefully weigh each budgetary decision. We need to determine the adequacy of our downtown parking. It is within City Council's authority (Code of Ordinances Sec. 82:151-155) to establish a parking authority to analyze the parking needs.

Have too many resources been invested toward development of the downtown business district, at the expense of surrounding neighborhoods and public services? Explain.

No. The downtown infrastructure has remained relatively unchanged since Main Street '93. DDA captured funding is providing maintenance and improvements. Our real estate values are directly tied to our downtown, so it must remain strong.

The viability of downtown is at the core of the city's desirability and has considerable impact on property values. I have not seen any erosion of our neighborhoods or reduction in city services as a result of investment in downtown development. A healthy downtown only enhances our neighborhoods.

The million dollars spent by the Downtown Development Authority must be spent in the downtown district. Other communities use their DDAs differently. The City of Wayne used DDA funds to build a new fire station. Brownstown Township built a new police station. Grosse Pointe and Allen Park built recreation facilities.

The Michigan Compiled Law Act 197 of 1975, (Downtown Development Authority) was enacted specifically to support development of downtown business districts only, and the DDA is obligated to use its nearly one million dollars of captured taxes per year for improving and developing our downtown.

Is the city too lax or stringent when enforcing existing ordinances?

In many ways, yes. This is an administrative issue that will only change by public policy. I believe this has to be addressed.

The planning commission's efforts this past year to amend zoning ordinances to limit size and scale in residential neighborhoods is a positive step toward maintaining the character of our neighborhoods.

In the historic district you can't brush your teeth without the Historic District approving the color of your toothbrush. In the downtown, put in a plaza, call it a public benefit and throw the ordinance book out the window.

While I cannot speak to specific cases pertaining to lax or stringent ordinance enforcement, I do question whether or not the City awards too many variances. The Board of Zoning Appeals should be stringent in upholding the 'proof of hardship' upon the owner of a property as stated in Section 25.04 b of the Zoning Ordinance.

Genitti said the idea for a community-wide collection and chartered truck sprang from awareness that people want to give but have no way to get it to the storm-ravaged South.

Northville Rotary Club members, Century 21 agents and other merchants also have joined in, she said. Organizers dubbed the campaign, "From Michigan to Mississippi, a new season, ... season with hope."

The truck is headed to a Mississippi church where a First United Methodist sister congre-

gation will distribute the items to needy families.

The local church has been selling stuffed bears to accompany the driver. Proceeds will go toward holiday meal fixings.

"That money donated as a ticket for the bear to get to Mississippi will be used to buy things that people might not necessarily bring, canned hams for example," said parish nurse Karen DeBenedet. "That's the other prong of this effort."

Lending a hand

The truck trip south coincides

with First United Methodist's ongoing "Flood Bucket" collection. Each week the congregation has been bringing in specific items — bleach, scouring pads, disinfectant soap and other cleaning tools to stock buckets.

These supplies enable people to begin the overwhelming job of cleaning up after a flood or hurricane, DeBenedet said. The buckets will ride with the food, clothing and other donated items.

"It certainly is a community-wide effort," she said.

Items suggested for donation include: T-shirts, socks, jeans,

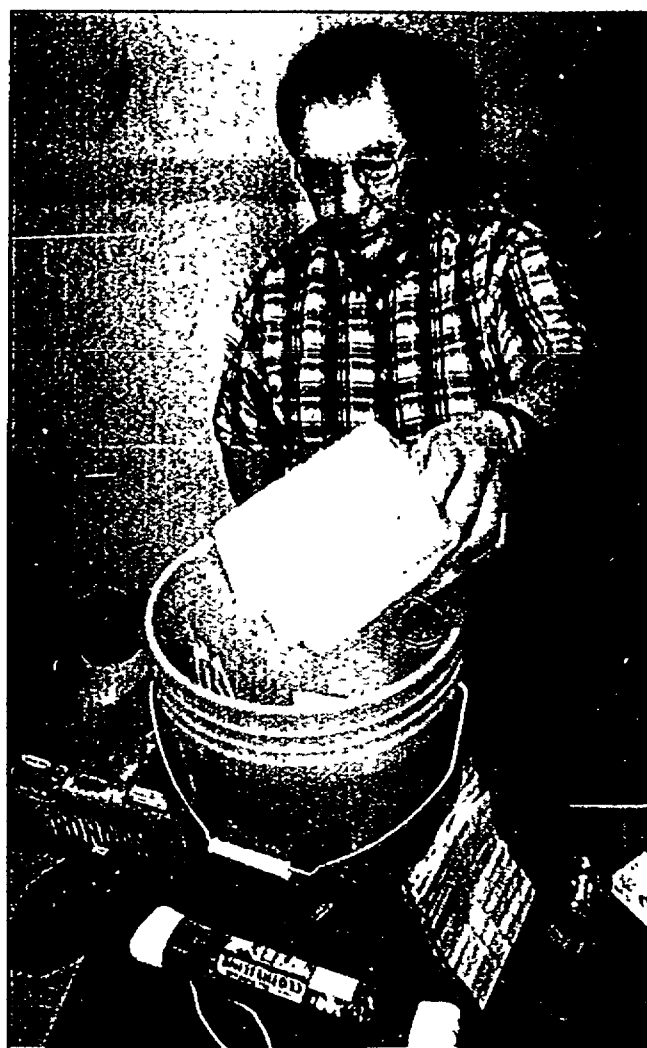

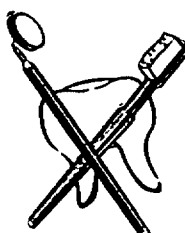

Take a (flu) shot

■ Flu shots available now for those at high-risk; Monday for general public

Jane Sheldwick has lost too many weeks to the flu during her lifetime to risk not getting vaccinated.

"Life is too short," said the 72-year-old Novi resident. "Why spend it on the couch with a 100-degree fever?"

Sheldwick said she has gotten the flu vaccine for the past five years, but panicked during last year's shortage.

"I haven't gotten the flu in years," she said. "Why start now?"

The flu is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses. It can cause mild to severe illness and at times lead

allowing enough time to vaccinate others desiring vaccination before demand declines in November.

Kaminski said the flu shot is given throughout the entire flu season, which peaks between February and March.

"The best time to get the shot is between October and November," she said. "It will last for months and protect people throughout the winter."

Staying healthy

Karen DeBenedet, a nurse for

the First United Methodist Church in Northville, said aside from getting a flu shot, continuous hand-washing is the next best alternative.

"If people get use to constantly washing their hands and using hand sanitizers," Kaminski said, "it will be better than nothing, and there will be fewer germs to spread."

Kaminski said the flu shot is no guarantee against the flu, but may reduce the severity.

"The flu actually takes many lives throughout the winter season," DeBenedet said. "People

No bird flu protection

Influenza outbreaks occur when a new strain emerges and people have little or no immunity, according to the Center for Disease Control.

While there are over 90 million flu vaccines available this year, Jackie Pebbles, a pharmacist for Walgreens in Novi, said there is currently no vaccine for the avian bird flu spreading throughout Asia.

"Researchers are worried about it mutating," Pebbles said. "But we don't know that much about it."

Pebbles said the bird flu virus occurs naturally among birds, and although the virus does not usually affect humans.

Most human cases of bird flu infection in humans have resulted from contact with infected poultry or contaminated surfaces, according to officials from the Center for Disease Control.

"It hasn't spread to the U.S.," Pebbles said. "That's what matters right now."

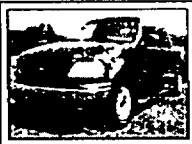

Does Northville have a parking problem? Is there a need for a public parking deck downtown? If so, how should it be paid for?

Parking is a personal issue with many differing opinions. The Strategic Plan will examine, quantify it and make recommendations. If the resulting conclusion is a deck, it will be paid for by the DDA captured funds and not out of the general budget or through an increase in taxes.

There is not consensus about whether Northville has a parking problem. That needs to be determined before we consider construction of decks or other parking options. The findings of the Beckett and Reader study should shed some light on the downtown parking issue.

We need to develop a long-term plan, devoid of favoritism and influence, that meets the needs of existing businesses. We should begin by building a tabletop deck, like the one on Center St. behind the new building on Main Street. Install parking meters on the lower level and free upper-deck parking.

I do not believe Northville has a parking shortage, however, when the four major downtown projects are completed, we may have a problem then. We need to determine the adequacy of our downtown parking. It is within City Council's power to establish a parking authority to analyze the city's parking needs. The DDA could provide funding as needed.

Currently, the city pays for recreation activities out of its general fund. Should it have a dedicated millage instead? Explain.

This is worth looking at and should be explored. A millage would provide consistent funding and not be subject to budget irregularities. The library is an excellent example of how this has been implemented.

A voter-approved dedicated millage would allow shared services — which includes Parks and Recreation, Northville Youth Assistance and senior citizens — to secure funding through a guaranteed millage. The City's modest general fund increases limit its ability to meet the growing demands of shared services.

I really don't know a lot about the millage proposal. I have, however, been out in the neighborhoods and so far not a single person has told me their taxes are not high enough.

The city's \$160,000 budgeted yearly contribution is only 6.5 percent of the total Parks & Recreation yearly budget. In the event that it was decided to dedicate a millage, under current law, each voter would be able to make his or her own decision in the ballot box.

Why are you running for city council? In what specific ways do you feel you can make a difference?

I believe our city is currently at a crossroad, and I can help lay the foundation for a successful Northville for future generations. I can make a significant contribution by utilizing my professional skills and personal civic passion to help make our town even better than it already is.

I am seeking a city council seat to help develop a blueprint for the future of the City that encourages economic viability of the downtown within the context of preserving our historic character. For the past 15 years, I have dedicated myself to giving back to the community.

The only debt I have is to the residents of Northville who voted for me and by so doing asked me to represent them. I have tried very hard to do just that these past eight years and with their blessing I will be doing it for four more.

The City of Northville's local government and its decision-making processes need to be more accessible to its citizens. I can make a difference by engaging with the community and encouraging citizens to become more actively involved in their government. 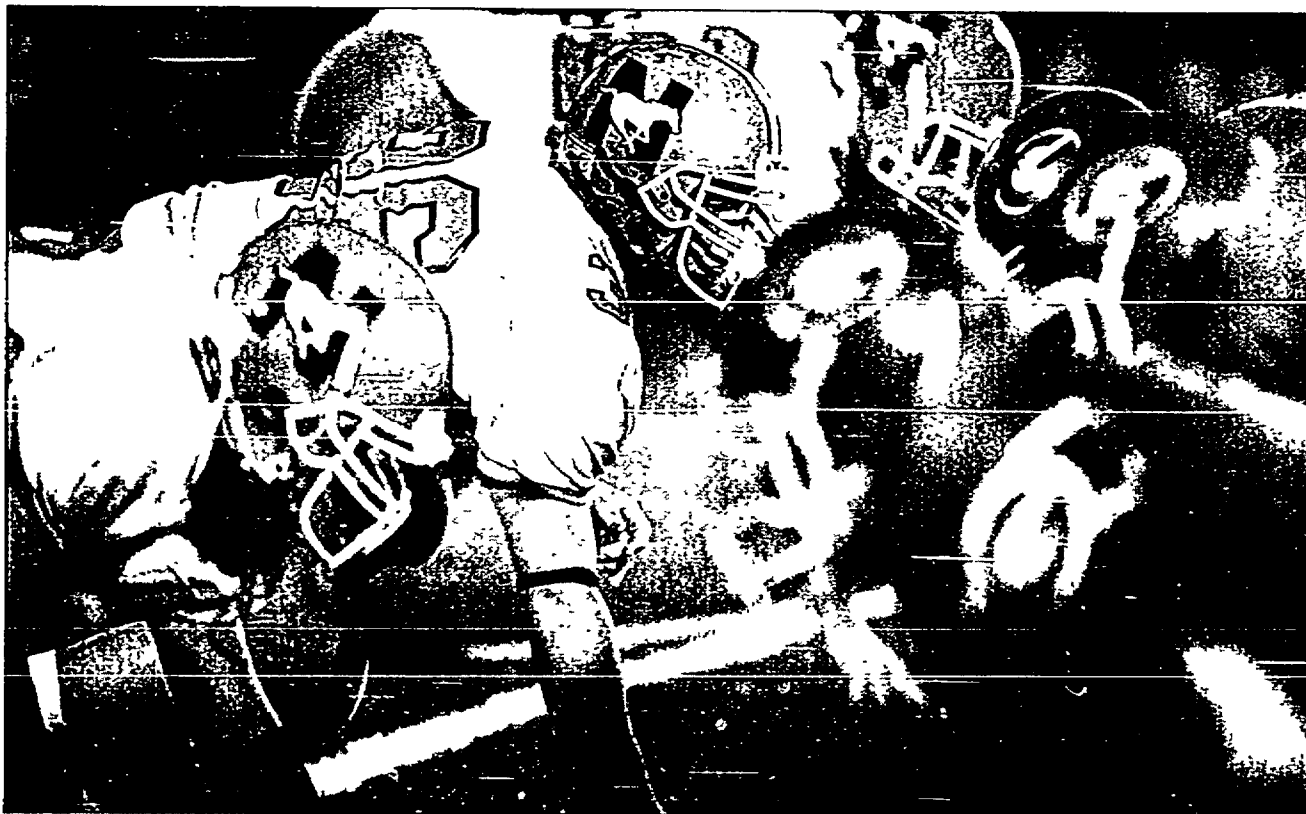

Mustangs earn victory over Rockets

Northville football fans should take a moment to thank Evan Corbeil.

The senior kicker helped secure a victory for the Northville Mustangs — their second of the year — with three decisive field goals in a 16-12 win over John Glenn.

"It was great to get it," said Northville captain Chris McGuire, who saw limited playing time due to an injury. "We knew we could beat them."

First-year coach Ryan Hockman credited his team's big plays for the victory. He said his team was also able to capitalize on special teams opportunities.

Northville went on the board first on a field goal by Corbeil before adding a second score on a one-yard quarterback sneak by Mike Deluca. John Glenn scored a touchdown of their own, but a blocked extra point made it 10-6 at the half.

Northville notched another field goal off Corbeil's foot and John Glenn collected a second touchdown but had their two-point conversion stuffed to stop their bid for the lead.

Corbeil ended the scoring with a field goal in the fourth quarter. "It's nice to get back on that other side of the win-loss column," he said. "It's an enjoyable experience for us."

The victory was the Mustangs'

first since week three win over the Wayne Memorial Zebras.

Northville lost to John Glenn in week two in double overtime. In that game, the Rockets passed at the end of the game to earn the victory.

The Mustangs expected to see more passing from the Rockets last week.

"They kept powering it forward, playing power I with two tight ends," Hockman said. "They didn't feel like they were going to spread us out, but they thought they could drive the ball on us."

Because the Rockets refused to pass the ball, the Mustangs were able to use big defensive plays for negative yards to quash potential scoring drives.

Sophomore linebacker Greg Hasse led the team in tackles with eight. He has 81 tackles this year.

Defensive lineman and fullback Joe Perpich, who is coming back off a series of injuries, also played well.

"Defensively, we beat but we didn't break," Hockman said. "The defense just hung around even though we only had two possessions in the second half. They kept making plays, kept playing and didn't give up the big play."

Northville's next game is tomorrow night when they end their season with a visit to cross-town rival Novi at 7 p.m.

It's for bragging rights

Records won't matter in this one.

The Northville Mustangs play victory in Novi this week when they take a trip across the Baseline Road in the annual cross-town rivalry showdown. Kick off is scheduled for 7 p.m.

Both teams head into this contest on a high note, winning last week with Northville climbing to 2-6 on the season and Novi securing a playoff berth at 6-2. Yet the records don't mean a thing when these two teams face off.

It's always intense, emotionally charged and full of big plays.

For the past few years, it's been Novi making the big plays. Lots of them. The Wildcats have been on a hot streak since 1995 as they've gone 8-2 in the Baseline Jug contest (9-3 overall, including state playoffs in 2004 and 2000). Over the past four games, Novi is undefeated, scoring an average of 39.5 points a game (41.8 including playoffs).

This year, the Wildcats are heavy favorites. Not only are they playing at home, but they're the second-place finishers in a highly-competitive Kensington Valley Conference and have scored 176 points this year while

allowing just 103.

Novi will use a balanced attack led by their two-quarterback system — Steve Hart and Adam Chandler. Hart is a pass-minded quarterback while Chandler is in charge of running the option for the Wildcats.

The Wildcats boast a slew of other talented players, including David and Brandon Carnegie, John Favorite, Tyler Hoover, Eric Zhao and Alex Barlett.

Northville, on the other hand, is expected to lose. With just two wins under their belt, the Mustangs will have a lot of work to do to escape this contest with a victory. Northville has just 100 offensive points while their defense has allowed a staggering 236.

But there's still talented players capable of winning ball games. Chris McGuire, a defensive back and utility player, has showcased his abilities all year while Joe Perpich, quarterback Mike Deluca, Ditrick Williams and David Bandy will have to step up and be leaders throughout the game.

For Novi, it's just another game on the way to the state playoffs. For Northville, it's their chance to make a dent in the Wildcats' season.

And it's all for bragging rights.

1988: The birth of the Baseline Jug

Novi News editor Phil Jerome wasn't able to attend the 1988 showdown between Novi and Northville to see the fruits of his staff's imagination and labor.

That was the year the Novi News and the Northville Record staffs came up with the idea of creating a trophy for the teams to compete for, and it's the official birthday of the Baseline Jug.

"We thought it would be a good idea and we thought it would be a great way to make the rivalry between Northville and Novi official," Jerome said.

Novi News reporter Ann Wilson, found a ceramic jug that became the Baseline trophy. The night it was unveiled and became an instant hit.

"I was surprised it was so popular," Jerome said. "I don't even remember who won, but I heard that the students and the football team was chanting 'We want the Jug! We want the Jug!'"

Northville was the first recipient of the trophy, earning it following a 23-18 victory over Novi. Since then, it has changed hands several times.

The longest streak is Novi's current four-year stranglehold. Prior to the creation of the trophy, the longest winning streak was a five-year Northville stretch from 1974-

78.

Novi earned its fifth-straight victory over Northville in the first round of the playoffs last year, though that game didn't count for the Jug.

A new jug

The Baseline Jug being hoisted today isn't the original, which was destroyed in the late 1990s. Instead, it's a donated milk jug from Guernsey Dairy, which sits on the dividing line of Northville and Novi.

The change came under the guidance of Chris Davis, former Northville Record editor.

The drive to hoist the trophy has-

n't waned despite its different appearance. Last year, the Novi Wildcats won the Baseline Jug, 35-7, in front of a packed stadium and quickly began passing it around and lifting it above their heads.

"The kids really love it," said Novi head coach Tab Kellepourey. Kellepourey would know. He's been the recipient of the Jug as an assistant and a head coach for the Wildcats.

This year, the Baseline Jug game will be played at Novi High School. Kick off is scheduled for 7 p.m. tomorrow night.

The game is expected to kick off at 7 p.m., but arrive early and expect a big, raucous crowd.

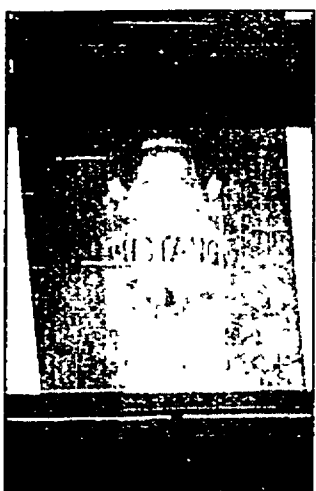
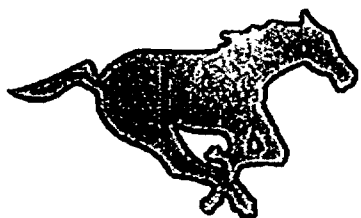

Bringing Baseball Back to Biloxi

Now that Hurricane Katrina has fallen off the front page and the hard work of rebuilding has begun, it might seem as if life is slowly returning to normal in the Gulf Coast region. But in that monumental reconstruction effort, one aspect of daily life is not likely to receive much attention: Little League Baseball.



The junior varsity Northville Colts continued their winning ways Saturday, defeating the Walled Lake Braves, 8-0.

The undefeated Colts are 6-0 and have secured the top seed in the WLJFL championship tournament beginning Oct. 29.

The two teams battled for field position much of the day, but the Colts took control on their fourth offensive series when a short Walled Lake left Northville at the Braves' 23-yard line.

Jeffrey Hewlett capped the drive with a 5-yard touchdown run, and Connor Pollifrone kicked the extra point for an 8-0 lead.

Marshall Williams preserved the Colts' half-time lead with a timely interception late in the first half.

No looking past Jug game

For Steve Hart, it's easy to recall just why his team can't overlook Northville.

"Those guys are just great," said Hart, who has thrown for over 1,400 yards this year and 10 touchdowns. "If you watch tape, you can see that I could have minutes back in the pocket if I wanted them."

Hart also credited the defense, which has allowed just 103 points, for victories. He said his team is loaded with talent.

"Every year they say Novi lost too many good players and isn't going to be any good," he said.

"Every year we're competitive."

Hart wasn't even in high school the last time Northville won the Jug. None of the players on this year's team were.

But the rivalry is alive and well.

"The guys are pumped for this game," Hart said.

"This is the game that we've all been waiting for. It's our senior year and we're playing Northville. We've got to win this one. It's our last time playing them."

Hart and his fellow seniors have never lost to Northville. They didn't play one another their freshman year and Novi won by one point in junior varsity competition two seasons ago. Last year, Novi won the Baseline Jug game and the following week's playoff game.

This year, Hart said he hopes to continue the tradition of bringing the Jug to Novi that so many players — including his older brother Mike — have carried on.

"It's the biggest game of the year for us," he said. "I can't wait to play Friday night."

Home Owners Do You Know...What Is GFI Protection?

This is a special electrical device (receptacle or circuit breaker) that can detect the flow of electricity in a circuit and stop the flow of electricity instantly; if a ground fault (electrical short or leak) is detected. This device is called a Ground Fault Interrupt (GFI). GFI devices are recommended for electrical receptacles located at the exterior electrical outlets around the house, in bathrooms, kitchens, and any locations where damp or wet conditions exist, as a basement for example. (Note: These are also identified as GFCI).

GFI receptacles have a test button and should be tested monthly to ensure they are providing the intended electrical shock protection. When the test button is pressed the Reset button will pop out. This will shut off the electricity to the outlet. Press the reset

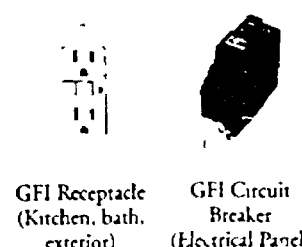

button and the circuit will come back on. The same procedure is used with a circuit breaker located in your main electrical distribution panel. Press the test button and the breaker trips. Reset the breaker and the electrical service is restored to the circuit.

These devices are recommended in all homes. If your bathroom, kitchen or exterior receptacles are not GFI protected, it is recommended that you upgrade these circuits and provide your family with safe electrical shock protection. Existing three prong grounded receptacles can be easily swapped out and upgraded to a GFI protected circuit. Older style two prong duplex receptacles must be upgraded to include a ground wire prior to installing GFI protection. We recommend having a Certified Electrician perform the electrical upgrades. The purchase cost for GFI receptacles are generally between \$12 - \$30, depending on the manufacturer and style.

Below are two examples of what a GFI receptacle and circuit breaker (located in your electrical distribution panel) look like.

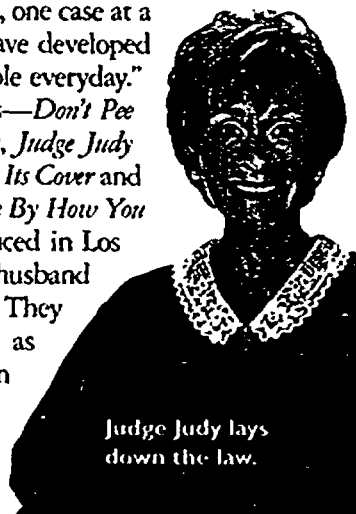

Teaching a School of Hard Knocks

Former rodeo star Lyle Sankey is holding class in an arena surrounded by pine trees in Gilmer, Texas (pop. 4,799). His group of battered and bruised students listens intently as he offers up advice: "There are three types of people in this sport," he says, "the ones that make things happen, the ones that watch things happen and those that wonder what happened. Decide which one you want to be."

For 30 years Sankey's straight talk has been the foundation of Sankey Rodeo Schools, based in Branson, Mo. (pop. 6,050). He and his six-member staff of rodeo veterans teach students bull riding, bronc riding and bull fighting at clinics across the country.

Sankey, 51, competed professionally from the mid-1970s to the early 1980s and is one of only four men to ever qualify for the National Finals Rodeo in bareback riding, saddle bronc riding and bull riding. Since that time, television coverage has made bull riding wildly popular, and today's school participants include future rodeo stars and adrenalin junkies, like J.B. Creech, a lieutenant colonel in the U.S. Army.

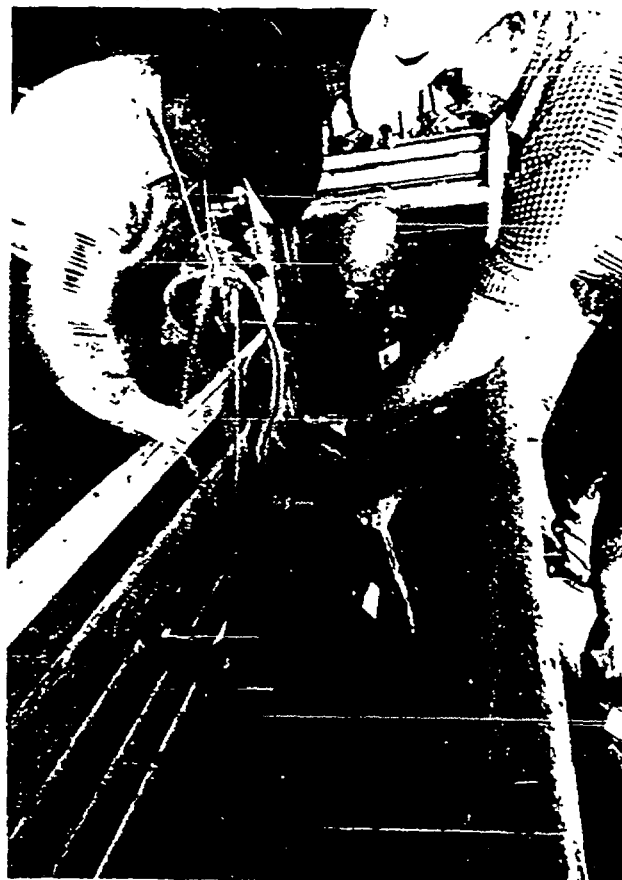
"It's a rush," says Creech, who's stationed at Homestead Air Force Reserve Base in Florida. "It's like the first time I jumped out of a helicopter. I don't have any fantasies about joining the Professional Bull Riders, but I might do more schools."

Whatever their goals, Sankey cares about all of his students. "We want everyone to have a great experience," he says.

Instructor and former bull rider Marty Roberts of Belton, Texas (pop. 14,623), says Sankey's character and

Student Jason Stiefer readies for a rowdy bull ride. teaching techniques are quite unique. "Lyle doesn't look down at anyone," Roberts says. "He looks them in the eye, and he helps the students make it happen."

Before their first bull or bronc ride, students are instructed on equipment set up, riding fundamentals, dismounts, physical preparation and emotion management. Each student gets plenty of individual instruction, and animals of all sizes and temperaments are provided to meet the needs of both novice and advanced riders.

To ensure the best start for his students, Sankey brings riding gear to each school that anyone can use for free, and he videotapes the students in action. After riding

sessions, students huddle around a television with Sankey, who watches each ride, identifies any problems and gives instructions on how to improve.

"If you've got hold of the bull rope, you're in the game," Sankey says excitedly after watching a rider recover from a near fall.

Sheer determination is what drove Sankey to compete in the first rodeo he ever attended in 1969. He rode horribly but was hooked. "At 17, this was new for me, but I was determined to figure out how to be successful," he says.

Sankey put on his first school with his brother, Ike, in 1975 in Roseville, Kan., for a group of local boys. As his competitive career ended, Lyle focused on the schools, and today Sankey Rodeo Schools puts on 35 classes annually with 20 to 40 students attending each one.

"I'm dedicated to the schools because of what they did for my career," says Sankey, crediting some of the rodeo schools he attended with improving his riding skills. "I felt like every time I went to one it advanced my career two years."

Due to recent shoulder surgeries, Sankey hasn't been on a bull in more than a year and he admits that he misses it. Still, he's never far from the action. He and his wife, Kathy, follow their goat-tying daughter Sasha, 19, to rodeo competitions at the collegiate level.

And the rodeo instructor continues to approach life with the philosophy of a rodeo contestant: "If you go to the bucking chutes, you need to finish." ☆

Chili cookoffs simmer with competition and camaraderie

Some Like It Hot!

A pungent concoction of cubed beef, reddish-brown gravy and zesty spices simmers in a heavy aluminum pot on Cindy Reed Wilkins' portable propane stove. In an hour, she'll add the last round of ingredients—salt, cumin, chili powder and a dash of fresh hot pepper—to what she hopes will be an award-winning chili.

"Good luck, Cindy!" exclaims fellow contender Honey Jones of Canyon Lake, Texas (pop. 16,870), as she gives Wilkins a hug.

Wilkins and Jones, both former grand champions of the Terlingua International Chili Championship, were among 330 cooks from across the nation who put their culinary talents to the test last November during the 38th annual competition in Terlingua, Texas (pop. 267).

Friend vs. friend. Husband against wife. Even mothers challenged daughters during the four-day outdoor event hosted by the Chili Appreciation Society International (CASI), which sanctions 560 cookoffs annually in the United States, Canada and Mexico.

Throughout the year, some 800 cookoffs across North America pit chili lovers against one another in an ongoing debate about who—and what ingredients—makes the best batch of chili. While the competition is heated, having fun is a big part of the contests.

"There's so much camaraderie," says Wilkins, of Houston, Texas, who met her husband, Bruce, at a chili cookoff 10 years ago in Rockport, Texas.

Both Bruce and Wilkins' mother, Maxine Reed, compete, too. "Chiliheads are truly one big family," Wilkins acknowledges.

During the CASI competition, which attracts 10,000 spectators, one chili is declared the winner by a final panel of 16 judges who evaluate entries based on aroma, red color, consistency, taste and aftertaste.

Even then, contestants still can argue that their chili is the best. After all, individual cooks determine their own ingredients and degree of hotness.

The inaugural cookoff

The first Terlingua chili cookoff was in 1967. That's when two writers—H. Allen Smith of New York City and Frank X. Tolbert of Dallas—argued at length in print over whose state made the best chili. Adding fuel to the chili fire, Smith claimed that "no living man" could top his homemade "zestfully flavorful" chili. With the article, Smith included his chili recipe that called for pinto beans, an ingredient shunned by Texas purists.

Ultimately, the two agreed to a chili duel. Smith's contender from Texas was Wick Fowler, the owner of Wick Fowler's Two-Alarm Chili in Austin and a member of the Chili Appreciation Society, CASI's predecessor, which formed in 1951. The much-publicized event drew hundreds of people to Terlingua, a remote ghost town in the desert near the Chisos Mountains.

The match ended in a draw. So a second competition was held the following year.

By 1969, the Terlingua cookoff had become established as the "world championship of chili." More and more people crowded into the tiny town with each passing year. In 1975, members of the newly formed International Chili Society (ICS) withdrew from the Terlingua cookoff over differences of opinion on how the contest should be run and started hosting their own cookoffs in Newport Beach, Calif.

Today, ICS has 4,000 members and sanctions more than 200 cookoffs annually, including its trademarked World's Championship Chili Cookoff each October. Last year in Las Vegas, 400 ICS contestants competed for cash prizes in three categories: traditional red, chili verde and salsa.

"Some of our cooks travel 40,000 miles a year," says Carol Hancock, ICS executive director in San Juan Capistrano, Calif. (pop. 33,826). "Some have cooked in 47 or 48 states, and their goal is to cook in all 50."

Another fracture took place at the Terlingua cookoff in 1983 when contestants disagreed over who qualified to participate in the championship. To this day, Terlingua hosts two chili cookoffs during the first weekend in November: CASI's Terlingua International Chili Championship at the 320-acre Rancho CASI de los Chisos west of Terlingua and the Original Terlingua International Frank X. Tolbert-

A Texas tradition

Chuck wagon cooks on Texas cattle drives made some of the first chili, according to folklorist W. C. Jameson, author of *The Ultimate Chili Cookbook*.

"Nothing's documented about that," says Jameson of Woodland Park, Colo. (pop. 6,515). "It likely had multiple origins."

Newspaper reports do confirm that during the 1880s, "chili queens," mostly Mexican women, hawked their fiery brews from colorful carts lined up around Military Plaza in San Antonio. They arrived before dusk and built mesquite fires to warm their cauldrons of chili. Health regulations in the 1930s ended the chili queens' reigns.

Chili became standard fare at jails across the Southwest in the early 1900s and a culinary favorite among Hollywood stars when Chasen's Restaurant in West Hollywood, Calif., started serving the hot stuff in 1936.

After World War II, chili parlors sprang up across Texas and other states. A bowl of chili with free soda crackers was an inexpensive meal.

Texas proclaimed chili as its state dish in 1977.

"We love the cookoff so much," says Kathleen Tolbert Ryan, of Grapevine, Texas (pop. 42,059), who directs the Tolbert-Fowler cookoff in tribute to her father, Frank. "I guess it just gets into your blood."

Last year, more than 100 chili cooks competed during the three-day Tolbert-Fowler event, which attracted 2,000 people.

Regional flavor

Differences of opinion long have been associated with making chili, whether the debate involved contest rules, personal tastes or regional variations.

Chili purists in Texas argue heatedly against adding beans of any sort, while California cooks can't imagine a bowl without them. In New Mexico, residents favor a traditional dish called chile verde, a green chile stew often made with chicken or pork. In the Midwest, folks relish Cincinnati-style chili, flecked with sweet spices like cinnamon and allspice, then served on top of spaghetti.

Chili fans canicker over meat, too. For family meals, many cooks brown ground beef, venison or pork. For competition chili, most contestants choose lean chuck roast cut into bite-sized cubes or coarsely ground. All chili cookoff regulations ban the addition of beans, rice or pasta so only primary flavors prevail.

Despite countless variations, all chili shares a common ingredient—chile peppers. Some cooks prefer peppering their pot with fiery hot haberos, while others choose milder green chilies. Many cooks skip fresh peppers altogether and simply sprinkle in store-bought chili powder.

That doesn't stop aficionados like Wilkins and Jones from putting their own chili recipes to the test at cookoffs across Texas and the nation. Packing tables, tarps, and utensils, bags of ingredients, and other gear, they spend their leisure time traveling thousands of miles each year to compete. Most meet fellow chiliheads and stay in travel trailers or motor homes they've bought since catching chili cookoff fever.

Contestants travel the chili circuit to earn enough points to qualify for the three national championships. Winners typically receive trophies and ribbons rather than cash

prizes because entry fees usually fund charitable causes such as college scholarships and public libraries.

The exception is during ICS's championship when a \$25,000 prize is awarded to the winner in the "traditional red" division, and the chili verde champ receives \$3,000.

Chili champion

Roger Foltz of Mesquite, Texas (pop. 124,523), made chili history last year when he won CASI's grand championship title and missed first place by one point at the Tolbert-Fowler cookoff.

"There was only one other better thing in my life," Foltz says of the moment he won the CASI title, "and that was the birth of my three children."

Selecting a CASI champion involves a team of 351 judges—supplied with bite-sized pieces of carrot, celery, and cheese for

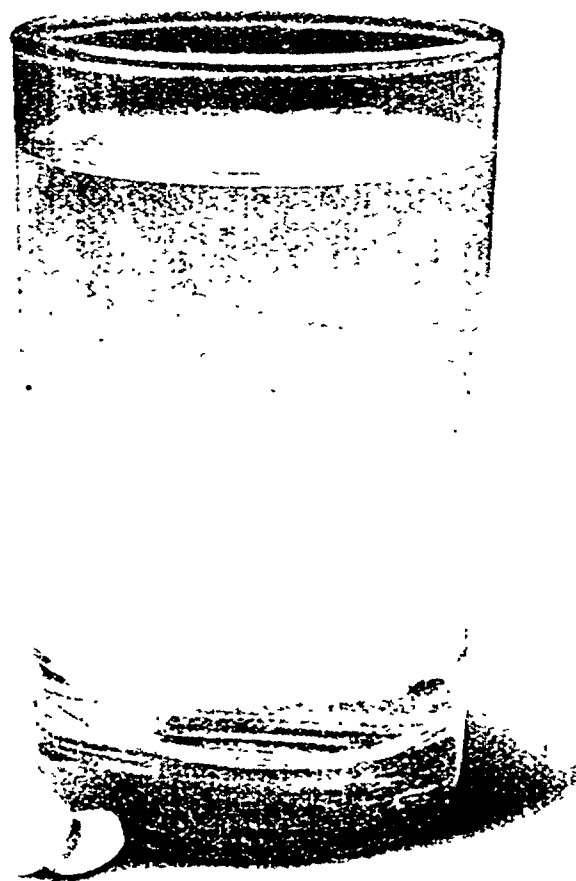

THE NEW MEDICARE PRESCRIPTION DRUG COVERAGE

AARP is a nonprofit, nonpartisan membership organization for people age 50 and over. And currently nothing is more important for this group than navigating the new Medicare prescription drug coverage (Part D). By now you have probably heard about or received an overwhelming amount of competing information. This insert cuts through some of the clutter to give you a quick and easy overview of the program. But we encourage you to learn more. There's a list of good sources on the back page of this insert. AARP also has a free **What You Need to Know About the New Medicare Prescription Drug Coverage** guide available to everybody, member or not.

WHO IS COVERED?

Are you on Medicare? Congratulations, you are eligible for the new drug coverage. And you can't be denied. It's a voluntary program, so if you don't want it, you don't have to enroll.

You may have prescription drug coverage from your insurance plan, a managed care plan, a former employer or a state assistance program. Each plan works differently with Medicare. For a copy of our free guide, "What You Need to Know About the New Medicare Prescription Drug Coverage" (D18350) or in Spanish (D18352), visit www.aarp.org/medicarerx or call **1-888-OUR-AARP (1-888-687-2277)**. THE IMPORTANT DATES TO REMEMBER

If you are enrolled in Medicare now, you'll need to join a plan between **November 15, 2005**, and **May 15, 2006**. For your coverage to begin **January 1, 2006**, you must sign up by **December 31, 2005**. Enroll between January 1, 2006, and May 15, 2006, and your coverage starts the first day of the month after you sign up. After May 15, you can join or switch plans every year from November 15 to December 31. You will also be able to enroll in a drug plan at the time you first enroll in Medicare.

IT DOESN'T PAY TO WAIT

There will be a penalty (a higher monthly premium) if you do not enroll when you are first eligible for Medicare or during the initial enrollment period and decide to join later. The longer you wait, the more the penalty. You should find out soon if any current prescription drug coverage you may have is as good as the new Medicare coverage. If not, you can sign up for a Medicare drug plan at a later date without penalty.

DO YOU NEED MEDICARE PRESCRIPTION DRUG COVERAGE?

Answering this question requires thinking about the future. Even if you don't think you need Medicare prescription coverage now, you might need it later on down the road. The facts are that drug use increases with age, and on average, someone who is 75 years old may expect to spend about 25% more in a year than someone who is 65 years old. And remember, waiting to sign up means you will pay more.

Right now the average person on Medicare spends \$966 of their own money each year on prescription drugs. Beginning January 1, 2006, Medicare's prescription drug program will offer a voluntary way for you to reduce these unexpected high costs. The greatest benefit of signing up now is gaining peace of mind for things that may happen later.

WHICH PLAN WILL YOU CHOOSE?

This is an important question you'll want to put some care and time into answering. You have many choices. All the plans are private. And while they must meet basic Medicare guidelines and be Medicare-approved, each is slightly different — from the drugs they cover to how they structure your costs and where you can get your drugs. Take a good look at these offers and see how they compare.

We know how stressful it is to wade through all of the information you are receiving. AARP encourages you to utilize the resources listed on the back of this insert, including our free educational guide, to clear up any questions you might have.

WILL YOU SAVE MONEY ON YOUR PRESCRIPTIONS?

Each plan negotiates lower prices with drug companies on your behalf. When you pay for drugs within the plan, you have access to discounted drugs. But not every drug is available on every plan. Each plan has its own list of preferred drugs (formulary). And the lists differ from plan to plan. Monthly premiums will vary, but some plans will have premiums under \$20 per month.

CRUNCHING THE NUMBERS

Will you save money on this plan? Millions will. Here are the basics on how the numbers work. When you join a plan, you'll usually pay a monthly premium, a co-pay for prescriptions and have to meet an annual deductible. Remember, plans vary. After you've met your annual deductible, the plan begins to pay some of your prescription drug costs. But remember, the new Medicare prescription drug coverage is about more than just saving money now. It's about protecting yourself from future expenses.

Programs in your area have already begun to distribute information on costs, covered drugs and network pharmacies. You can also find this information and compare plans by visiting www.medicare.gov. For information call 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227).

Individuals with limited income can get extra help to pay premiums and co-pays. In June the Social Security Administration (SSA) mailed applications to some of those who may qualify. If you did not receive this and feel you may be eligible, call 1-800-772-1213. "cleansing the palate"—who sample spoonfuls of chili and pare 337 entries down to one outstanding winner.

"There were four top-notch chilis this time," says Ronny Dodson, the Brewster County (Texas) sheriff who has judged chili at Terlingua for 11 years. "They had just the right texture. They weren't too dry or too spicy."

Even in the wake of such thorough testing, some will argue—naturally—on what constitutes a championship-worthy bowl of chili.

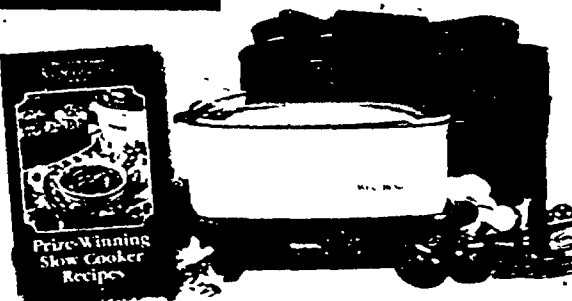

Home Inventory Made Easier

Anyone who has experienced property loss and had to make an insurance claim knows how important it is to document their possessions. An inventory is a record of what you own with a description of the articles and their value. While the task of taking a household inventory may seem daunting, the process can be made much easier with the use of a digital camera and home inventory software for your computer.

"Very few people are able to remember everything they own, so having an inventory gives you one less thing to worry about," says Kip Diggs, a representative of State Farm Insurance in Bloomington, Ill.

A digital camera helps create an itemized record of possessions because it generates an image that can be printed, embedded in a printed document, or saved on a CD. The image can be manipulated and enlarged so it can identify details, such as the serial number on electronics or intricate markings on a piece of silver.

A detailed inventory should include everything of value inside your home, including furniture, jewelry, artwork, antiques, collectibles, appliances, kitchen contents, clothes, linens, computer equipment, televisions, electronic equipment, musical instruments, tools and sporting gear.

The goal is to document this information:

- Item description and quantity
- Manufacturer or brand name
- Model or serial number
- Description of where (or how) the item was obtained
- Date of purchase or age of item
- Receipt or other proof of purchase, showing cost
- Current value or replacement cost
- Photocopies of any appraisals

Creating an inventory is time consuming, so break it down into workable segments. Make sure the digital camera's time and date are set correctly and then tackle one room at a time. First photograph an overview of the room from several different

locations, then take individual shots of each item as you work your way around the room. Open cabinet doors and drawers and photograph what's inside. Remove any items that are difficult to see and photograph them on a tabletop where you can get close-ups of identifying features.

The process of transferring images to a home inventory document can be handled by software that connects the camera to the computer. Most home inventory software allows you to imbed digital images into a document so you can create a complete inventory with images and descriptions.

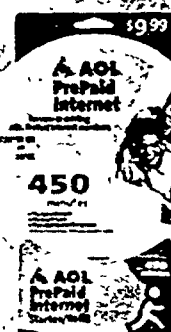
Free inventory software is available on the Internet. The Insurance Information Institute offers "Know Your Stuff Home Inventory" software at its website, www.knowyourstuff.org.

At www.statefarm.com, type "Property Matters" in the search box and you'll also be directed to free downloadable software. In addition, the website makes available an extensive checklist that can be found by typing "Inventory Checklist" in the search box. Make sure to print out the checklist and fill it in.

To store the inventory, you have several options. Burn the file onto a CD and save it in a safety-deposit box; save it on a hard drive and e-mail it to yourself and a family member for safe keeping; or make a printout of the report to have a hard copy. Of course, the best advice is to do all three. ★

Avoiding the Flu

Flu season is just around the corner and that means it's time to get serious about staying healthy and protecting yourself against the viral illness that can make you feel miserable.

Influenza viruses are spread in the droplets of moisture released when an infected person coughs or sneezes. So it's easy for people to become infected by opening a doorknob, exchanging money or pushing a shopping cart, and then touching their mouth or nose.

Each year, 5 percent to 20 percent of the U.S. population gets the flu, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and 36,000 people die from the illness and the complications it causes. That's why, along with an annual flu shot, anticipating and avoiding situations where you can pick up the virus just makes good sense.

Hygiene is fundamental

Wash your hands thoroughly and often and use plenty of soap and water. That's the anti-flu advice of health care professionals.

"Use plenty of hot soap and water and rub your hands together," says Sherri Dodson, a registered nurse and program director for the Butler County Health Department in Poplar Bluff, Mo. (pop. 16,651). "We recommend you wash them for about the length of time it takes to sing *Happy Birthday* to yourself twice." To prevent re-infection, use a paper towel or your elbow to shut off the water faucet.

At a minimum, wash your hands three times a day and more often during peak flu season, especially if you have contact with someone who already is ill, adds Laura Fullerton, a nurse practitioner with the Knox County Health Department in Galesburg, Ill. (pop. 33,706). "The point is to get the germs off your hands so you don't pick up the virus," Fullerton says.

Get immunized

While proper hygiene is a good way to reduce your risk of infection, an annual flu shot is an even better deterrent.

"Getting immunized helps you develop antibodies to the three strains of flu that are expected to be common in any given year," Fullerton says. "The shot not only protects you, it can protect those around you because it prevents the virus from multiplying and spreading."



Flu-fighting Strategies

- Getting sufficient sleep to boost your immune system and eating plenty of fruits and vegetables, which are rich in disease-fighting nutrients.
- Staying home if you're sick. You can pass the flu to others beginning one day before you have symptoms and up to five days after you get sick.
- Using liquid hand-sanitizers when soap and water aren't available. Every time you shake hands with someone, use currency to pay for something or touch any object that another person has touched, the risk of infection increases.
- Disinfecting shared objects and surfaces such as telephone receivers and computer keyboards. When possible, put a barrier such as a paper towel or tissue between your hand and contagion-rich surfaces such as doorknobs or the coffeepot handle.
- Staying out of crowds, especially in January and February, the height of the flu season, also reduces chances for infection.

Timing is critical when it comes to getting the flu shot. Late October or November are the best times to get vaccinated, but getting vaccinated in December or even later can be beneficial. Flu season can begin as early as October and last into May.

"It takes the body about two weeks to develop antibodies and that immunity lasts three to four months," Fullerton says.

Flu symptoms include a high fever, headache, fatigue, dry cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose and muscle aches. Complications can include bacterial pneumonia, dehydration and worsening of chronic medical conditions, such as congestive heart failure, asthma or diabetes.

While a flu shot is a good idea for everyone, Fullerton and Dodson recommend that people over age 65, young children, health care workers and those who are caretakers for others get immunized. It's also a good idea for people who are in regular contact with the public—schoolteachers, store clerks and workers in large offices—to get immunized.

"Protecting yourself and others against the flu is a matter of immunity," Dodson says. "If as many people as possible are immunized, it cuts everyone's risk and reduces the chances of the flu becoming an epidemic." ☆


