

Parking plan key to drug store move

CVS pitches new \$8M Dunlap Street store; sharing parking sandbox remains key holdup

By Maureen Johnston RECORD STAFF WRITER

CVS officials hoped building a new downtown store would be as easy as picking up a drive-through prescription.

But devising a plan that would allow adjoining business owners to share parking surrounding the proposed \$8 million store is giving some city officials the chills.

"I would love to give the city a new CVS," said six-year store manager Harold Reihl. "We need more space to give customers more product and to get upscale in what they want. We're here to take care of the city, not to hinder it, to

A local mainstay and a sales success story within the national chain, the store sits off Dunlap Street, cramped and outdated. Now CVS officials want to tear down the existing store and construct a new building that sits closer to Dunlap and includes a drive-through bay.

But according to city officials, the CVS plan must also include a commitment to share a common parking lot with other Center, Dunlap and Hutton street property owners. To date, no such agreement has been forged.

Police presence increased following report of young girl being approached

Local cops say prevention best cure



Northville police are maintaining an increased presence in the city after a 12-year-old girl was allegedly approached last Thursday by three men in the area of Hillside Middle School.

'My intention is we are going to devote as many resources as we need to ... until we feel there is no longer a threat," said Chief of Police Gary Goss, City of Nonhville.

Police said shortly after 3 p.m. on Sept. 21 three white males in their twenties driving an older style light blue Ford Taurus pulled to the curb on Jeffrey Street, west of Center and north of Eight Mile Road, and asked the girl if she wanted some candy.

Meeting marks start of official approval process

Northville Township residents have a chance to comment - for the record - about what should be done to the former Northville Psychiatric Hospital.

On Tuesday, Oct. 24 at Township Hall, the planning commission is holding it's first public hearing on the Highwood project.

This is their first formal submittal and action on the plan, there could be

a vote," said Jenniser Frey, director community development

for Northville Township. "This is the first of several steps before the plan's final approval.

"The project itself, with parks, a trail system and school site as well as wooded acres can be enjoyed by those who will live there, as well as the entire Northville community.


The 415-acre parcel is anchored at the southwest corner of Seven Mile and Haggerty Road.



An old tale: teach the children well

no serious doubt that the key to Michigan's economic survival is preparing more young people for the new global econo-

my - as fast as this state possibly can.

But so far, it's not happening. A report released this month by the Center for **Public Policy** and Higher Education reveals that the chances of any Michigan ninthgrader enrolling in college by

age 19 is only 38 percent. That's down from 41 percent in 1991, back before the computer revolution.

Why is this? One big factor: The affordability of college in our state, according to the center, a non-profit research outfit concerned with improving access to higher education.

Michigan, in fact, received a big fat "F' on the center's recent report card. And no wonder. Over the past five years, state support for colleges and universities has declined by more than 20 percent.

Reduced state support leads inevitably to increased college costs. Even after financial aid is factored in, the share of an average Michigan family's income needed to cover costs at a state university has gone from 28 percent to 36 percent over the past few years.

This isn't a one-dimensional problem, to be sure. Over the past five years, inflation-adjusted tuition has gone up by nearly 40 percent at our state universities. Over that same time, family median incomes have declined by double digits.

Michigan's report card didn't carry all bad news. We ranked A- in the benefits citizens derived from a college degree one more proof how essen-

tial higher education is today. We showed improvement in the number of adults 18-24 who were enrolled in some kind of post-high school education. That was up to 42 percent compared with 35 percent in 1992.

But ominously, enrollment of adults from 25 to 49 in college or retraining programs dropped slightly, to 4.4 percent. In coming years, this figure is going to need to go way, way up.

Certainly, there are lots of reasons other than money that young people don't go to college. Some want to go into a trade without getting a degree. Others come from an unstable or impoverished family background, which makes doing anything serious very tough. And some family cultures

simply don't value higher education -something that now has to change, if their children are to survive.

But preliminary findings from the Kalamazoo Promise, a program that provides graduates from Kalamazoo public schools with free college

tuition, suggest the high cost of college truly is a big barrier. Some (including yours truly) want to look carefully at the components of the Promise to see if it could be retooled into a "Michigan Promise," a kind of GI Bill for Michigan residents. Sure, that would cost a lot.

But what kind of return do we get from the billions we spend warehousing tens of thousands of felons at \$40,000 a year each? Do you think our money is better spent subsidizing countless special interest claims from the past?

If Michigan is going to succeed in an increasingly competitive globalizing economy, we're going to have to hugely increase the percentage of high school graduates who get a college degree — and then decide to stay in Michigan.

We aren't doing very well on that score, the center found: "Internationally, Michigan not only ranks very low in the proportion of certificates and degrees produced, but it was outpaced by such low-performing nations as Poland and the Slovak Republic.

What about the idea that popular perception is a "brain drain," with highly educated Michiganders leaving the state in droves? That's somewhat overblown, Jim Rogers, manager of data for the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments, told the Detroit Free Press. In fact, Michigan's population is increasing, although at a relatively slow rate. Most of the increase is due to new births and an influx of foreign immigrants. And Michigan's population of college graduates is in fact increasing, not declining. Between 2001 and 2004, Michigan had a net increase of 35,700 people with a bachelor's degree of more, according to the U.S. Census.

But most of that came from overseas immigrants with college degrees. During those same three years, 61,800 college-educated foreigners arrived here from places like Canada, India and China.

Unfortunately, simple math shows that means something like a net 26,000 degree-winners left the state during the same period.

There's some truth in the popular perception of young college grads migrating to places like Chicago. Most likely to leave: Young graduates who come to Michigan universities from out of state. Barely one in 10 of them end up settling here, while more than 70 percent of in-state college graduates remain in Michigan.

Conclusions? First, we need drastically to increase the percentage of Michiganders who go to college and get degrees. If affordability is a problem, we'd better figure out how to support state universities so they don't have to charge such high tuition.

We need to ask the universities to exercise maximum budget restraint to keep the costs of college affordable and Lansing needs to make it possible for them to do so.

Second, we should be active in recruiting college graduates from around the world. Before you snarl at this, consider what happened in Vancouver, Canada, in the 1960's, when word that China was going to take over Hong Kong caused panic there.

Vancouver offered any family with \$1 million in liquid assets automatic citizenship and a permission to work in Canada. Today, Vancouver is one of the most thriving and prosperous cities in North America. Maybe we might learn something by talking with our thousands of collegeeducated, energetic and ambitious immigrants.

"Why did you come? How's it going?" we should ask, and then pop the big question: "What can we do to get more people like you?"

The MEAP test time begins next month, including Northville Public Schools.

MEAP stands for "Michigan Educational Assessment Program." and consists of tests given to students in subject areas including language arts, math, science and social studies. Different subjects are tested at different grades.

High school kids take the MEAP. too, but in the article today, we're just going to talk about the elementary and middle schools.

To help understand just what these tests are about, we sat down with Edward Roeber, a senior executive director at the Michigan Department of Education, and Jane Faulds, also with the department, to get an update and some answers to questions about the tests.

Here's what you need to know:

Why is MEAP important?

The MEAP folks stress the exam is important because the MEAP is designed to measure both what you've learned and what your school is teaching you.

MEAPs are supposed to measure how well kids are being taught the required subjects.

Plus, the national "No Child Left Behind" act is a law that the United States requires every state to follow.

The act requires schools to test what you're learning. That means kids in other states

taught (and tested) in Michigan is the same curriculum as in other states, Roeber said.

The biggest differences would be in social studies - Michigan focuses on Michigan history in part of its teaching and on the MEAPs, just as other states focus on their state his-

The idea is that it measures what you have learned from the previous year - and with the goal that the scores and results would come back to your schools in December.

That way the schools know what to focus on.

There are guidelines for teachers on how long the testing period is expected to take, but you are not measured on how fast you answer questions.

The tests are not timed. It is up to each school to plan the days and times for MEAP testing.

Schools generally must give the MEAPs during the October test period, Oct. 9-27.

Teacher will tell you which days and which tests you will be taking. And remember, the tests should be covering topics you've already learned about.



The beginning of autumn spells the beginning of the sinusitis season. Individuals who have allergies or asthma are more prone to developing sinusitis. Two types of sinusitis exist. The acute version involves symptoms that persist for 10 to 30 days and often resolve themselves without antibiotics. (Moderate to severe symptoms that sting longer than 7 days may indicate a bacterial infection and the need for antibioxics.) Chronic sinusitis involves somewhat milder symptoms that recur throughout the year. This version is linked to cough, bad breath, low-grade fever, facial pain, and fatigue.

"A drive-through pharmacy is an absolute necessity to move the project forward," said John Baumann of CVS developer, Velmier Companies, adding the corporation already is taking extra steps to fit into Northville, "We're providing enhanced architecture based on the historic district beyond the normal prototype."

For months, CVS and city representatives have been discussing how to fulfill the national drug store chain's goals while providing a public benefit as dictated by a planned-unit-development designation. The designation is required because the city's zoning ordinance does not allow a drivethrough in the central business district.

Last week, the city planning commission deemed the CVS project eligible for special zoning. City Manager Patrick Sullivan said the plan met three initial criteria: locating at Dunlap Street, meeting historical district standards and providing for cross circulation and shared parking.

"Just because it's eligible doesn't mean it will be approved," Sullivan said.

Tweaking needed

For Baumann, that first vote was progress.

Planning commission chairman Jay Wendt said CVS earning the special zoning requires compliance with historic district design standards, and a shared parking

and traffic circulation plan. But the developer said CVS typically does not enter written parking agreements, adding he gathers data for CVS officials; who in turn make final decisions."

CVS plans to build a new store closer to Dunlap Street.

That hesitation is creating a

sticking point for some neighbors. businessman Lee Holland, who plans to replace his one-story Dunlap Street offices with a three-story building, has postponed starting his project, awaiting resolution of a shared parking plan. Guided by local architect Walt Coponen, Holland's brick and stone project has received all the necessary approvals to proceed.

Coponen, also a historic district commissioner, said - aside from parking - the CVS architectural design will need to be fine-tuned before it passes historic district muster.

"We all think a drive-through pharmacy is great, if you have a sick kid in the car or are a senior in the winter," Coponen said. "My opinion is CVS dug their heels in on this and I'm not sure why.

"We haven't been able to get the thing off dead center."

The next formal action on the CVS project is an Oct. 17 public hearing when the planning commission will determine whether CVS's site plan qualifies for the revised zoning the drive-through would require. That approval would kick the project up to city council level, for definition of additional conditions.

Baumann said CVS is willing to meet the city's requirements. Wendt said progress next month will depend on tweaking plans in the interim.



Woman's Right to Historically speaking! Choose

The coming election is very important for the state of Michigan. Both the composition of the legislature and who will be our governor will make a big difference for our state. Gov. Jennifer Granholm has started us on the road to economic recovery by convincing so many firms and industries to locate here and by her plans to improve the technical and intellectual capacity of our work force so as to diversify our base and not be so heavily dependent on manufacturing alone. Hardly, had Justice Roberts, the fifth conservative justice been sworn in, than laws were enacted in different states denying women their rights under Roe y. Wade. Of course, those pushing such laws knew that a lower federal judge, if not their own state constitutions. make those laws illegal and unenforceable because Roe still stands. But their intchuion is to reach the newly constituted Supreme Court and hope that the majority now, five ultra-conservative justices will reverse Roe. If that happens, there will be no federal protection

Design?

The trouble is that intelligent design is another beautiful theory done in by ugle facts. the essential flow through it. The spinal column has curves that weaken it. The jaw has more teeth than optimum, with wisdom teeth often requiring removal. By rejecting the relevant scientific understanding, proponents of intelligent design are left with the awkward implication that poor as well as good design is attributable to the designer. That disparagement of the designer's competence should be offensive of the religious belief

Do these fellow citizens really want such a rude challenge to their faith to be required teaching? And what actual performance can any of us expect from politicians who promise support for teaching a science for economic progress to one audience and anti-science to another

tims back to shore. "He can definitely shoot the ball," said Guy DelGiudice, head basketball coach at Divine Child, a small Class B Catholic School League school with about 850 students. "And this year he's gotten bigger, wider and stronger, so he should be even tougher to guard - and hopefully that much tougher on defense."

How good is Manno? No question, he is the best Northville player most local residents will never see play. As a freshman, Manno averaged 10 points for his 12-8 team, which last year lost in the second round of district playoffs to eventual state champion, Detroit Renaissance. Since then, Manno has grown two inches, gained some bulk and has been working on his conditioning

using a workout regimen that includes regular pickup games at the Basketball Planet in Canton, weightlifting, plenty of jumpshooting and one-two weekly workouts with a personal trainer.

Manno's approach is steeped in hard work and team play, lessons learned, he said, from his parents, Pat and Janice. "As long as your team is winning, you just have to keep doing what you're doing." Manno said. "Sometimes that means you have to give the ball

DelGiudice appreciates the team-first approach, but knows Manno must take more shots this season. "He is already very unselfish," DelGiudice said. "In fact, I have to work to make him more selfish."

For Manno, everything boils down to hard work, "Everyone tells me just to bust your butt when you're out there," Manno said Saturday during a 90-minute lunch break at the BankHoops.com basketball camp, held annually at the Aim High gym in Lansing. The camp is a basketball talent showcase, mostly for Michigan players who will one day play college ball; some even in the pros.

"And defense, everyone is preaching defense all over the place. In our league especially, you have to be able to defend people."

DelGiudice doesn't worry about Manno's work ethic, "His upside is that he's a workaholic," he said "He's constantly in the gym working on some part of his game. He's always trying to get better.

Manno said he's ready for the challenges ahead. Yes, he wants to improve last year's record and drive deeper into the state playoffs. But he also has revenge on his mind.

"I'd like to beat Orchard Lake St. Mary this year," he said, "And I kind of want to get back at (Detroit) Catholic Central this year. They kicked

Meanwhile, the lanky kid who began playing organized basketball at 8, giving up soccer as part of his devotion, is wrapping up another competitive summer that included plenty of AAU competition and trips to the St. Cecilia gym in Detroit, where true basketball stripes have always been earned against top statewide talent.

Study: Michigan girls rank fourth in sports participation

Statewide 135,377 girls participated

EAST LANSING, Mich. -Sept. 19 — Participation by girls in high school sports in Michigan, which hit an all-time high during the 2005-06 with 135,377; again ranks fourth nationally, and participation rates in five boys sports moved up on the charts in figures released last week by the National Federation of State High School Associations.

Michigan's girls participation held its own, trailing only the largest populated states of California, Texas and New York: and staying ahead of the more densely population states of Illinois, Ohio, Pennsylvania and New Jersey, According to 2005 U.S. Census Bureau figures, Michigan continues to rank eighth in both females and males of ages 14 through 17.

Participation in five boys sports basketball, bowling, golf, swimming and diving, and track and - all moved up nationally in 2005-06. Michigan now ranks third for boys in basketball, bowling, and track and field; and fifth in golf and swimming and diving. Track and field moved up two notches from a year ago, while the other sports each rose one spot in

All other boys sports positions remained unchanged from a year ago. Ice hockey and skiing still rank third; tennis is still fourth; cross country, football and wrestling are still fifth; lacrosse continues to hold onto sixth place: baseball is seventh; and soccer is in eighth place.

The most popular participation

sport in Michigan for girls -- volleyball - rose on the national list to third. Other sports rising on the charts were competitive cheer to fifth place, and gymnastics to tenth place. Holding the same spots as last year were bowling and tennis in third; cross country and golf in fifth; soccer in sixth; and softball in seventh. Slipping one spot from the 2004-05 survey results were skiing in third place; basketball in fourth place; and swimming and diving in fifth

Michigan's all-time overall participation mark of 321,250 was good for fifth place in 2005-06, less than 2,000 behind Illinois, and down one place from a year ago as the two states switched positions in the final numbers. Boys participation in the NFSH survey for the past year ranked sixth with 185,873. Michigan's girl's participation has set records for four consecutive years.

National participation in high school sports in 2005-06 was up to 7,159,904, setting a new

The MHSAA is a private, notfor-profit corporation of voluntary membership by over 1,800 public and private senior high schools and junior high/middle schools which exists to develop common rules for athletic eligibility and competition. No government funds or tax dollars support the MHSAA, which was the first such association nationally to not accept membership dues or tournament entry fees from schools. Member schools which enforce these rules are permitted to participate in MHSAA tournaments, which attract approximately 1.6 million spectators each year.

Nineteen percent of our children are overweight, and that percentage is growing faster than the rapidly increasing number of overweight adults. In essence, we are letting our kids design their own food plan. I have news for you: they are not qualified!

Most eating habits are formed during childhood. Thus, children will become adults and 9 out of 10 adults will be overweight at some point in their lives. Many will become sick or die from increasing body fat, causing not only serious emotional damage, but further burdening our fragile healthcare system, and choking our economy.

So what can you do to help you child eat healthier this school sea-

Make them eat breakfast no matter how much time is available. We certainly know that eating breakfast can improve students, academics and attention span and contribute positively to, weight control. Cognitive test scores are higher in adolescent breakfast eaters. At the very least, chronic breakfast skipping may have a negative impact on ones overall nutritional status based on years of omitting valuable breakfast-type nutrients and the fact the body/brain is continually going undernourished for extended periods of time.

Giver them milk or a nutritionally equivalent food twice daily along with a multi-vitamin. Increasingly, milk is being replaced by better marketed and addicting soft drinks. In the average school child, a 1-ounce decline in milk consumption results in 4.2-ounce increase in soft drink intake, a net gain of 31 calories, and a loss of 34 mg of

Do the long term math. Many or most children drink one to two 12ounce soft drinks daily! The multi-vitamin is not an excuse to eat poorly but rather an insurance policy.

Pack a lunch for them. School lunch eaters consume 40-120 more calories each school day than children who pack a lunch. School lunch eaters also have higher obesity rates than their brown bag counterparts when all else is equal. Packing your children's lunch offers a degree of control and thought of what they eat not only for their lunch but for their snacks.

We can't wait for the government, schools or someone else to save our children's health and their future. We have everything we need to make some immediate improvements. Now all we need to do is look at our child and make the decision: Do I want him/her to grow up like the typical adult, or the person we have always dreamed they could be and truly

want them to be. It's your call.



Nine ways to build employee confidence

However skilled and ambitious your employees may be, their greatest value often lies in their self-confidence. Confident, independent people possess courage and eagerness and they're strong self-

Use these nine tips when you're trying to foster a spirit of confidence among members of your small-business team. Your efforts will pay off time and time again:

· Affirm your employees' strengths. Confidence is often based on self-understanding, so identify the key strengths of each member of your team. Then, make it a point to recognize those strengths and demonstrate that you value them.

 Relate insights into relationships. Most personal growth comes about when individuals learn the art of relationships. So make it a point to help your employees understand what motivates others and how to negotiate and persuade. Resist the temptation to "fight battles" when they run into relationship trouble, but help them learn how to gently navigate their way through tense, difficult sit-

· Help them dream. Independent people set goals. often lofty ones. Encourage your employees to dream big. to set ambitious, long-term goals. Then help them figure out the steps they need to take to make those goals become

· Assign in increments. People learn by doing. They become confident in small doses. So give your staff members small assignments and challenges at first. Then make those challenges a little more difficult — but substantially more significant — and watch your their confidence grow.

 Challenge and stretch their minds. True confidence develops when people leave their comfort zone and realize that they can thrive outside of their routine. Once you see a genuine sense of confidence developing in an individual, give him or her a "stretch assignment" one that forces the employee to learn and practice new skills.

Coach your staff to avoid taking difficulties and setbacks personally. Equally important, help them recognize that setbacks are a natural part of progress and can even be growth experiences.

• Trust your employees. An atmosphere of trust allows confidence to grow. Let your people know, in word and deed, that you have confidence in them and watch their self-confidence bloom. Your confidence should include a willingness to allow mistakes. Mistakes, at the end of the day, can be learning experiences for the people around you. 
















































Hankering to build can be great way to help others

No free lunch; attorney fee money well-spent

Q. Our developer will not fix our defects but the board is unwilling to retain an attorney to assist the board and has gone to the state legislature and the city. Do you have any comments?

A. While the state or city may be able to assist you to some limited degree in resolving disputes with the builder/contractor, they are generally not in a position to resolve all issues and may not do so in a timely fashion. You may well have claims which should be pursued in court, if necessary, and it is imperative that you retain the services of a knowledgeable condominium attorney who knows who to sue and what claims to be able to assert in order to maximize your claims against the developer. There are no

free lunches and the board should be aware of that.

Q. Must an association's audit be in compliance with the condominium documents to be valid regardless of whether or not there has been a lawsuit?

A. The Condominium Act and most condo bylaws require that the association have an audit done by an independent accountant but the audit need not be certified. My recommendation to associations is

that they get a certified audit and that, of course, a financial statement be provided to the co-owners on a yearly basis as is required by the Condominium Act. The auditor should be condominium wise in knowing about the ins and outs of condominium accounting and governance.

The Benefits of Massage

Many people think of a massage as an expensive, indulgent luxury. However, enjoying a massage has become more commonplace, and studies show that it provides many health benefits.

"Research has suggested that massage is an excellent technique for relaxation that improves the body's response to stress," says Dr. Lee Litvinas, who integrates alternative therapies with conventional health care in Charlottesville, Va. (pop. 45,049).

The power of massage lies in its ability to improve immune function, stimulate muscle tissue, and encourage blood flow through key areas of the body. Proper blood flow revives sore muscles and relieves pain, especially in the neck, shoulders and lower back.

People have discovered that massage can help a wide range of medical conditions, including anxiety, circulatory problems, depression, headache, insomnia, sports injuries and all types of stress, Litvinas says.

Massage returns the body to its normal state (homeostasis) and repairs the chemical imbalances caused by stress. "Studies show that massage decreases certain stress hormones," he explains.

While it's easy to see why massage can be relaxing, some people feel uneasy about disrobing in front of a complete stranger. Fortunately, there are simple steps to help you make the most of your massage experience.

Denise Logsdon, a certified massage therapist based in Louisville, Ky., provides these tips:

- Be honest when completing the health form prior to the appointment. Some medical conditions such as pregnancy and varicose veins require certain considerations.
- The office or clinic should be clean at all times; fresh sheets and blankets should always be available.

- Expect the massage therapist to treat you with respect at all times. You should have privacy when disrobing and while positioning yourself on the massage table.
- If you are uncomfortable about disrobing completely, wear gym shorts or keep your underclothes on during the massage.
- Do not expect the massage therapist to judge you about your body, cellulite or unshaven legs. The goal is to relax, so don't worry about those few extra pounds.
- Select a qualified massage therapist. Thirty-seven states require licensing for massage therapists. Credentials may originate from massage school certificates, national certification or membership in the American Massage Therapy Association.
- If an hour-long massage is too expensive, some massage centers ofter 30-minute massages at a lower cost.
- Let your massage therapist know about any pain you're experiencing so he or she can properly treat these areas. Always speak up about what you need, particularly if the pressure of the massage is too light or too deep
- Check your health insurance policy to see if it covers massage therapy. Some insurance plans maintain a list of massage therapists who give their policyholders a discount

"There's no place like home.

There's no place like home," whispers Elizabeth Barton of Dallas as the 4-year-old clicks the heels of her shoes and presses her face against a display case holding exact replicas of the ruby slippers worn by Judy Garland in The Wizard of Oz.

Elizabeth continues to quote lines from the 1939 film classic as she strolls, wide-eved, with her mother and grandmother through one of the largest collections of Oz artifacts in the world. The Oz Museum in Wamego, Kan. (pop. 4,246), houses some 2,000 items associated with the timeless movie, its actors and the magical world created by author L. Frank Baum.

"The museum isn't just for Oz fanatics," says Ellie Coots, who manages the museum's gift shop. "It appeals to everyone of all ages who has ever seen the movie. When they walk through and see the displays, it brings back a rush of memories."

The museum houses the private collection donated in 2004 by Wamego native Tod Machin, 45, who began collecting Oz-related items in the early 1980s. His collection now spans more than 100 years of Oz, starting with copies of the books by Baum on which the movie was based.

I never set out to collect Oz memorabilia, says Machin, who now lives in Kansas City. "But the more I learned about Oz and the more people I met associated with the movie. the more I wanted to know." Eventually his collection grew too large for him to keep

Replicas of props from The Wizard of Oz. at home, and the museum was born.

The artifact-packed Oz Museum beckons visitors to

downtown Wamego, Kan.

For a group of 5- and 6-year-olds from a nearby preschool, encountering a life-size, full-color, costumed acrylic sculpture of Dorothy holding her faithful pet terrier elicits a round of "ooos and "ahhhs."

"Toto!" screams Jarva Chambers, 6.

"Look! It's the Scarecrow!" says Tristan Olyncik. 5. pointing at the sculpted man of straw sitting with pumpkins and crows in a cornfield, just

as he first appears in the movie.

The students can hardly contain their delight as they view displays filled with autographed photographs, playbills, posters, costumes and props from the movie, including the Wicked Witch's death certificate and a dress worn by Diana Ross in The Wiz, the 1978 movie musical version of the Oz story

The museum will feature prominently during Wamego's annual OZtoberFest Oct. 20-22, a weekend (Continued on page 8)

of activities and entertainment for the entire family, including presentations by descendents of Baum and several actors who played Munchkins in the film

"We won't always have these actors around, and OZtoberFest is a great opportunity to meet them in person," says Jim Ginavan, the museums executive director.

Although the Wizard of Oz movie begins and ends in Kansas, it never specifies exactly where—giving artistic license for various locations throughout the state to lay claim to Oz magic. Liberal (pop 19,666) has Dorothy's House, a full-size replica of Dorothy's prairie home, and a display of memorabilia. In the town of Sedan (pop. 1,3-42), a winding Yellow Brick Road snakes through downtown Wamego's Oz Museum has welcomed more than 30,000 visitors from all over the world since it opened in 2004.

Ginavan believes this unflagging interest in Oz, which continues more than 65 years after the movie's release, stems from its enduring tale of a girl, her loyal pet, her three traveling companions in search of something missing from their lives, the







Winterize Your Car

While you may be ready to take on the harsh winter weather, your car may not. The key is to take preventative maintenance steps, according to John Paul. known as AAA's "Car Doctor."

"A well-maintained car will perform in almost any circumstances and stand up to most weather conditions," Paul says. Unfortunately, most of us aren't proficient in automobile maintenance checkups. So start your winterizing by having a professional check your spark plugs, filters and hoses.

"The main issue facing drivers with winter weather is that it usually makes a car harder to start," Paul says. To help prevent this, he suggests the following:

- If necessary, have your battery tested. The typical life is about 40 months, so if the battery is approaching three years old, have it checked before winter weather hits.
- Make sure you have the proper amount of antifreeze in your radiator.
- Visibility is crucial in winter weather, 50 check the heater and defroster before there's an immediate need for defrosting.
- Check the windshield wiper blades and make sure they are working properly.
- Check headlights, raillights and brake lights, so other drivers can see you.
- Buy quality tires—snow tires if necessary—and then maintain them. Tire threads should be deep to provide greater traction. Also make sure your tires are properly inflated, as air inside a tire contracts in cooler temperatures, reducing pressure. A good rule of thumb is to check the pressure every week in cokker weather.
- Have an emergency box in the trunk, stocked with a snow brush, scraper, kitty latter or salt, a flashlight, reflectors and flares. For your own comfort and convenience, pack an extra pair of winter clothes. an extra hat and a pair or two of gloves (one waterproof to wear outside, and one woolen for inside) if you travel in remote areas.



He is in pain every day, especially from the shins down, and often has problems with balance. He says he often feels like he's being hit on the bottom of his foot with a sharp or burning hammer. He's had blurred vision, digestive problems, chest spasms and swallowing difficulties. He's grappled with the depression that can accompany MS, which led to some dark moments in the early days of his diagnosis when he even contemplated suicide.

'I have MS, but MS does not have me'

Williams says those dark days are now behind him, but he remains convinced that he can alter the outcome of his situation. He is dealing with MS just like he's dealt with every other obstacle in his life.

"Rather than sit back and just wait to see what happens, I've taken a very proactive stand against this illness, and I'm going to take that proactive stand until the day I die. I've been this way my whole life, and circumstances and other things may be a part of the reasons why I'm so driven."

He takes 70 pills each day and works out rigorously. A healthy eating regime has vastly improved the way he feels. He discovered that snowboarding relieves his leg pain, so he spends about 110 days annually on the slopes.

"I have MS, but MS does not have me, and I'm not going to let it," he says. "That's the difference. I may be ill, but I am not weak, and I'm not going to let myself be weak. If my body plays tricks on me, then I'll be as strong as I can be in whatever body

"I work very hard at making sure I stay on top of my medications, my diet, everything I need to stay on top of to counterbalance the negative effects of this illness. To answer the question of how I'm doing, I'm doing incredibly well for a person with MS, but I stay at it every day."

He's also committed to using his celebrity to find a cure. He established


the Montel Williams MS Foundation, which has raised more than \$1 million to date, to further scientific study of the disease. "Every single penny that the public has given me has gone back out and been put in the hands of research," he says. He's increased national awareness of the disease by devoting numerous episodes of his TV show to the topic, delivering public speeches and pressing drug companies to find a cure.


"I'm so impressed personally with Montel because it took a lot of courage for him to go public," says Joyce Nelson, president and CEO of the National MS Society. "He has put a real face on MS and he has been willing to commit to very publicly speaking about the disease. Now, more and more, when I say I work with MS, people say, 'Isn't that what Montel Williams has?' That has made a tremendous difference. The people who have MS know that there is someone who is really fighting for them and is willing to use his platform and influence to bring more awareness to the disease."

A greater understanding

Williams doesn't view his MS as a tragedy because it's brought him a greater understanding of himself and others, and now he's less judgmental and more aware of the needs of those around him. "It's made me live every day to the fullest," he says. "I don't put stoppers on it. Also, the longer I stay on this journey with this illness, the more open and honest it makes me."

He's intent on fostering a positive attitude and instilling that sense of honesty in his own four children, who range in age from 12 to 23, so they'll be equipped to conquer whatever roadblocks that come along, whether it's a negative comment or a debilitating

LLINOIS—New York native Isaac Swan founded Canton (pop. 15,288) in 1825 and named it on the mistaken belief that the location was diametrically opposite Canton, China.

NDIANA—The state has had a bouquet of official state flowers. In 1913, the carnation was adopted, but critics noted it wasn't native to the state. In 1923, the tulip tree was adopted, but was replaced by the zinnia in 1931. Since 1957, the peony has been the official state flower.

IOWA—A 56-foot-tall replica of a railroad spike in Council Bluffs (pop. 58,268) marks the eastern terminus of the Union Pacific Railroad, the nation's first transcontinental railroad, completed in 1869. The Goklen Spike monument was dedicated in 1939.

KANSAS—In 1949, the Merci Train arrived from France with 49 boxcars—one for each state and one shared by the District of Columbia and Territory of Hawaii—loaded with gifts of appreciation to America for the food and supplies sent to the war-torn country after World War II. The restored Kansas Merci Boxcar is at the American Legion Hall in Hays (pop. 20,013).

MICHIGAN—That lovable hunk of green clay, Gumby, was created by filmmaker Art Clokey, born in 1921 in Detroit. A photo of his dad sporting a wacky hairstyle inspired Gumby's lopsided head. Gumby debuted on *The Houdy Doody Show* in 1956.

MINNESOTA—Built in 1910, the Fitzgerald Theater in St. Paul is named after native son F. Scott Fitzgerald, but perhaps is best known as home for Garrison Keillor's A Prairie Home Companion radio show.

MISSOURI—Established in 1911, the Capaba Annu: at Southeast Missouri State University in Cape Girardeau (pop. 35,349) is among the nation's oklest college newspapers. The second editor was Rush Limbaugh Sr., grandfather of radio talk-show host Rush Limbaugh.

NEBRASKA—Founded in 1890 by Joseph Steiner, Deshler (pop. 879) Broom Co. swept away the competition and became the world's largest broom factory during its heyday in the 1930s and 1940s. The factory closed in 1998 after 108 years.

NORTH DAKOTA—Students from Sioux reservation schools held their first Scrabble tourna-

ment—in the Dakota Sioux language—in March in Hankinson (pop. 1,058). With the support of game maker Hasbro, tribal members are handcrafting letter tiles from local stone for the games in an effort to save their dying language.

OHIO—To celebrate the potato chip's 150th birthday in 2003, five Ohio potato chip companies created a bag of potato chips weighing 1,082 pounds and serving 16,000. Chipping in were Ballreich's in Tiffin (pop. 18,135); Conn's in Zanesville (pop. 25,586); Jones in Mansfield (pop. 49,346); Shearer's in Brewster (pop. 2,324); and Mike-sell's in Dayton.

SOUTH DAKOTA—Vern Sager, a cowboy in Porcupine (pop. 407), is the subject of the 2005 PBS documentary *The Last Couboy*. Filmmaker Jon Alpert spent 23 years trailing and filming Sager to capture the realities of cowboy life.

WISCONSIN—In 1986, Pleasant T. Rowland created the popular American Girl books and dolls, which represent specific historical time periods. She sold the Middleton (pop. 15,770) company to Mattel in 1998 for \$700 million.

no one. They have to figure out who they are."

He's optimistic about the future, especially since the twice-divorced Williams became engaged to flight attendant Tara Fowler in July. Forget the cliché about stopping to smell the roses: His schedule remains overwhelming, and if anything, he has a heightened awareness of how short life is and how much there is to accomplish.

"I don't fear death at all," he says. "If it happens, it happens. But between now and that time, I'm living I million percent. Beyond that, I look for every opportunity to just do something different today, something good today. As I end every single day, I will never close my eyes without asking myself, "What did I do today that's worth talking about tomorrow"."


be brought in on a pallet/skid. All specimens will be judged by noon on Sunday.

All entries should be dropped off at Millennium Middle School 5 to 7 p.m. Friday, Oct. 6.







Spotlight on ... Civil Air Patrol

For many Pumpkinfests past, cadets from the local Civil Air Patrol squadron have assisted with parking, crowd control, clean up, finding "lost parents", and keeping watch over the school building and grounds Friday and Saturday nights.

Civil Air Patrol cadets study the principles of aviation and aerospace flight. They learn about rocketry and physics through launches and scientific experiments. Thanks to good preparation and valuable scholarships, many CAP cadets go on to careers in the aviation and aerospace industries. Some pursue technical degrees and others go on to one of the nation's prestigious military academies. Each year, at least 10 percent of the freshman class at the U.S. Air Force Academy is made up of former CAP cadets.


Cadets gain valuable, lasting skills by participat-

ing in practice missions that give them hands-on experience in emergency service procedures, survival techniques and search and rescue.
