## Suspending gas

## tax a bad idea

You want an example of political pandering at its most basic? Look no furher than the ridiculous "gas tax holiday" idea being promoted by two of the remaining major-party candidates for president: Republican Sen. John McCain, R-Ariz., and Democratic Sen. Hillary Rodham Clinton, D-N.Y
A similar measure is being considered in Michigan's legislaIure, too.
McCain
McCain and Clinton are both strongly supporting the idea of
suspending the federal gas tax (18.4 cents a gallon) sumner. With gas approaching $\$ 4$ a gallon, they apparently feel the voters will strongly embrace the idea. Of the presidential candıdates. only Democratic Sen. Barack Obama. D-Ill., opposes the idea, correctly calling it a "political gimmich. This "gas tax holiday" idea is bad policy and bad economics, and despite the fact that virually every cconomist in the country opp
port.
Speaking to a group in Ohio recently. McCain said. "I'd lihe to see families in America hate a rellef from ever-increasing costs of gasolne. so maybe at the end of the summer after this tax holiday they coutd buy school supplies for their children as they start the school year.
Clinton. meanuhile. uas ashed by ABC's George
Stephanopoulos to name "a Stephanopoulos to name "a credible economist who suppors the suspension. and she responded that she doesn ' really care
what economists thinh. "We ve got to get out of this mindset where somehow elte opinion is always on the side of doing things that really disadvantage the vast majority of Americans, Clinton said.
This suspension of the federal gas tax is a bad idea on so many levels. it's hard to know where to begin. But the arguments against it include these.

- The money raised by the federal gas tax helps fund badlyneeded highuay projects throughout the country. It's estimated be lost nationwide. Roads will get worse and many road workers will suffer - all so that people can save 18.4 cents a gallon this summer.
Much of the money generated by the state gas tax funds
Michigan's School Aid fund.
- Any solution to the gas crunch has to include saving gas by
driving less. driving more efficienuly and driving more fuel-effidrising less. driving more efficiently and driving more fuel-efficient cars. Having the federal govemment step in with this gas
tax holiday just gives people less incentive to embrace these tax holiday
measures.
- Gas tax holidays don't work. States have tried them in the past, and in every case, the reduction in the price of gas for
drivers wasn't consistent with the amount of tax suspended. Instead, the average driver only saved about half of the amount of the tax suspension because retailers are not required to pass
the savings onto their customers. If the tax goee down 18 cents the savings onto their customers. If the tax goes down 18 cent there"s nothing stopping a retailer from adding that 18 cents right bach to the cost of the gas - and pockeling the additional
money. significant enough to outweigh all the problems a caxts isn' would cause.
McCain and Chnton are obviously pushing this idea to cum noters who are weary of paying so much for gas. This pandering is incredibly transparent, and thankfully, it appears the volers are smart enough to see this gimmick for what it is.
Some pundits are arguing that it's no coincidence that

than- - pectacular show ings in the Indiana and North Carolina primarie. Clearly. the voters weren't swayed by her support of this plan
We're hoping that MrCain and Clinton drop their tocal sup-
port of this idea. As they're discowering, the idea of a gas tax ho iday is not jut bad policy and bad economics - it's bad poltuics.
