■ Northville Girl Scout brightens days of area seniors

t's a Monday afternoon in July, and Joy Lerner is madly running around trying to meet the needs of each of her 14 stu-

She tries to assist each student as best she can, but Lerner's pupils seem to be having no trouble with their art project—based on chants of "that was easy" and "oh, look at that."

Lerner isn't a teacher, though – at least not a licensed one. She is a 17-year-old Northville High School senior and a Girl Scout working to earn her Gold Award.

Her students didn't have recess before the afternoon art class started, either. They may have watched a "Matlock" or "Ironside" rerun, though.

Lerner's students are residents of Northville's Allen Terrace assisted living complex. She has visited Allen Terrace and other senior citizen complexes for the past nine months. During that time, Lerner has given complex residents the opportunity to construct items such as wreaths and flowers. Complex tenants have gotten the chance to mingle with their neighbors and have a little

"She comes here at least once a month, and I think it's great," Allen Terrace resident Marie Frederick said. "Last month, we made wreaths to hang on our doors. This gives us a chance to get together and laugh a little bit because we might not be able to get together outside of lunch"

Frederick also said she admires Lerner, who provides all the necessary supplies for each art class.

Lerner, whose vest is so full of badges you can barely see what color it is, said she was somewhat shocked by the turnout, as she usually averages six or seven students per class.

"Ten is usually a pretty big number." Lerner

Town Square project gets under way

■ Construction on schedule; workers find historical remnants of city

In this day of electric and gas heat, it's hard to remember the days when coal was king,

But construction workers tearing up Main Street and the sidewalk in downtown Northville as part of the Town Square Redevelopment Project this month discovered old coal chutes that still feed into the buildings.

The openings, some rather large, were used to dump coal directly into the basement of the

buildings from the sidewalk. Some of them even still have coal in them.

Another interesting discovery was when workers uncovered the old footings of the former ticket booth in front of the Marquis Theater.

With workers already putting in some 12-hour days, construction is on schedule for the project, which is supposed to be completed in October.

The fire hydrant in front of Comerica Bank was capped last week. It will be relocated to the south side of Main Street.

Crews began to cut the grade down to subgrade in Town Square last week between Main Street and Mary Alexander Court. Underground utility work also began.

"The next big thing will be the pavers," said John Hazinski.

Northville new student enrollment could take significant dip this fall

■ Drop in residential building permits, home sales at forefront

The Northyille Public School district's adopted budget is based on the enrollment of 80 new students. That number, however, is a considerable drop

from figures over the past five years, according to NPS Director of Human Resources Don Thomas.

Both Thomas and outgoing Board of Education President Ken Roth said the district has seen anywhere from 200 to 250 new students enrolled in Northville schools each of the last five school years. Roth said the district saw 115 new students during the 2006-07 school year — a good number, he said, but a lower number than in recent years.

Thomas said the district will base this year's numbers on actual students, as opposed to the data




Lerner knows it's not completely out of the question to continue on as a Girl Scout. A friend of hers established a troop during her freshman year of college.

New bike racks coming downtown

Access will be greatly improved for area's cyclists

Doug Bingham says there's one way to alleviate the lack of parking in downtown Northville provide more bike racks.

A volunteer for the Northville Development Downtown Authority Board, Bingham researched this need and convinced the board Tuesday morning to approve \$3,727 for the purchase of six additional racks for downtown Northville.

The six racks, which will be able to hold nine bikes each, will be placed in strategic locations throughout the downtown area.

Letters went out to downtown businesses recently to gauge their interest in providing a pad for the racks.

"Only one or two businesses rejected the idea," Bingham said. "For the most part, they've been very receptive.

Bingham said he looked at various styles of bike racks and wanted ones that would hold a lot of bikes and fit into the area's landscape.

The ones selected have a black mat finish and are rubberized to protect the bikes.

"Cyclists don't want metal on metal," he said.

Bingham believes cyclists. want to park their bikes in a spot that's convenient and in the open to detract from thefts and that these facts will be considered when placing the racks.

"I think this is going to have a significant impact on our parking," Bingham said.


"We want everyone to know that Northville is bike-friendly," said Lori Ward, DDA director.

There are more than 1,800 families affected within the Metro Detroit area. You can make a difference this weekend by helping fire-fighters Fill-the-Boot.



Michael Moore's "Sicko" will make you sick

Michael Moore's new film, "Sicko," is a communal experience that begins the moment you stand in line to get tickets and continues through the laughter and moans you hear during the film to the tears and outrage you see expressed as you exit the theater. This is more than a movie, it's an experience to share with others.

Michael Moore has done it again. He has sparked a hot conversation that has the potential to start a raging fire under our national politicians to actually do something about something that everyone admits is a problem. He has placed our system of health care under a microscope for all to see – and the sight is not pretty. Sicko shows that the only ones getting healthy under our system of care are the members of the health care industrial complex: giant drug companies, mega-hospitals and health insurers that victimize people to maximize profits.

iize profits. The film is not about the 45 million Americans that do not have any health insurance, it is about the more than 260 million citizens who do and still receive inadequate care. It poses powerful questions about a health care system that rations care and debates who has to the right to life-saving procedures that may deprive the system of maximum profits.

Some will argue the film is an unfair assessment of our health care system and it is Michael Moore at his demagoguery best. Others will say the film and the truth it shares will make you angry and sick.

Tapping the anger

As I stood in line to see Sicko I could over hear people talking about their painful experience dealing with the "best health care system in the world." The anger, seems to cut across all racial, age, social-class and political perspectives. As the movie ended it seemed as though a

spontaneous political protest might break out.

The frustration from hardworking Americans fed up with a sick, 'health care system is palpable.

Sicko seems to make the word "why" form on your lips. Why in such a great country, the richest country in the world, do we have the health care problems we do? Why are countless Americans, who "work hard and play by the rules," who are God-fearing, patriotic, flag-waving, red-white-and-blue-bleeding taxpayers, being neglected by the country they helped build? Why indeed?

Equal opportunity outrage

Unlike his previous films, "Roger & Me," "Bowling for Columbine" and "Fahrenheit 9/11," that tended to polarize an already polarized American public by inflaming the politically conservative right and making the political left rejoice as he took on General Motors, the NRA and bashed Bush. Sicko

Partisan drivel gets in the way of progress

Frankly, I have no idea why I did it. But there I was on a slow news day, sitting in front of my computer, trolling for interesting ideas.

So I googled both the Democrats and the Republicans to see what serious public policy issues they were talking about these days.

The Democrats announced they'd bought Michigan Chief Justice Clifford Taylor's car at public auction. The headline on the press release said: "Supreme Court Chief Justice admitted using taxpayer-funded car for personal reasons."

The chief justice, a Republican, voluntarily turned in his state-supplied Ford Five Hundred because of the state budget crisis. Other judges followed. But the Dems weren't about to give him any credit.

Their handout charged that Taylor "admitted" using the car for personal reasons, quoting a Detroit Free Press story that he used it for "commuting, law school visits, ceremonial functions, and occasional trips to the grocery and for dinners out."

Mark Brewer, the Michigan Democratic Party's longtime chair, was quoted: "Taylor, the highest paid judge in Michigan, abused the public's trust in state government when he used his taxpayer-funded car for dinners, trips to the grocery store and personal trips. During the state's budget crisis, Taylor should have led by example and not wasted taxpayer money." (Funny, but Brewer didn't mention that Democratic judges who got cars also used them to go to the store.)

The Republicans, naturally, were not to be outdone. On their Web site, the GOP ran a picture of Gov. Jennifer Granholm looking tired and frazzled next to the headline, "Granholm Travels to Germany/Sweden While Michigan Burns."

This was prompted by the announcement that the governor will be traveling to Europe to sell Michigan as a good place to do business. Republican Party Chairman Saul Anuzis was quoted as saying, "Today's announcement reeks of hypocrisy...

"If the governor wants to go on a 'real' jobs mission, she should travel to other states to convince the hundreds of companies that have left Michigan on her watch to come back."

Well, so much for thoughtful,

constructive political discourse in a state facing the greatest economic crisis of our time.

For contrast, let's leave the playpen for a moment and consider New York City Mayor Michael Bloomberg's comments when he announced his resignation from the Republican Party in June.

That was noteworthy, because it fueled speculation he intends to shake up the presidential race by running as an independent:

His comments were downright refreshing: "Any successful elected executive knows that real results are more important than partisan battles and that good ideas should take precedence over rigid adherence to any particular political ideology."

Speaking at a conference at the University of Southern California, "Ceasefire! Bridging the Political Divide." Bloomberg pointed to climate change and stem cell research as areas where cities and states had stepped in to fill the void caused by ideological and partisan bickering in Washington. "When people seek the presidency, hopefully they will address these issues rather than issues that are of importance to a small number of people."

There are some bright pockets. The South Bend Tribune ran a feature on Michigan Congressman Fred Upton (R-St. Joseph) and his geographic neighbor on the other side of the political fence, Indiana Congressman Joe Donnelly (D-Granger). Both men were outraged at the inadequate treatment and the long delays in providing benefits for wounded soldiers returning from Iraq and Afghanistan.

After reading a Newsweek story on the subject, Upton sought out Donnelly, a new member of the House Veterans Affairs Committee, which has jurisdiction over benefits for vets.

They then joined together to introduce a bill to shift the burden of proof in the complex and frustrating bureaucratic process

of awarding a disabled veteran medical benefits.

Their idea is to make the system serve the veteran, rather than the other way around. "I've been fortunate to have a friend like Fred Upton," said Donnelly. "We work as a team. We don't care about the 'R' or the 'D' part of it." For his part, Upton disavows his own National Republican Congressional Committee's targeting Donnelly for defeat.

He instead praised "the very good job" his colleague is doing as a freshman congressman.

Lansing desperately needs some of that spirit today. Our government is paralyzed by partisan infighting over the 2008 state budget, reliably estimated by experts to be at least \$1.8 billion in deficit. Bipartisan votes will be required to erase the red ink.

Democrats need to vote for the kinds of structural reforms to government and cost cuts that Republicans want, while Republicans need to vote for the tax increase Democrats (and everyone else, for that matter) know has to happen to close the budget gap.

It's a Grand Bargain that most civilized, responsible adults could reach in moments. Yet when you see what kinds of partisan drivel both our political parties are churning out, you understand why it's so hard for our elected lawmakers to do the right thing.

The hard-working, set-upon citizens of Michigan deserve better – lots better. And it's high time we started to demand it!





Rumors of Jane Goodall's death have been greatly exaggerated

To coin a famous phrase of author Mark Twain's when someone reported that he was dead — and he wasn't "Rumors of my death have been greatly exaggerated."

These words must have come to Dr. Jane Goodall's mind when I inadvertently mentioned in an article in last week's paper about a local

woman mar-

rying a Kenyan she



met while studying baboons that her mentor, the famous primatalogist

Pam Fleming Goodall, was "the late" and that she studied gorillas. Goodall is actually alive and well at age 73, and she didn't study gorillas; she studied chim-

panzees. It was Diane Fosse, whose life was depicted in the movie "Gorillas in the Mist," who studied gorillas, and she is "the late." Although the movie suggests Fosse was killed by gorillas, locals believe Fosse was most likely murdered by gorilla poachers.

But back to Goodall. I first received an e-mail about my faux pas from Joseph Blumberg, manager of Science Communications at Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey. in New Brunswick, N.J., who had read the article online.

Blumberg explained that university staff members use LexisNexis Academic Search and Google Advanced News Search to pick up any mentions of Rutgers on a daily basis even in the Northville Record.

The next day I received an email from Mary Paris of the Jane Goodall Institute in Alexandria, Va., who also informed me that Goodall is indeed alive.

"I'm pleased to tell you that Jane Goodall is not 'late.' She is alive and very active at age 73, traveling more than 300 days per year around the world working for environmental causes and the protection of chimpanzees," Paris said.

Goodall's chimpanzee research continues at Gombe Stream Reserve in Tanzania the longest running wildlife research project ever. On July 7, Goodall appeared at the Live

Earth Concert in East Rutherford, N.J., where 60,000 fans gave her a standing ovation. The concert was one on each of the seven continents.

Paris added that it was also misleading to have implied in the article that Goodall left chimpanzee research on religious grounds to pursue conservation. That is not the case.

"In the 1980s while attending a scientific conference, she realized that she could not continue blissfully spending her time in the forest studying the chimps while their very existence was being threatened by environmental devastation," Paris wrote.

So, she chose to turn the scientific research over to others under the aegis of the Jane Goodall Institute, and she took to the road to speak and write about environmental preservation."

Paris said that today the youth environmental education program Dr. Goodall started, Roots & Shoots, has groups in 90 countries. Villages in Africa are also getting assistance in sustainable agriculture.

Chimpanzee habit is being preserved through creative partnerships with organizations like Google. And coffee farmers in Tanzania are selling beans to Green Mountain Coffee Company for their new Gombe Reserve coffee. These are just a few of the

wonderful things Dr. Goodall is doing to make the world a better place," said Paris. The most amazing thing about

all of this to me was that people are reading the Northville Record in New Jersey, Virginia and elsewhere. As a journalist today, our words are not just read by members of our local audience. With the advent of the Internet, even the Northville Record has "gone global." It's now an undeniable fact about the media industry in 2007.



Camp plays to children's imaginations

■ Ridge Wood Elementary hosts Camp Invention for second year

In the fifth-grade hall at Ridge Wood Elementary School, anyone out of the loop who entered the hall last week might think a hurricane hit the corridor.

For the elementary school-aged children who participated in last week's Camp Invention program, however, the pile of empty cereal boxes, paper towel rolls, trash bags, cardboard boxes and bubble wrap provided the elements required for the imagination to

Camp Invention is a summer enrichment program that fosters creativity, teamwork, inventivethinking skills, and science literacy. Children enhance their understanding of science, math, history. and the arts as they participate daily in five activity-oriented thematic modules.

During the five-day camp. youths disassemble old machinery and use the parts to make their own inventions in the "Take Apart/I Can Invent" module; travel around the world to deliver secret documents in "The Wild Blue Y'Under" module: build communication centers to respond to alien radio signals in the "Tape Me to Your Leader" module; and use forensic science as crime scene investigators in the "Solve It: The Missing Inventor's Log" mod-

Certified teachers oversee each class, and Northville High School students serve as counselors for the week. Camp Director Tom Boomer, who teaches fifth grade at Ridge Wood, said his school's program is the best of the more than 40 in the state of Michigan.

"This is the second year we've had it (at Ridge Wood)," Boomer said. "It's a great week. Everyone

has fun.

"Most kids always want to know what's inside a VCR. This allows kids to take hammers. screwdrivers and other things and take out wires and see what it takes to make things work."

Ridge Wood third-grade student Logan Goering was enthusiastic about the prospects of what he could make from an old hair dryer. He decided on constructing 'a robot that gives you a million dollars every day."

"(Camp Invention) is really cool," Goering said. "I'll probably

do it next year, too." Lining the walls near Hurricane Ridge Wood are some of the students' finished works. Goering said the inventions, comprised of aluminum foil. Styrofoam dishes and a host of other household items, are space stations, towers and command centers. He' and other students had the chance to showcase their work during an

"Inventor's Showcase" that took place last Friday afternoon.

Ridge Wood Camp Invention Associate Director Heather Zoldak said the program leads to children expressing an interest in open-ended projects. Zoldak, who teaches kindergarten at the school, added the program teaches youth that it's not the end result, but the process that makes a project fun.

'As a teacher. I enjoy it, too, because it's a lot different than a normal classroom," said Marc Lipke, a fourth-grade teacher at Winchester Elementary. "It's more challenging, too, because you're trying to teach the same curriculum to a first-grader and a fifth-grader."

The Camp Invention program was created by the National Inventors Hall of Fame Foundation with support from the Patent and United States

inception in 1990, the program has grown to include more than 800 sites in 44 states.

Boomer said the group sought out Northville Public School District personnel when looking for a venue for the program. He said running the program has been a piece of cake, too.

"It's been pretty simple." Boomer said. "If you keep the kids busy and give them something to do, they have fun. Plus, this is a camp they want to be at, so that makes it better.

"This is all cool stuff. Hopefully, we can keep the program (in Northville) for a while."

'Powerful Kids' program offers students lessons in self-esteem

■ Children learn to think positive

Karin Pearson thinks education doesn't have to end when summer begins.

One of two assistant principals Northville High School, Pearson said this year's third "Powerful Kids" summer education program turned out to be another success.

The program began two years ago and was developed by staff from Northville Youth Assistance, a school-based program that reaches out to disadvantaged chil-

Each year has a different theme, and this year's was 'The Power of Positive.

The program took place last week and this week at the local high school.

A variety of activities took place that focused on incorporating positive messages into students' lives.

Participants included students from Northville schools in grades second-fifth, with about 40 students in each of the two sessions

each week.
The fee for the week-long program was \$40 per child.

The program included karate and yoga instruction and an arts and crafts project in which students made inspiration boxes.

Although the enrollment changed from one day to the next due to family vacations and other conflicts, "We encouraged students to stay for the whole week," Pearson said.

Educators enjoy program,

Pearson feels educators benefited from the program, as well.

"The greatest thing about being an educator in the district is that I get to teach, I get to know elementary students and form relationships with them," she said.

The students have a good time in the program, and they learn."

A chance to make new friends

Another benefit of the educational program is that it provides students with an opportunity to meet children who attend other schools.

"It's a great way to spend a week in the summer, and they feel better about themselves," she said. Students also get to play a lot of

games during the program "I have a theater background, so we did a lot of things that talked about the theme," Pearson said. Children learned about proper

nutrition, including an explanation of the food pyramid and healthy

We also talked about put ups rather than put downs to encourage good behavior," she said.

Students constructed personal shields, similar to a family crest, and were asked to talk about themselves and what makes them special.

"It's a very interactive program." Pearson said.

Another goal of the program was to make children feel comfortable around others their age.

We ask boys to talk about their feelings with girls and vice versa," Pearson said. "That's something they may not get to do much during the school year."

Educators believe that even though it's only a week long, the program can do a lot to produce more well-rounded students once they start school again in September.

Pearson hopes the program can be offered again next summer.

There is a lot of character building in our school system, but it helps to have that reinforcement during the summer," Pearson said.

REHABILITATION AFTER HEART SURGERY

Men undergoing the surgical procedure to get to damaged arteries. known as "coronary artery bypass grafting" (CABG) should know that the surgery is associated with a significant decline in bone mineral content. As a result, they could be at increased risk for fractures. When researchers performed dual-energy X-ray absorptiometry, which is a method of measuring bone mineral content, they found that bone mineral density decreased in the arms, pelvis, and total bodies of male treatment. With this in mind, low- to moderate-risk patients are advised to undergo low-intensity resistance training regimens after their sternums are fully healed. The sternum (breast bone) is the flat bone in the chest through which the surgeon must cut

"Learning about the food groups that promote a 'nutritionally-bundled' breakfast is only half the battle of consuming a complete meal. Learning how to translate these groups into a desired meal is the other. As a culinary nutritionist, I like to put nontraditional spins on some of America's favorite breakfast items, focusing on flavor, color and convenience as menu must-haves. I've listed a few great-tasting, simple-to-prepare balanced breakfast ideas below. Enjoy!"

- BOCA Meatless Breakfast Wraps. Talk about simple all these need is a quick zap in the microwave and you've got a meatless version of the traditional sausage wrap, filled with egg whites and cheese. And better yet, they include the bundle of benefits one needs for a balanced breakfast they're an excellent source of whole grains and protein and a good source of fiber and iron. Try topping the Southwestern variety with a dollop of salsa, and grab a side dish of fresh mixed berries. Or, go with the Original variety and serve with sliced tomatoes and fresh fruit. These wraps are my new breakfast favorites when convenience is key.
- Yogurt Trifle. Liven up granola and fresh and/or dried fruit with this delicious twist on the simple yogurt parfait. Layer the bottom of a serving dish or bowl with low fat granola and fresh raspberries or dried cherries or cranberries, top with a thin layer of soy-based or regular yogurt and then repeat until filled. Add a dash of cinnamon for some sweetness at the top. Pair with a half grapefruit to tempt the taste buds with a sweet and tart duo.
- Blueberry Buckwheat Pancakes. Buckwheat is a good source of whole grains and fiber. If you can't find buckwheat pancake mix or flour, opt for whole grain pancake mix or flour which is usually carried by the local grocer. Stir fresh or frozen blueberries into the batter and plop onto a nonstick griddle or pan. And to turn the pancakes into a downright wholesome treat, top each with a dollop of vanilla yogurt or mini scoop of frozen vanilla yogurt or soy dessert.

are aware that their breakfast choices often lack important nutritional components. In fact, 64 percent of adults said they "wanted to get more of" key nutrients in their breakfast package, like whole grains, fiber and protein.

"A nutritionally complete breakfast is key and helps provide Americans with the valuable nutrients and energy that is important for jumpstarting a productive day. Yet, far too often breakfast routines are unbalanced, creating a missed opportunity for the nutritional benefits provided by a balanced meal," says Jackie Newgent, RD, contributor to Weight Watchers and Fitness magazines.

According to Newgent, there are simple and convenient ways to enjoy a nutritious breakfast. And, it doesn't need to be big, to be balanced. Try choosing soy-based breakfast sausages or patties which usually contain 75 percent less fat than traditional pork sausages and are a good source of protein. "Scramble up some eggs or egg whites, bell peppers and sliced soy-based meatless sausage, with a toasted whole wheat English muffin and fresh berries on the side," she adds. In fact, this meal incorporates three food groups that Newgent identifies as supporting a "nutritionally-bundled" meal — Whole Grains, Protein and Fruits & Vegetables.

Whole Grains

Whole grains contain complex carbohydrates, including fiber, and other key nutrients, such as folate,

tron, selenium and magnesium
Fiber, in particular, helps to promote digestive health. Products
that are a good source of fiber help
keep the digestive tract working
smoothly. According to Newgent,
Americans consume only about half
of the fiber they need per day.

Good sources of whole grains and fiber include: barley, brown rice, buckwheat, oatmeal, popcorn and whole-wheat breads, pastas and cervals

Protein

Protein is essential for maintaining the health or strength of our skin, bones, muscles and teeth. It plays an important role in the production of red blood cells and normal functioning of our immune system

"Protein is the most satiating nutrient, providing a full feeling to keep you more satisfied between meals," adds Newgent. Newgent stresses protein as an important nutrient to consume at breakfast to help keep energy levels up throughout the day and maintain a nourished body. Newgent also suggests that, similar to protein, tron is an essential nutrient to consume that helps the body produce energy and keeps the immune system healthy.

Good sources of protein and iron include, soy, fish, meat, poultry and beans. Fggs and milk products are good sources of protein and other valuable nutrients, too.

Fruits & Vegetables


Fruits and vegetables are essential to promoting good health as they contain vital nutrients, including fiber, potassium, vitamin C and other health-promoting plant nutrients.



Home Owners Good Information For Your Home

HOME ELECTRICAL SERVICE SIZE:

Homes built in the 1940's, 50's and early 60's generally had 60 Amp of electrical service installed to the home. This in itself does not mean that the electrical service is unsafe. 60 amp service is typically fine for a small house with two people living in the home. The electrical service can become an unsafe issue when the home owner replaces a 15 amp glass fuse with a 20 amp or larger size fuse. This will allow the circuit to draw more electrical power than was intended. This will cause the wires to overheat and create a possible fire hazard.

Another concern today for 60 amp service is the total limitation of electrical power that can be used in the home with multiple appliances running at the same time. With modern electrical appliances,

home for the demands of today's family lifestyles. The service size should be based on the electrical requirements for all electrical appliances installed, based on how many appliances could be running at the same time, and the number of people in the home that could be requiring electrical demands at the same time. This total should be used to determine and identify the electrical requirements for the home. MAP/Label Your Home Electrical Panel

Breakers: Label each breaker/fuse in your

panel to identify which room/circuit the breaker controls/protects. . It is recommended that you have a

floor plan drawing of the home that also identifies the circuits located by the electrical panel. This can also help future owners know the electrical layout for the home.

• You could consider placing a small number on the front cover (in the lower corner) of the outlet or switch plate, which corresponds to the panel breaker number.

• The best time to mark your home electrical panel is not when the power goes out and you are in the dark. Take the time to mark your electrical panel on a nice day with plenty of sunlight and a good helper.

• Any unusual electrical wiring suspected or noted during the labeling process should be inspected and serviced by a certified electrician to avoid any possible electrical danger in the home.

Time to listen: Lawyer knows best on FCC, satellite issues

Q. Could you briefly give us a description of the law regarding satellite dishes as it relates to community associations?

A. Under the law, a member has a right to install a satellite dish (one meter in diameter or less) on property that the member owns or which the member has exclusive use or control. This includes condominiums, cooperatives and homeowners associations. In the case of condominiums and cooperatives, the rules apply to "exclusive use" areas, such as terraces, balconies or patios. In the areas shared with others or accessible without your permission, it is not considered under exclusive use and is off-limits for satellite dish installation. However, a cooperative or a community association can deny such installations if it can show that its decision is necessary to prevent danger to the building, common elements, as long as its argument is reasonable. Also, an association can impose certain restrictions when safety is a concern or where an historic site is involved. You are best advised to consult with your attorney regarding the FCC regulations and cases in that regard.

Q. I understand there was an act passed by

the Michigan Legislature concerning eminent domain and private property. Do you have any information?

A. Public Act 367 of 2006 prohibits the use of eminent domain, i.e., condemnation, by a state or local

government to take private property for the primary benefit of a private entity. You are best advised to consult with an attorney experienced in condemnation law, if you have an issue. A similar act also provided for payments to residential occupants who moved due to condemnation actions, being Act
