





Victorian Festival Parade

The Victorian Festival Parade will begin and end at the Community Center/Old Village School parking lot, located behind those buildings off Cady Street. Parade line up begins at 5:30 p.m., with the parade having a 6:30 p.m. start time.

The parade will exit the Community Center parking lot onto Cady, then take Cady Street east to Wing Street. It will turn north on Wing Street and proceed to Main Street. It will turn west on Main Street to Linden, north on Linden to Dunlap, east on Dunlap to Hutton, south on Hutton to Main, west on Main to Center, south on Center to Cady, and west on Cady to return to the Community Center lot.





many other items) into an image or pattern, ranging from abstract to representational.

Used for centuries as floor and wall ornamentation, and for iconic symbols in many religions, mosaic has seen a resurgence beginning in the last century, continuing with architectural uses and gaining acceptance in the world of fine art. Today, some artists use classic materials that date back to the origins of mosaic, while others take full advantage of the limitless tesserae choices available today.

This is the second allmosaic auction to be held for DWB/MSF. The first, held in April 2011, included a collection of 127 artworks that generated more than \$20,000 for the benefit.
