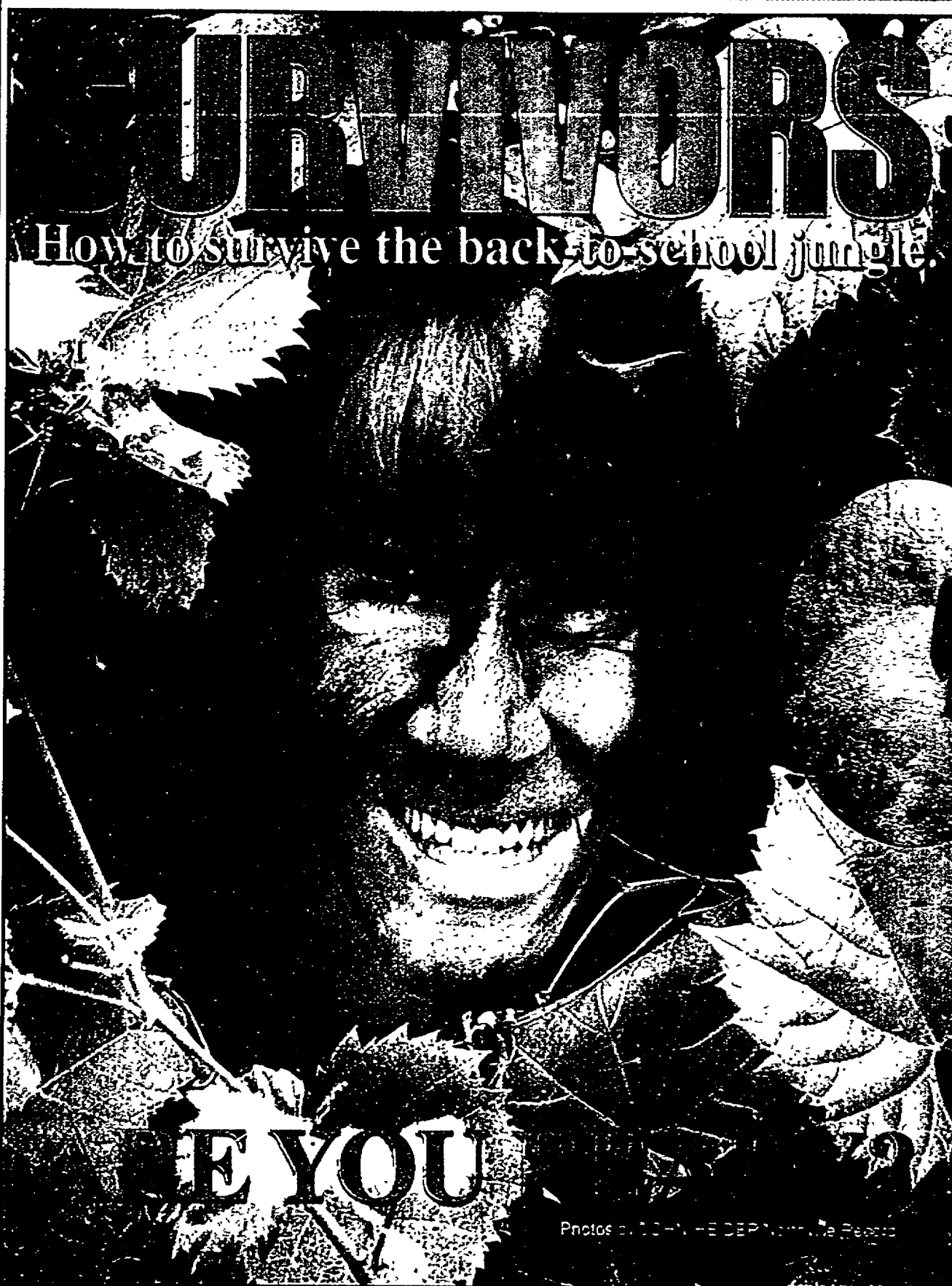

How to survive the back-to-school jungle

Three days in, students brace for long haul

You're already in it — the thick of the first days of school. And like foraging through the jungle, navigating a pathway through Northville High School can be like an adventurous reality game show. Only as students, you have no choice but to stay the course. Seldom are teens asked to extinguish their flames and leave the building immediately.

Relief? Forget it. Your first break is Thanksgiving, and you get no full vacation until Christmas. The challenge is great: The predators are fierce.

Trouble on the 10th

Homeowner teed-off by damage caused from errant golf balls

Northville Township resident Wayne Avers had enough when he found another window was broken in his house.

It was hit by a golf ball. "It's dangerous," Avers said. "If I had been sitting on the couch and the golf ball had gone all the way through, it would have ended up on my lap."

For the last three years, Avers and his wife, Carol, have lived on Tournament Drive on Northville

Hills Golf Course.

His home is located near the course's 10th teeing area.

Avers, who doesn't golf, said everything was fine the first year they lived there.

But about two years ago, Avers said, stray golf balls were being hit into his yard and through his windows. He said he's replaced six windows in his house because they were broken by golf balls.

"The windows are not the issue," Avers said. "If I can't

Bluegrass slated for new location

When the Victorian Festival parade sashays into Northville Sept. 15, the saloon that debuted last year will strut right behind it.

"This is more of the Old West, country, Victorian theme," said Jody Humphries, president of the festival host, Northville Chamber of Commerce. "It is fun. We'll see all kinds of costumes."

"It was almost like an adult homecoming last year, people saw people they hadn't seen in years."

After the parade Friday, the

saloon stage will feature Company of Strangers, known for their bluegrass and Celtic influenced music. For Saturday night, the chamber hired the RFD Boys, who mix between-song humor with bluegrass tunes.

"They are regulars at The Ark in Ann Arbor," Humphries said, adding both bands are new to the saloon stage this year.

said, while playing on the teeter-totter after the opening ceremony of Northville Community Park, located along Five Mile between Beck and Ridge roads.

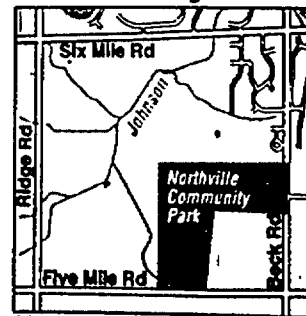
Katlyn's mom wasn't teeter-tottering after the ceremony; she and her friend, Joanne Buckingham, sang the park's praises.

A rock star to students

With a teacher's help, kids' interest in nature soars

When Heidi Capraro tells her students she's going to a rock party, she's not talking about a Coldplay concert. A onetime Michigan Teacher of the Year, she's a self-described "earth science geek" whose hands-on style engages students. Now she has left the classroom for the assistant principal's office with another goal in mind. This is her story.

Heidi Capraro, 39, is the kind of teacher who makes students want to be one when they grow up. "I get bored quickly," Heidi says. "I'm kind of like a sixth-grader in a bigger body."

That's a plus for the students she has taught at Hillside Middle School, and the new teachers she mentors in her second year as Hillside's assistant principal.

Heidi's teaching methods were shaped by her father, who was a Utica schools science teacher; her husband, who is an artist; and her daughter and son, Riccardo Capraro, her husband, does exquisitely detailed bird sketches now, but he struggled in a conventional classroom.

"I realized how many of these kids I have in my classroom," Heidi says. "If they're not getting what's in the book or the writing on the board, there's got to be some other way they excel."

In her sixth-grade science classroom, she limited lectures to 10 minutes or less and always used visual prompts. People learn best when presented with a mix of audio, visual and hands-on manipulative instruction, Heidi says.

So she brings in rocks, for example, harvested from friends who are amateur geologists. When she takes her kids to a rock party, the games that ensue are incorporated into her classroom.

Heidi was recognized with a Presidential Award for Excellence in Science Teaching in 2002. When she was selected as the Michigan Teacher of the Year, Heidi spent 2004-05 touring the state.

■ Five ways to help your kids excel

- **Focus on organization.** Teach organizational skills, Heidi says. Corral school papers that flood the house. Decide where school papers go, and show kids where they go. When a test comes home with a grade, put it in a labeled class folder. Heidi says some kids get confused by papers caught in limbo — assigned one day but not due until a few days later. Heidi's kids used a manila folder brought home from Heidi every day with handouts. "Find a system that works for your child," Heidi says.

- **Articulate doable goals for your kids.** Heidi's daughter maintains a school assignment book. It's not enough for Ariana to write "no homework" under science class after a particular day. Heidi requires Ariana to write a few words about what she did learn in science that day and if upcoming quizzes were announced.

- **Be clear about consequences.** Consequences need to be immediate and meaningful. For example, when Heidi's daughter didn't maintain her assignment book, Heidi didn't let her go to her beloved Brownie Scout meeting.

- **Read with your kids.** Heidi likes classics, in part because they can spur history lessons in which parents can describe eras.

- **Got a problem? Talk to the teacher.** Heidi says e-mail is fine to clarify questions. But she likes calls or face-to-face conversations if parents have major concerns. "You're going to be building a long-term relationship." E-mail may not convey the emotion and the personal relationship, she says.

After her year away, Heidi shifted career gears. "I realized I had the ability now and the responsibility to do more than teach in my classroom," Heidi says.

"I realized new teachers were looking up to me." The knock against assistant principals is that they're the school disciplinarians. Heidi views the position as an administrator who helps teachers through personal experience.

"I think I owed it to the profession," Heidi says. "But there are times that I would give anything to go back into the classroom."

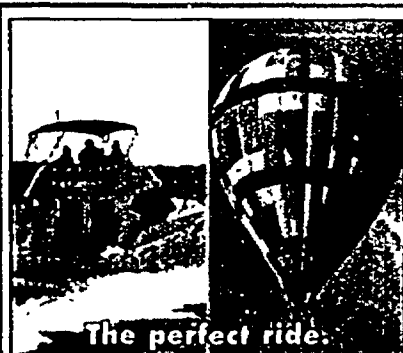

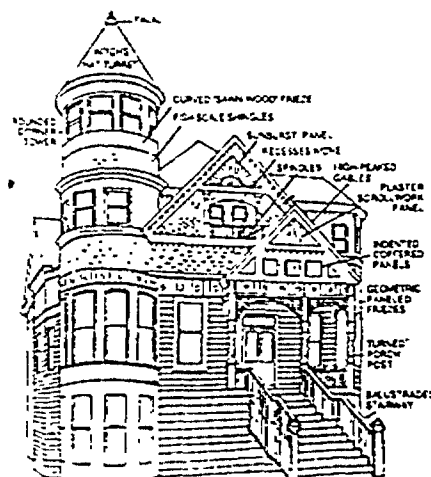

afford to replace windows, then I shouldn't be living here. I have a 19-month old granddaughter. I don't want anyone to get hurt."

Avers said he documented 250 golf balls were hit onto his property in 2004. In 2005, he documented 150 golf balls hit into his yard.

Avers wants the golf course to move the teeing area to the right or perhaps plant some evergreens to help keep the golf balls out of his yard.

Avers said he's talked to his attorney about the problem, as well as the township's planning commission and golf course officials.

Avers said the issue could lead to a lawsuit against the golf course.

"The planning commission has been very supportive," Avers said. "The golf course agreed to do some things. They've planted trees, but it doesn't help."

Jennifer Frey, director of community development for the township, said the municipality has looked into the 10th tee problem.

"The golf course was approved back in 1996 and a lot of precautions were taken in looking at the design," Frey said. "The township is following up with our attorney as to what roles and responsibilities the township has in this."

Township Treasurer Richard Henningsen said he personally thought the tee should be moved.

"That's my uneducated solution," he said. "I think it could be moved, but I'm not paying

The golf course management recently asked the township's zoning board of appeals to allow them place a net along Eight Mile, but the board unanimously denied the request.

Abbo kicked the first soccer ball onto the refurbished field after thanking residents for supporting the land acquisition and development millage that paid for the park's \$4 million expansion.

Costs included cleaning up the property, next to the Robert Scott Correctional Facility, as well as developing the property into a park.

"Anything worthwhile is never easy," Abbo said. The 242-acre park used to be empty space.

Now it includes a playground, a dog park, one practice soccer field, five soccer fields and two lacrosse fields.

"I think it's great, we should have (the park)," township trustee Marv Gans said. "This was a no-brainer."

Gans said in the future, the park will also have two basketball courts and six sand volleyball courts.

No date has been set for the future park amenities.

"It depends on when the board feels it's able to do it," Gans said.

Trustee Brad Werner also revealed in the park's opening by watching local children play on the playground.

"I love it. I'm really happy to see it open," he said. "From five years ago to today — it's amazing. I want to say 'thank you' to the community."

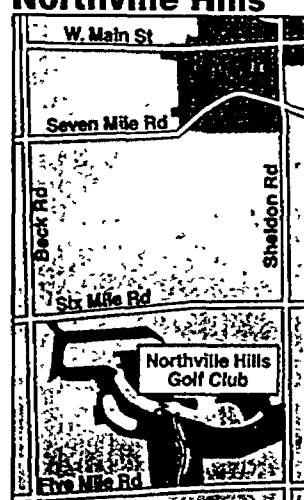

M.O.M.S. share outreach opportunities, child-rearing challenges

If Karen DeMeo's twins are asleep in their carseats when she grabs her newspaper from the mailbox, she devours a few paragraphs while she's still in the van.

The stay-at-home mom tries to keep current on community activities, chases after house-keeping and picks up one wailing baby at a time. The new mobility of 14-month-old Leyton and Ellie quickened the pace of her world.

But every other Monday morning, DeMeo drops the kids in her church's nursery, slips into a deep brown easy chair and emits a contented sigh: It's M.O.M.S. time.

M.O.M.S. helping moms

Weary mothers of newborns and seasoned moms of kindergartners gather at First United Methodist Church Monday mornings. They push strollers into the nursery, then join peers to share coffee and experiences, a guest speaker and two hours hands-free.

"They're right down the hall," DeMeo said. "If they need you, they'll come and get you."

Sometimes new mothers hold onto their infants during the program, she said. As M.O.M.S. president, DeMeo introduces the guest or topic during her break from her twins.

"We don't all necessarily look good — but that's O.K."

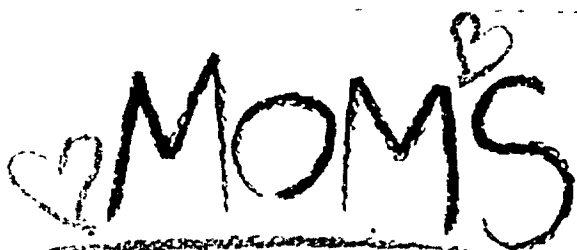
Elizabeth Strong, mother of Hannah, 7, and Christian, 4, said the interaction with fellow moms helped her recover from postpartum depression following the birth of her son.

What started as an opportunity to get out of the house turned into a gratifying assignment for the former nurse, who coordinates the group's outreach efforts.

DeMeo said the motherhood bond brings the 50 women together; shared experiences and community projects tighten the friendships.

"We know that there's another world out there," said DeMeo.

adding staying at home with young children needn't translate into tunnel vision. She said the group's outreach activities are an important and gratifying part of M.O.M.S. affiliation.

Strong said women who left professional ranks are willing and able to direct their energies toward service projects. "You're at home thinking, 'How can I be involved in my community?'" she said. "As one person it's overwhelming, but as a group we can make an impact."

Regular beneficiaries of the group's fund-raisers and donations are Northville's emergency service agency, Civic Concern, and women's shelter, First Step. Every month, moms and children visit Brighton Gardens assisted living facility.

The group also donates gifts to new moms with children in local hospital neonatal intensive-care units on Mother's Day. And they take care of their own members, providing meals for families coping with an illness or surgery.

"Sometimes what makes you feel good is helping other people," DeMeo said.

M.O.M.S. sharing

Family safe as basement fire claims Northville township home

No one was injured as a fire destroyed a home on the 16000 block of Highland Lane in Northville Township Sunday morning.

Fire Chief Bill Zhmendak said the fire department responded in three minutes after someone reported a basement was on fire.

"When we arrived, fire was already coming out of the basement windows," he said.

Zhmendak said Tuesday afternoon that the fire department is still investigating the cause of the blaze.

He said two firefighters attempted to fight the fire from the interior, but the intense heat, strong enough to melt their face masks, beat them back as they made their way down the basement steps.

"The gear we wear allows us to get deep into the root of the fire," Zhmendak said. "But to get to the seat of the fire or the center of the fire, this stuff would eventually melt. Everything has a melting point."

Zhmendak said there were five people in the home at the time of the fire, and all of them were outside by the time the fire department arrived. He said the wife was treated on the scene for smoke inhalation. He said the family's two dogs also escaped the blaze, but two or three cats have not yet been found.

POLICE BRIEFS

Crash 'em up derby

Last Friday, a 91-year-old Northville woman crashed into four parked cars before flipping her own vehicle upside-down.

Northville police reports indicated the 1993 Oldsmobile driver was "shook up" but not seriously injured and was taken by emergency rescue personnel to St. Mary Mercy Hospital in Livonia.

According to reporting officers, "She seemed confused and could not recall the accident."

Department officials said the driver was not ticketed because the incident occurred on private Cady Street property, adjacent to the Northville District Library. Officers said none of the vehicles the woman hit were occupied and all were legally parked. Police reports indicated the driver smashed into a Toyota and pushed it into a Mercury backing out of a parking space. Witnesses told police the driver backed up again and hit two Chryslers, ricocheting off vehicles, until striking a 3-foot stanchion which flipped her car.

Cash register emptied

An early Labor Day morning walker discovered a robbery at the Pizza Cutter, 340 N. Center St.

Northville police reports indicated an intruder entered the restaurant by breaking a window on the building's north side. The 49-year-old owner who officers called to the scene to unlock the door told police all that was missing was \$100 in start-up cash kept in the

register, the report said. According to police reports, the owner does not suspect current or past Pizza Cutter employees. Officers turned over footprint photographs and a flashlight and coins found near the broken window to the detective bureau. After collecting evidence at the scene, police questioned Rayson Street neighbors. The case remains open.

A 42-year-old Northville Township woman who left the pin number to her ATM card in her wallet is now a fraud victim. The woman told police she lost her wallet and when she called her bank to cancel the card, she learned it already had been used. More than \$200 was taken from her account.

Arts commission courting new audience with indie films

Eric Novak thinks indie films will play in town.

The 31-year-old writer, the newest member of the Northville Arts Commission, is riding the cultural wave sweeping down Main Street. With a hopping gallery circuit, a humming Art House venue and a host of art-related downtown events, a big-screen splash was inevitable.

"The whole arts commission feels we need to reach down and get the younger generation more involved in the arts," Novak said. "Movies are the way to get in contact with the younger generation."

On Wednesday night, the Marquis Theatre will premiere "InZero," a science-fiction short film shot entirely in Detroit.

Home-grown products

The Mitten Movie Project, dedi-

icated to showcasing the work of independent Michigan film makers, will debut in the hometown of InZero director, Jamie Sonderman.

Long-time arts commissioner Kathleen Tabaczynski helped hook up the indie film promoters with downtown theater owner, Inge Zayti. She said the movies expand the arts group's appeal, potentially adding showings a monthly basis.

"I think this is kicking it off," Tabaczynski said. "I think we're in a situation the Marquis is feeling it out."

"We want to help bring this to the community."

The movies will appeal to high school and college students as well as an older crowd, she said. Although the film screenings — like upcoming concerts planned at the Art House — are deliberately geared toward the younger generation.

"Film is one of the arts that

appeals to everyone — all ages — it's more palatable," Tabaczynski said. "I think it's a good way we're rounding out our offerings to the community."

New cultural trend

After InZero, the evening will continue with short films "Caught" and "Starlet," also produced in the area by local casts and crews.

Sonderman, who directed InZero and Starlet, won first place in the Visions of U.S. video competition, sponsored by the American Film Institute, for his short film, "The Empty Chair." Francis Ford Coppola, Tim Allen and LeVar Burton judged the competition.

Prior to the films, a reception will be held in the lobby from 6-7:30 p.m. attended by the directors, cast and crew.

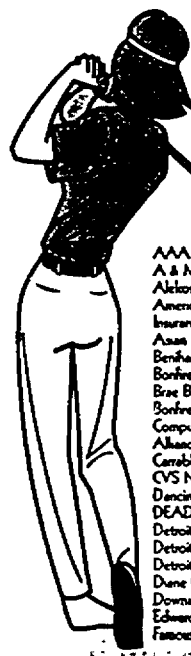

Welcome to the tavern

How's a Victorian saloon visitor to act? Politely, if you please.

The Lively 19th Century History Association's Web site details the tremendous social and economic flux of the 19th century and the impact on gentlemen's proper public behavior.

Bottom line: "If you wish to portray a refined 19th Century American, just do the things your mama taught you, and you are more than half way there already."

The history association presents the following background:

The Industrial Revolution created a consumer economy and a huge middle class with the means of purchasing consumer goods. This new middle class felt that they had arrived at a higher social plan of existence. The social norms of the farm and the tenement would not do for the family of a man who had made his way in the world.

The new middle class wanted to purchase

appropriate manners, just as they could purchase fashionable homes, stylish clothing or the latest domestic gadget. From the 1850s on, the market was flooded with etiquette books which laid out to people who had never been exposed to such things, the rules of "polite society."

Ironically, these rules were based upon the norms of the 18th Century aristocratic society which the middle class had supplanted and rendered obsolete. Many 19th Century Americans saw the manners of "polite society" as contrary to the egalitarian nature of America.

Hifalutten manners were a thing of the decadent Old World. This often manifested itself in loud, coarse and rough behavior and downright rudeness — especially on the part of the have-nots towards the haves.

There was a gradual shift, however. As the century wore on, the norms of the middle class diffused throughout society, and "coarse behavior" became far less the norm in 1900 than it was in 1800.

By the 20th Century, a watered down version of middle class manners had become the property of the entire society.

The manners of the 19th Century, as expressed in etiquette books, included rules:

- Don't chew with your mouth open.
- Don't interrupt people.
- Don't be a lot of bother when you are a house guest.

Police: 'Columbine' messenger still at large

The pencil-drawn message — "Columbine can happen" — is long gone.

But Northville Township police still don't know if the author of that message, discovered March 29, on the wall of a Northville High School lower-level boys' bathroom wall, has vanished as well.

Sgt. Matt Mayes of the Northville Township Police Department said police still don't know who wrote the message.

"There are no current suspects," Mayes said. "There were many interviews and follow-up of potential suspects, but there have been no further suspects developed or further leads at this time."

The building was evacuated after the message was discovered and the school was put on lock down over the course of the rest of the week.

Township police and K-9 units from multiple city and federal police units searched the building. Nothing was found, and no one was arrested.

Police departments from Dearborn, Ann Arbor, Macomb County and Washtenaw County along with the U.S. Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms

The investigation cost the police department \$4,500.

Previously, Northville Township Police Chief John Werth said, if caught, the police department would seek financial restitution from anyone involved.

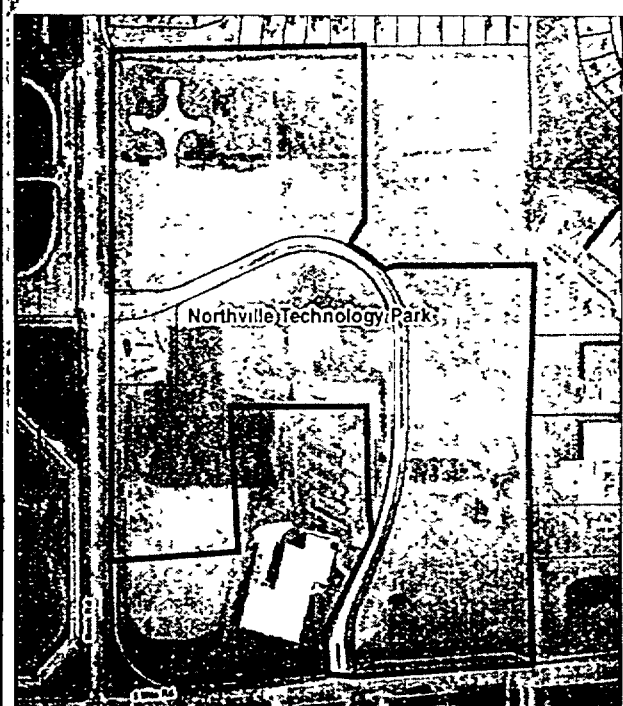

Words of advice about looking both ways and crossing with signals are not trite when a child's safety is at risk.

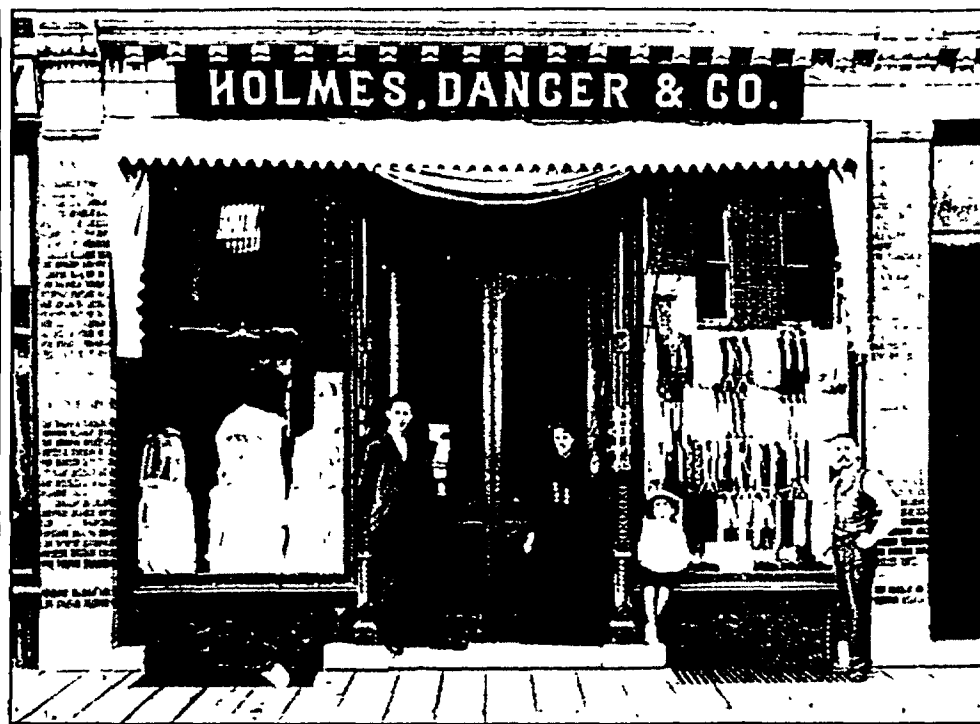

Election year math does not add up

"Things that make you say, 'hmm'"

The annual Lansing budget dance is over and there is much to make you shake your head, wonder and say, "hmm" about.

Where is this new revenue coming from to provide increases to universities, community colleges, K-12 schools, additional state police and other politically popular programs? There is enough new money to expand the base budget while Michigan remains in the dumps economically? Hmm?

Don't get me wrong, I want to believe the revenue will be there for these programs. Yet, I have not heard one economist say that the next 12-month economic outlook looks any better for Michigan.

In fact, in a recent article, Dana Johnson, chief economist for Comerica Bank said, "Michigan's employment situation may get worse before it gets better because the state still hasn't felt the full force of the auto industry job cuts. We will see a big drop in employment in the next six months, reflecting those buyouts."

To compound matters, the Ford Motor Company is hitting the gas pedal on its North American restructuring effort after posting a \$254 million loss for the second quarter of 2006, meaning more job cuts and plant closings are coming sooner rather than later. The announcement that auto production is being cut by 21 percent does not bode well for white or blue collar jobs in Michigan. Further, the Ford cuts will trickle down to their major suppliers causing a ripple effect of additional layoffs.

Nouriel Roubini, president of Roubini Global Economics and a senior economist in the White House and Treasury Department in the late 1990s, was quoted as saying the U.S. economy is headed for a recession that will be "much nastier, deeper and more protracted recession than in 2001."

Michigan has pneumonia!

Dr. Roubini, writing on his blog stated, "The impact of the bursting of the bubble will affect every household in America, not just the few people who owned significant shares in technology companies during the dot-com boom. Prices are falling even in the Midwest, which never experienced a bubble, 'a scary signal' of how much pain the drop in household wealth could cause."

Michigan's home foreclosures are up and the housing market that has spurred the national economy is cooling off. Luxury home builder, CEO, Robert Taft was recently quoted in the Wall Street Journal as saying: "It is the first downturn in the 40 years since we entered the business that was not precipitated by high interest rates, a weak economy, job losses or other macro-economic factors."

Further, the national economy is slowing down and is expected to stay subdued. What is that old

saying, "When the nation's economy catches a cold — Michigan gets pneumonia?" Hmm.

Other troubling trends that do not bode well for the people of Michigan or the state budget include:

- U.S. census figures reinforce what people in our communities already know: times are tough in Detroit, where three in every 10 people live in households earning less than \$19,350, the federal poverty threshold.

- Union membership, and the middle class wages they produce have declined during 2005 to 20.5 percent of Michigan workers, its lowest level since at least the late 1980s. This is a drop from 21.6 percent in 2004 and from 26 percent in 1989, according to the Chicago regional office of the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Further, the State Senate recently passed, and the Governor supports, an income tax credit for low-income workers. This laudable action, will further reduce the revenue available to the state by an estimated \$95 million in 2008 and \$250 million in 2009. Without a corresponding budget reductions or revenue (tax) increase this action will cause further budget strain.

This dog don't hunt

The state budget that has not been solvent enough to provide significant increases to education over the past three years and, lo and behold, in an election year when nothing has improved economically, suddenly there is money available? There is an old southern saying that seems to fit: "This dog don't hunt!"

This same budget prolongs seven consecutive years of state government either cutting or flattening their revenue-sharing for local government — forcing local governments to either raise taxes or cut local services.

The Reality

Could it be that the budget is nothing more than an election year shell game to pull the wool over the voters eyes by providing increases (in theory) to politically popular programs in a cynical attempt to garner votes? Hmm?

Is it the classic shell game that will leave Michigan citizens without the promised services after the election? The response will go from "hmm" to "How did that happen?"

Real leadership means telling the truth

Michigan government, like the domestic auto industry has a structural budget morass that requires bold, honest leadership to solve. Many Capital observers believe the election year state budget will be nearly one billion dollars out of whack before we enter the second week of the new year. The typical Lansing response will be a fake shock, like they did not know this reality

would come home to roost. The only thing that will have transpired is the election will have passed; the structural budget problem will remain.

The nonpartisan Citizen Research Council (CRC) has for over 90 years provided factual, unbiased, independent information on issues concerning state and local units of government. The CRC concluded in its March 2006 report, Michigan's Budget Crisis and Prospects For the Future: "Permanent solutions to Michigan's structural budget crisis will require structural changes. The economy and state revenues in a period of continuing expansion will not grow enough to keep up with the growth of costs associated with maintaining current policies and programs." (see the report at www.crcmich.org)

Real change requires real change

In late 2004, while serving as State Superintendent of Michigan Schools, I wrote a report (Structural Issues Surrounding Michigan School Funding in the 21st Century) that identified the looming state structural budget deficit and pending pension and health care crisis facing our public schools. These problems are coming home to roost.

Even if the promised school funding materializes, it will not provide the necessary resources for new text books, technology, adding new science and math teachers or providing necessary quality professional development. These investments are needed to prepare our children of the 21st century knowledge economy. The new money the Governor and the Legislature have promised will be absorbed by rising health and pension costs. Pending Challenges

The 2006-07 State budget, does not even take into account the potential budget consequences of three ballot initiatives that will likely face voters this November: The Michigan Civil Rights Initiative, Education Funding Guarantee and Stop Overspending (SOS).

Like your family, the state only has three ways to balance its budget: cut expenses, raise revenues or a combination of both. Pretending is not a choice.

Hmm!

Michigan sinks; status quo stinks

Sorry to hit you with this, especially after a nice Labor Day weekend. But the news for Michigan is bad. Very bad.

The facts are clear, cold and come from five years of U. S. Census data released last week. The main points:

- Michigan's median household income (adjusted for inflation) fell from \$52,323 in 1995, when the stock market was booming, to \$46,039 in 2005, when the bottom started falling out of the automobile industry. That's a 12 percent drop. Put another way, Michigan's "Joe Six Pack" just became "Joe Five Pack."

- This didn't just hit working stiffs. The decline was pretty much across the board, from rich areas to poorer ones. In wealthy Oakland County, median household income fell 11.7 percent, while Wayne County families were 14.4 percent worse off.

- Family income in urban Ingham County (Lansing, Michigan State University) fell by 11 percent, while neighboring, rural Eaton County families were down 18.5 percent.

- Nineteen percent of Michigan children live in poverty. That's up sharply from six years ago. Nearly a third of African-American families are now below the poverty level.

- The expert opinion comes from David Littmann, the longtime chief economist for Comerica and now senior economist for the Mackinac Center told the Detroit Free Press: "I hate to superimpose worse news on top of bad news. We're in a secular decline here in Michigan. As the economy slows nationally, we're going to sink much further relative to the other states. We've only just begun."

- "We're going to see Michigan sink to levels that no one has ever seen. We're going to be looking at the highest unemployment

rates in the nation for the next five to 10 years."

Talk about a bucket of cold water in the face!

The context is as simple as it is stark. Michigan is facing its worst economic crisis since the Great Depression. While the automobile industry (both management and labor) is undergoing its long, inevitable, grinding restructuring, there isn't much that publishing, institutions or policy-makers can do in the short run.

But over the long run, sensible public policy has to be tailored to the dimensions of the crisis in order to shorten the period of transition and lay the foundation for a better future for us all.

So far, the response from our political leaders might best be termed "remorseless incrementalism."

In plain English, what that means is that too many of them are putting their heads in the sand when it comes to dealing with our major problems. Instead, they have a single-minded obsession with reducing business taxes. Nor does the public have any confidence in our elected leaders anymore. I've been talking with lots of Michigan folks about our economic troubles over the past few months; to a person, they say the best response from the politicians would be to get the hell out of the way. Not a pretty picture.

My view is simple. Michigan is so economically damaged, its politics so splintered and its civil society so threatened that we need radical measures. That means a far-reaching, breathtaking, but broadly acceptable restructuring plan. History has seen something like this before—namely, the Marshall Plan—the great device by which America saved and rebuilt Western Europe after World War II.

What might a "Marshall

Plan for Michigan" look like? It would focus on growing a brain-based knowledge economy in place of a brawn-based manufacturing base. It would require a dramatically more skilled and educated work force.

It would concentrate on attracting and retaining in Michigan talented and ambitious people, especially the young. For when you're in the trouble we're in, nothing trumps energy and talent.

A proper Marshall Plan for Michigan would also require a tough-minded review of our state's antique, built-in spending priorities.

We need to ask whether what we spend on prisons, Medicaid and generous benefits for public sector employees really helps get us where we need to go. And it would demand we concentrate our resources on what makes Michigan really distinctive, whether the Great Lakes or our great universities.

Where is this thinking going to come from? Forget the politicians in Lansing. Instead, we need to convene our best minds and our most dedicated assets, from far-seeing business leaders who see their assets withering to the experts resident in our universities and the stewards of Michigan's great philanthropic foundations.

The assignment: Design a Marshall Plan for Michigan. If it is as far-reaching and broadly acceptable as it could be, its very presence will compel attention and diligence from the political system.

The hour is late. The situation is dire. The challenge is profound. Let's get on with it!

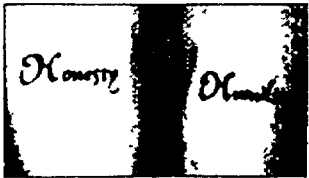

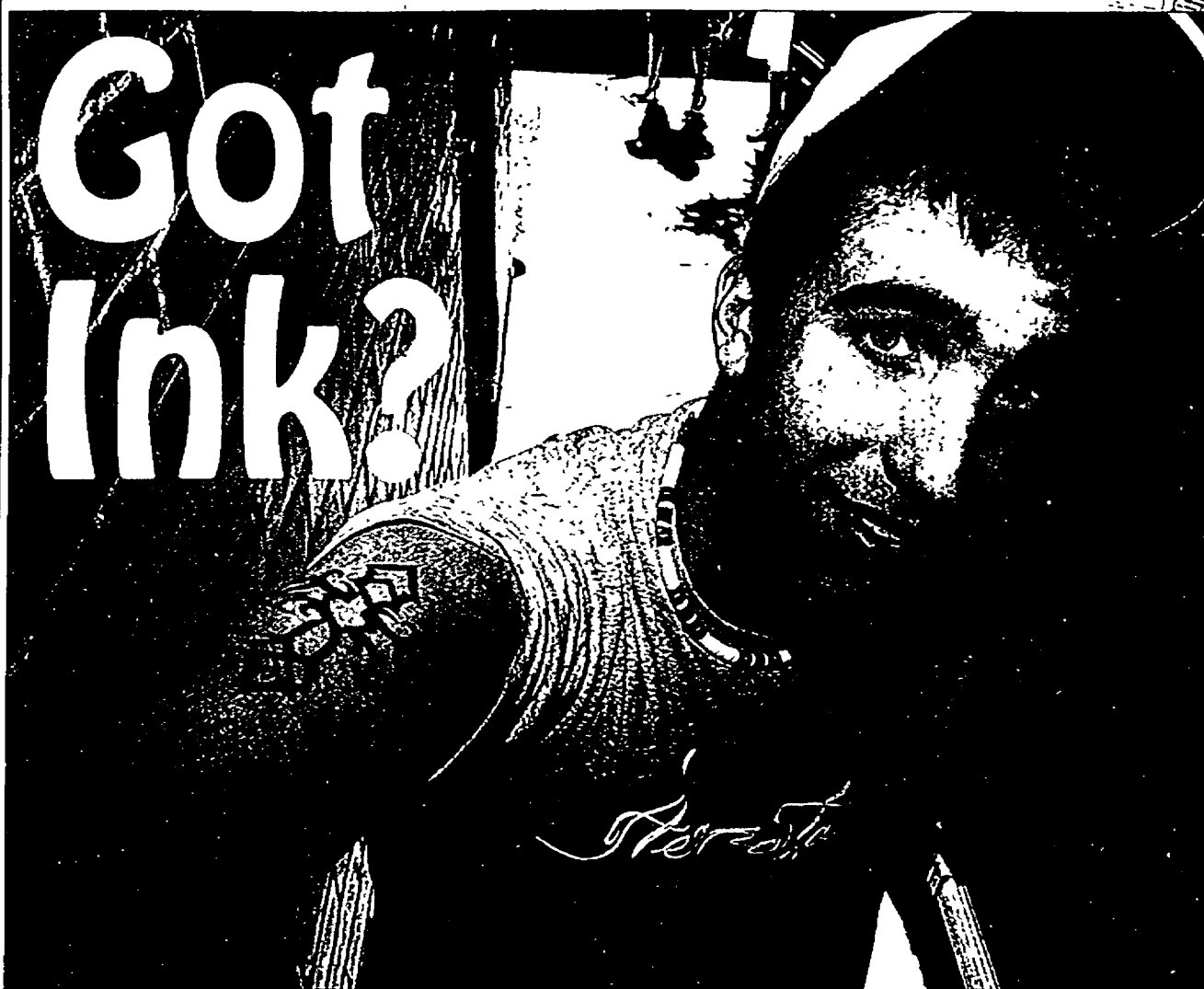

McGuire said, with his family's blessing, he got the \$100 tattoo while still a senior at Northville High School.

Graduating senior Mark Obermiller said his tattoo also represents family. He has his father's initials permanently inked on his body.

"I wanted to show respect for him," he said.

Obermiller already has his next art sketched. "It's a cross with wings attached," he said. "I designed it myself."

Give me edge

Ask any old schooler and they will tell you people with tattoos aren't what they used to be.

Once reserved for a few punks, body art is now popping up on teens from football players to straight-A students.

You're going on a job interview

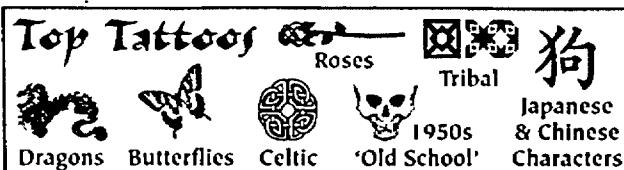
According to www.career-woman.com, 95 percent of employers interviewed said a

How you deal with it depends on who you are. Most take a vicious route. Spreading rumors and gossiping seems to be the favorite choice for all ages, especially in high school.

Gossip Begins

Surviving and avoiding this may be tougher than you think, but it's worth it in the end. According to Northville High School senior Alex Kendra, sometimes students find themselves trapped in the gossip cycle without even knowing it. "Avoiding this can easily be done by first catching yourself in the gossip and then trying to change the subject smoothly and quickly," he said. Changing the subject smoothly is key. Instead of dropping a quote from your favorite movie, try something subtle by using the topic you are talking about — but do not include the person.

There are always ways to avoid gossip, and if changing the topic does not work, just walk away and save yourself the trouble.

In high school, peer pressure is huge. Assemblies confront this issue and teach students how to overcome it. Unfortunately, the positive effect is only temporary, and the good feeling stops when you are confronted with the real issue.

The only real cure is knowing who you are and what you believe in. Coming back to school leaves more opportunities to be influenced by others because you are not surrounded by just your friends. Coming back to school also puts parents in overdrive, adding parental pressure into the mix.

Under Pressure

For Northville High School senior Michelle Mousseau, this divide becomes apparent every day after school. "On school nights, I'm not allowed out of the house much because my parents want me to stay home and study," she said. Mousseau said this lack of socialization during the week puts her in a dilemma with her friends. "When this happens, my friends get angry at me because I can not go out," she said.

Parents wanting their kids to stay home so they can do better in school is reasonable. But opposing pressures often puts the students in a very uncomfortable situation.

If you can't get out, your friends should understand. If they do not, just set aside one or two days every week for you to get together with your friends for a few hours.

It seems that every few years, students are pushed into choosing a career path earlier than necessary.

Starting at the end of junior high school, students must choose the future career field they wish to work in.

A choice must also be made between a four-year college, community college or life in general after high school.

These are serious questions given to a 13- or 14-year-old, which they must debate every year leading up to their senior year of high school.

It's Your Life

Northville High School graduate Adam Messina said Educational Development Plans mandated in high school did not help him determine what he wanted to do after high school.

"Family and friends affect a person's life, not what's written on a sheet of paper," he said.

For some students, writing down a career path stresses them out even more, if they do not know what they want their future to hold.

Just remember, what you decide to do in high school may affect what job you want, or where you want to go to college. But do not worry about all the small things that won't affect you in five years.

Have fun with your friends, and value the time you have in school.

Running man: Governor names resident fitness ambassador

Jerry Mittman recently ran into a pack of Northville High School runners. Traveling a Hines Park path, the 61-year-old runner encouraged the girls as he kept pace with their cross country training. He's hoping they're on a path for life, embracing physical fitness.

"It's not just running — it's an active lifestyle, running, walking, swimming," Mittman said. "What better example than by doing it with them?"

"I'm proud of it — being 61 and being active."

Northville resident Mittman promotes healthy living by example, by encouraging others — and now, by title.

Representing Oakland County, Mittman and 56 other statewide "fitness ambassadors" selected by the Governor's Council on Physical Fitness ran alongside Jennifer Granholm during her annual Labor Day five-mile jaunt across the Mackinac Bridge.

Healthy living

Mittman qualified for the title by participating in at least one running event endorsed by the Governor's Council on Physical Fitness prior to July 30. Years before that deadline, he was fulfilling the ambassador's role by developing a healthier lifestyle through regular activ-

ity. The fitness enthusiast who turned competitive runner at age 47 is the epitome of the state council's intent.

"Our ambassadors often show that age and ability are not necessarily road blocks to better health, and living a healthy lifestyle is obtainable and rewarding," said fitness council president Marilyn Lieber.

The governor's representatives were impressed by the dedication to community involvement Mittman detailed on his ambassador application, as well as his athletic accomplishments.

"The overwhelming majority want to convince people anyone can run," said Gail Hanna, manager of the physical fitness council office. "They want to convince people they can get up off the couch."

"We have quite a few who are just amazing stories — they've lost a lot of

weight or they're combating heart disease."

Family affair

Frequent travel during his Ford career prompted Mittman to seek a fitness regimen he could take anywhere. Running did not require an opponent. It was something he could do anytime, anywhere.

"All you have to do is take your shorts, your shoes and a shirt," he said. A competitor at heart, Mittman soon turned running for fitness into racing.

Retired seven years, he now combines pleasure trips with running events, often accompanied by his wife, Terry, daughters, Cheryl and Kathryn, son, Michael, and son-in-law David Check.

Internet sites have led him to marathons in Beijing, Budapest, Dublin,

London, Paris, Stockholm, as well as throughout the U.S.

The Mittmans were scheduled to leave yesterday for a run in Bordeaux, France, where he will run alongside his 31-year-old son. "It's not just me, it's a family event, too."

An Amsterdam marathon awaits in October, the final leg for Mittman to complete Running World Web site's suggested Top 10 marathons in the world.

Winning hobby

By the end of the summer, Mittman will have run 1,200 miles. He also bikes, climbs and lifts weights. "Primarily, running is the main focus," he said. "The others are for recreation and cross-training, pretty much."

Hines Park is Mittman's favorite route. He prefers asphalt to concrete. A daily run ranges three to 20 miles.

"You want this to be fun, not a chore," he said. "If it becomes a chore, you have to do something different — take some time off, change your route."

As for Mittman's practice of encouraging fellow runners, there's a reason: "If he picks up the pace and I pick up the pace, we're both winners."

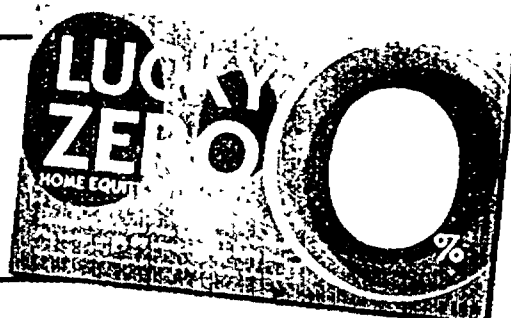

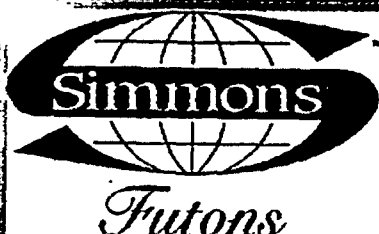

Mustangs beat Chargers on late TD, 17-10

LIVONIA — Northville running back Dittrick Williams was tired after carrying the ball 32 times Friday at Livonia Churchill.

But not too tired to take the 33rd handoff for the game-winning score from 4 yards out with 2:37 left in the ballgame.

"It felt good," Williams said smiling. "I'm really tired right now. It was a lot, but I want to put that on my shoulders to carry the team."

"If they need me, I'll come through."

The Mustangs cashed in late for a 17-10 win, evening their record at 1-1.

"I've very excited to get our first win. It didn't come until week three last year," Northville head coach Ryan Hockman said. "We played four quarters."

Williams was the focal point of the offense all night. He carried the ball 24 times in the first half for 105 yards. He opened the scoring with a 4-yard run to end the opening drive of the game.

The Mustangs drove 63 yards on 10 plays with Williams carrying the ball nine times for 57 of the yards.

"He usually gets better as the game goes on," Hockman said. "I was kind of mad at him a little bit, mid-game. I thought he was trying to pick and choose too much."

"I doubted him for about three series and then he looked me in the eye and said, 'I'm fine ... get me back in there.' He's a football player."

The Chargers wasted little time responding. Michael Berger returned the kickoff 72 yards, and Joseph Spiess rumbled in from 6 yards to score less than a minute after the Mustangs.

The only scoring the rest of the half came when Max Bojovic connected on a 25-yard field goal with 2:47 left in the half.

Chargers kicker Nicholas Barbas evened the score with a 37-yard boot with 7:28 left in the third quarter.

The Winning Drive

Both offenses sputtered through the second half until the Mustangs put together their final drive of the night, starting at their own 44 with 5:53 left to play.

Williams carried the first three plays for a first down. Quarterback Mike DeLuca hit Andrew Devine for an 18-yard gain. After another Williams run, DeLuca hit Cavan Corcoran for a 16-yard gain on a blown coverage play by the Chargers.

Corcoran came in motion, but no defender came with him, allowing an easy pitch and catch for a big gain to the Charger 4. Corcoran finished with four

catches for 59 yards.

Williams cashed in the next play for the game-winning score. He thanked his linemen after the game.

"All my linemen are good," he said. "It's going to boost our confidence a lot."

Williams finished with 33 carries for 147 yards and two scores.

The Chargers moved from their own 37 to the Mustang 37 but were unable to complete four straight passes. Kris Baumgardner ended all hopes with an interception to end the drive.

"We're getting there, but we've still got a long ways to go," Hockman said.

DeLuca finished the game 9-17

for 113 yards with one interception. He was 4-for-5 for 56 yards in the fourth quarter.

"I've got to continue to trust our quarterback and trust our receivers," Hockman said. "I'm gaining trust in them. When you make plays like we did there in the end of the game, you get trust."

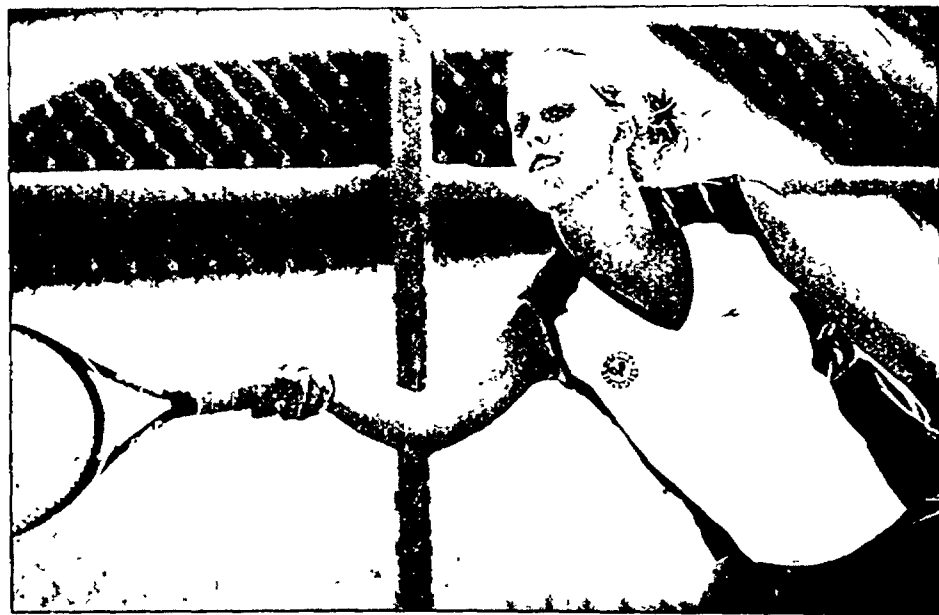

How to Avoid Roof Leaks?

Roofing problems can develop at any time. Most asphalt fiberglass shingles are made to last about 15 years, but roofs could begin to present some problems at the age of 8 to 10 years. Roof leaks are often difficult to find and can be the cause of significant structural damage that may appear sometime later.

SIGNS OF ATTIC LEAKS/MOISTURE:

- STRUCTURAL SAGGING: WAVE ROOF FRAME AND SHEATHING DAMAGED, WORN OR MISSING SHINGLES, MOSS GROWTH
- CORRODED FLASHING (AROUND CHIMNEY, DORMER VENTS AND IN VALLEYS)
- RAISED SHINGLES ALONG THE BOTTOM OF THE ROOF
- ICICLES HANGING FROM GUTTER IN THE WINTER (POTENTIAL ICE DAMS)
- STAINED, DISCOLORED OR DELAMINATING SHEATHING
- RUSTED NAILS AND RUST STAINS ON SHEATHING
- DAMP OR DISCOLORED INSULATION
- WATER SPOTS OR BLACK MARKS ON THE CEILING OR AT THE JUNCTION BETWEEN CEILING AND WALL
- WATER MARKS AROUND CHIMNEY, FIXTURES

SOURCES OF ROOF LEAKS / MOISTURE:

RAIN/WIND - Some roof problems occur when wind forces the rain under the edges of the roof or shingles. Two factors contributing to this phenomenon is an improperly sloped roof or failure to adhere, using roofing cement, the asphalt fiberglass shingle tabs in high wind areas.

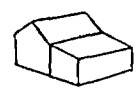
ICE DAM - is an accumulation of ice at the lower edge of a sloped roof. Then form when there is a layer of snow on the roof, which melts due to heat loss from the house into the attic. The water refreezes at the eave because it extends past the warm interior of the house and the backup of water seeps underneath the roof covering.

MOSS - Wood and built up roofs are vulnerable to the deterioration by moss for its ability to retain moisture and its root system penetrating the roof surface.

WATER VAPOR - Until the late 1970s residential construction codes did not require thermal or vapor barriers that are now standard practice. Exfiltration of warm moist air to drier colder air results in condensation (frost in the winter), mold, mildew and wood decay. It causes curling, cupping and shrinkage in asphalt/fiberglass shingles, corrosion of metal roofing and rotting of wood shakes and shingles.

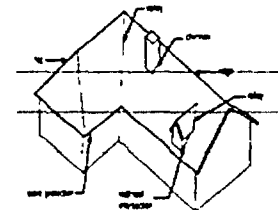
FACTORS CONTRIBUTING TO LEAKS/MOISTURE:

- POOR ROOF SLOPE DESIGN, INCORRECT SHINGLE INSTALLATION
- EXCESSIVE EXPOSURE LENGTH, IMPROPER JOINT LOCATIONS OR NO UNDERLAY ON WOOD SHAKE/SHINGLE ROOFS
- WATER PONDING OR CLOGGED ROOF DRAINS ON FLAT ROOFS
- MISSING OR DAMAGED SHINGLES, EXPOSED NAILS

- To remove one's gloves when making a formal call.
- To stare around the room.
- For a caller who is waiting the entrance of the hostess to open the piano or touch it if it is open.
- To go to the room of an invalid unless invited.
- To look at your watch when calling.
- To walk around the room when waiting for the hostess.
- To open or shut a door, raise or lower a window curtain, or in any other way alter

the arrangement of a room when visiting.

- Turn your chair so that you back faces another guest.
- To play with any ornament in the room or to seem to be aware of anything but the company present while visiting.
- To remain when you find the host or hostess dressed to go out.
- To make remarks about another caller who has just left the room.

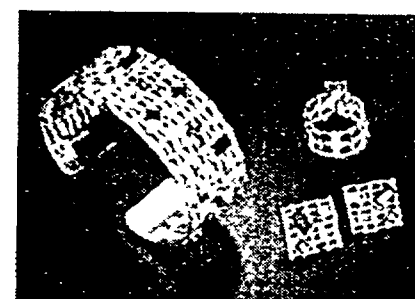
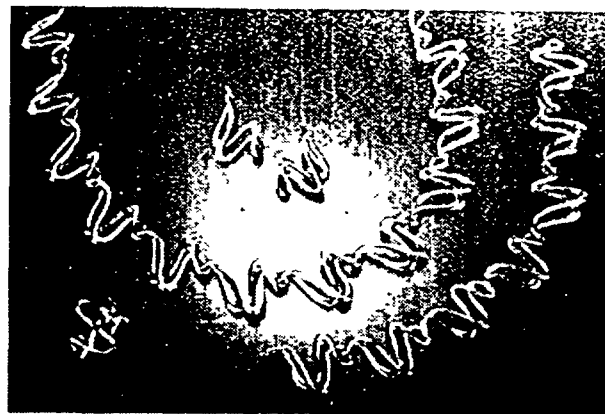

■ Victorian Etiquette: Etiquette on the Street

Courtesy requires the return of all civil greetings — those of servants included. Only the most serious causes can justify "a cut."

- In bowing, the head should be best; a mere lowering of the eyelids, affected by some people, is rude; but etiquette does not permit a familiar nod, except between business men, or very intimate friends. In passing and repassing on a public promenade or drive, bows are exchanged only at the first meeting.

- In carrying canes, umbrellas and packages, care should be taken that they do not inconvenience others.

- In meeting on a street crossing, gentlemen should make way for ladies, and younger persons for older ones.

- Ladies and gentlemen, when meeting on the sidewalk, should always pass to the right.

- In the evening or whenever safety may require, a gentleman should give a lady his arm.



- A gentleman may take two ladies upon his arms, but under no circumstances should the lady take the arms of two gentlemen.

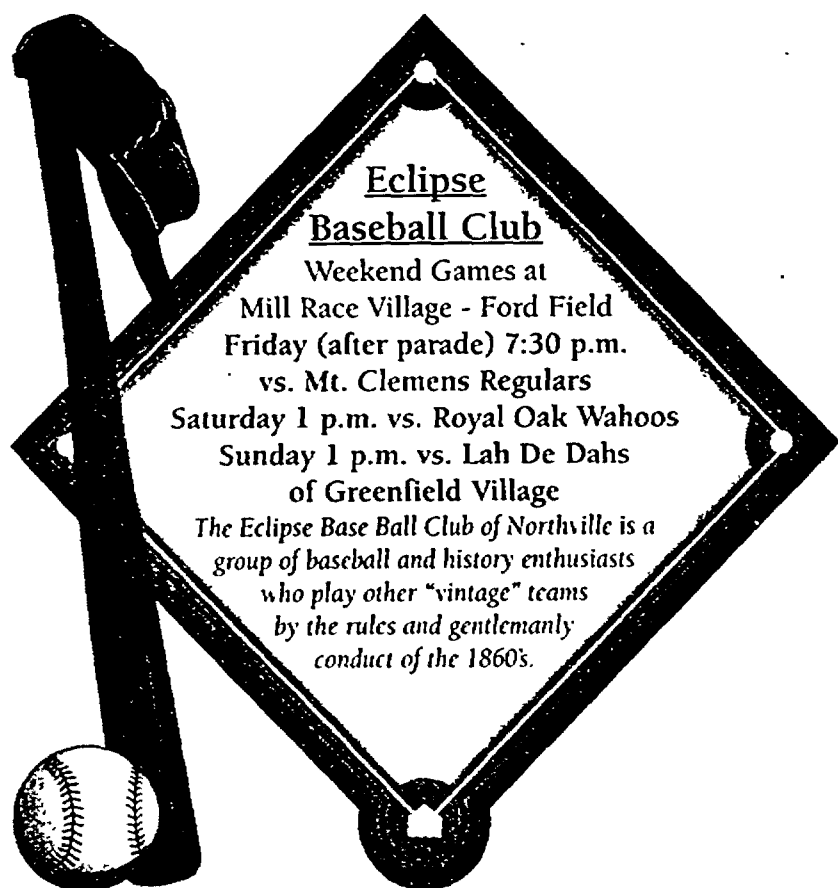
- A gentleman will assist a lady over from an omnibus or carriage, without waiting for the formality of an introduction.

- No gentleman will smoke when walking with or standing in the presence of a lady standing in the street.

- No gentleman should stand on the street corners, steps of hotels, or other public places and make remarks about ladies passing by.

- A true lady will go quietly and unobtrusively about her business when on the street, never seeking to attract the attention of the opposite sex, at the same time recognizing acquaintances with a courteous bow, and friends with pleasant words of greeting.

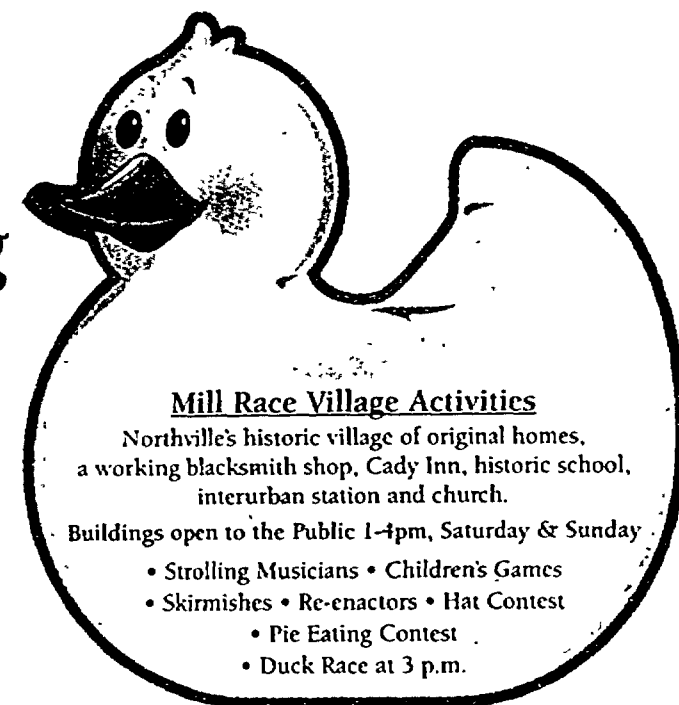

New School Church

The church was built in 1845 by a splinter group, "a new school of thinking," of the Presbyterian Church of Northville and moved to the village in 1972

Cady Inn

Moved to the Village in 1987, the salt-box style building is believed to have been a tavern and early stage coach stop.

Hunter House

The classic Greek Revival home, built by Stephen and Mary Hunter in 1851, was moved to the village in 1972.

Wash Oak School

One of the few surviving one-room schoolhouses in Michigan, the school was built in 1873 and operational until 1966.

Gazebo

Modeled after a turn-of-the-century version, the gazebo was built in 1979 by John Glenn High School shop students.

Yerkes House

Built in 1868 by William and Sarah Yerkes, the traditional Gothic Victorian style house stood on the south side of Cady Street between Church and Center streets until it was moved to the village in 1975.

Weaver's Cottage

Built in the 1890s on the east side of Center Street between Lake and Rayson streets, local handicrafters now use it as a gathering site.

Hirsch Blacksmith Shop

A replica 1890s style shop built by volunteers, the fieldstone building is home to a blacksmith shop and general store.

Interurban Station

Moved to the village in 1990, the late 19th Century building was a transit system waiting room at Newburgh and Eight Mile until the 1930s.

The elegant custom of hosting tea is one of the traditions celebrated during Northville's annual Victorian Festival.

Tea Time

■ Victorian Etiquette: At Teas and Receptions

- The day and hour of an afternoon tea may be written on a visiting card. For an afternoon reception, an "At Home" card is used.

- Only simple refreshment should be served at an afternoon tea. Thin slices of bread and butter, sandwiches, fancy biscuits or cake, tea, coffee, or chocolate, ice-cream and bouillon. Punch and lemonade may also be served, but no wine or alcoholic drinks.

- The hostess should shake hands with her guests and receive them cordially; any formality is out of place on an informal occasion.

- If the number of guests is small, the hostess should walk about the room, talking with her visitors. If large guest list, she should remain near the door and have the aid of other ladies who should help entertain the guests, ask them to take refreshments and make introductions when necessary.

- At a large and elegant afternoon reception, windows may be darkened, lighted by gas lights and musicians employed.

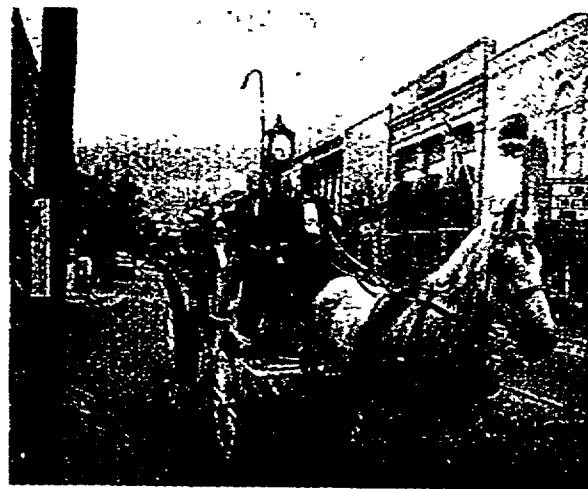

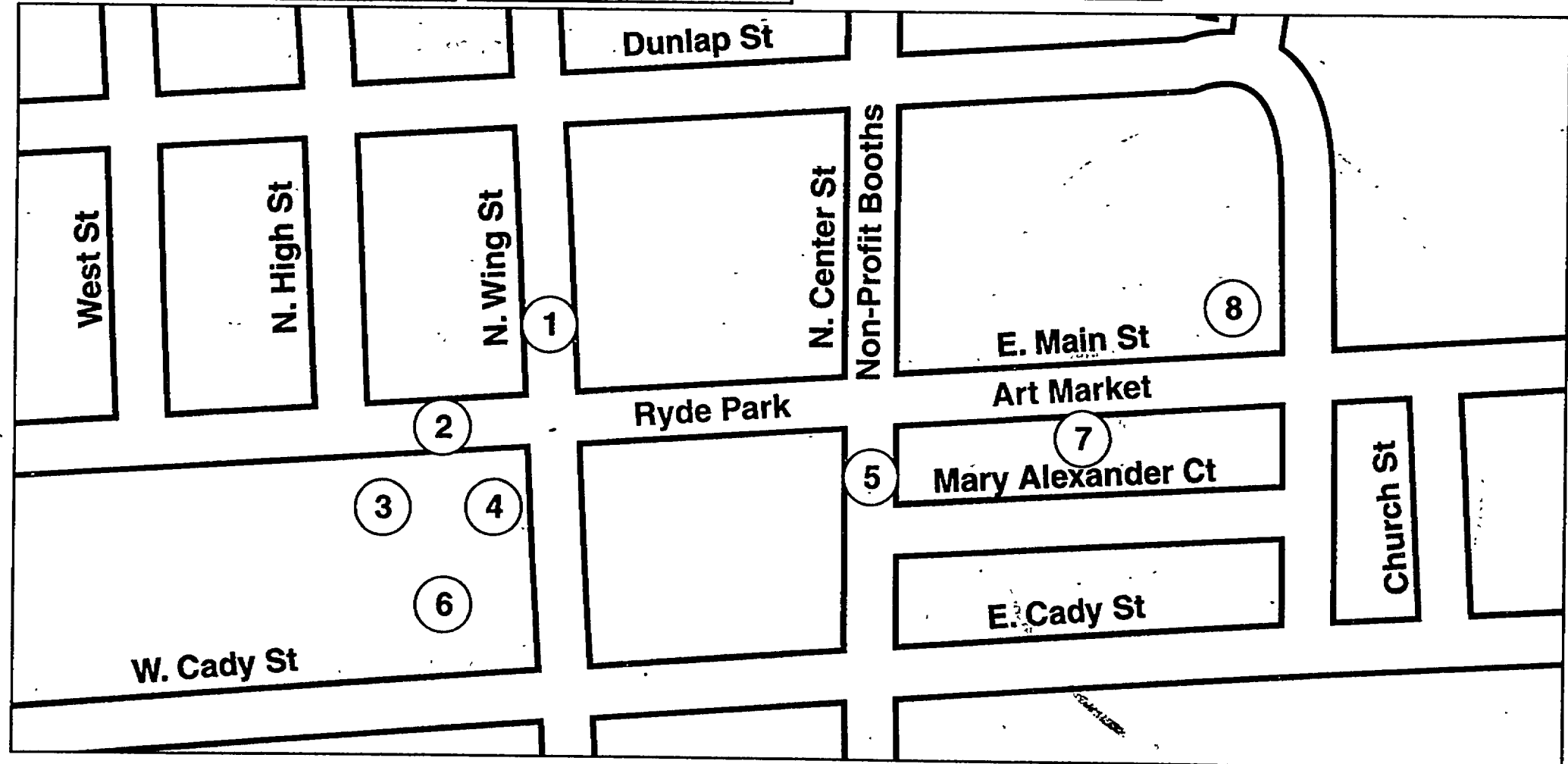

Victorian Etiquette - Shopping

In visiting a store for the purpose of examining the goods or making purchases, conduct yourself with courtesy and amiability.

• Never look over goods without any intention of buying them.

Speak to the clerks and employees of the store with courtesy and kindness. Do not order them to show you anything. Request them to do so in a polite manner. In leaving their counter, say pleasantly "Good morning" or "Good Day".

• Never take a costly piece of goods — nor any piece — into a better light without first asking the clerk's permission to do so.

• Should you find another person examining a piece of goods, do not take hold of it. Wait until it is laid down, and then make your examination.

• To attempt to "beat down" the price of an article is rude. In the best conducted stores the price of the goods is "fixed", and the salesmen are not allowed to change it.



If the price does not suit you, you are not obliged to buy, but can go elsewhere.

• Pushing or crowding at a counter, or the indulgence in personal remarks, handling the goods in a careless manner, or so roughly as to injure them, lounging upon the counter, or talking in a loud voice, are marks of bad breeding.

• Never let the door of a shop slam in the face of any person, nor permit a stranger to hold it open without any acknowledgement of courtesy.

• Never express your opinion about an article another is purchasing, unless asked to do so.

• You should never ask or expect

a clerk waiting upon a customer to leave that person and attend to you. Wait patiently for your turn.

• It is rude to make unfavorable comparisons between the goods you are examining, and those of another store.

• Have your parcels sent and so avoid the fatigue of carrying them.

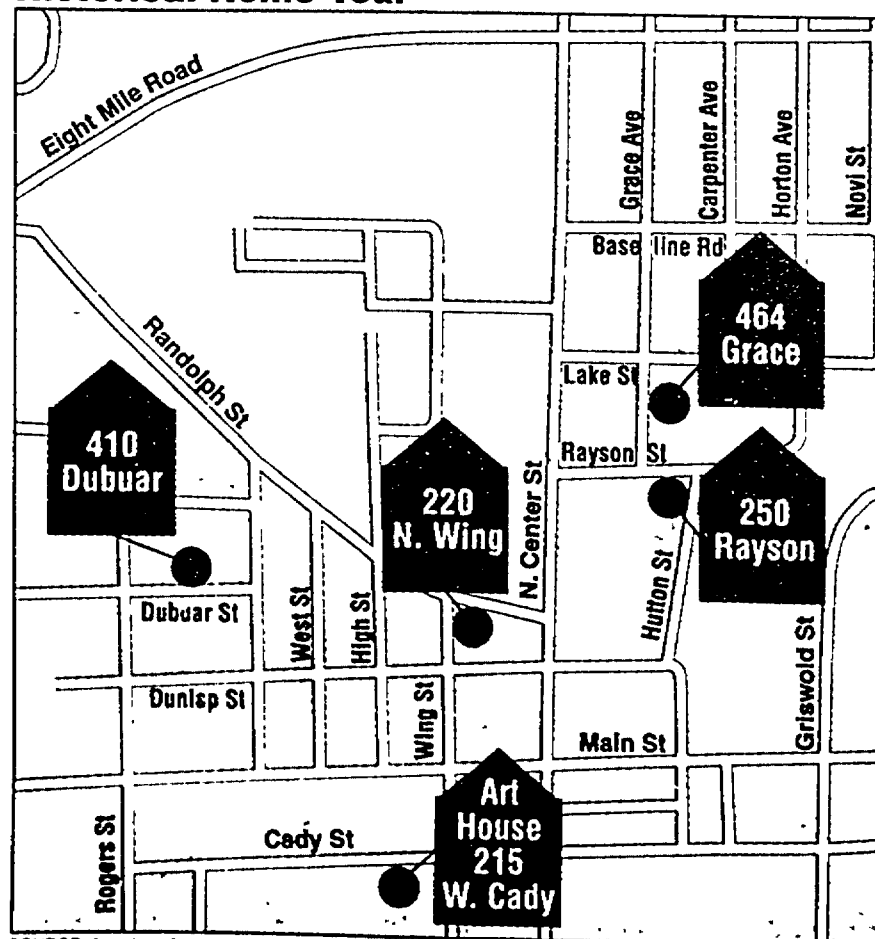

Re-enactments bring customs to life

The Victorian Festival is a unique place where live historians can show visitors what it was like to live in the 19th century.

Each year reenactors gather in period costumes to demonstrate an encampment, march in the parade or man an old-fashioned war recruiting booth.

These volunteers come from groups of reenactors dedicated to the hobby as a way of showing their dedication to their country.

It's not an easy or inexpensive hobby, said Karen Mehaffey, owner of The Moss Rose in Northville. Mehaffey and her husband, Colin, have been Civil War reenactors for 18 years.

Playing the part means ordering hand-sewn work dresses and ball gowns. Mehaffey owns several hoop-skirt gowns plus a handful of summer calicos.

Colin Mehaffey normally wears coarse work clothing and brogans unless he's in uniform for a skirmish. But for men, the clothing takes a back seat to the more exciting — and expensive — accessories like a reproduction rifle, cartridge pouch and leather fittings.

"You try to make your clothing as authentic as possible, including your underpinnings, which are your underclothes," explained Karen Mehaffey. "For men that's knee-length cotton drawers, and for women there is always a corset."

Learning the history is just as important as looking the part, but that comes easy to most reenactors. Individuals choose the hobby because they are history nuts, often students of military history.

Mehaffey said that she's met a variety of people that take part in reenactments, from factory workers to teachers. Many are veterans or reserve soldiers, so they are especially enamoured with military history.

"These live historians have a lot of patriotism and are in love with our country and its history," said Mehaffey.

The reenactments typically held at the Victorian Festival are similar to presentations at schools, fairs and group functions. It is not so much reenacting a battle as it is telling about history.

"We try to educate people about the history and teach them what it was like to live in the 19th century," said Alan Kohring, president of the 17th Michigan Infantry Company, a local reenactment group.

Kohring said live historians can accomplish more than books or video documentaries, Kohring said. Through one-on-one interaction, the historians can demonstrate what life was like and illustrate points otherwise lost in translation.

"If you read about history or watch a DVD, you're not going to get the whole story," Kohring said. "We bring history alive, because we are a living, breathing, demonstration of history."

"It's a little early to say," he said of the

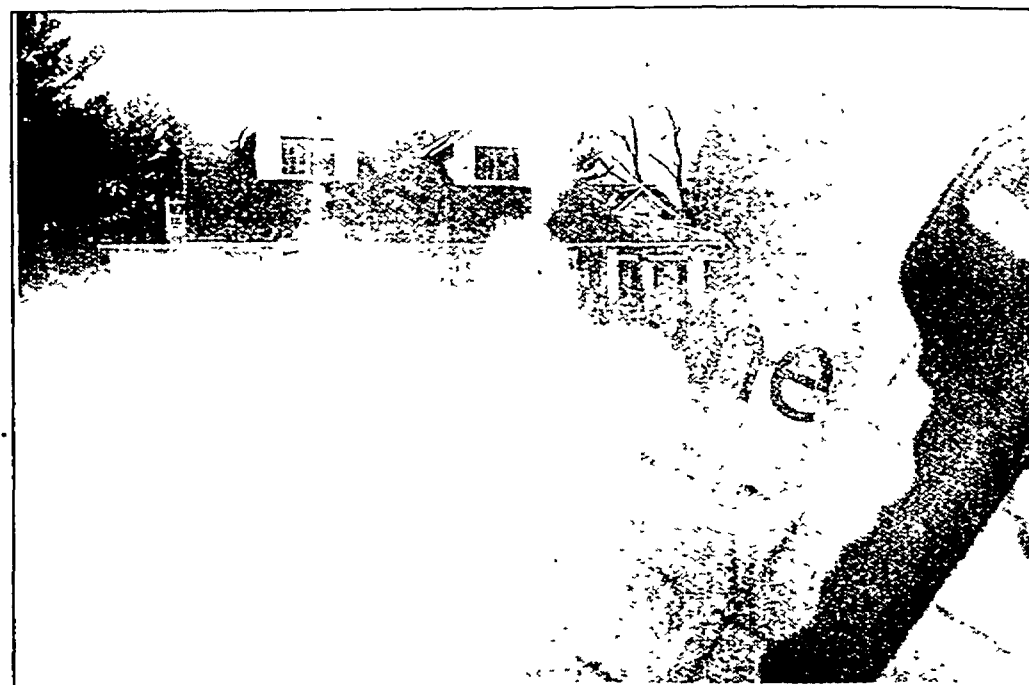

Reveal assessment to avoid problems down road

Q. We are a management company and I am wondering what we should do about disclosing additional assessments which have been levied but are not immediately payable when asked to provide that information to prospective purchasers from our condo association clients. What do you think?

A. If the association has levied the additional assessment under the Michigan Condominium Act, even though it is not immediately payable, it is arguably an unpaid assessment and should be disclosed to the prospective purchaser so that there is no question as to the purchaser's obligation with respect to that assessment. Many management companies fail to do that which causes problems for the condo association.

Q. I am a developer who has been hit with the sudden change in the economy in Michigan

and am wondering what I can do in terms of liquidating my properties since I am having a difficult time selling my condos.

A. Unfortunately, a number of developers are finding themselves in your position. That is, they have been blind sided by the change in the economy and the bank is threatening to foreclose. There are developers out there who are willing to get into a workout program in connection with the bank to buy your property and to relieve you of your obligations. This is typically the case in difficult times and

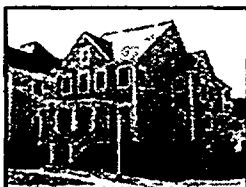
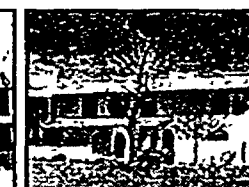
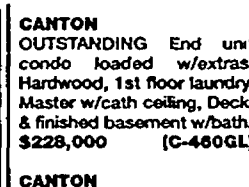
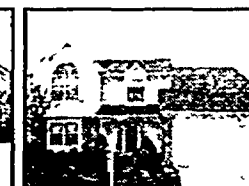
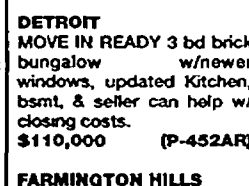
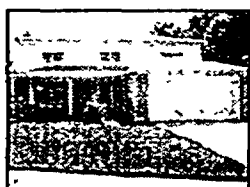
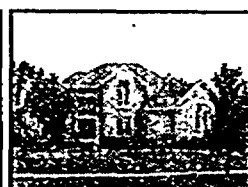
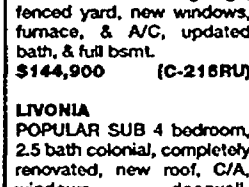
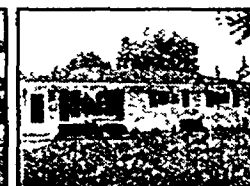
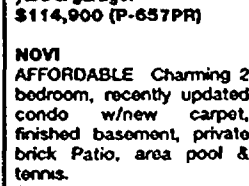
