



Relay for Life: Cancer fund-raiser returns to Ford Field this weekend

■ Campsite fun, silent auction, entertainment open to public Saturday

Traci Sincock has her fingers rossed on the weather.

But the Northville Relay for Life planning committee co-chair knows factors within her volunteers' grasp are slipping into place as the annual fund-raiser returns to town this weekend.

Where does the money go?

Every Relay for Life dollar raised goes toward making a difference to people whose lives are touched by cancer. The American Cancer Society has contributed to almost every major discovery in cancer research. Millions of fives have been saved as a result of the society's research into better ways to prevent, detect and treat cancer. The non-profit agency also exerts influence on all levels of government, advocating stronger policies and enacting legislation that will save lives and conquer cancer.

The 24-hour relay is expected to draw about 1,000 participants and spectators to Ford Field where ceremonies commence at 10 a.m. Saturday. The American Cancer Society signature event,

"We're there for a specific purpose, but part of that purpose is a celebration," Sincock said. "There are lots of opportunities for the community to come down and participate in the fund-raising efforts or just make general donations.

For months, volunteer relay team members have been selling goods, serving meals and coaxing individuals and businesses to support the cause. Their fund-raising efforts will hit a fever pitch on the track infield this weekend, wrapping up at 10 a.m. Sunday.

Fund-raising on-site

At the start of the week, online donations already neared the \$70,000 mark. Sincock said event organizers would have a better handle on money raised to-date when cash contributions were tallied midweek.

To further up the ante, relay teams have planned a variety of on-site activities - from fortune telling to selling glow necklaces for the late night sing-a-long.

Some teams raise money ahead of time," Sincock said. "Some teams raise money on site. Some do both."

Committee members Sue and Dave Laabs, supporters of the inaugural appearance by Team 755 comprised of local boy scouts, coordi-nated live stage entertainment throughout the event.

'They've really done a fabulous job," said Sincock, who scheduled tent activities for the wee morning hours like movies and dance routines. 'The planning committee did a lot of work

Starting a new tradition

With a theme "It's a Whole New Ballgame," Northville and Novi for the first time are hosting separate relays after participation climbed to 57 teams in a combined event last year.

"We're right back up there in spite of being split in half," Sincock said, citing registration of returning squads and newcomers. The addition of new sponsors — Hillside Middle School, Center Stage Dance Studio and Henry Ford Health System — also has boosted Northville's donations to the American Cancer Society.

DJs and American Cancer Society messages about advocacy, nutrition,

feature specific activities for a chance to win prizes and encourage additional donations, including a poker round, a pajama fashion show, bubble blowing and male participants donning evening gowns.

Meanwhile, cancer survivors, volunteers and relay teams of all ages shapes and sizes will take the field. The relay concept encourages one member of each team to be on the



McCotter introduces VETS Act to help local veterans get hired

■ New bill introduced Monday in D.C.

Ron Jones of Northville wanted

to hire a veteran. He just didn't know how.

So, he decided to call his congressman.

Now, years later, U.S. Rep. Thaddeus McCotter (R-MI), has introduced legislation that, if adopted, will help veterans find jobs and offer benefits to their employers.

McCotter introduced the Veterans' Employment Transition Support (VETS) Act bill on Monday which would provide income tax credit for businesses that hire veterans.

A press conference took place Monday in Westland to announce the proposed bill.

McCotter is calling on Congress to amend the Internal Revenue Code to allow employers an income tax credit for hiring U.S. military veterans.

The VETS Act would provide a one-time credit to employers on income tax for hiring military service personnel honorably discharged.

The credit would equal 40 percent of the veterans' first-year

wages or up to 50 percent for disabled veterans.

"This bill ensures our valiant veterans' service to our nation continues when they come home," said McCotter, chair of the House Republican Policy Committee.

Encouraging companies to hire veterans is not just the smart thing to do; it is the right thing to do. By facilitating their transition to civilian life, we further their good works on behalf our country and our communities."

Jones at press conference

Jones, who attended Monday's press conference, said about two years ago the company he works for needed to fill an entry-level computer job, and he wanted the company to hire a veteran.

He called McCotter's office to see if any programs existed that helped returning veterans find

"They did some research and found there really wasn't any type of network set up to do this," Jones said. "His staff looked into it and thought it appropriate to introduce a bill to offer an incentive for employers to hire vets."

Jones said the original bill about two years ago, which was just for veterans returning from Iraq and Afghanistan, did not pass. The bill was then rewritten to include all veterans.

Michael Harris, director of

Monday's press conference. Jones said he's glad McCotter reintroduced this legislation to

"He took a proactive position in trying to correct this situation,"

The bill has five original cosponsors, Rep. John Carter (R-TX), Candice Miller, (R-MI), Stevan Pearce (R-NM) and Jon Porter (R-NV).

McCotter flew to Washington,

D.C., after Monday's press conference to introduce the bill in Congress.



unit's deployment to Iraq began in September 2006 and ended at the end of April.

Many members received a heroes' welcome a few weekends ago when they returned to the area. Others did not return.

But Herrmann said some families who had lost a loved one came to the homecoming to show their love and support.

Her Marine Corps support team members also provide assistance to families of fallen soldiers.

"We do things like help families when their health insurance changes," Herrmann said.

They deserve the credit

Although she's being recognized by the county on Saturday, Herrmann doesn't think she should get any credit.

These young Marines who are serving their country should be getting the recognition," she said. Herrmann said these men serve their country at tremendous personal sacrifice.

They miss the births of their babies, the death of a parent, family members' illnesses and injuries," she said.

Herrmann, who grew up in Kalamazoo, moved to Northville Sept. 10, 2001 - the day before the terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center.

She and her husband, Fred, whom she met at the U.S. Naval

Academy, have two children. He was on active duty for five years, served as a reservist in her unit and now practices law in Detroit.

Progress made in Iraq

Herrmann said Americans should be glad U.S. troops are still in Iraq.

"We've got an impatient populous," she said. "What you don't hear are the good things that are happening over there.

I'm proud of what our battalion has done in Iraq to make the area safer and the Iraqi government better able to stand on its own. I definitely think they've made progress. For a Marine, the

most important thing is winning." She hopes to announce the ded-

ication of a proposed memorial for the 22 members of the U.S. Marines from her battalion who have died in Operation Iraqi Freedom. About 1,100 Marines belong to the unit.

She said the families she's met who have lost a loved one in Iraq are wonderful, just like their sons and daughters who served our country.

"These family members deserve the never-ending grati-tude of the American people." Herrmann said. 'They are in a class by themselves."



Developers seeking feedback on new Five Mile/Beck concept

■ Thumbs down on big box retail at two meetings

By Pam Fleming RECORD STAFF WRITER

Developers Frank Jonna and Scott McCarthy want to hear what residents have to say about their proposed development at Five Mile and Beck roads.

So, Jonna, of Jonna Companies, and McCarthy of REDICO, both in Southfield, had two neighborhood meetings last week to get a feel for what people really think about their

The developers are proposing to build a retail development that would include a large sculpture at the corner, decorative street lamps, benches, open seating areas, a collection of smaller buildings and at least one retailer with a 100,000plus-square-foot store.

Gateway to the township

The design would make the corner appear to be a gateway to the township with an agrarian feel, said Adriaan Van Velden of Hobbs + Black Architects in Ann Arbor.

"We think a well done retail project would be an asset to the community," McCarthy said.

The May 8 meetings — one in the afternoon and one in the evening — included a presentation on the proposed retail development in Northville Township followed by discussion.

About 30 people showed for the first meeting, with about 40 attending the evening meeting, Jonna said.

More than 2,000 invitations were mailed to residents, homeowners associations and local police, fire and government representatives.

"The crowd was clearly much more receptive, interested and asked better questions at the evening meeting," Jonna said. "The people at that meeting were more open minded."

The site, on the northeast comer

of Beck and Five Mile, sits in "a sea of R & D and industrial uses," said Charlie Jacobs, a planner hired by the developers to perform a land use study of the area

"We realize that a development on the corner does affect the residents," Jacobs said.

The developers believe the site needs more retail, especially with IAV Automotive moving its headquarters from Ann Arbor to the site next year.

Safety, traffic concerns

Jonna said safety and traffic seemed to be residents' biggest con-

Those who attended the afternoon session did not lend as much support to the development. Their biggest fear was the introduction of a big box retailer such as a Wal-Mart or Meijer store to the site.

"We prefer to call it a large format retailer because big box implies that there's not much going on interesting architechturally," Jonna said.



their property values," Jonna said. Northville Planning Commission members denied a rezoning request several weeks ago, and the concept was tabled by the township board of trustees. Developers now plan to submit an application to the planning commission for conditional zoning, also called spot zoning.

"We're scheduled to meet to finalize some plans with our team and then to start drafting our proposal," Jonna said last week.

Jonna said he and his team members are also going to see if they can line up some potential tenants at the Shopping Center Convention in Las Vegas this weekend.

"Once we've got some feedback from potential retailers, we'll then develop a proposal to present to the planning commission.

The planning commission denied

Jonna's request to rezone the research and development site to a B-3 or general business zoning one of the most lenient as far as the type of businesses that could open at the site.

The next planning commission meeting is scheduled at 7:30 p.m. on Tuesday, May 29.

Community Park soccer fields' drainage plans being reviewed

Board member Gans suggests money-saving design

By Pam Fleming RECORD STAFF WRITER

Mary Gans says he has a way to build a better mousetrap - or, in this case, a better drainage system for Northville Township's Community Park soccer fields.

Gans, who sits on the Northville Township Board of Trustees, addressed members of the new Northville Parks and Recreation Commission May 9 to mention a less expensive but just as effective way to provide drainage to two of the fields in the park at Five Mile and Beck roads.

The fields will be discussed at today's 7:30 p.m. Board of Trustees meeting at township hall.

Although Gans didn't want to go into too much detail until the topic comes under discussion tonight, he said his design basically includes 2-inch-diameter piping and small trenches with pea

He said the irrigation system should be installed in the fields before the drainage system. The fields being discussed are the two primary fields used by local soccer players at Community Park.

"There may be some ideas I haven't explored," said Don Weaver, director of public services for the township, in reference to Gans' idea for the fields.

Gans said the traditional method to provide drainage is effective but very expensive and that if township officials want to be fiscally responsible they should use his plan.

He estimates his proposal would cost \$62,465 per field per a quote Gans obtained or \$117,000 for two fields if they're done at the same time, with the more expensive method currently under consideration by the township costing about \$120,000 per field.

Area counseling centers attempt to dispel stigma of seeking help

■ It's actually sign of strength, not weakness

Dr. Paul Melrose believes pastoral counseling can assist people

matter what their spiritual beliefs.

And, as the executive director of the Samaritan Counseling Center

Southeastern Michigan, he and his team of counselors try to dispel the stigma of seeking help. Melrose works at the center's

Farmington Hills office in the Nardin Park Methodist Church on 11 Mile Road between Orchard Lake and Middlebelt. Other offices are in Northville. Birmingham and Milford.

The centers were established about 20 years ago, and Melrose is the second executive director. following Rev. Dr. Wesley Brun.

"We work with people on religious and spiritual issues from a variety of faiths and backgrounds." Melrose said

He is also available to speak to local groups about counseling

Although individual counseling is the most common, he's seen an increase in marital and family counseling lately.

Successful counseling is as much about the relationship between the individual and the therapist as it is about the person's or persons' problems," Melrose

"In relationship counseling, our goal is to get couples to talk to each other. We're more of a consultant than a preacher."

An ordained United Methodist minister, he's worked at the counseling center for seven years and says layoffs initiated by local companies have taken their toll on people's psyches.

The current job market has produced a lot of stress as well as issues with children when both parents have to work," Melrose

Depression can be triggered by many events, including a job loss, death of a family member or even the loss of an opportunity to advance or loss of physical capacities due to illness or dis-

"We provide resources so that people can hopefully move forward." he said.

He believes this is one of the most important aspects of counseling - to help clients identify resources they currently have to cope with various issues.

For more complicated concerns or issues — such as if a client needs medication for depression or anxiety - counselors make referrals to mental health professionals.

Affairs, addiction issues

Relationship counseling involves such things as extramarital affairs, gambling, drinking and even Internet addiction.

"Often there are unspoken expectations," Melrose said.

He said, sadly, there is still a stigma on counseling because many people see it as a sign of weakness.

"Instead, I tell clients it is more a sign of courage and strength," Melrose said.

He said the stigma stems from the fact that most people believe

■ Two therapists serve community

Diane Grech and Dr. Ronald Studer are ready to help area residents with their problems.

The two therapists work in the Northville office of the Samaritan Counseling Center of Southeastern Michigan, which has existed for more than a decade in the First United Methodist Church of Northville on Eight Mile Road west of Taft Road.

Grech, of Livonia, has worked at the Northville office about 17 months and graduated from Madonna University in the school's first master's degree program in clinical psychology.

"It's a wonderful place to work," she said. "It's nice to have the spiritual component."

Why do people come to their office for counseling?

"Sometimes people come in because they feel their life isn't working for them," Greeh said. "It's not going the way they want it

She said we often feel anxiety in our daily lives and don't really

know why. "A lot of times things unfold that sure about why we're feeling the

way we feel," Grech said. In her practice, she uses psychotherapy, which she describes as a journey through a person's life to determine why they developed how they did and how they got to where they currently are in life.

In her quest to update her skills, she is in the process of completing a two-year program at the Michigan Psychoanalytic Center in Farmington Hills.

Grech said some people seek counseling during a crisis or life transition.

"It could be after a trauma in the family, such as the loss of a spouse," she said.

Communication is a big issue with couples, such as the inability to share needs, wants and expectations with the other person. "We often get into other difficul-

ties when we're not communicat-







Jim Conzelman thinks the Robostangs rock.

The faculty advisor of the Northville High School robotics team had the honor of watching them capture second place out of 58 teams after the preliminary rounds in the FIRST Robotics Buckeye Regional in Cleveland last month.

This was the best finish in the team's seven-year history.

Unfortunately, they lost in the quarter finals.

But they're still thrilled with

About 30 students worked on the robot project for six weeks. Team members Dan Keys, Sean Hadley, Lauren Staszel, Don Ebben and Tim Tsai gathered recently to discuss the project.

And, they did it without a lot of backing.

"We had a limited budget, and we built the design around that," Keys said.

Hadley said sign-up was completely volunteer this year. But, if the popularity of the team continues, the school may have a selection process next year, Conzelman said.

"It's a good business model," Hadley said.

The students said they learned more than just how to put together a robot. The project teaches cooperation, team management, time management and problem solving.

"It also teaches skills such as CAD (computer-assisted design), engineering, manufacturing and computer knowledge," Keys said.

Students may also discover that they're not be suited for an engineering career. Although many team members do become designers or engineers, sometimes students in the robotics competitions learn such fields really aren't their cup of tea.

"Just as many students realize they don't want to be engineers, Conzelman said.

Students blast off to new planet On CAMPUS in Amerman space simulations

Overnight stay tomorrow, caps off weeklong project

Watch out, Captain Kirk and the fictional crew of the Starship Enterprise.

You don't have anything over a group of fifth-graders at Amerman Elementary School.

Students at the Northville school will simulate space missions to a new planet each day this week, followed by an overnight mission from 7 p.m. Friday-8 a.m. Saturday.

Children often learn about space travel as part of science curriculum.

But few have the chance to blast into space and explore a new planet, unless they are part of Amerman Elementary's Space Simulation project, a hands-on learning experience led by fifth-grade teachers Wendy LaValle and Robin Long.

On their sixth space adventure, LaValle and Long will guide a new group of students . sion," LaValle said. this week as they embark on a simulated mission to a new planet, created in Amerman's courtyard, to study earth and natural sciences, collect and investigate data and explore careers in space studies.

A highlight of the project was the May 10 visit by retired NASA astronaut Jim Begian of Northville.

Begian, who served as a mission specialist on NASA missions in 1989 and 1991, told students that there is one piece of equipment invaluable to astronauts - duct tape.

"My dad says duct tape is like the force - it has a dark side and a light side and it holds the universe together," said one stu-

Begian said astronauts have to learn to improvise in space while traveling 25,000 feet a second.

Students participate in daily and members of Mission Control, culminating in a final launch Friday when some astronauts spend the night on the planet's surface.

The students learn far more than just about space travel and how NASA conducts a mis-

We have something we call a binary machine where we type in special codes which allows us to communicate through flashes of green and red lights.' Crittenden said.



Northville High **School Internship Program**

Business internship coordinator Leigh Steams said more and more students are signing up for on-the-job training.

The Northville High School internship program she took over five years ago with 34 kids enrolled grew to 120 this school year. Steams said 180 juniors and seniors signed up for the creditcourse for 2007-08.

Work settings range from hospitals to radio stations, beauty salons to travel agencies. She solicits businesses in and around Northville willing to welcome high school students

After meeting with students to discuss their declared career pathway and aspirations, Steams tries to match an appropriate work environment. The employer and intern determine how the required hours are logged, sometimes in operating rooms, in court rooms, at concerts and in offices.

During the internship, the teacher visits the workplace, conducts evaluations and assigns a

"The goal is for the student to experience the career," Steams said. "A lot of the time, the student changes their mind and decides that's not what they want

"I say, 'That's good."

Stearns logs plenty of hours tracking down business owners who will invest the necessary time with students in the growing pro-

"it's pretty stressful at the beginning of the year until everyone's in place once the school year starts," she said. "It's a really good program. I rarely get turned down - they really enjoy working with young people.

The internship is detailed in the high school course catalog, Steams said. A letter in August acquaints students with the rules, expected conduct, dress codes and other aspects of the course. Different from co-op work experiences, interns are not paid, provide their own transportation and eam course credits

"At parent-teacher conferences, I've had a couple of parents say, 'I didn't know about this - I found out from my neighbor," she said. It's a win-win. The company gets free help and they get to mentor students going into their field.

"The kids get invaluable experience. A lot of companies really take the time to spend with these kids."

Benefits of internships go both ways

High school, college students all over town

Brian Bielksis can meet people a little easier these dáys.

As an intern with Long's Plumbing, greeting several customers a day was part of the crew's routine — not instinctively comfortable for the 17-year-old Northville High School senior, But the past four months have meant on-the-job training in a lot of areas.

And although Bielskis has ruled out plumbing as a career direction, he said the internship experience has been invaluable.

"I'm learning a lot about plumbing - I'll be able to do some things in my own home," Bielskis said. "I would definitely recommend the internship program at the school.

Considering a direction

Northville High School business internship coordinator Leigh Steams matched Bielskis with Long's. During the past five years, the business teacher has talked with hundreds of juniors and seniors about their career paths, considering a potential fit with willing local business owners.

Don Luke, Long Mechanical vice president, said the Main Street business started bringing in high school and college students two years ago.

'We're enjoying it," Luke said. We like to give the opportunity to have someone see if they'd like to do what we do in plumbing and heating.'

For three hours three days per week, Bielskis has been traveling with a heating and air conditioning technician.

"He kind of helps the guy -whatever he can do," Luke said. "He observes.

Meanwhile, Eastern Michigan University alumnus Priya Niskode earned a position in the kitchen and bath design showroom. After proving herself during a college internship, Long's hired her to work full-time until she moves on to graduate school.

Benefits both ways

A little west on Main Street, Nickie Bateson, City of Northville finance director, has had similar

success with hiring interns to provide professional services. Back when she decided to earn her business degree, she chose to attend the University of Michigan in Dearborn because of the strength of their internship program.

You get on the job experience and it makes it easier when you graduate and are starting your career out," she said. "It gives the employer a lot of flexibility in

staffing."
So, Bateson knew to turn to her alma mater for a temporary replacement for an finance department employee on maternity leave. Tim Davis, who holds three master's degrees, has worked on several projects for the city, including preparation of audit schedules and year-end financial data

"You get someone who is educated in a particular area, but it isn't a long-term commitment," Bateson said. "It's a cost-effective way to get the work done.

'Any employer — I'd encourage to contact the intern department they always have quality people who are right in the area."

And with the evolving job market and investment in education and training required by worker and employer, test driving a career makes good business sense.

Steams said the internships can play a critical role eliminating a career path for high school students, as much as cementing a direction.

Sampling the water

Based on the interns so far, Luke said Long's will continue to bring in rookies for training.

'We've had an excellent experience — it's been quite a surprise." he said. "By bringing the younger people in - the fresh blood, the new ideas - it really makes us all think a little more outside the box."

So, Bielskis' career path options will still be wide open when he heads to Western Michigan University this fall.

"I think the internship is a great idea," he said. "I thought about plumbing as a career, then realized after a couple of months it's not for

But, he is grateful he has the Long's experience under his belt.

'Going into different people's homes all the time, I'm definitely a lot more comfortable talking to





Tonight, members of the Northville Township Board of Trustees will discuss the possibility of upgrading two soccer fields at Community Park.

These fields near the northwest corner of Five Mile and Beck roads are two of the most popular fields in the township and are in need of irrigation and drainage systems.

At the May 9 Northville Parks and Recreation Commission meeting at the Northville Township hall, board member Mary Gans briefly reviewed a proposed design for a drainage system for the fields.

In his opinion, the design would be as effective as the more traditional

method used but at a significant savings to the township.

The most savings would occur if work on both fields was done at the same

time. However, this might put a crimp in the spring soccer program.

With some financial assistance from the Friends of Northville Parks and Recreation, Gans says the township might have to pay only \$60,000 for work on one of the fields. He has also estimated that the township could save up to \$180,000 with the less expensive method.

Mark Abbo, township supervisor, said at the meeting that the township normally does business by using the advice of professionals in the field before making any decisions.

Abbo also said that the board would never do anything to circumvent the fiduciary responsibility of its members.

He said he has instructed Don Weaver, director of public services for the township, to compare Gans' proposal with any others and to determine if his method could possibly be incorporated with another method.

"I'm not an engineer," Abbo said. "And we do rely on the expertise of professional engineers." He said his goals are to find the most efficient and effective way to fix the soccer fields, to make sure that the work is done correctly so it doesn't have to be redone in the future and to save as much

Hopefully, members of the board will at least consider fellow member Gans' alternative method of providing drainage to the Community Park soccer fields if the design is as effective as a more costly concept.

These fields are a vital part of the recreation offerings of the city. Their care and upkeep is important, as is saving township dollars, especially with the reduction in state shared revenues municipalities have had to face in recent years.

Legislation requires children entering kindergarten to be 5 by Sept. 1

Recently I introduced two measures, Senate Bills 474 and 475, that would require children to be 5 by September 1 of the year they enter kindergarten. Currently a student must be 5 by December 1 to start school.



Year after year, I have seen children attend kindergarten who have late birthdays and would have, without a doubt, done much better in school had they waited until the following school year," said Benn, currently a first-grade teacher at the school. "Give our children the time to develop and mature and to be truly ready to start their academic journey. Life is not a race, and we shouldn't be rushing these little ones before they're able to handle the greater expectations placed on them."

Most states require a student to be at least age 5 by August or September before being allowed to enter kindergarten. Michigan is one of only six states with a cutoff date of December 1 or later.

The bills would phase in the cut-off date over three years by making the deadline one month earlier each year. They would also require local school boards to adopt a policy enabling parents of a child who is 4 by September 1 to request a waiver of the age requirement if the student is deemed to have the capabilities necessary for kindergarten.

Similar measures were part of a landmark legislative package that I sponsored last year that focused on prevention and early interven-

tion of learning failure. The new legislation will complete a comprehensive plan to give students the strongest start possible and help ensure a solid foun-

Mortgage fraud legislation passes Senate

The Senate has passed legislation that will help prevent mortgage fraud in Michigan.

According to the FBI, mortgage fraud loss in Michigan skyrocketed from \$9 million in 2003 to \$26 million in 2005. Currently, Michi \$29 million a year to mortgage

To help address this serious crime, Senate Bills 343 and 356 will prohibit mortgage brokers or other lending professionals from coercing or inducing real estate appraisers to inflate the value of real property used as collateral for a mortgage loan.

A companion measure, SB 342, would prevent appraisers from conducting an appraisal if a requirement for getting the job is an expected outcome, or it is implied that their payment is based upon a desired minimum appraised value.

SB 432 is a technical bill that will remove the outdated threeyear misdemeanor penalty from the sentencing guidelines associated with mortgage acts. The penalty will be replaced with a standard one-year misdemeanor and increased fines.

Senate Bills 342, 343, 356, and 432 now move to the House for consideration.

Tax plans go to workgroup

House and Senate plans to replace the Single Business Tax which expires on December 31, 2007, are the subject of negotiations between 8 members of a bicameral, bi-partisan workgroup. Co-Chairs are Rep. Steve Bieda, House Tax Policy Chair and myself, Chair of Senate Finance.

County commissioners oppose plan

We are writing on behalf of Oakland County to ask that readers oppose the planned raid of the convention facility fund - which is collected from liquor and hotel taxes - to balance the general State of Michigan budget. Discussions are currently under way to liquidate that fund in Senate bill 220, for fiscal year 2007. If enacted, our communities will lose nearly \$36 million currently used for public safety and substance abuse treatment programs.

These programs with their intense focus on intervention and public safety of our citizens provide successful and less-costly alterntives to incarceration, such that our strained county jail space can be used for criminals more likely to steal from or harm our residents. The Legislature and the Governor are working to finalize the budget within the next two weeks.

Michigan counties, most especially Oakland, have already helped the state to the tune of \$183 million annually for a limited period of time. Other annual cuts to county programs in other areas of the budget have left critical county services which our residents use in an extremely vulnerable position. The 'slash and burn' planned for substance abuse programs is dangerous policy, when added to state proposals to dump felony parolees back into our localities while also shifting sentencing guidelines.

Even as state leaders contemplate confiscating funds from these proven programs, they continue to dither over changes needed to reawaken Michigan's economy; and massive unfunded future budget obligations are eleft untouched while legislators perpetuate massive subsidy programs for favored clients, and indeed, even propose new ones.

Recent suspicious person report prompts quick action at schools

Steve Anderson never would have believed that a harmless computer game could lead to a security alert at his school.

Anderson, principal of Amerman Elementary School in Northville, said an alert was issued last week for Amerman, Hillside Middle School and Cooke School last Thursday when a suspicious male came onto his school's property.

The man climbed over an 8-foot fence by the baseball field next to the school to find an object in the popular Global Positioning System game, Geocaching.

Like an online scavenger hunt, players use a GPS to locate an object at coordinates posted on the official Global GPS Cache Hunt Site, www.geocaching.com.

Billed as "the sport where you are the search engine," Anderson said he played the game recently while visiting friends in Arizona.

"It's a fun diversion and hobby, but to put one of these on public school property is rather naive in the sense that everyone would be aware of our security with the students," Anderson said.

When the unknown man came onto school property, security measures had to be taken.

"I'm very happy with what went on," Anderson said. "The response was within minutes both at the school, with the police and other schools. The communication protocol worked quite well."

Too much wine

A 24-year-old Northville Township woman is facing drunk driving charges in court next Thursday following her May 15 arrest.





Female athletes: Knee deep in injuries?

The prototypical sports injury is the anterior cruciate figament (ACL) injury. Every year in training camp where hope springs eternal for most football teams, the future is inevitably dimmed by the loss of a potential star for the year to this common knee injury. For three consecutive years at least one of my fantasy football 'horses' has gone down early with an ACL.

And every year, scores of our high school and collegiate female athletes have their seasons ended by this injury. Indeed. there are

times when it feels as though female knee injuries are the sole reason we're still in business.

The ACL is the main stabilizing ligament of the knee allowing for jumping, cutting and pivoting motions. Basketball, volleyball and soccer are the major at-risk sports for women's knee injuries. Almost two-thirds of female ACL injuries occur while landing from a jump. As women's parucipation in sports has risen over the last two decades, the corresponding storm of female ACL injuries has produced a minor epidemic. Several reasons for the three to four times higher rate of this injury in women compared to their male counterparts have been proposed.

Estrogen, the principal female hormone, has a direct negative effect on collagen. Collagen is the protein making up the bulk of every ligament in the body including the ACL. The intuitive thought is that increased levels of estrogen in females contribute to their higher rate of ligament injury. Taking this one step further, several studies have been performed attempting to pinpoint a time during the woman's menstrual cycle during which they are most susceptible to injury. Studies so far have failed to show a consistent point in the cycle when these injuries occur but a clear trend of increased injury during times of high estrogen has been identified. We do not have enough information at this time tify stages of the cycle which are "high-risk" for injury (nor would avoidance of sports during this time be practical either) but the original hypothesis that estrogen plays a role in ACL injury seems to have been

proven. Several anatomic differences have been put forth to explain the gender difference in ACL injury. The 'notch' area of the knee is an area in the center of the knee joint where most ACL injuries occur, this area is proportionately smaller in women compared with men. Combine that with the reduced thickness of the ligament and you get one more reason for the increased risk of injury in

women Instant replay and super slomo have allowed us to identify several subtleties in jumping mechanics. Women tend to land from a jump in a more upright position with their knees much closer together than male athletes and this type of position has been found to directly increase the stress on the ACL. Female athletes also tend to fire their quadriceps muscles more than their hamstring muscles during cutting maneuvers which can also put

the ACL at higher risk. While we cannot change the anatomic and hormonal differences in women, we can change mechanics and this has been the focus of the ACL injury prevention program we have implemented and others like it around the country. Just as a golf swing or jumpshot can be properly taught, so can landing mechanics and muscle balance. Early studies show that these injury prevention programs are effective in reducing ACL injunes. Unfortunately, though, for our sisters and daughters (and mothcrs!), we haven't reached the point at which we're putting ourselves out of business...yet.





Clinic emphasizes a healthier lifestyle

There are a number of very good reasons why patients visit the Northville Physical Rehabilitation clinic on 300 E. Cady st. in Northville. Most importantly, they feel much better when they leave and they get a very personable experience from the three-person staff.

The staff is led by physical therapist Ann Bishop, a graduate of Wayne State University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Physical Therapy. She has worked mainly in an outpatient orthopedic setting and continues to grow her knowledge of physical therapy by taking numerous continuing education courses in a variety of fields. She formerly worked through Providence Hospital in Novi

Bishop said that people who visit the clinic come in a variety of different shapes and sizes, all seeking the same things: rehabilitation and ways to live a healthier lifestyle.

"Most of our patients are from Northville and are referred from physicians in the area," Bishop said. "We treat orthopedic and neurological disorders in patients of all ages, Many hear about us by word of mouth.

"In fact, some people see us and walk in with their prescriptions."

one of the most popular pieces of equipment in the clinic is the underwater treadmill, referred affectionately as the pool by staffers at the Cady Street location as well as the original office at 215 E. Main St., which is run by Dennis Engerer, P.T.

"The underwater treadmill is a nice feature for patients who have back, knee, or hip problems," Bishop said, "There is less loading on the joints because of the water. Sometimes walking on a normal treadmill can be painful and some doctors specifically request aquatic therapy for their patients."

Bishop said that patients can adjust the water height to their specific needs and that the underwater treadmill has no age limit. Young children to the elderly can schedule routine treatments in the water.

But there are other reasons why patients

— or anyone — can find the facilities very useful. Anyone can pay a monthly fee to come in and use the exercise and fitness equipment if they have been a patient. It is like having a private, personal health club right in the neighborhood. The fee is \$35 a month and requires no lengthy commitment.

"You don't have to commit to paying for a year as with other health clubs," Bishop added, "And people can continue their therapy for as long as they like."

The underwater treadmill is not part of the monthly fee.

monthly fee.

Beyond what the Northville Physical Rehabilitation clinic can do for the physical treatment of patients, the staff can also help with the disposition of patients too.

"We are homey," Bishop said. "It is nice and bright in here and people just like to visit."

The clinic has been open for two years and is located just east of the First Presbyterian Church. The staff also includes physical therapy technicians Judy Majewski and Melissa

Maltese, two very personable workers.

Eating and the Elderly: Approaching Diet As You Age

Parents often hear about the need for their children to eat a healthy and balanced diet. But what about the parents of those parents? As people age, a balanced diet remains important.

For seniors, maintaining a healthy diet is very important as they head deeper into their golden years. - · Continue to consume calcium.

 Bone diseases such as osteoporosis can be the result of calcium deficiency, and most seniors will admit their calcium intake isn't what it should be. Since osteo-

porosis weakens bones and makes them more susceptible to breaking, consuming calcium is essential for seniors to avoid potentially debilitating breaks. Seniors who don't like the taste of milk or other dairy products, can consider a calcium supplement or regularly include broccoli, a good source of calcium, in their diet.

Dehydration is common among seniors due to the reduction in the body's overall water content. Regardless of thirst, seniors should drink water with each meal. Oftentimes, low water levels in the body can result in fatigue. How much water you should drink depends on individual body weight, so consult with your physician and stick to his or her recommendations.

• Don't eliminate fat entirely.

While it's important for seniors to limit their fat intake, fat remains an important energy source, so eliminating fat entirely is not a good idea. Low fat dairy products and lean meats are good sources of fat, which also provide necessary vitamins to maintain health. Also consider where you're getting fat from. If your preferred method of preparing meals is frying, that should be eliminated, as it will only lead to excessive fat intake.

Most of these changes are manageable and will help seniors maintain a healthy lifestyle as they age. However, consult a physician before making any of the above modifications.





Seniors: Start Walking

Contrary to popular belief, moderate exercise to improve overall health doesn't require a slew of expensive equipment. You likely already have just what you need at home: a pair of good shoes.

Many people underestimate the power of walking. According to James M. Rippe, M.D., a cardiologist and director of the Rippe Lifestyle Institute in Shrewsbury, MA, almost all of the benefit you get from exercise comes from escaping the bottom 20 percent of people in terms of physical activity. To achieve this, all you need to do is walk for 30 minutes per day.

The Benefits of Walking

Walking just may be one of the most beneficial actions you can take. If the power of walking were compressed into pill form, it would be one of the most popular remedies ever. What's more, walking is something that is easy to do, requires no prescription and you've been doing it from as early as age 1.

Here are just some of the benefits of walking:

· Weight loss: Physical activity com-

bined with well-balanced eating can keep the pounds off. This means advantages in lowering risk of heart disease, cancer, diabetes and more.

- Decreases your risk of heart attack: Exercising just half an hour a day is associated with a 30 percent to 40 percent lower risk of heart disease in women, according to a 20 year Nurses' Health Study of 72,000 female nurses.
- · Moderates blood pressure: Getting the heart pumping regularly conditions it to work more effectively and with less effort.
- Reduces "bad" cholesterol: Physical activity boosts good cholesterol (HDL) and lowers bad cholesterol (LDL), which causes plaque to build up on the walls of the arteries.

Other pluses ...

- · Protects against hip fracture
- · Enhances mood
- · Improves sleep
- · Lengthens life span

· Strengthens muscles, joints and bones ... and much more.

Getting Started

Being sedentary is one of the worst things you can do for health, particularly if you have no medical reason to stay put. You don't have to run a marathon the first day. Build up to the recommended 30 minutes of walking by starting slowly and for whatever duration you can manage - even 5 minutes. As you gain confidence your momentum will approve.

Choose a safe place to walk that is also comfortable. Many seniors enjoy a stroll around an area mall because walking is not impeded by weather conditions. Still, you can walk on the boardwalk, around a scenic lake or wherever else you choose.

Overcoming Obstacles

If you feel unsteady walking, or have had a fall or broken bone that limits mobility, there are solutions. You can use walking poles, which will give you balance and a little extra body strength. If you use a walker or cane, still get out there and get moving as much as possible.


Water exercises can also be beneficial. The water serves to support your body, and walking through water provides subtle resistance that can build strength. Check out area health clubs or senior centers that have a pool.

If dizziness or balance is a concern, you may need a new hearing aid or glasses. Sight and ear function contribute to balance.

Here are a few tips to make your loved one's home safer:

- Keep all areas of the home, including hallways and stairs, well-lit, but free from glare.
- Remove scatter rugs, or attach a nonskid backing to them.
- Reduce the risk of falling on uncarpeted floors by ensuring that they are not slip-pery. Do not use any gloss polish.
- Use night lights in the bedroom, hall-ways, kitchen and bathrooms.
- Keep the stove area in the kitchen free of towels, paper towels, napkins, curtains, and other things that might catch fire.
- Remove all newspapers & magazines from the kitchen counter areas.
- Keep a fire extinguisher in the kitchen, and teach everyone of age to use it.

- A three-pronged plug should be used in a three hole outlet, or an adapter should be used.
- Always turn off heating pads before an older person goes to sleep.



Learn the Ways to Prevent Medication Errors

Medication errors can occur at any step during the health care process. It's estimated that on average, there is at least one medication error per hospital patient per day, although error rates vary widely across facilities. Errors can also occur at the pharmacy and result from doctors prescribing medications that just aren't compatible.

Estimates suggest that millions of people are injured each year from medication errors - mostly seniors. This should come as no surprise because seniors often take several prescriptions to maintain health and manage chronic diseases. Studies show the average senior takes four or five prescription drugs and two over-the-counter drugs on any given day, and this can compound the risk for complications. That adds up to quite a number of pills and liquids being consumed daily, which can be confusing in and of itself. Plus, slower metabolism among seniors means that drugs will remain in the body longer than in younger people, making them more prone to adverse drug reactions and the potential for overdose.

Limit Risks From Medication Mistakes

There are ways to reduce the chances for mistakes when it comes to your medication.

- 1. Notify your doctor of all overthe-counter, prescription drugs and vitamin or herbal supplements you are taking. Every one of these items has the potential to interact with new drugs your doctor may be thinking of pre-
- 2. Take the drugs your doctor prescribes according to directions (time of day, empty/full stomach, duration). Do not stop a medication without consulting with the doctor first, even if it seems like it may be a good idea.
- 3. Be aware that drugs can be listed and prescribed by their trade or generic name.
- 4. Some over-the-counter medications contain the same ingredients. For example, cold remedies can contain acetaminophen (Tylenol), therefore taking pain relievers on top of cold medi-cines could prove dangerous.

Always read the packaging and warning labels before taking a drug or supplement.

- 5. Drinking alcoholic beverages when you are taking some medications may alter their effects or create hazardous reactions.
- 6. Pharmacies may offer special services to make managing medications easier. For example, some can print labels in larger print for the vision impaired. Prescriptions may be color-coded if multiple members of the family are taking different drugs and the opportunity for confusion exists.
- 7. Paper prescriptions may become extinct soon. New computerized systems for prescribing drugs may reduce the number of drug-related mistakes. Studies indicate that paper prescriptions are associated with high error rates. Electronic prescribing is safer because it eliminates prob-lems with handwriting legibility and, when combined with decision-support tools, automatically alerts prescribers to possible interactions, allergies, and other potential problems. Technicalities still need to be worked out, but

forecasters predict that by 2008 all health care providers should have plans in place to write prescriptions electronically.

- 8. Develop a rapport with your pharmacist. He or she can prove a wealth of knowledge on medications and answer any questions you may have concerning prescriptions or general health
- 9. Create a system at home that keeps medications organized according to when you need to take them. Some people prefer a pill organizer in which they distribute pills. When the caddy is empty, they've taken all the pills for the day. Others feel this presents confining heavyer the pills. ents confusion because the pills are taken out of their original bottles. A chart placed in the bathroom or where you keep your medications could prove handy.
- 10. If you notice any strange feelings or side effects in response to a medication, alert your doctor.

What's your home worth - really?

(NAPSI) — Many homeowners are curious about the value of their property and would like to find a reliable way to get an estimate. Here are some tips on how to get the facts and not settle for a guess:


■ Don't always believe what you see at online home valuation sites. On some sites, you can enter your address and a property value pops up. While these sites can sometimes be fairly accurate, research has shown that they are often off the mark. The reason is that online valuation sites primarily consider public records data such as tax assessments or listings for sale — not current, independent appraisal data. Plus, Web valuation sites can't look inside a house to note major upgrades such as a new kitchen or other amenities. A good rule of thumb: Don't take a free Internet estimate to the bank.

■ Not all appraisers are equal. The most reliable way to get a value estimate of your home is to use a professional real estate appraiser. Using current market data, knowledge of the area, a home visit and analysis of comparable properties, the appraiser arrives at an opinion of market value.

Appraisers are hired by banks or mortgage brokers during a pending sale transaction. Homeowners can also hire their own appraiser as a check on the bank's appraiser, or for assurance that they aren't paying too much. Homeowners also use appraisers for home valuations when appealing property tax assessments, drafting wills, undertaking a major home renovation or dividing property pursuant to legal actions.

Although all real estate appraisers must be state licensed or certified, some appraisers increase their credentials by earning an SRA designation conferred by the Appraisal Institute to distinguish members experienced in the analysis and valuation of residential real property. They meet stringent education, experience and ethical requirements that surpass many of those required for state licensure. Appraisal Institute-designated appraisers can be found at www.appraisalinstitute.org.

Not all renovations add value. A common misperception among homeowners is that remodeling and renovating cost equals value. Remodeling a kitchen or bathroom may bring the greatest return on your investment, but some custom installations can actually detract from value. A good rule is to stick to what's standard in your neighborhood and consider projects that add square footage to bring a house up to — but not beyond — community norms.

Toilet display could violate condo restrictions

Q. One of the co-owners in our condominium has displayed a toilet painted in a particular school's colors underneath their deck in their back yard and the board is serious about fining them. Do you have any suggestions?

A. Besides it potentially being obnoxious, it may well, no doubt, be in violation of the condominium restrictions against maintaining a nuisance or otherwise placing personal property on common elements. If the board chooses to fine, the board should be sure that it complies with the notice and hearing requirements mandated by the Condominium Act and presumably the condominium documents.

Q. I have heard about a recent case in a co-op regarding mold related health problems which resulted in a dismissal of a claim. Do you any information?

A. I am advised that a couple claimed that mold-related health problems drove them out of their co-op building in New York. After reviewing 1,000 pages of testimony and more than 70

scientific articles and books, the judge concluded that the couple had not shown conclusive scientific evidence that mold or a damp, indoor environment caused their illness. The court relied on the Federal Court of Appeals case of Frye vs. United States that

found that testimony regarding novel scientific evidence is not allowed if it has not "gained general acceptance in the particular field in which it belongs." The court in that case evaluated the mold sampling report, medical reports. and scientific writings and gave great weight to a 2004 report issued by the National Academy of Sciences' Institute of Medicine which found that existing research did not show sufficient evidence of a casual relationship between mold and symptoms complained of. The judge also considered a 2006 posi-

tion paper of the American Academy of Allergy, Asthma, and Immunology which did not find a causal relationship between airborne mold exposure and allergies, rashes, or fatigue. Of course, that is merely a New York decision and each case must be evaluated on its own facts. In other words, the court found that the couple's health problems could have arisen from other manifestations of building dampness such as dust mites, cockroaches, or chemical emis-

sions from building materials.

"After being out in the woods for six months I thought it was something I wanted to do as a service to the hikers," Patrick ackls. "At the time, it was hard to even find a pair of socks in Damascus."

Plenty has changed in Trail Town USA since Patrick started selling outdoor gear 16 years ago. Today, Damascus, which lies at the junction of five hiking, biking and scenic trails, is home to two sporting goods stores, six bike shops, and more than a dozen bed & breakfast inns and hostels that cater to thousands of hikers and cyclists each year.

Many come to Damascus to ride bicycles on the 34-mile Virginia Creeper Trail, which follows the forested route of a former railroad line between Abingdon and Whitetop Station, Va.



Damascus," says Rick DeArmond, 40, the owner of Blue Blaze Bike & Shuttle. "It's all downhill, so families can bring kids along and ride 18 miles."

Colorful tents dot

The dense forests around Damascus long have arrracted adventurous outdoorsmen. Daniel Boone blazed a trail through the wiklerness of southwestern Virginia in 1775, opening the region to European settlement.

"He came through here and went west into the Cumberland Gap in Kentucky," says Louise Fortune Hall, 94, the town's historian and a founding member of the Mount Rogers Appalachian Trail Club, which maintains 56 miles of the trail north of Damascus.

Today's trailblazers are the hundreds of longdistance hikers that pass through Damascus each year en route to Mount Katahdin in Maine. Most arrive in April or May and many time their visit to coincide with the town's annual Appalachian Trail Days.

The festival, which serves as both a community celebration and hikers' reunion, features a hikers' parade and talent show, Appalachian Trail photo contest, backpacking workshops, a trout tournament, and dozens of outdoor product vendors and trail-related organizations.

"Hiking the Appalachian Trail is a mission and they want to accomplish the whole trail," says Mayor Creed Jones, 80, of the visiting trekkers. "Then they love to come back here and brag about it."

Damascus is a virtual oasis for weary hikers, a place where they can eat a hearty meal, wash a load of laundry and restock their (Continued on page 16)

Doctoring Beloved Dolls

Mary Ann Pizzolato peers into the dull blue eyes of Baby Coos, a 60-year-old doll whose plastic peepers have been clouded by a fungus—and time. Next, she flexes the doll's vinyl legs, which are ripped and ready to fall off.

After examining the doll from head to toe, Pizzolato looks hopeful. After all, she's been repairing cracked Kewpies, balding Barbies and tattered teddy bears for 30 years.

"If we treat her mold and attach these legs the best we can, it's going to be about \$60," says Pizzolato, 53, the owner of The Doll Hospital in Spring, Texas (pop. 36,385).

Baby Coos is worth saving to Beverly Peach, 68, of Mount Carmel, Ill., who received the doll as a Christmas gift when she was 10.

"Then we'll get her admitted," says Pizzolato, who has repaired dolls as a sideline since the 1970s when she apprenticed with a doll doctor in her hometown of East Orange, N.J.

Clad in a white lab jacket, Pizzolato tags and bags Baby Coos' clothing and assigns her a bed-box in a ward with a hundred other dolls with flopping limbs, sunken eyes, broken necks, squawky voice boxes and sawdust seeping from their middles. Dolls that arrive without clothes

are robed in miniature hospital gowns. "They get embarrassed," Pizzolato says with a smile.

"Some things are minor, like reattaching a head or restyling hair," she says, whereas other dolls need major makeovers. "I restored a Shirley Temple doll that had both feet and arms eaten by a rottweiler."

In 1985, Pizzolato left a career as a chemical engineer for Gulf Oil Co. during a slump in the oil business and opened the doll repair and retail shop two years later. Her chemistry background comes in handy in duplicating the original material used by the doll makers.

"I go back to the basics," she says. "I'm at heart a conservationist,"

Pizzolato restores dolls made of china and leather, wood and wax, papier-mâché and plastic. With the duplicated material, she sculpts a new toe, a chin or other body part, then sands and paints them.

To remove decades of dirt left by grubby little hands, Pizzolato concocted a solution that cleans without removing painted ruby lips and pink cheeks.

A rejuvenated 1931 Patsy doll decked in a pink corduroy coat and a 1923 Bubbles in bloomers and bonnet look like a lineup in a beauty pageant after Pizzolato's handiwork. They smell as fresh as they look, too, because she sprays them with a vanilla-scented fragrance that she formulated.

"New dolly smell and Christmas morning just go together," Pizzolato says. "I like being able to bring back some of that magic to people's lives."

Dolls are sent to The Doll Hospital for appraisals and repairs from around the United States and keep Pizzolato and four assistants bustling. Costs range from \$25 for a simple restringing of limbs to more than \$1,000 for a major reconstruction, such as the work needed on

an 1850s china doll with a shattered face. In its restored condition, the rare doll by French doll maker A. Thuillier is valued at \$50,000.

Not every doll that Pizzolato rescues has antique value, though. Some are modern plastic dolls that have been squeezed and smooched to shreds, but are priceless to their young owners. Last year, Brooke Frohock, 7, and her sister, Madison, 9, checked their dolls into the hospital for needed eye implants and skin transplants, but were sad about leaving their beloved babies.

"These were their first dolls," says their mother, Gabrielle Frohock, of Sugar Land, Texas. "They put them to bed each night."

To ease the girls' worries, Pizzolato sent daily e-mails to them from their dolls. "Dr. Mary Ann gave me a bubble bath and I got to eat chocolate ice cream," one message read. "Don't be sad because I'm going to be so beautiful when you see me."

"Mary Ann made the whole thing a pleasant experience," Gabrielle says.


Pizzolato delights in seeing the faces of 7-year-olds and 70-year-olds when they come to take their rehabilitated dolls home from The Doll Hospital.


"It's a little piece of childhood that people hang onto," she says. "We get to relive a lot of happy times with people."

Reverendof the Rodeo

Former bareback bronc champion Todd Pierce still gets nervous

when he steps into a rodeo arena, but his fear has nothing to do with riding a buck-

ing horse without a saddle or reins.

"I'm scared to death to speak in front of people," Pierce admits with a grin. "And it's a big part of my job."

Pierce, 35, of Shel-Idaho (pop. 3,885), hung up his spurs several years ago to answer a call to the ministry as a rodeo pastor. As an ordained, nondenominational minister affiliated with

Pro Bull Riding Outreach, a Christian ministry for rodeo contestants, he travels to competitions all over the nation, and also served in Australia last year.

"It's good I get butterflies (when I speak)," Pierce says. "If God asked us to do something that we were capable of doing without him, then we'd never ask for help."

At every event, Pierce leads Bible studies for riders and their families, and a Sunday worship service that is open to everyone, including fans. Since rodeos are primarily weekend events, Pierce brings a religious worship experience to people whose lifestyle frequently takes them on the road and away from regular worship services.

Bull rider Wiley Peterson, 26, attends Outreach services regularly and says Pierce is "gifted at touching people's hearts."

"He's a real guy, without a holier-thanthou attitude," says Peterson, of Fort Hall, Idaho (pop. 3,193). "That's what people like about him."

Riders especially relate because Pierce has lived their lifestyle. He successfully competed as a bareback rider in Professional Rodeo Cowboy Association events for seven years, finishing third in the world in rookie standings his first year and later winning the Wilderness Circuit title three times.

Pierce knew he wanted to be a minister after becoming a Christian while attending Idaho State University. He also had done some bareback horse riding previously so, after graduating in 1994, Pierce joined the professional rodeo circuit and brought along his wife, Leslie. The couple hoped their rodeo experiences would help

them understand how they eventually could minister to others.

When he wasn't competing explosive broncs, Pierce studied for the ministry and conducted informal prayer groups and Bible studies for fellow riders. He was ordained in 2001 by the Trinity Fellowship in Oklahoma and, that same

year, became a pastor with Pro Bull Riding Outreach.

"We had another pastor," says Cody Custer, a founding member of both the ministry and the Professional Bull Riders Association. "But things were a little rough and unorganized for him. Sometimes we have bulls and tractors in the background during services."

A little noise and a few bulls don't rattle Pierce. He's just as passionate about worship whether it is for 20 people gathered backstage at a dusty arena or 1,500 people in a Las Vegas ballroom.

"Todd is the most tenacious man I've ever met," says Custer, who met Pierce at a rodeo competition. "He's got so much grit and determination. But it's a blessing and curse. There are nights he doesn't sleep because he cares so much for people and what they're going through."

Once when a bull rider was thrown and in danger of being trampled, Pierce jumped the fence and got "right in the middle of it," according to Custer. "I've never said he was *smart!*," he adds with a smile. "But that man has a heart of gold."

Pierce says the sport of bull riding creates an intense environment. "Sometimes it's life or death. When you're in a setting like that, there's a closeness you enter into," he says.

The physical demands and inherent dangers of the rodeo lifestyle combine for a unique community of faith living life on the edge. "I love these men like my own brothers," Pierce says. "My ultimate goal is to bring them into a deeper relationship with God."

Cyrus and Miley star on TV's Hannah Montana.

Riding high on the latest loop of an upand-down, 25-year roller-coaster career. Cyrus is burning the candle at both ends, but he doesn't show it. As he brushes an errant lock of hair out of his eyes, he looks cool and collected, suggesting that he's a man who can't be frazzled.

"I lose it sometimes," he admits. "I just don't ever let anyone see it. I do it alone in my car with the music blasting."

The loud music in Cyrus' automobile could easily be Miley's Hannah Montana CD, which last year made history as the first TV soundtrack to enter the Billboard chart at No. 1. The CD's out-of-the-gate avalanche of sales was spurred by the runaway success of the TV series, which debuted last year and remains one of the most successful projects in the history of the Disney Channel. Expectations are that Miley's upcoming solo CD, set for release in June, will sell even better than the soundtrack.

"My dad holds the record for an album at No. 1 the longest," she says with a smile. "My goal is to beat my dad."

That could take some doing. Cyrus' debut CD, Some Gate All, remained at No. 1 for 17 weeks in 1992, creating a fan-frenzy phenomenon and making him a seemingly overnight sensation. But he'd been singing since the age of 4, when his grandmother nudged him in front of the congregation of the Pentecostal church pastored by his grandfather in Flatwoods, Ky. By the following year, he was singing with his father's gospel quartet, The Crownsmen.

A crucial decision

Baseball competed for Cyrus' attention throughout high school, but at age 20, he made a crucial decision. "I-put-my-catcher's mitt up on a shelf and listened to my intuition," he says. "I drove to a music store and bought a guitar and decided I was starting a band."

After years of struggle, dashed hopes and false starts, he exploded onto the charts in 1992

with the hit single "Achy Breaky Heart" and a video that ignited a dance craze and created an Elvis-like pandemonium.

"People didn't believe it was real. They thought it was staged," Cyrus says of the fan frenzy that his very appearance would incite. "But that was how life was for me. None of it was make-believe."

While "Achy Breaky Heart" catapulted him to fame, many critics considered it a novelty song and pegged Cyrus as a one-trick pony. By the mid-1990s, his rocket ride was mostly over, radio was turning a deaf ear to his music and people remembered him as "the 'Achy Breaky Heart' guy."

With his music career running out of steam, he reassessed his priorities and turned his attention toward home. "I wanted to embrace my family," he explains, "and take a little bit of time to get connected back with who I am and where I'm from, love my kids, my wife, and be a great father and a husband."

Change of scene

A couple of years later, Cyrus took his father's suggestion and began to explore other avenues of entertainment, finding a refreshing change of scene in acting. A role in the quirky movie *Mulbelland Drine* paved the way for a couple of other small acting jobs, and in 2001 he landed the kad on a new PAX-TV series, *Dic.* Cyrus loved the fish-out-of-water role of a country physician in the big city, but the show filmed for weeks at a time in Toronto and the separation from his family in Tennessee was agonizing.

Dic was discontinued in 2004, but a year later Disney executives saw something they liked in both Cyrus and Miley and cast them in the cornedy series Hannah Montana, about a young teenager with a secret life as a pop star. Cyrus relocated his entire family—wife Tish, daughter Brandi, 20, son Trace, 18, Miley, son Braison.

Who should not take ACTONEL? Do not take ACTONEL if you:

Tell your doctor before using ACTONEL if:

How should I take ACTONEL?

What are the possible side effects of ACTONEL? Stop taking ACTONEL and tell your health care provider right away if:

- swallowing is difficult or painful
- · you have chest pain
- you have very bad heartburn or it doesn't get

ACTONEL may cause.

- · pain or trouble swallowing (dysphagia)
- · heartburn (esophagitis)
- · ulcers in your stomach and esophagus (the tube that connects the mouth and the stomach)
- pain in bones, joints or muscles, sometimes severe Pain may start as soon as one day or up to several months after starting ACTONEL.

The most common side effects with ACTONEL include back pain, joint pain, upset stomach, abdominal (stomach area) pain, constipation, diarrhea, gas, and headache. Tell your health care provider if you have pain or discomfort in your stomach or esophagus. Rarely, severe skin reactions may occur. Patients may get allergic reactions such as rash, hives, or in rare cases, swelling that can be of the face, lips, tongue, or throat, which may cause trouble breathing or swallowing

in rare cases, patients taking ACTONEL may get eye inflammation, usually with pain, redness and sensitivity to light

Rarely, patients had jaw problems associated with delayed healing and infection, often following tooth extraction

Your body keeps your bones strong and healthy by replacing old bone with new bone.

How can osteoporosis affect me?

Who is at risk for osteoporosis?

Many things put people at risk for osteoporosis The following people have a higher chance of getting osteoporosis:

Women who.

- are going through or who are past menopause ("the change")
- are white (Caucasian) or Asian

People who:

- are thin
- have a family member with osteoporosis
- do not get enough calcium or vitamin D
- do not exercise
- smoke
- · drink alcohol often
- take bone thinning medicines (like prednisone or other corticosteroids) for a long time



backpacks from the parcels of food and outdoor gear they send to the local post office.

Townspeople welcome the hikers with open arms. During Trail Days, the First Baptist Church congregation serves free meals to the hungry hikers and offers them complimentary hot showers.

Most of the hikers pitch tents in a campground on the edge of town, while others bunk at The Place, a hostel operated by the United Methodist Church since 1976. "We just ask for a donation to keep the lights on and the water hot," Pastor Jane Ayers says.

The backpackers appreciate the hospitality and

each spring they return to Damascus, a hikers' haven that residents appropriately call the Friendliest Town on the Trail.

"I hiked 34 miles to get here today," says Zack Zanzinger, 19, of Chicago. "I've got to get to the camparound and get out of these boots."



Summer Car Care

Whether on a family vacation or a long Sunday drive, your car will get a workout during the upcoming summer months. Here are some tips to keep your vehicle cruising down the highway as the temperature rises.

Overhearing is a major cause of summer breakdowns. As a preventive measure, make sure your cooling system is completely flushed and refilled every two years. Also remember to check the level, condition and concentration of the car's coolant regularly. At the very least, have your radiator fluid professionally tested, says John Paul, known as AAA's "Car Doctor."

"Don't forget to make sure your oil is in good condition," Paul adds. "That will help prevent overheating as well."

Hydroplaning is more common during the summer, when sudden minstorms can surprise motorists. "To avoid hydroplaning, it's essential to keep your tires in good shape," says Paul, who recommends checking tires regularly for signs of wear by using the "penny method."

If a tire has sufficient tread, the grooves should be deep enough to touch the top of Lincoln's head when a penny is inserted "head first." Also check tire pressure before long trips to ensure that the tires are properly inflated, and don't forget to check your spare.

Paul provides some other suggestions to prepare your car for summer.

- If your air-conditioning system hasn't been checked in several years, take your vehicle to an expert who can check the refrigerant charge, and the compressor belt and compressor clutch.
- Make sure the engine is cool, then look for cracked or worn belts and check hoses for damage or softness. Replace if necessary.
- If the radiator pressure cap shows signs of wear, replace it.
- Check your windshield for chips or cracks, and aplace the wiper blacks if worn.

Following these tips should keep you and your vehicle rolling through the horrest days of the year.






