## January

- More than 800 people attend the 10th annual Northville Nite festivities at Hillside Middle School on New Year's Eve. The family celebration is a way for Northville residents to ring in the new year in a safe and positive way.
- The owner of STUDIO 427 and the Taurus Cafe on Main Street closes the doors on her gallery business with little notice. The Donut Scene, a

Center Street business for 23 years, also closes its doors.

- After a meeting with district officials in December 2006, the Northville teachers union announces the group is preparing for emergency times.

- Northville Township trustee Brad Werner learns the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office won't be filing charges against him. He said local developer Sam Sackllah's allegations of extortion were the result of a land deal gone sour. Sackllah

claimed Werner used his role as a township official to exert undue pressure on him to sign a purchase agreement. The conflict arose from Sackllah's need to run a water line to his commercial development at Napier and Seven Mile roads across Werner's front yard.

- The Historic District Commission of Northville announces an upcoming presentation on "An Introduction to the History of Northville Township" at town-

ship hall on Jan. 10.

- Students at Meads Mill Middle School are chosen to be part of the Michigan Honors Choir.

- Northville Township leaders await a decision from developer Real Estate Interests Group on whether it plans to purchase 153 acres of former Detroit House of Corrections property north of Five Mile Road owned by the city of Detroit. Township officials say they don't want to get into a bidding

war with the developer over the property.

- Northville resident Bob Wilkinson, owner of the Highland Lakes Laundromat at 43093 Seven Mile Road, won \$500 from the Michigan Lawsuit Abuse Watch group for noticing this warning on a washing machine: "Do not put any person in this washer."

- Jan Zuyus, owner of Trader Tom's Tobacco Shop at 43249 W. Seven Mile Road, celebrates her cigar shop as home to a 30-year-old

social club.

- A Michigan Department of Natural Resources grant paves the way for a new nature area and park in Northville Township along Johnson Creek to be called Linear Park.

- A new upscale bar and restaurant, NOMI, an acronym for Northville, Mich., announces its plans to open soon on Main Street in the new Northville Square in downtown

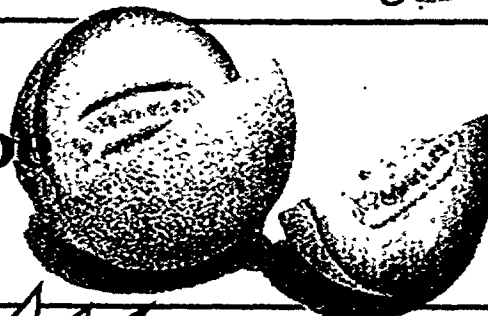

• Northville Township medical malpractice attorney Brian McKeen is named one of the top 10 lawyers in 2006 by Michigan Lawyers Weekly.

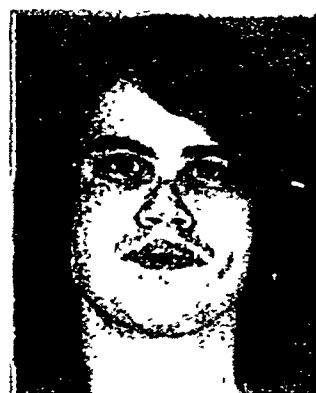
• Local architect Greg Presley is named chairman of the Northville Downtown Development Authority.

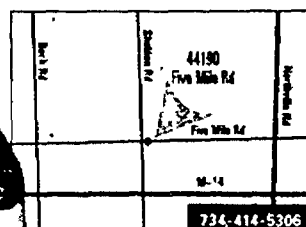

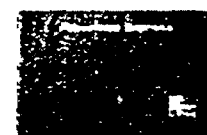

determine Northville Township residents' views on Thayer's Corner Park at Six Mile and Napier roads.

- Developer Grand Sakwa announces plans to build a project at the northeast corner of Five Mile and Sheldon roads that will include a bank, pharmacy, grocery store, restaurant and other retail outlets.

- The Northville Record learns that in November 2006, the American Association of University Women's Legal Advocacy Fund's Progress in Equity Award was presented to the University of Michigan-Dearborn for the school's educational program for female prisoners at the Robert Scott Correctional Facility at Five Mile and Beck roads.

- Northville's and the rest of the state's schools get a reprieve when Gov. Jennifer Granholm proposes that the state not make any cuts to its operating budgets midyear. She proposes a 2-cent service tax instead.

- Marketing consultants, New Moon Visions, for Northville focus on identifying what's unique about

- A crew of volunteers installs a new floor in the New School Church at Mill Race Historical Village in downtown Northville.

- Developer REIS (Real Estate Interests Group and Schostak) cannot win approval from Northville Township trustees on an almost \$1-billion project called Highwood on the site of the former Northville Regional

Psychiatric Hospital on Seven Mile Road. The developer wants to add more commercial space on the property than township leaders.

- Planning commissioners consider a new senior living campus at Five Mile and Haggerty roads in Northville Township. The project, proposed by Sunrise Senior Living of McLean, Va., is described as a \$44-million development with a full range

of senior services.

## March

- The Town Square Redevelopment project moves ahead as the Downtown Development Authority Board awards the construction bid to Farmington Hills-based contractor McCarthy & Smith. The project involves revamping the Bandshell Park area

across from the Main Street clock.

- City council mem-

bers meet to consider rezoning that would allow the development of the new Tipping Point Theatre on east Cady Street.

- Northville teachers could end the school year without a new contract, according to the teachers' union representative. The request for a fact finder by the Northville Public School District in January brings an end to bargaining negotiations with the union.

- John Werth is promoted from chief of police to director of public safety in Northville Township after a 25-year career in law enforcement.

- Residents are still picking up the pieces after a Feb. 7 fire at the Innsbrook Apartments on Seven Mile Road in Northville Township.

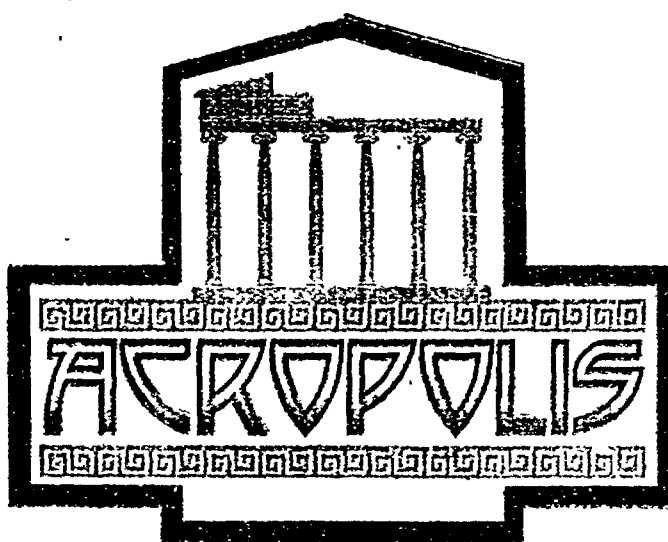

The fire starts when a plumbing contractor worker uses a propane torch to try to thaw frozen pipes in one of the apartment buildings.

• The Northville Parks and Recreation Department will begin receiving direction from a new commission formed of residents from both the city and the township. Day-to-day supervision will be handled by the city manager. The arrangement is known as a shared services agreement. Services to city residents will not be affected.

• Northville Township residents oppose township residents funding the

opening.

• Another apartment fire destroys a second-story unit in the Harbour Village Apartments on the north side of Seven Mile Road. A candle left burning in the bathroom is determined to be the cause of the fire.

• An indoor soccer facility is proposed at Northville Community Park at Five Mile and Beck roads in Northville Township.

• The Chase Bar & Grill plans to open on the lower level of Northville Square on Main Street in downtown Northville. Other new tenants include CVMedia and Plymouth Physical Therapy Specialists.

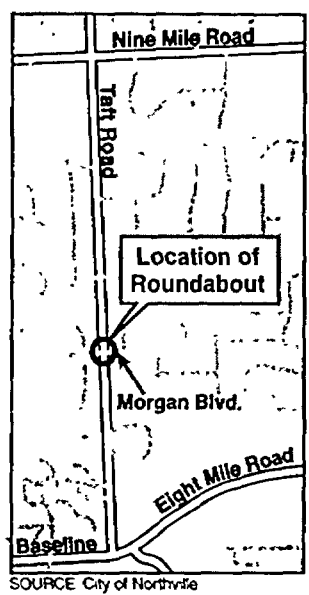
• Parents are concerned about proposed boundary changes in the Northville school district.

• Northville High School students initiate a week of outreach and community service called Outreach Week during their regular Spirit Week activities.

• The Town Square project will include improvements to some of the buildings flanking the downtown renovation, including Helen's Uptown Cafe and Rock on Main clothing store.

• Meridien Development announces plans to develop Center Street Square, a condominium/retail project off north Center Street in downtown Northville at Rayson Street. The project is estimated to cost \$3.1 million.

• Northville Township board members deny a \$100,000 Michigan Department of Natural Resources grant application for Thayer's Corner Park at Six Mile and Napier roads. Board members say they do not have enough information to approve it. They are concerned about the cost the township might incur if improvements to the

cleanup of the proposed Highwood project on Seven Mile Road. The developer wants the community to agree to a brown-field redevelopment plan that would use tax dollars to help fund the estimated \$15-million cleanup of the contaminated former psychiatric hospital property.

• The nonprofit Tipping Point Theatre has a gala fundraiser titled, "A Call to Action." The theatre is looking at an August

• The Northville Township fire chief and deputy chief both decide to leave. Chief Bill Zhmendak, 59, announces in February that he is retiring. Then Deputy Chief David Carignan

resigns.

• The Northville school board has a study session to review proposed attendance boundary plans. Three scenarios are presented.

• Members of the Northville Township Brownfield Redevelopment Authority vote to not

approve developer REI's brownfield redevelopment plan that would use tax dollars to fund the cleanup of 414 acres at the site of the former Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital. The project, called Highwood, is now at a standstill. REI requests a use

variance on the project with the Zoning Board of Appeals.

• A Redford-based church, Detroit World Outreach, defends its purchase of a \$3-million home for its pastor, Ben Gibert, and his family

## May

- A play area in Cabbagetown in downtown Northville takes shape. The park is located at the corner of Baseline Road and Carpenter Street.

- Plans progress on two new buildings on Dunlap Street — an office/retail building and a new CVS Pharmacy in front of the current pharmacy.

- IAV Automotive Engineering officials announce plans to build an \$18.2-million facility in Northville Township on Centennial Drive off of Five Mile Road. The company is expanding and relocating from Ann Arbor.

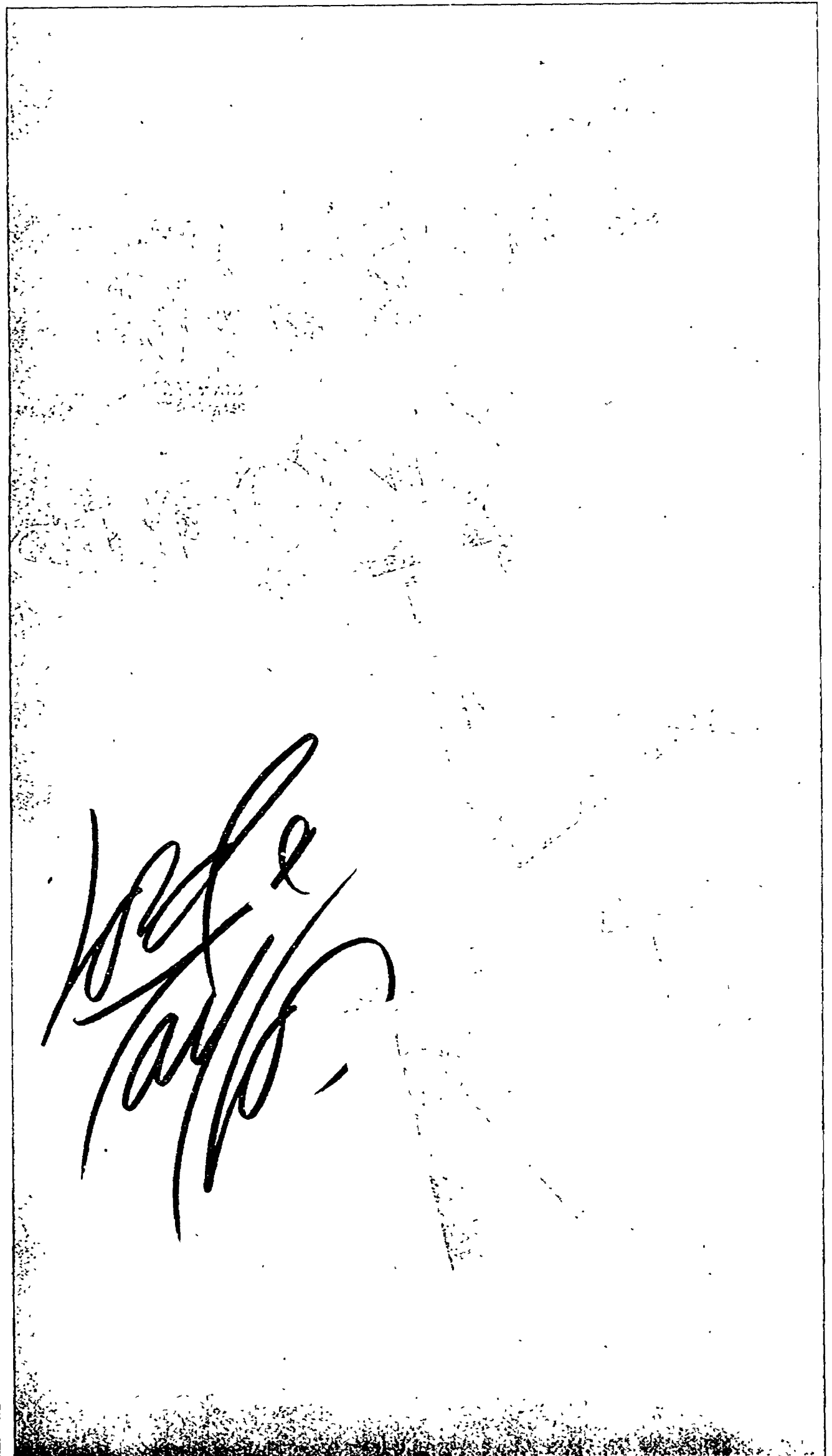

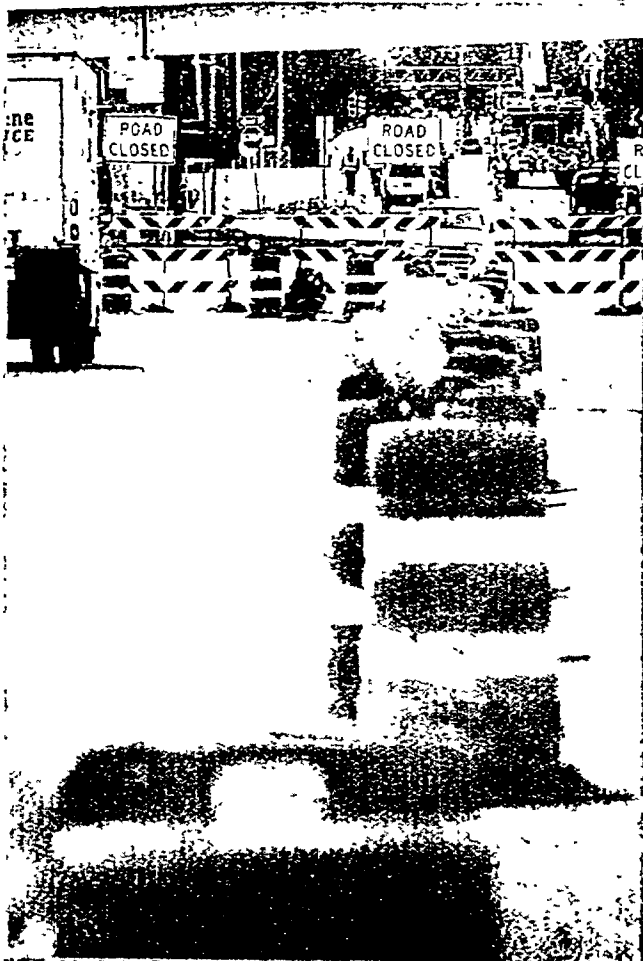

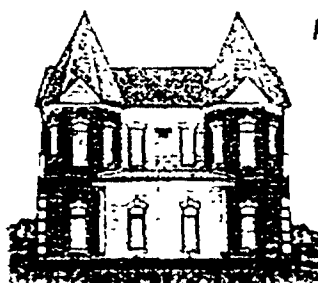

- Northville finally selects a new marking campaign, "timeless...with a twist" for the downtown area.

- New student enrollment could take a significant drop in the fall.

## August

- A fact-finder's report is scheduled to point Northville Public School District administrators and members of the

Northville Education Association in the right direction with the hopes of approving a new teachers' contract before the start of the 2007-08 school year on Sept. 4. The teachers' last contract expired in September 2006.

- The family of Northville resident Dennis Shields, 57, who died June 28 after a fight with cancer, established a scholarship fund in his name that will benefit Northville High School students. Shields was a huge supporter of the Mustang baseball, cheerleading, football and hockey squads and served as a coach in the Northville Junior Baseball program for 10 years.

- The Northville Township Planning Commission unanimously approve a plan to rezone 18.3 acres of land from office to senior living. The property, located on the east side of Haggerty Road north of Five Mile Road, will be called Sunrise Senior Living. The Northville Township Board of Trustees later veto the plan, saying it wants the space for office buildings.

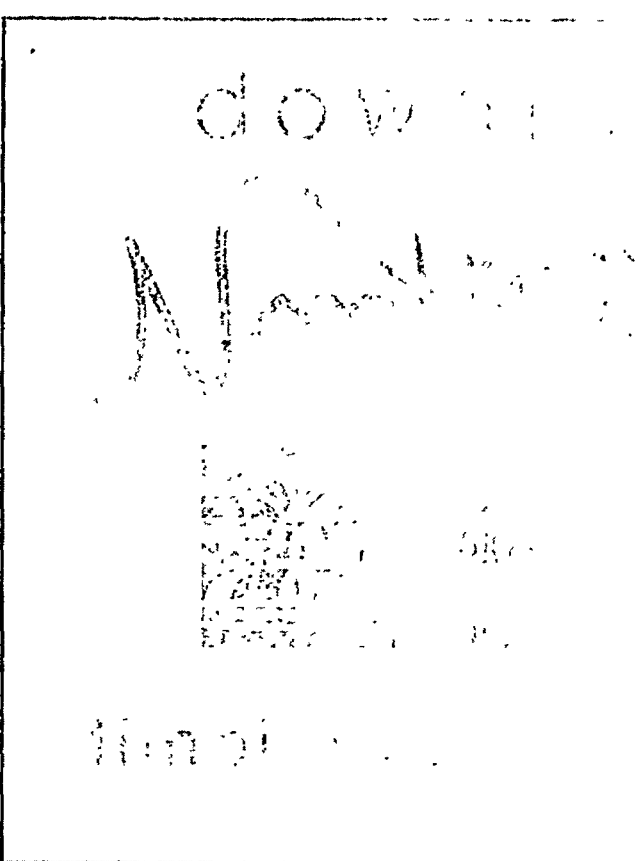

some capacity since 1947, retiring as the track's executive manager in 2004.

- Swedish firm Trelleborg Automotive makes plans to invest \$10.2 million in a new technical center in Northville Township, which is expected to bring 32 jobs to the area.

- Residents of two Northville Township subdivisions — Edenberry Hills and Shadbrook — are faced with having to pay about \$11,500 per home if a Special Assessment District is established to pay for road improvements.

- The Northville High School class of 2008 outperforms state averages in both the ACT and the first installment of the Michigan Merit Exam.

- The Northville Public School District calls back six of 10 laid-off teachers. The callbacks were the

result of changes in enrollment, leave requests and resignations.

- Barry Brown, the fact-finder responsible for mediating negotiations between the Northville Public School District and the Northville Education Association, delivers his report to both sides Aug. 28. The two factions have 60 days to discuss Brown's findings.

## September

- Due to state officials' failure to reach an agreement, the state of Michigan faces a governmental shutdown this month. If there is no budget in place by Sept. 30, a \$4.8-million payment due to the Northville Public School District could be delayed.

- The Tipping Point Theatre, 361 E. Cady

St., opens Sept. 6 with "Don't Dress for Dinner."

- Northville High School tweaks its cell phone policy so that students will lose the device if caught with a phone during school hours. The measure is taken as a way to prevent students from cheating.

- The Northville Downtown Development Authority establishes a Business Assistance Program for downtown Northville businesses. The group will offer financial assistance to downtown businesses through grants in the following categories: a Technical Assistance Grant for marketing consultant services, window display and architectural design consulting and a Facade Improvement Grant for signage, lighting and front, rear and side facade work. The Tech grant will be awarded for profes-

sional services and is a 50-50 matching grant that will not exceed \$500 per application. The Facade grant must provide written consent of the building owner if a tenant applies for the award. This 50-50 matching grant will not exceed \$5,000 per facade for improvements to the front and/or side facade and \$2,500 for a rear facade. The initial allotment for the program is set at \$45,000.

- The Northville Public School District finishes the 2006-07 school year with a surplus of funds of about \$360,000. This is positive news since the district has a projected deficit of around \$80,000.

- A number of residents in the Edenberry and Shadbrook subdivisions say there are alternatives to the Special Assessment District Northville Township is proposing for road improvements in the two areas that, if residents approve, could cost lot owners about \$11,500. Residents vote against the \$1.3-million project.

- The Northville Public School District is a part of a six-district consortium in which each district is awarded \$569,000 by the U.S. Department of Education to help enhance and fortify readiness and emergency response management plans in their schools.

- Doing an about-face from its Aug. 16 decision, the

**SPRAY CLEANERS CONTRIBUTE TO ASTHMA**

A multi-country study in Europe has found that using household spray cleaners and air fresheners can cause asthma. Even if a person uses the spray cleaners only once a week, he or she has as much as a 50% increased risk of developing asthma over people who do not use them. None of the subjects had any asthma or respiratory issues at the start of the study, and the risk of developing asthma increased the more spray cleaners people used. Researchers say it is still too early for people to stop using spray cleaners altogether, although they point out that cleaners that you can pour into a bucket or sink clean just as well.

Researchers estimate that one out of seven cases of adult asthma is the result of spray cleaner use.

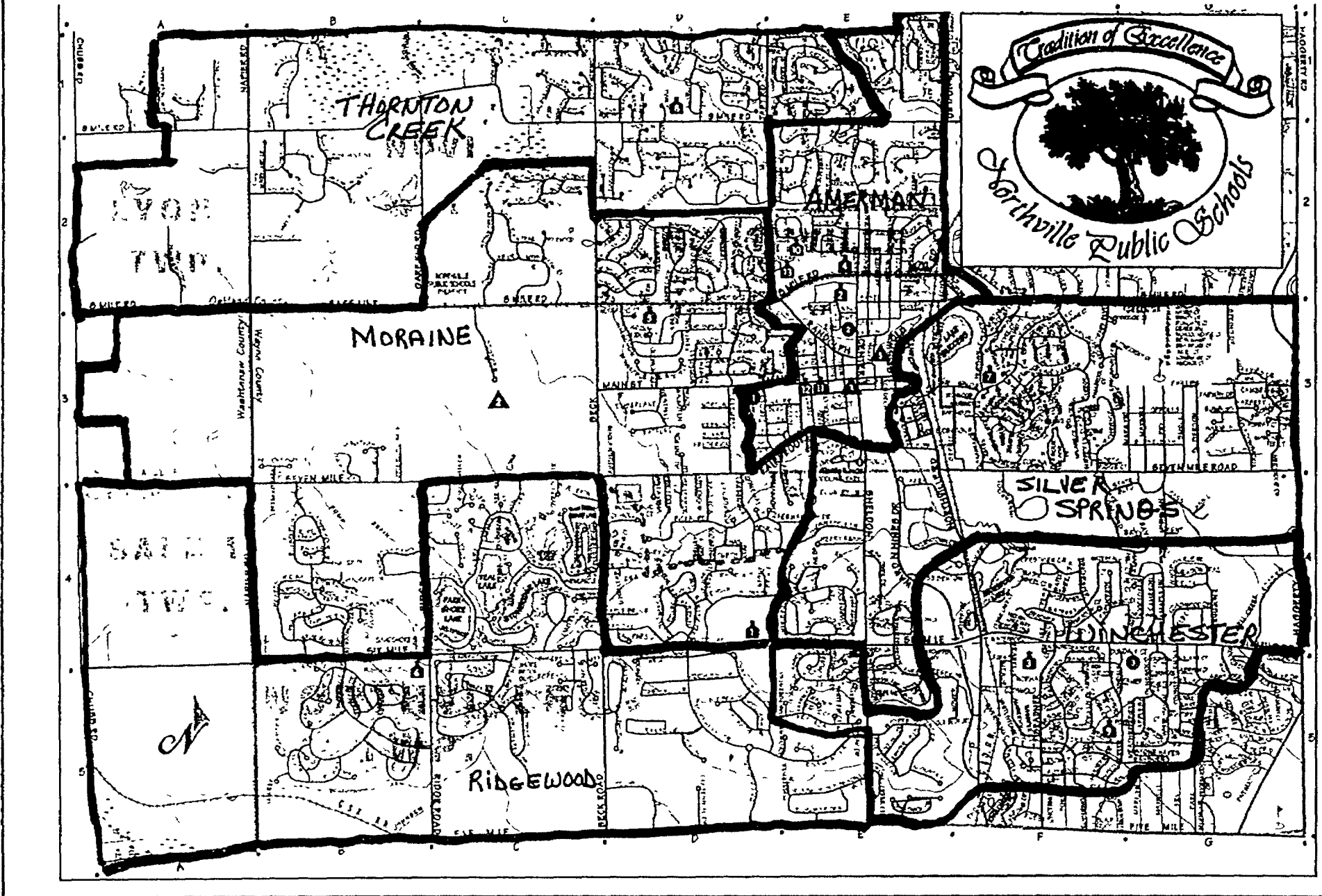

- Northville resident Dennis Delaney, 36, is charged Nov. 2 with three counts of child sexually abusive activity and four counts of use of a computer for communication with another to commit a crime or felony.

- Officials in the Northville Public School District find out they would receive an additional \$48 per student from the state of Michigan, increasing the district's per-pupil allotment from \$8,435 to \$8,483. The increase will add more than \$330,000 to the district budget.

- Bloomfield Hills-based REIS, which in October purchased the former Northville Psychiatric Hospital property, files suit in Wayne County Circuit Court seeking monetary damages and other relief from Northville Township, its board of trustees and planning commission. The lawsuit claims the township interfered with and prevented the development of the former hospital site. The township later files suit in the same court against the developer to prevent four families from living on the hospital property. That suit alleges that the families were illegally moved into security trailers on the site.

- Northville Township officials plan to seek a court injunction to remove some families they say are living illegally in security trailers on the former Northville Psychiatric Hospital property.

- A decapitated and burned body is found the morning of Nov. 8 at Ridge and Seven Mile roads in Northville Township. The Wayne County Medical Examiner determines the cause

of death Nov. 9 as multiple stabbings. Two teenagers — Jean Pierre Orlewicz, 17, of Plymouth, and Alexander James Letkemann, 18, of Westland, str charged Oct. 12 in 34th District Court in Romulus with first-degree murder in the death of 26-year-old Daniel Sorensen of River Rouge. Besides being charged with first-degree premeditated murder and felony murder, which both carry mandatory life sentences, the two str charged with mutilation of a corpse, which carries a maximum sentence of 10 years in prison.

- A report released by the Oakland County Equalization Division says the taxable value of homes in the Oakland County portion of Northville has decreased 2.37 percent.

- At a conference Nov. 8 in Traverse City, Amerman Elementary School Principal Steve Anderson is named Distinguished Principal by the Michigan Elementary and Middle School Principals Association.

- Five Northville Township residents are appointed to serve on the resurrected Ethics Board at the Nov. 15 board of trustees meeting. The board will serve as a watchdog group for all township elected officials, employees and volunteers who serve on various boards and

commissions.

- The Northville Public School District Board of Education approves pay increases, mostly retroactive, to a number of district administrators.

## December

- Susan Greenlee, president of the Voices for Maybury Farm, tells a group Dec. 1 that a meeting between with board members of the Northville Community Foundation is "productive." The sides discuss financial information regarding Maybury Farm.

- Northville resident and bicycle enthusiast Dave Duffield establishes a group — the Friends of the I-275 Bike Path — which aims to promote usage of the path, which stretches through Wayne, Oakland and Monroe counties. Duffield's group also hopes to have improvements made to the route, which would be made by the Michigan Department of Transportation.

- Scores for Northville High School students decrease in all areas of the Michigan Educational Assessment Program (MEAP) test as Northville High School (NHS) receive a composite grade of

## CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF NORTHVILLE CODE OF ORDINANCE AMENDMENT CHAPTER 61 BUSINESS REGISTRATION ORDINANCE ADOPTED

The following ordinance amendment was introduced at the November regular Board of Trustees meeting and approved for adoption at the December 20, 2007 regular meeting of the Board of Trustees.

### BUSINESS REGISTRATION ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE ENACTED PURSUANT TO MCLA 41.181; MSA 5.45(1) et seq. and MCLA 42.15, TO PROVIDE FOR THE REGISTRATION OF ALL BUSINESSES ENGAGING IN BUSINESS ACTIVITY WITHIN THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF NORTHVILLE WHICH AFFECT THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY, AND GENERAL WELFARE OF PERSONS OR PROPERTY; TO SET FORTH THE PROCEDURES FOR REGISTRATION AND THE CONDITIONS OF RENEWAL; TO ESTABLISH A REGISTRATION FEE TO BE PAID WITH APPLICATION; AND TO ESTABLISH PENALTIES FOR NONCOMPLIANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS SET FORTH ABOVE.

The Charter Township of Northville, Wayne County, Michigan ordains:

### Section I

#### Title

This Ordinance and the state laws adopted by reference herein shall be collectively known and may be cited as the "Northville Township Business Registration Ordinance."

### Section II

#### Definitions

As used in this ordinance:

"Business" means any trade, occupation, profession, work, commerce or other activity owned or operated for profit by any person within the township excluding, however, political, charitable or religious establishments.

"Registration Agent" means the Charter Township Clerk or such other township official or employee as may be designated by resolution of the Charter Township Board.

"Person" means any individual, partnership, association or corporation.

"Charter Township" means the Charter Township of Northville.

### Section III

#### Purpose

The purpose of the ordinance is to assist the Charter Township with information to provide more adequate police and fire protection; more equal and equitable real and personal property taxation; better efficiency and economy in furnishing public utility services within the township; more comprehensive and informed planning and zoning for uses of land and structures within the township; and to establish a registry of businesses operating within the township for the general information of the public and for the promotion of the township.

### Section IV

#### Registration Requirements

No person may commence or continue a business, as herein defined, within the Charter Township without having first registered with the Charter Township therefore as hereinafter provided and without maintaining such registration in current effect during any business operation or activity. Annual registration updates will be required and the penalty provision of this ordinance may be exercised for failure to supply the township with requested annual updates.

### Section V

#### Procedure for Registration

Registration to commence or continue a business shall be required and the Registration Certificate will be issued upon submission of the application and payment of the registration fee by the owner or operator to the Clerk of the Charter Township on a form provided by the township for such purposes. A fee, established annually by Resolution of the Board of Trustees shall accompany the application. The information provided in the application shall be complete and truthful. Upon the filing of a properly completed application and upon payment of the fee, the township shall issue a certificate of registration to the person to commence or continue the business designated in said application if the business complies with the terms of this ordinance.

### Section VI

#### Conditions of Registration

The registration issued under this ordinance shall be effective until December 31st of the succeeding year with renewals required annually. No registration shall be issued by the township where the existing or proposed business would be in violation of any law or ordinance of the United States of America, the State of Michigan, the county having jurisdiction thereof, or the township. Transfers by the holder to any other person are required to be submitted to the township on a new business registration application and the new owner or holder will be required to pay the appropriate registration fee, except upon prior approval of the Charter Township Board. The registration agent shall have the right of inspection of the business premises to assure compliance with this and other Township ordinances.

### Section VII

#### Exemptions

No registration shall be required of any political, charitable or religious establishment situated within the township. The provisions of this ordinance are not applicable to any agency of the United States of America, the State of Michigan, or any political subdivisions thereof.

### Section VIII

#### Penalty Clause

Any violation of this ordinance or any part thereof shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed \$100.00 plus court costs and/or confinement in the County Jail for a term not to exceed 90 days. In addition, the Charter Township specifically reserves the right to proceed in any court of competent jurisdiction for the purpose of obtaining an injunction, restraining order or other appropriate remedy to compel compliance with this ordinance.

### Section IX

#### Severability Clause

Should any portion of this ordinance adopted hereby be declared unconstitutional, illegal or of no force and effect by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such portion thereof shall not be deemed to affect the validity of any other part or portion thereof.

### Section X

#### Effective Date and Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances

This ordinance shall take effect upon publication as required by law. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed; provided that any violation charged before the effective date of this Ordinance under an Ordinance provision repealed by this Ordinance shall continue under the Ordinance provision then in effect.

a composite grade of "B" on the 2006-07 Education Yes! School Report Card. Despite the slight decline in performance, the school also meets Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) standards, according to a report released Nov. 30 by the Michigan Department of Education.

• Members of the Miles Christi religious order file a federal lawsuit against Northville Township claiming their constitutional rights have been violated. It claims that through the enforcement and attempted enforcement of zoning laws that the township violated the priests' civil rights.

• A group of Northville citizens establish a legal defense fund for former Maybury Farm farmer John Beemer

to pay for expenses relating to his appeal on denied unemployment benefits. The Northville Community Foundation Board fired Beemer as farm manager on Sept. 28.

• A group of Northville residents launch a new coalition, Citizens to Protect Northville's Future. The group's mission is to promote safe neighborhoods, quality of life, job creation, economic development and responsible land development in both Northville Township and the city of Northville.

• Water rates in both Northville Township and the city of Northville will increase in 2008. The city's proposed 2008-09 wholesale rates are \$20.96, compared to \$16.14 in 2007-08, representing an increase of 29.9 percent. In Northville Township, the rates will increase to

### ATTACHMENT A - SCOPE OF PROJECT

#### WATER QUALITY MONITORING

1. The engineering consultant will develop a QAPP based on the ARC, Rouge Project monitoring program and 2006 BST activities. The QAPP will include elements related to the BST sampling, including definition of terms, equipment needed, sampling methods, sample handling and chain-of-custody, laboratory coordination and supplies, analytical methods, laboratory QAPPs, personnel responsibility, quality control procedures, health and safety precautions, site selection, and sampling schedule. The QAPP will be sent to Wayne County Department of Environment (WCDOE) for review to insure testing procedures are following past monitoring efforts.

2. The engineering consultant, with assistance from Northville Township will sample at 15 different locations during one wet weather event. These samples will be analyzed for DO, temperature, pH, Conductivity, E. coli, ammonia, CBOD5 and BST. Northville Township, with assistance from the consultant, will meet with the WCDOE to review results and discuss further sampling locations.

Once analysis has been completed, a second round of sampling will occur to further track the source of any bacterial findings. The second round of sampling has been planned for 21 locations during two wet weather storm events. The same parameters will be analyzed.

3. The engineering consultant, with assistance from Northville Township will complete one dry weather sampling event at four locations, three on the Johnson Creek and one on the Rouge River. Samples will be analyzed for DO, temperature, pH, conductivity, E. coli, ammonia, and CBOD5.

4. The engineering consultant will perform data analysis and complete a report summarizing the findings. All data will be given to the ARC to be included with the ARC water quality monitoring database and reviewed along with all other water quality data collected through the ARC's monitoring program.

The deliverables for this task include a QAPP, GIS maps, field inspection sheets, laboratory analysis sheets, and a report.

#### COMMERCIAL LUNCH N' LEARN

1. The engineering consultant, with assistance from Northville Township, will develop a one-hour long program for commercial businesses within the Township. Possible business groups to focus on would be restaurants, automotive businesses, and property and residential managers. The session will include how businesses can help improve water quality through various good housekeeping practices and also promote Wayne County's River Friendly Businesses Partners program.

2. The Township, with assistance from the engineering consultant, will conduct one Lunch n' Learn session by coordinating with the Kiwanis Club and/or Chamber of Commerce.

3. To assess the effectiveness of the Lunch n' Learn, a survey will be distributed for the participants to complete during the Lunch n' Learn. The engineering consultant, with assistance from Northville Township, will create the survey for this task.

4. The engineering consultant will provide information developed as part of this program to the Township for use in direct mailings.

The deliverable for this task will be the program materials, attendance list, and surveys.

#### STORM DRAIN INLET MARKING

1. To help define the areas of the Township that already have storm drain markers (disks or stamped catch basins), a GIS layer will be developed by the Township. This layer will include the type of marking, when it was installed, and if necessary, when it will need to be replaced. Completing this GIS layer first will eliminate any duplicate efforts.

2. The engineering consultant, with assistance from Northville Township, will develop and promote one storm drain marking workday. This workday will include maps of marking area, educational programs, and refreshments.

This storm drain marking workday will focus efforts on a small-medium size subdivision within Northville Township. Approximately 250 door hangers will be hung and 100 catch basins will be labeled.

The deliverable for this task will be the volunteer educational program.

#### REPORTING AND GRANT CLOSE-OUT

1. The engineering consultant, with assistance from Northville Township, will provide quarterly progress and billing reports to the RPO in accordance with RPO procedures, beginning three months after project inception.

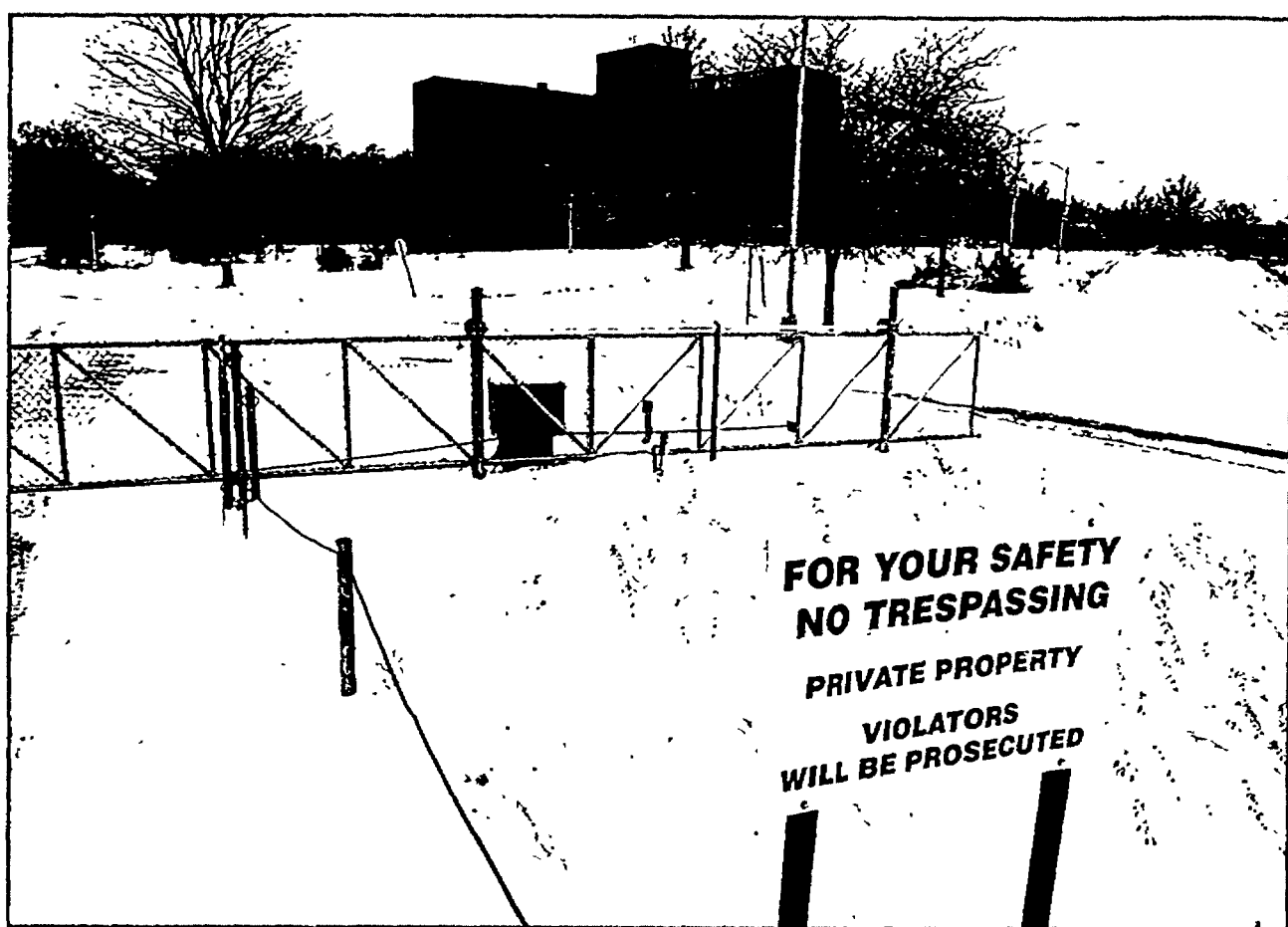

### Girls Cross Country

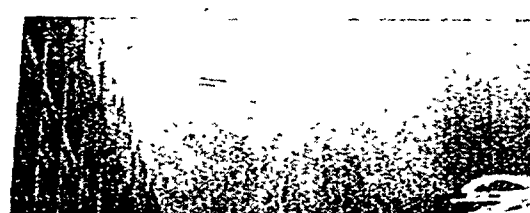

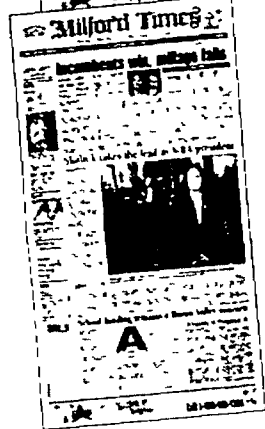

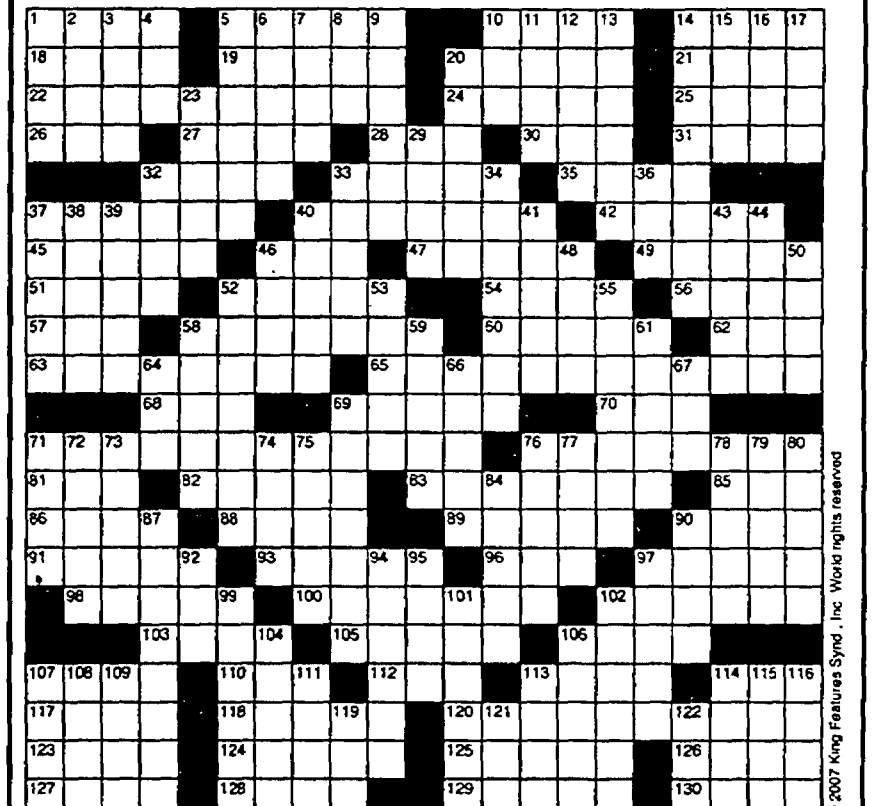
